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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-40) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (38-53)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five of the last six games, seven of the last nine and 12 of the last 16...are 16-7 (.696) dating back to June 9, which is the second best record in the American League behind the Yankees (17-5, .773)...are a season-high tying eight games over .500 at 48-40 (also 47-39 on July 2)... have a run differential of +64, which is fifth best in the AL and sixth best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 7½ games...are one game behind Cleveland for the second Wild Card and two games behind Tampa Bay for the first Wild Card...have spent 11 days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 16-7 (.696) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 32-33 (.492) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (19-6)... are batting .276 with an .838 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .238 with a .739 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the American League, but the fourth lowest batting average against righties...rank third in the AL in home runs off lefties (39).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 20-21 (.488) against American League West competition compared to 28-19 (.596) against all other teams...the mark against the West is second best within the division as Houston is 24-6 and everyone else is under .500...last year, the A's went 38-38 (.500) against the West, 59-27 (.686) against all other teams.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's have set an Athletics franchise record for home runs before the All-Star Break with 139 (previous: 137 in 1996)...that is tied for the 15th best total in Major League history before the break, but is tied for seventh in the majors this year...have 309 extra base hits, which is third best in A's history (321 in 2018, 317 in 1996)...have 452 runs, which is sixth best in Oakland history (522 in 2000, 494 in 1996, 466 in 2014, 459 in 1998, 456 in 1973)...the pitching staff has 701 strikeouts, which is third most in Athletics history (728 in 2014, 715 in 2018)...have clinched a winning record at the break for the second consecutive season as they are 48-40 with three games remaining.

THE LONG BALL: Marcus Semien hit the A's fourth grand slam of the season yesterday, which is tied for fourth in the American League...the A's have now homered in each of the last nine games (18 home runs total)...have 88 home runs over the last 47 games dating back to May 13, which is tied for second most in the majors over that span (Minnesota, 90)...hit 51 home runs over the first 42 contests and have 139 for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .259 (134-for-518) with 91 runs scored over the last 15 games (6.1 runs per game)...have 33 doubles, two triples and 30 home runs over that stretch for a .504 slugging percentage...rank third in the American League in hit by pitches (45), fourth in fewest strikeouts (693) and most grounded into double plays (77) and fifth in doubles (160)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in plate appearances (56) and doubles (3), third in home runs (3), RBI (12) and extra base hits (6) and tied for third in walks (7).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.16 ERA (67 er in 191.0 ip) over the last 31 games dating back to June 11 and have a 4.06 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also rank second in fewest home runs (99) and opponents slugging percentage (.395), third in OPS (.707), tied for third in shutouts (6) and fourth in opponents batting average (.242).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 16 of the last 22 games and are 10-5 with a 3.57 ERA (49 er in 123.2 ip) over that span...overall, starters rank second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.397), tied for second in wins (35), third in winning percentage (.603) and fourth in ERA (4.10), opponents batting average (.241), OPS (.705) and innings pitched (478.0).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors over their last four games after a six-game errorless streak...have just 48 errors for the season and their .985 fielding percentage is fourth best in the American League... have the third fewest double plays (56) and the fourth fewest unearned runs (24).

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been caught stealing 26 times, which is the most in the majors...however, Oakland has allowed 58 stolen bases,

which is second most to the Mets (76)...on offense, the A's are 28-for-43 (65.1%) in stolen base attempts...have the second lowest stolen base percentage in the American League and the third fewest stolen bases and attempts.

FOUR SERIES IN FOUR CITIES: This four-game series with Seattle concludes a stretch where the A's play four series in four different cities...began the stretch by sweeping a two-game series at St. Louis, won three of four at Los Angeles (AL) last weekend and two of three from Minnesota in Oakland to start this week...are 7-2 over the first nine games of this 12-game stretch.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a three-game road trip to Seattle tonight... went 5-1 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and are now 17-5 over their last 23 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-14 on the road...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Minnesota and are 8-10 over the last 18 home games...begin post All-Star Break play a week from today with a five-game homestand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Seattle (two games)...are 26-20 (.565) at home compared to 22-20 (.524) on the road.

EXTRA INNINGS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 2-7 in extra inning games with the loss Wednesday night...the losses are the most in the majors and one more than the A's team total from last year...the nine extra inning games tie Boston for the most in the American league...have allowed 19 runs in extra innings, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2011 (22)...are tied with New York (NL) for the most walk-off losses in the majors (6), rank second in last at bat losses (13) and tied for third in losses when leading after seven innings (6)...are 0-28 when trailing after seven innings and are one of three teams without a win (Baltimore, Tampa Bay).

A'S IN JUNE: The A's went 17-11 (.607) in June, which was the fourth best record in the American League...it marked the second consecutive season Oakland finished with a winning record in June (were 17-10 last year)...allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (27) and had the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.376) and OPS (.682)...also ranked third in ERA (3.99), tied for third in fewest walks (77) and fourth in batting average (.243) and on-base percentage (.305)...the offense ranked second in extra base hits (106), tied for third in doubles (58) and fourth in runs (149)...the extra base hits were second in Oakland history in June to the record of 116 in 1996...hit 45 home runs, which was second only to the 1996 club (55).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 4-6 against the Mariners, which includes 4-2 in Oakland, 0-2 in Tokyo and 0-2 in Seattle...have lost each of the previous six season series after going 9-10 against Seattle last year...the last time Oakland lost six consecutive season series to one team was 1993-98 to Boston... are 50-74 (.403) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season... all-time, the A's are 354-298 against the Mariners...that includes 193-134 in Oakland, 160-161 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 84-97 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman was named to his first American League All-Star team last Sunday...leads the AL in extra base hits (46), ranks fourth in total bases (178), tied for sixth in home runs (21) and doubles (22), ninth in slugging (.543), tied for ninth in triples (3) and runs (58) and tied for 10th in goahead RBI (13)...*Liam Hendriks* has a career-high tying and A's season-high tying 14.2 inning scoreless streak...has the lowest relief ERA in the majors (0.96)...*Matt Olson* has homered 17 times in 47 games dating back to May 12, which is tied for the most in the majors over that span...*Marcus Semien* has started each of the A's last 170 games dating back to June 28 of last year...that is the fourth longest consecutive games started streak in Oakland history and the eighth longest consecutive games played streak.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1989** Mark McGwire connects off Charlie Leibrandt for his 100th career homer, a three-run shot in the third inning of the A's 12-9, 11-inning loss to Kansas City...in **1993** Rickey Henderson becomes just the second player in Major League history to lead off both games of a doubleheader with a homer...Boston's Harry Hooper was the first on May 30, 1913 vs. Washington...prior to the game, Rollie Fingers has his number 34 retired...in **1994** Rickey Henderson becomes Oakland's all-time leader in games played when he plays in his 1411th game as an Athletic...in **1996** the A's set an Oakland record and tie a franchise record by scoring 13 runs in the first inning of a 16-8 win over California...Matt Stairs tied a ML record by driving in six runs in the inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (8-5, 3.92 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season, which will be his most since 2015 when he had 31 with the Dodgers...won his eighth game in his last start, which is tied for ninth in the American League...combined for seven wins over his previous three seasons and has his most wins since going 10-9 in 2015...his 96.1 innings pitched are also his most since 2015 (180.1)...the A's are 11-6 (.647) in his starting assignments.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 6-2 with a 2.74 ERA (19 er in 62.1 ip) and .215 (50-for-233) opponents batting average in 10 starts at night compared to 2-3 with a 6.09 ERA (23 er in 34.0 ip) and .324 (45-for-139) opponents average in seven starts during the day...ranks fourth in the American League in night ERA, tied for sixth in wins, seventh in OPS (.598) and ninth in opponents batting average

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-2 with a 2.68 ERA (13 er in 43.2 ip) in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 5-3 with a 4.96 ERA (29 er in 52.2 ip) in 10 starts against all other teams.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed nine home runs in 96.1 innings and his average of 0.84 home runs per nine innings is seventh lowest in the American League...six of the nine home runs are solo shots.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 6-4 with a 3.14 ERA (22 er in 63.0 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-1 with a 5.40 ERA (20 er in 33.1 ip) in six starts on four days rest.

STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out just 48 batters in 96.1 innings and his average of 4.48 strikeouts per nine innings is the lowest mark in the majors (Davies, MIL 5.79)...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.45 is also the lowest (Alcantara, MIA 1.49)...the last A's pitcher to average fewer than 4.53 strikeouts per nine innings is Tom Candiotti in 1998 (4.39).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received three runs of support or fewer in seven of his last nine starts...however, has starts with 16 runs of support and 13 and his season run support average of 7.19 (77 rs in 96.1 ip) is fifth highest in the American League.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was one of three inactive pitchers for the opening series in Japan...was slotted in as the A's third starter when the club returned home and made his first start March 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to extend his home scoreless streak to an Oakland record 34.1 innings...broke the previous record of 33.0 set by Matt Keough (Sept. 5, 1979-April 16, 1980)...it is also the longest Athletics home scoreless streak since at least 1908...the streak ended in the first inning of his next start April 4 against Boston, marking the first time he allowed a run in the Coliseum since May 7, 2018...then defeated the Orioles 13-2 at Baltimore on April 9 for his third win in his third start...the only other time in his career he won at least his first two starts in a season was in 2012 when he won his first four starts after missing the first 4½ months of the season following "Tommy John" surgery...was 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA over his first three starts through April 9...then went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his next six starts through May 14...left with a 7-3 lead on April 14 at Texas but Soria blew the save in the eighth inning...it was his first of two starts in which the bullpen blew the save (June 12 at Tampa Bay, Hendriks)...was charged with his first loss of the season April 21 games Toronto when he lasted a season-low 2.2 innings following an ankle injury...it snapped a career-high tying four-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 19, 2018 (fourth time)...went 4-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .243 opponents average during the streak, which spanned seven starts... made his next scheduled start April 27 at Toronto but allowed a season-high 10 hits for his second consecutive loss...finished April 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA and .307 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 3-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in five starts in May...snapped his twogame losing streak May 3 at Pittsburgh when he picked up his 50th career win in the A's 14-1 victory...walked a season-high five and had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 13-inning win over Cincinnati May 8 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter for the sixth time in his career as a starter (number seven came on June 23 against Tampa Bay)...struck out a season-high five but also surrendered a career-high tying three home runs in a 4-3 loss at Seattle on May 14...left his start on May 20 at Cleveland after 5.1 innings with a cervical strain but did not miss a start...picked up the win in that start to begin a six-start stretch through June 18 where he went 3-1 with a 2.70 ERA...tossed a season-high 110 pitches in a 7-1 win over Seattle on May 26...the pitches were his most since June 26, 2015 at Miami (113)...struck out a season-high tying five batters in a no decision on June 7 at Texas...allowed a season-high seven runs on nine hits and two walks in 3.0 innings in an 8-2 loss at Tampa Bay June 23

LAST START: He combined with Hendriks on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday...tossed a season-high 7.2 innings and allowed two of the hits...retired each of the first 10 batters before Trout walked with one out in the fourth...did not allow a hit until Simmons singled to lead off the fifth.

2.34 ERA (123.1 ip, 115 h, 38 r, 32 er, 28 bb, 94 so, 13 hr) in 21 career appearances, including 20 starts...the wins are his most against any team...the ERA is fourth lowest ever against the Mariners by any Major League pitcher with at least 100 innings...is 3-3 with a 2.37 ERA (16 er in 60.2 ip) in 11 games at T-Mobile Park and 7-2 with a 2.30 ERA (16 er in 62.2 ip) in 10 starts in his home ballparks...is 6-2 with a 2.18 ERA (14 er in 57.2 ip) in nine starts in the Coliseum...is 1-1 with a 3.65 ERA (12.1 ip, 11 h, 5 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 9 so, 4 hr) in two starts this year...this loss came in a 4-3 decision at Seattle on May 14...surrendered a career-high tying three home runs...allowed solo home runs to Vogelbach and Beckham in the second but the A's tied the game with a two-

2018 RECAP: Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville before he was selected on May 2... went 4-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 17 starts with Oakland in a season that was interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...was out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder and Aug. 28 to Sept. 12 with a strained left forearm...walked just 13 batters in 80.1 innings for an average of 1.46 walks per nine innings...that was a career low and was second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched (Kluber, CLE 1.46)... struck out just 47 but his 3.62 strikeout-to-walk ratio was a career high...allowed a .285 opponents batting average, including .257 against left-handed hitters compared to .293 against right-handers...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...went 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts with Triple-A Nashville...did not allow a home run in 32.1 innings...struck out 36 (10.02 per nine innings) and walked just six (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.0...his opponents batting average included a .223 mark against right-handed hitters compared to .314 against left-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (5-3, 3.80 ERA): scheduled to make his 14th start of the season today, which is a new career high, surpassing his previous best of 13 from 2015...has five wins, which is one more than his career total in 40 games (30 starts) entering this season...also has a career-high 72 strikeouts... is 3-2 with a 5.31 ERA and .235 opponents average over his last eight starts after going 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents batting average, which is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 12-3 A's win at Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday (5.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 1 hr)...is 0-3 with a 3.60 ERA (30.0 ip, 26 h, 14 r, 12 er, 21 bb, 15 so, 0 hr) in six career appearances, including five starts, against Seattle...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 9-2 A's loss in Oakland on June 14 (5.2 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 4 so).


