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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (34-34) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (41-25)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last five games but are 5-4 over the last eight contests...are 34-34 overall and have not been more than one one game over .500 or one game under .500 since May 29 (29-27)...are in third place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 12 games...are three games behind Texas for the second Wild Card... started the season 10-8, went 5-13 over an 18-game stretch from April 14 to May 5, were 14-4 from May 7 to 27 and are 4-9 since then...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 26 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 53 home runs over the last 27 games dating back to May 13, which are second most in the majors over that span to Minnesota (56)...hit 51 home runs over the first 42 contests and have 104 for the season, which is fifth in the American League...it is second most in Athletics history after 69 games to the 2000 club, which had 105...the Athletics record for players with 10 or more home runs in a season is nine in 2000 and 2017...had their season-high streak of 13 consecutive games with a home run snapped last Wednesday.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .260 (227-for-874) with 142 runs (5.68 per game) and 48 home runs over the last 25 games dating back to May 16 after hitting .236 with 4.4 runs per game and 56 home runs over the first 44 contests...overall, rank fourth in the American League in hit by pitches (32) and fewest strikeouts (543)...A's pinch hitters are 9-for-36 (.250) with two home runs, eight RBI and seven walks...are tied for the AL lead in pinch walks, rank second in plate appearances (45), third in home runs and RBI and tied for third in hits...Oakland's number eight hitters are batting a combined .295 (74-for-251), which is the third best mark in the majors...also have the third best OPS (.867).

STARTING PITCHING: Monday night, Tanner Anderson became the 11th pitcher to start a game for the A's this year, which is tied for third most in the majors behind the Angels (15) and Rangers (12)...A's starters are 12-4 with a 3.81 ERA (57 er in 134.2 ip) over the last 25 games dating back to May 16 after going 14-15 with a 4.51 ERA over the first 44 contests...are 26-19 with a 4.25 ERA overall...rank third in the American League in wins, fourth in innings pitched (366.0), opponents slugging percentage (.412), and OPS (.721), and fifth in ERA and winning percentage (.578)...used an "opener" for the second time this year last Wednesday and lost...are 1-2 in games in those games this season after going 4-5 last year...openers have allowed at least one run in two of the three games (3 er in 3.0 ip, 9.00 ERA) but do not have a decision...Hendriks has started twice (May 11 and 29) and Soria once (June 5)

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.40 ERA (82 er in 136.2 ip) over the last 15 games dating back to May 27 after logging a 2.88 ERA over the previous 18 contests...overall, have allowed 83 home runs, which is fourth fewest in the American League...have the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.406) and the fifth lowest OPS (.723).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 11 errors in the last 13 games after a season-high eight-game errorless streak...have committed 37 errors for the season, which includes 11 by second basemen, eight by pitchers and 18 by all other positions...have a .985 fielding percentage, which is fifth best in the American League...have the fifth fewest double plays (44) and are tied for the third fewest unearned runs (15).

ON THE BASES: The A's have allowed 50 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors to the Mets (53)...however, opponents have been caught stealing 19 times, which is tied for second most to the Phillies (22)...on offense, the A's are 22-for-35 (62.9%) in stolen base attempts...the percentage is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have the third fewest stolen bases and stolen base attempts in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-4 on this season-long 10-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (2-1), Texas (2-2) and Tampa Bay (1-1)...are now 11-4 on the road dating back to May 16 after starting the year 5-15 in away games... are 16-19 (.457) on the road compared to 18-15 (.545) at home...return home following the game tomorrow for a season-long 10-game homestand against Seattle (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games) beginning Friday...went 4-5 on the last homestand against Seattle (3-0), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (0-3), which was their first losing

homestand since May 22-31, 2018 when they went 4-6 against Seattle, Arizona and Tampa Bay...have a season-high five-game home losing streak but are 50-24 (.676) in Oakland dating back to June 16, 2018.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .256 (329-for-1283) and are averaging 5.58 runs per game on the road (201 runs in 36 games) compared to .231 with an average of 4.09 runs per game at home...have the fourth lowest home batting average in the AL...have a 4.86 ERA (169 er in 312.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.78 at home...have the fifth highest road ERA and the fifth lowest home ERA.

CLOSE CALLS: Seven of the A's last 10 games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 17-18 in those games for the season and the 35 games are second most in the American League (Seattle, 36) and third most in the majors (Cincinnati, 37)...are 10-10 in one-run games and the 20 games are third most in the AL...are 2-6 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning losses and lead the AL in extra inning games...have allowed 18 runs in extra innings, which is twice as much as any other team (17 er in 20.2 ip, 7.40 ERA)...allowed just nine runs in extra innings all last year (8 er in 38.1 ip, 1.88 ERA)...are 5-12 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat losses and are tied for second in last at bat games (Atlanta, 18)... also lead the majors with six walk-off losses, which is one more than all last year...have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the Astros and White Sox for the most in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 14-6 (.700) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 20-28 (.417) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (15-5)... are batting .277 with an .845 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .234 with a .715 OPS against right-handers...have the second best batting average and third best OPS against lefties in the American League but the fifth lowest batting average against righties...tied for the lead in the AL and rank tied for third in the majors in home runs off lefties (33).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 11 times this year...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Hundley, Manaea) and all but Estrada and Hundley are on the 60-day IL...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's and Rays have split the first two meetings of 2019 over the last two nights...Oakland went 2-5 against Tampa Bay last year for the second consecutive season, marking the second time they have lost back-to-back season series to the Rays (2007-08)...the 2-5 record matches the A's worst ever against the Rays (2017)...went 1-3 in the Coliseum and 1-2 at Tropicana Field...have lost 10 of the last 15 games and seven of the 10 losses have been by one run...all-time, the A's are 106-74 (.589) against the Rays, which is their best record against any American League team...are 58-30 in Oakland and 48-44 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is tied for eighth in the American League in extra base hits (31) and tied for ninth in home runs (16)...his 16 home runs are the most among AL third basemen...leads Major League third basemen in total chances (214) and putouts (79) and ranks third in assists (130)...Josh Phegley leads ML catchers with 36 RBI and is third among all AL players in RBI on the road (30)...Marcus Semien has hit safely in all nine games on the road trip and is 16-for-39 (.410) with three doubles, two home runs and nine RBI...the hitting streak matches his career high of nine, and is the fourth time hes had a nine-game hitting streak.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1938 Bob Johnson has three home runs and a single and drives in all the A's runs in an 8-3 win over St. Louis in the first game of a doubleheader... in 1975 Billy Williams hits his 400th career home run in a 9-7 A's loss at Milwaukee...in 1990 Rickey Henderson steals third base against Texas, his 900th career steal...in that game, Dennis Eckersley walks his first batter of the season, snapping a string of 52.0 innings and 186 hitters without a walk...in 2009 Jack Hannahan commits his first error of the season, snapping a 72-game errorless streak dating back to August 10, 2008, which is an Oakland record for a third baseman.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (6-4, 3.98 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Went 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his first four starts, 1-3 with a 6.12 ERA and .287 opponents average over his next five starts from April 21 to May 14 and is 2-1 with a 3.09 ERA (8 er in 23.1 ip) and .267 (24-for-90) opponents average in four starts since then...has six wins this year after combining for seven wins over his previous three seasons...has his most wins since going 10-9 for the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2015.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 2-2 with a 6.16 ERA (13 er in 19.0 ip) in four starts against American League East teams compared to 4-2 with a 3.21 ERA (19 er in 53.1 ip) in nine starts against all other teams...is now 9-16 with a 5.00 ERA (91 er in 163.2 ip) in 32 career starts against the AL East, 43-40 with a 3.87 ERA (314 er in 730.0 ip) in 138 games against everyone else.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-2 with a 3.40 ERA (18 er in 47.2 ip) and .239 (44-for-184) opponents batting average in eight starts at night, 2-2 with a 5.11 ERA (14 er in 24.2 ip) and .299 (29-for-97) opponents average in five starts during the day...is tied for 11th in the American League in wins at night.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received three runs of support or fewer in each of his last five starts but his season run support average of 6.72 (54 rs in 72.1 ip) is ninth highest in the American League.

STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out just 39 batters in 72.1 innings and his average of 4.85 strikeouts per nine innings is the lowest mark in the majors (Nova, CWS 5.78)...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.44 is second lowest.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was one of three inactive pitchers for the opening series in Japan...was slotted in as the A's third starter when the club returned home and made his first start March 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to extend his home scoreless streak to an Oakland record 34.1 innings...broke the previous record of 33.0 set by Matt Keough (Sept. 5, 1979-April 16, 1980)...it is also the longest Athletics home scoreless streak since at least 1908...the streak ended in the first inning of his next start April 4 against Boston, marking the first time he allowed a run in the Coliseum since May 7, 2018...then tossed a season-high 6.2 innings and defeated the Orioles 13-2 at Baltimore on April 9 for his third win in his third start...the only other time in his career he won at least his first two starts in a season was in 2012 when he won his first four starts after missing the first 41/2 months of the season following "Tommy John" surgery...was 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA over his first three starts through April 9...then went 0-2 with a 6.92 ERA over his next three starts through April 27...had his first no decision April 14 at Texas...allowed three runs in 6.0 innings and left with a 7-3 lead but the pen allowed a run in the seventh and four more in the eighth (Soria blown save)...was charged with his first loss of the season April 21 games Toronto when he lasted a season-low 2.2 innings following an ankle injury...it snapped a career-high tying four-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 19, 2018 (fourth time)...went 4-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .243 opponents average during the streak, which spanned seven starts...made his next scheduled start April 27 at Toronto but allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high 10 hits for his second consecutive loss...finished April 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA and .307 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 3-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in five starts in May...snapped his twogame losing streak May 3 at Pittsburgh when he picked up his 50th career win in the A's 14-1 victory...walked a season-high five and had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 13-inning win over Cincinnati May 8 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter for the sixth time in his career as a starter...struck out a seasonhigh five but also surrendered a career-high tying three home runs in a 4-3 loss at Seattle on May 14...left his start on May 20 at Cleveland after 5.1 innings with a cervical strain but did not miss a start...tossed a season-high 110 pitches in a 7-1 win over Seattle on May 26...the pitches were his most since June 26, 2015 at Miami (113).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win at Texas last Friday.. struck out a season-high tying five batters...blanked the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the sixth on an Andrus RBI triple, a Mazara RBI ground out and a Pence solo home run...the A's tied the game in the seventh and he was relieved by Petit with one out in the bottom of the seventh.

2018 RECAP: Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville before he was selected on May 2... went 4-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 17 starts with Oakland in a season that was interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...was out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder and Aug. 28 to Sept. 12 with a strained left forearm...walked just 13 batters in 80.1 innings for an average of 1.46 walks per nine innings...that was a career low and was second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched (Kluber, CLE 1.46)... struck out just 47 but his 3.62 strikeout-to-walk ratio was a career high...his starts and innings pitched were his most since 2015 when he made 31 starts and tossed 180.1 innings with the Dodgers...had a 1-2 record, a 6.08 ERA and .356 opponents batting average in six starts at the All-Star Break last year... then went 3-3 with a 3.81 ERA and .251 opponents average in 11 starts after the break...issued eight free passes in 23.2 innings before the break (3.04 per nine innings) and then walked just five batters in 56.2 innings after the break (0.79 per nine innings)...has a 25-34 career record before the break, 27-22 after the break...allowed a .285 opponents batting average, including .257 (18-for-70) against left-handed hitters compared to .293 (72-for-246) against right-handers...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties... yielded a .333 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .280 when leading off an inning but he walked just three...went 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts with Triple-A Nashville...did not allow a home run in 32.1 innings...struck out 36 (10.02 per nine innings) and walked just six (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeoutto-walk ratio of 6.0...his opponents batting average included a .223 (21-for-94) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .314 (11-for-35) against left-handers.
