## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (42-38) VS. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (40-38)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 26, 2019 — BUSCH STADIUM — 6:15 P.M. CDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won six of the last eight games and nine of the last 13 and are a season-high tying four games over .500 for the fourth time this year (last: 41-37 on June 22)...are in third place in the American League West for the 23rd consecutive day and trail first place Houston by eight games...are 1½ games behind Boston, Cleveland and Texas for the second Wild Card...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 39 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

**THE HALFWAY MARK:** Yesterday's game was the A's 81st of the season, which is the halfway mark of the season...have hit 124 home runs and are on pace to break the Athletics record of 243 set in 1996...with 280 extra base hits, are on pace to fall nine short of the record of 569 set last year...have been hit by a pitch 40 times, which is on pace for the second highest total in Oakland history (88 in 2001)...have two sacrifice hits after setting an Athletics record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season last year (6)...the pitching staff has 637 strikeouts and are on pace to break the Athletics record of 1244 set in 2014.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 4-3 in interleague play (2-1 vs. Cincinnati, 1-2 vs. Pittsburgh, 1-0 vs. St. Louis)...in addition to this two-game series with St. Louis, the A's will also travel to Chicago (Aug. 5-7) and San Francisco (Aug. 13-14) and host Milwaukee (July 30-Aug. 1), St. Louis (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 24-25)...went 12-8 (.600) against the National League last year, which tied for the eighth best interleague record in the majors...finished with a winning record against the NL for the first time since 2015 and the 13th time in 22 seasons of interleague play...are 221-190 (.538) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

**PITCHERS HITTING:** A's pitchers are 2-for-9 (.222) with two walks and three strikeouts this year after going 3-for-21 (.143) with a run, a RBI and six strikeouts last year...they are batting .086 (36-for-417) with four doubles, 12 RBI, 14 walks and 194 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is second lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .080)...the last home run by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit 73 home runs over the last 39 games dating back to May 13, which is tied for third most in the majors over that span...hit 51 home runs over the first 42 contests and have 124 for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...have seven players with 10 or more home runs, which matches Boston, Minnesota and Seattle for the most in the majors...Phegley and Piscotty have nine home runs each and the Athletics record for most players with 10 or more home runs in a season is nine in 2000 and 2017.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .262 (337-for-1285) with a .492 slugging percentage (83 doubles, four triples, 68 home runs) and an average of 5.7 runs per game (212 runs) over the last 37 games dating back to May 16...hit .236 with a .396 slugging percentage and 4.4 runs per game over the first 44 contests...rank third in the American League in hit by pitches (40) and fourth in fewest strikeouts (621) and most grounded into double plays (65).

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 3-for-16 (.188) with a walk, a double and two RBI over the last 30 games...for the season, rank second in the American League in plate appearances (53) and doubles (3), tied for second in home runs (3) and walks (7), third in RBI (12) and extra base hits (6) and tied for third in hits (11).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.46 ERA (45 er in 117.0 ip) over the last 13 games after logging a 5.61 ERA over the previous 13 contests...overall, are tied for second in the American League in fewest home runs (91), rank third in opponents slugging percentage (.398), fourth in OPS (.713) and fifth in opponents batting average (.242).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have tossed four innings or fewer in three of the last four games and have a 7.71 ERA (14 er in 16.1 ip) over that stretch...posted a 2.63 ERA over the previous 11 contests...starters are now 30-22 with a 4.18 ERA...rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.399), tied for third in wins, fourth in opponents batting average (.239), OPS (.708) and innings pitched (433.0) and fifth in winning percentage (.577).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 11 errors in the last 17 games, which has led to nine unearned runs...had just 12 unearned runs over the first 64 contests...have 21 unearned runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League...rank fifth in the AL in fielding percentage (.985) but are tied for the second fewest double plays (50).

**ON THE BASES:** A's opponents have been caught stealing 23 times, which is second most in the majors to the Phillies (24)...however, Oakland has allowed 57 stolen bases, which is second most to the Mets (70)...on offense, the A's are 27-for-40 (67.5%) in stolen base attempts...have the third lowest stolen base percentage in the American League and the third fewest stolen bases and attempts.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-0 on this six-game road trip to St. Louis (1-0) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...went 6-4 on the last road trip and are now 13-4 over their last 18 road games (includes May 19 suspended game)...went 6-4 on the last homestand, a season-long 10-game stand against Seattle (1-2), Baltimore (3-0) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...are 6-9 over the last 15 home games...are 18-19 (.486) on the road compared to 24-19 (.558) at home.

**HOME AND AWAY SPLITS:** The A's are batting .257 (348-for-1355) and are averaging 5.63 runs per game on the road (214 runs in 38 games), compared to .240 with an average of 4.47 runs per game at home...are averaging the third most runs per game on the road in the American League...have a 4.74 ERA (174 er in 330.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.76 at home.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 14-7 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 28-31 (.475) against right-handers...have faced just one lefty over the previous 14 games...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to Houston (17-6)...are batting .281 with an .852 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .237 with a .730 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL, but the fourth lowest batting average against righties...rank third in the AL in home runs off lefties (38).

**A's vs. CARDINALS:** The A's won the first meeting of 2019 last night...meet again in Oakland Aug. 3-4...last met in 2016 when the A's won two of three at St. Louis...have won two of three in each of the previous two season series but are 7-9 all-time against the Cardinals...are 3-3 in Oakland and 4-6 in St. Louis...including 4-3 in the new Busch Stadium...the two franchises also met in back-to-back World Series with the A's winning in seven games in 1930 and the Cardinals winning in seven games in 1931.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** ranks third in the American League in extra base hits (40), tied for eighth in doubles (20), ninth in total bases (158) and tied for 10th in home runs (18)...**Liam Hendriks** has not allowed a run in 21 of his last 22 relief appearances and has the second lowest relief ERA in the AL (1.09)...**Josh Phegley** has 30 of his 41 RBI on the road and is tied for third in the AL in road RBI...**Marcus Semien** has a 15-game road hitting streak (24-for-66, .364)...leads the majors with 81 games played and has now started each of the A's last 162 games dating back to June 28 of last year.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1958** Hector Lopez hits three home runs in the A's 8-6, 12 inning win over Washington...in **1974** Campy Campaneris has two hits in the A's 5-0 win over California, giving him 1,000 in his Oakland career...in **1997** Mark McGwire hits his ninth career grand slam in a 6-3 win over Texas, tying the franchise record held by Jimmie Foxx, Sam Chapman and Gus Zernial...in **2005** the A's set an Oakland record for margin of victory in a shutout with a 16-0 win over San Francisco...switch-hitter Nick Swisher becomes just the second player in Oakland history to homer from both side of the plate in the same game.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (1-1, 5.09 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas today for his second stint with the A's this year...began the year at Las Vegas and was 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA in seven games (six starts) with the Aviators when the A's called for the first time on May 12...made three starts in then pitched twice in relief of an "opener"...was 1-1 with a 5.09 ERA in five games when he was optioned back to Las Vegas June 6...went 1-0 with a 6.10 ERA in two games, one start, at Triple-A following his option and is 4-2 with a 3.47 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in nine games, seven starts, overall with Las Vegas.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 1-1 with a 3.31 ERA (6 er in 16.1 ip) and .217 (13-for-60) opponents average in his three starting assignments and 0-0 with a 9.45 ERA (7 er in 6.2 ip) and .323 (10-for-31) opponents batting in two relief appearances...the A's are 2-1 when he starts, 0-2 when he pitches in relief...his two relief appearances came in "opener" games on May 29 (Hendriks) and June 5 (Soria)...over the last two years, he is 7-7 with a 4.33 ERA (54 er in 112.1 ip) in his 20 starts and 1-0 with a 3.76 ERA (11 er in 26.1 ip) in his seven relief appearances...the A's are 13-7 (.650) in his starting assignments over the last two years and 1-6 (.143) in his relief appearances.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Is scheduled to make his first interleague start of the season...has won each of his last three interleague starts dating back to Sept. 15, 2017 (23.0 ip, 11 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 17 so, 1.17 ERA)...has two two-hit shutouts during the streak (Sept. 15, 2017 at Philadelphia and May 26, 2018 vs. Arizona)...is 4-3 with a 3.10 ERA (18 er in 52.1 ip) in eight career interleague starts compared to 9-15 with a 5.10 ERA in 40 games against the American League.

**WITH THE BAT:** Went 1-for-3 with a RBI last year and has a two-game hitting streak (2-for-5, .400)...is the first A's pitcher with a two-game hitting streak since Dan Haren (May 21-June 10, 2005)...the last A's pitcher with a hitting streak longer than two games is Catfish Hunter, who had a five-game streak from Sept. 12-Oct. 3, 1972...is now 2-for-11 (.182) with two runs, one RBI, one walk, four strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in 13 career plate appearances...never batted in the minors.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has issued 12 of his 15 walks to lefties...opponents are 2-for-24 (.083) with a walk (.120 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has a .271 (19-for-70) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup. .190 (4-for-21) after that...the opponents number three hitter is 1-for-11 against him.

**2019 HIGHLIGHTS:** Tossed a season-high 100 pitches in his first start May 12 against Cleveland and allowed four runs in 5.1 innings for the loss...then went 1-0 with a 1.76 ERA and .203 opponents batting average over his next three games (two starts)...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings and allowed just one run on three hits and two walks for his first win on May 18 at Detroit...allowed just one run in 4.0 innings in his next start May 24 against Seattle but walked a career-high tying five and threw 99 pitches in a no decision in a 6-2 A's win...pitched in relief of Liam Hendriks May 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and struck out a season-high six batters in 4.1 innings.

**LAST MAJOR LEAGUE APPEARANCE:** He pitched in relief of Joakim Soria in the A's 10-9 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on June 5...allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high six hits in a season-low 2.1 innings...had a 7-1 lead when he allowed four runs in the third inning on a two-run home run by Trout, a RBI ground out by Calhoun and a RBI single by Fletcher...put runners on first and second with one out in the fourth and was relieved by Petit with the A's leading 7-5...Petit allowed a three-run home run to Ohtani.

average includes a .207 (23-for-111) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .213 (16-for-75) against left-handers...tossed at least six innings in six of his nine appearances, allowed two runs or fewer five times and yielded three hits or fewer four times.

**2019 LAS VEGAS HIGHLIGHTS:** Was the Aviators Opening Day starting pitcher and had a no decision in a 9-8 win at El Paso on April 4...allowed four runs in 5.0 innings and left with a 6-4 lead...made his first relief appearance on April 9 against Sacramento in relief of a rehabbing Chris Bassitt...allowed one unearned run on one hit in 6.0 innings of relief and struck out a season-high nine for the win...that began a three-game winning streak where he went 3-0 with a 2.37 ERA and .149 opponents batting average over a three-start stretch from April 9-20...tossed a season-high 99 pitches and allowed five runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings April 15 against Fresno but still picked up the win...logged a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings and yielded just two hits in an 11-0 win at Fresno April 20...had his three-game winning streak snapped April 26 against El Paso when he had season highs in runs (6) and hits (8) and a season low in innings pitched (3.0) in an 8-6 loss...lost his second consecutive start May 1 at Reno...allowed just two runs in 6.0 innings in a 2-0 loss...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings in his final start before his first promotion on May 7 against Salt Lake but had a no decision...started in his first game back with the Aviators on June 10 and was the winning pitcher in a 17-7 win over San Antonio.

**LAST MINOR LEAGUE APPEARANCE:** Pitched in relief of "opener" Brian Schlittler in an 11-8 win at Memphis on June 16...entered the game to start the second inning with the Aviators leading 2-1...blanked the Redbirds on two hits and a hit by pitch and had a 7-1 lead when he was charged with five runs in the sixth inning...McNutt also allowed a run in the sixth inning for the blown save.

**2018 RECAP:** Was in the A's Opening Day starting rotation but was optioned to Triple-A Nashville following a mid-season stint on the disabled list before returning to Oakland in late August, working primarily as a long man in "opener" games...went 7-6 with a 4.05 ERA and .234 opponents batting average in 22 games, including 17 starts, in his third season in the majors and tossed 115.2 innings...was 5-11 with a 5.24 ERA, .265 opponents batting average and 115.0 innings in 21 starts over his first two seasons...struck out just 72 batters in 115.2 innings and his average of 5.60 strikeouts per nine innings was second lowest in the American League (Colon, TEX 4.98)...walked just 26 (2.02 per nine innings)...his opponents batting average broke down to .221 against left-handed hitters compared to .244 against right-handers...issued 20 of his 26 walks to righties...held the opposition to a .185 batting average leading off an inning and issued just three walks for a .211 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage was the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 100 or more innings and the batting average was fourth lowest in the AL...went 4-1 with a 2.98 ERA in nine games, including eight starts, with Nashville...surrendered just two home runs in 45.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...walked one batter or fewer in each of his nine appearances and issued seven free passes total, an average of 1.39 per nine innings...struck out 34 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.86...allowed a .231 opponents batting average.

<b>RHP Tanner Anderson (0-2, 4.20 ERA):</b>	Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas June 10 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...has a .125 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .286 after that...has a .138 opponents average against right-handed hitters, .300 with both of his home runs against lefties...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-3 A's loss to Tampa Bay last Friday in Oakland (4.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Angels in his career...was 4-4 with a 6.26 ERA and .297 opponents batting average in 11 games, including 10 starts...walked 26 batters in 54.2 innings, an average of 4.28 per nine innings...yielded 14 home runs, which was tied for fifth most in the Pacific Coast League at the time of his promotion...his opponents batting average broke down to .258 against right-handed hitters compared to .356 against left-handers...righties had a .799 OPS, lefties 1.116

- The A's bullpen has a 1.83 ERA (4 ER, 19.2 IP) with 21 strikeouts over its last four games...had a 5.60 ERA (50 ER, 80.1 IP) with 77 strikeouts in 22 games from May 28 to June 20.
- Is 17-for-33 (51.5%) in save opportunities for the season...the 16 blown saves are tied for second most in the majors (Mets, 18)...the save percentage is second lowest in the majors (Mets, 50.0%).
- Is fourth in fewest wins in the American League (12) and has the fourth most losses (16)...is tied for the third fewest home runs (33).
- Has the lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.304) among Major League bullpens.

- Began the season as the A's fifth starter and went 2-3 with a 5.74 ERA in six starting assignments before pitching in relief of "opener" Liam Hendriks May 11...has a 4.20 ERA (7 er in 15.0 ip) in seven relief appearances.
