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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (45-39) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (42-42)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won last night and have won 4 of the first 5 games on this road trip and are now 5-3 over the last eight games...however, have won nine of the last 12 contests and 12 of the last 17 and are 45-39 (.536) overall...the six games over .500 is a season high...are in third place in the American League West for the 27th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by seven games...are 1½ games behind Texas for the second Wild Card...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 43 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

DON'T SLEEP ON THIS TEAM: Oakland is 26-14 (.650) since May 16, T3rd-best record in the American League behind New York-AL (27-12/.692), Texas (28-15/.651) and tied with Minnesota...the mark in this stretch is T5th-best in the Majors...began the season 19-25 in the first 44 games.

QUIET SUPERSTAR: Matt Chapman has collected 55 runs scored, 20 doubles and 20 home runs, the only American Leaguer to reach each of those mark this season, and joins National Leaguers Josh Bell (PIT), Javier Baez (CHC) & Freddie Freeman (ATL) as the only ones in the Majors with 50/20/20...Chapman leads American League third basemen in home runs, 2nd in doubles, RBI, runs and slugging percentage...in the AL, his 3.4 WAR is the 4th-best behind Mike Trout (5.2), Xander Bogaerts (3.7) and Alex Bregman (3.5).

STRENGTH IN STARTERS: The A's rotation is 19-8 with a 3.73 ERA (93 ER, 224.2 IP) with 174 strikeouts in 41 games since May 16...during this stretch, the starters are tied for the Major League lead in wins (TEX, WAS), T2nd in the AL in ERA (5th in MLB), and winning percentage (.704)...posted a 4.51 ERA (116 ER, 231.1 IP) during the first 44 starts of the season...Oakland joined Minnesota as the only Major League club with three starters with 8+ wins.

PUT ME IN, SKIP: Mark Canha has made 39 starts this season, with Oakland going 26-13 in those games...are 3-10 when he enters as a substitution...as a starter, he has 26 runs scored, 7 doubles, 9 home runs and 16 RBI to go along with 23 walks and a .363 on-base percentage.

MATT-ER OF TIME: Matt Olson is hitting .302 (26-for-86) with 13 runs, 7 doubles, 9 home runs, 20 RBI with a .381 on-base mark, .698 slugging percentage and a 1.079 OPS in 24 games since June 5...among American Leaguers in June, he's tied for the lead with 16 extra-base hits, T3rd in home runs, T5th in RBI and T13th in slugging percentage (.612)...his 16 home runs since May 12 are tied for the most in the Majors with New York-NL's Pete Alonso.

UNDER THE HALO: Robbie Grossman is hitting .366 (30x82) with 18 runs, 8 doubles, 2 home runs, 10 RBI, a .416 on-base percentage, .537 slugging park and a .952 OPS in 24 career games at Angel Stadium, with 11 multi-hit games...his .366 average is the best at Angel Stadium among active players (min. 20 G), ahead of Matt Wieters (.363) & Jose Altuve (.332).

SETTING THE TABLE: Marcus Semien has reached base 137 times this season, tied for the 6th-most in the American League behind Mike Trout (162), Mookie Betts (146), Alex Bregman (143), Carlos Santana (143) and Xander Bogaerts (142)...he ranks 6th in the AL with 94 hits and 12th with 43 walks.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 16-11 (.593) in the month of June and have clinched a winning record in June for the second consecutive season (were 17-10 last year)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the Majors this month (25) and also have the 2nd-lowest opponents slugging percentage (.375) and OPS (.681)...in the AL, the offense ranks third in extra base hits (100) and fourth in doubles (54)...have tallied 100 extra base hits in June two other times in Oakland history (116 in 1996, 102 in 2017).

ROAD WARRIORS: Oakland is 16-5 over its last 22 road games (lead 5-3 in May 19 postponed game) since May 16...the 16-5 (.762) mark is the best road record in Majors, ahead of Boston (13-6/.684)...began season 5-15 on road, including 11 losses in the 12 games immediately before this winning stretch.

FOUR SERIES IN FOUR CITIES: The A's are 4-1 in this stretch that features four series in four different cities...the stretch began on Tuesday and takes the club into the All-Star Break...it features games in St. Louis (2-0), Los Angeles-AL (2-1), Oakland (three games vs. Minnesota) and Seattle (three games).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 81 home runs over the last 43 games dating back to May 13, which is 2nd to the Twins (85) for the most in the Majors in that span...hit 51 home runs over the first 42 contests and have 132 for the

season, which ranks fifth in the American League...have seven players with 10 or more home runs, which is tied for the second most in majors...Phegley and Piscotty have nine home runs each and the Athletics record for most players with 10 or more home runs in a season is nine in 2000 and 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .257 (364-for-1415) with a .486 slugging percentage (87 doubles, four triples, 76 home runs) and an average of 5.6 runs per game (228 runs) over the last 41 games dating back to May 16...hit .236 with a .396 slugging percentage and 4.4 runs per game over the first 44 contests...rank third in the American League in hit by pitches (42) and T4th-fewest strikeouts (659)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in plate appearances (55) and doubles (3), tied for second in home runs (3) and T3rd in walks (7), third in RBI (12) and extra base hits (6) and tied for third in hits (11).

PITCHING: The A's rank second in the AL in fewest home runs (93), second in opponents slugging percentage (.393), 3rd in opponents batting average (.241), 4th in OPS (.706), T3rd in shutouts (6)...have a 3.20 ERA (54 er in 152.0 ip) over last 17 games after logging a 5.61 ERA over previous 13 contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-1 on this six-game road trip to St. Louis (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...went 6-4 on the last road trip and are now 16-5 over their last 21 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...are 21-20 (.512) on the road compared to 24-19 (.558) at home...return home following the game Sunday for a brief three-game homestand with Minnesota that starts on Tuesday...went 6-4 on the last homestand, a season-long 10-game stand against Seattle (1-2), Baltimore (3-0) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...are 6-9 over the last 15 home games.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .253 (375-for-1485) and are averaging 5.48 runs per game on the road (230 runs in 42 games), compared to .240 with an average of 4.47 runs per game at home...are averaging the third most runs per game on the road in the American League...have a 4.50 ERA (183 er in 365.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.76 at home.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 15-7 (.682) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 30-32 (.484) against right-handers...have faced just two lefties over the previous 18 games...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to Houston (18-6)...are batting .278 with an .845 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .236 with a .730 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL...rank third in the AL in home runs off lefties (38).

A'S vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series, 8-5...are 4-3 in Oakland and 4-2 in Anaheim...have lost each of the previous five season series, which is the Athletics (Kansas City and Oakland) longest season series losing streak against the Angels...are 48-60 (.444) against the Angels over the last six seasons...that breaks down to 27-27 in Oakland and 21-33 on the road...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 445-381 against the Angels...that includes 232-180 in Oakland and 213-201 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 494-458 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is batting .340 (18-for-53) with six doubles, a triple and four home runs over his last 15 games...is tied for American League in extra base hits (42), tied for fourth in total bases (167), tied for seventh in home runs (20), tied for ninth in doubles (20) and tied for 9th in runs (55)...**Khris Davis** leads designated hitters in home runs (16) and is 2nd in RBI (39)...has 292 career games at designated hitter with the A's, which ties Erubiel Durazo for fourth most in Athletics history...**Liam Hendriks** has not allowed a run in his last 11 games (11.2 ip) and in 24 of his last 26 relief appearances (0.88 ERA)...has the second lowest relief ERA in the Majors (1.03)...**Josh Phegley** has 31 of his 42 RBI on the road and is fourth in the AL in road RBI...**Marcus Semien** leads the majors with 85 games played and has now started each of the A's last 166 games dating back to June 28 of last year.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1995** Mark McGwire hits a two-out grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning off California's Lee Smith to lift the A's to an 8-5 victory over the Angels...in **2001** Miguel Tejada has three home runs and eight RBI in the A's 15-4 win at Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (4-3, 3.86 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season today, which matches his career high from 2015...has four wins, which equals his career total in 40 games (30 starts) entering this season...is 2-2 with a 5.66 ERA (22 er in 35.1 ip) and .237 (31-for-131) opponents average over his last seven starts after going 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first five starts...is averaging 6.94 (27 so in 35.0 ip) strikeouts per nine innings over his last seven start after averaging 10.47 over his first five.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 3.20 ERA (14 er in 39.1 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 1-2 with a 4.76 ERA (15 er in 28.1 ip) in six starts at night...was 0-8 in 15 career day games entering the season.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .210 opponents batting average, which is **fifth** lowest in the American League among pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched...however, 24 of the 52 hits he has allowed have been for extra bases (13 doubles, three triples, eight home runs) and he has walked 31 batters in 67.2 innings (4.12 per nine innings)...has held left-handed hitters to a .195 (25-for-128) average, compared to .225 (27-for-120) against righties... however, has surrendered six of his eight home runs and issued 23 of his 31 walks to lefties for a .730 OPS (.643 vs. righties)...six of his home runs have come with the bases empty...opponents are batting .192 (20-for-104) with runners on base and .187 (17-for-91) the first time through the lineup...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .107 (3-for-28) batting average.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 12 starts and is 1-3 in those games...has 43 runs of support for the season (67.2 ip, 5.72 RSA) but 17 of those runs came in one game on May 16 at Detroit... last year, he received two runs of support or fewer in five of his seven starts and his RSA as a starter was 3.19...has received two runs of support or fewer in 31 of his 42 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 3.54 (93 fr in 236.1 ip)...is 5-0 in 11 career starts with run support of three runs or more.

PRE AND POST "TOMMY JOHN": Is 6-6 with a 3.51 ERA (45 er in 115.1 ip) and .214 (92-for-429) opponents batting average in 23 games (19 starts) since undergoing "Tommy John" surgery May 6, 2016...is averaging 8.27 strikeouts per nine innings (106 so in 115.1 ip)...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA, .263 opponents batting average and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contusion...went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA in three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16...was recalled by Oakland the next day when Marco Estrada went on the injured list...made his first start April 22 against Texas and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings for the win...struck out a season-high nine in his second start April 28 at Toronto (also May 9 against Cincinnati)...however, had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss in 11 innings...left his third start on May 4 at Pittsburgh after five innings with a 4-3 lead but Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss...allowed a season-high seven hits and took the loss on May 9 against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a three-game streak dating back to last year...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...the loss was his first since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits in a 17-3 win at Detroit on May 16...walked a career-high six batters in 3.2 innings in a no decision at Cleveland May 21...is the first Major League pitcher since at least 1908 with a pitching line of 3.2 innings, three hits, three runs, three earned runs, six walks and six strikeouts...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.0 innings on May 27 against Los Angeles (AL) but picked up the win in an 8-5 decision.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win at St. Louis on Tuesday... allowed three runs on four hits and four walks in a season-low 3.1 innings... the A's scored a run in the second but he allowed three in the bottom of the second on a Carpenter two-run triple and a DeJong RBI double...was relieved by Wendelken with one out in the fourth after tossing 94 pitches and the A's scored six times in the fifth for the win.

BASSITT vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-2 with a 7.47 ERA (15.2 ip, 21 h, 17 r, 13 er, 4 bb, 15 so, 2 hr) in five career appearances, including three starts...is 0-1 with an 11.57 ERA (6 er in 4.2 ip) in two games in Anaheim and 1-1 with a 5.73 ERA (7 er in 11.0 ip) in three games in Oakland...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, an 8-5 A's win in Oakland on May 27...yielded a RBI double to Calhoun in the second but the A's tied the game with a run in the third...surrendered two runs in the fourth on a Pujols home run and a Rengifo sacrifice fly...Oakland then built a 6-3 leading before he allowed a RBI double to Fletcher in the sixth...was relieved by Petit who allowed Fletcher to score...was 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA (5.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so) in two games last year.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA and .242 opponents batting average on a three start rehab assignment...struck out 16 batters in 11.0 innings and walked two...his first assignment came with Stockton on April 4 against Rancho Cucamonga...retired all nine batters he faced, the first five by strikeout...moved to Las Vegas for a start on April 9 in a 10-2 win against Sacramento...allowed just one run in three innings of work, a bases loaded walk to Michael Reed in the first inning...then had a no decision in a 6-5 loss to Fresno on April 14...allowed five runs on five hits in five innings of work.

2018 RECAP: Had seven stints with Oakland in his return to the majors following "Tommy John" surgery in 2016...went 2-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games, including seven starts...the ERA and opponents batting average were the lowest of his four seasons as was his .309 on-base percentage, .315 slugging percentage and .624 OPS...the two wins matched his career total entering the season as he was 2-11 over his first three seasons...struck out 41 batters in 47.2 innings for a career-best average of 7.74 strikeouts per nine innings...also went 5-5 with a 4.30 ERA in 18 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...was 2-3 with a 6.10 ERA and .314 opponents batting average over his first 10 games (seven starts) through June 2...then went 3-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final eight games (seven starts) following his July 12 option from Oakland...surrendered six home runs in 81.2 innings, an average of 0.66 per nine innings...struck out 83, an average of 9.15 per nine innings, and walked 25 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.32...allowed a .271 opponents batting average, including .215 (29-for-135) against left-handed hitters compared to .313 (57-for-182) against right-handers...had a .573 OPS against lefties, .817 against righties.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Daniel Mengden (2-1, 4.03 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas last Wednesday for his second stint with the A's this year...tossed six shut-out innings for the win that night at St. Louis, a 2-0 A's win (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 5 so)...began the year at Las Vegas and was 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA in seven games (six starts) with the Aviators when the A's called for the first time on May 12...was 1-1 with a 5.09 ERA in five games when he was optioned back to Las Vegas June 6...went 1-0 with a 6.10 ERA in two games, one start, at Triple-A following his option and is 4-2 with a 3.47 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in nine games, seven starts, overall with Las Vegas...with the A's, he is 2-1 with a 2.42 ERA and .207 opponents average in four starts, 0-0 with a 9.45 ERA and .323 opponents average in two relief appearances...has allowed a .194 opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .294 against left-handers...has never faced Minnesota in his career.

- Is 18-for-34 (52.9%) in save opportunities for the season...the 16 blown saves are tied for second most in the majors (Mets, 21)...the save percentage is third lowest in the majors (Mets, 46.2%; Red Sox, 51.5%).
- Is tied for third fewest wins in the American League (12) and has the fifth most losses (16)...has allowed the fewest home runs allowed (33).
- Has the lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.313) among Major League bullpens.

- Began the season as the A's fifth starter and went 2-3 with a 5.74 ERA in six starting assignments before pitching in relief of "opener" Liam Hendriks May 11...has a 3.71 ERA (7 er in 17.0 ip) in eight relief appearances.
