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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (49-40) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (38-54)

SATURDAY, JULY 6, 2019 — T-MOBILE PARK — 7:10 P.M. PDT RHP CHRIS BASSITT (5-3, 3.80) VS. LHP MARCO GONZALES (9-7, 4.39) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KTRB 860 AM/KHTK 1140 AM) — A'S CAST ON TUNEIN

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last seven games, eight of the last 10 and 13 of the last 17...are 17-7 (.708) dating back to June 9, which is the second best record in the American League behind the Yankees (18-5, .783)...are a season-high nine games over .500 at 49-40...have a run differential of +67, which is fifth best in the AL and sixth best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the fourth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 6½ games...are a half game behind Cleveland for the second Wild Card and one game behind Tampa Bay for the first Wild Card...have spent 12 days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 17-7 (.708) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 32-33 (.492) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (19-6)... are batting .273 with an .829 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .238 with a .739 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL, but the fourth lowest batting average against right-is...rank third in the AL in home runs off lefties (40).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 21-21 (.500) against American League West competition compared to 28-19 (.596) against all other teams...the mark against the West is second best within the division as Houston is 24-7 and everyone else is under .500...last year, the A's went 38-38 (.500) against the West, 59-27 (.686) against all other teams.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's have set an Athletics franchise record for home runs before the All-Star Break with 140 (previous: 137 in 1996)...that is tied for the 13th best total in Major League history before the break, but is tied for sixth in the majors this year...have 312 extra base hits, which is third best in A's history (321 in 2018, 317 in 1996)...have 457 runs, which is fifth best in Oakland history (522 in 2000, 494 in 1996, 466 in 2014, 459 in 1998)... the pitching staff has 709 strikeouts, which is third most in Athletics history (728 in 2014, 715 in 2018)...have clinched a winning record at the break for the second consecutive season as they are 49-40 with two games remaining.

THE LONG BALL: Marcus Semien hit the A's fourth grand slam of the season on Thursday, which is tied for third in the majors...the A's have homered in each of the last 10 games (19 home runs total)...have 89 home runs over the last 47 games dating back to May 13, which is tied for second most in the majors over that span (Minnesota, 94)...hit 51 home runs over the first 42 contests and have 140 for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .254 (139-for-548) with 96 runs scored over the last 16 games (6.0 runs per game)...have 35 doubles, two triples and 31 home runs over that stretch for a .495 slugging percentage...rank third in the American League in hit by pitches (45), fourth in fewest strikeouts (701) and most grounded into double plays (77) and fifth in doubles (162)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in plate appearances (57) and doubles (4), tied for second in RBI (14) and extra-base hits (7), third in home runs (3) and tied for third in walks (7).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.11 ERA (69 er in 200.0 ip) over the last 22 games dating back to June 11 and have a 4.04 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also rank second in fewest home runs (100) and opponents slugging percentage (.393), third in OPS (.704), tied for third in shutouts (6) and fourth in opponents batting average (.241).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 17 of the last 23 games and are 11-5 with a 3.53 ERA (51 er in 130.0 ip) over that span...overall, starters rank second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.397) and wins (36), third in winning percentage (.610) and innings pitched (484.0) and fourth in ERA (4.09), opponents batting average (.241) and OPS (.703).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors over their last five games after a six-game errorless streak...have 50 errors for the season and their .985 fielding percentage is fourth best in the American League...have the third fewest double plays (57) and the fourth fewest unearned runs (24).

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been caught stealing 27 times, which is the most in the majors...however, Oakland has allowed 59 stolen bases, which is second most to the Mets (79)...on offense, the A's are 28-for-43 (65.1%) in stolen base attempts...have the second lowest stolen base percentage in the American League and the third fewest stolen bases and attempts.

KHRUSHING IT: Khris Davis has 24 home runs and a .551 career slugging percentage against the Mariners...his .552 slugging percentage at T-Mobile Park ranks fourth all-time and his 12 home runs at T-Mobile Park are tied for 11thmost all-time among visiting players...he averages a home run every 9.67 atbats at T-Mobile Park, the best mark in the majors (next: Mike Trout, 12.55).

FOUR SERIES IN FOUR CITIES: This four-game series with Seattle concludes a stretch where the A's play four series in four different cities...began the stretch by sweeping a two-game series at St. Louis, won three of four at Los Angeles (AL) last weekend and two of three from Minnesota in Oakland to start this week...are 8-2 over the first 10 games of this 12-game stretch.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this three-game road trip to Seattle tonight...went 5-1 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and are now 18-5 over their last 24 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-14 on the road...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Minnesota and are 8-10 over the last 18 home games... begin post All-Star Break play next Friday with a five-game homestand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Seattle (two games)...are 26-20 (.565) at home compared to 23-20 (.535) on the road.

EXTRA INNINGS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 2-7 in extra inning games with the loss Wednesday night...the losses are the most in the majors and one more than the A's team total from last year...the nine extra inning games tie Boston, Kansas City and Tampa Bay for the most in the American League...have allowed 19 runs in extra innings, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2011 (22)...are tied with New York (NL) for the most walk-off losses in the majors (6)...are 0-28 when trailing after seven innings and are one of three teams without a win (Baltimore, Tampa Bay).

A'S IN JUNE: The A's went 17-11 (.607) in June, which was the fourth best record in the American League...it marked the second consecutive season Oakland finished with a winning record in June (were 17-10 last year)...allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (27) and had the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.376) and OPS (.682)...also ranked third in ERA (3.99), tied for third in fewest walks (77) and fourth in batting average (.243) and on-base percentage (.305)...the offense ranked second in extra base hits (106), tied for third in doubles (58) and fourth in runs (149)...the extra base hits were second in Oakland history in June to the record of 116 in 1996...hit 45 home runs, which was second only to the 1996 club (55).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 5-6 against the Mariners, which includes 4-2 in Oakland, 0-2 in Tokyo and 1-2 in Seattle...have lost each of the previous six season series after going 9-10 against Seattle last year...the last time Oakland lost six consecutive season series to one team was 1993-98 to Boston... are 51-74 (.408) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season... all-time, the A's are 355-298 against the Mariners...that includes 193-134 in Oakland, 161-161 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 85-97 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman was named to his first American League All-Star team last Sunday...leads the AL in extra base hits (46), ranks fifth in total bases (179), tied for sixth in home runs (21), tied for eighth in doubles (22), tied for ninth in triples (3) and runs (58), 11th in slugging (.534) and tied for 11th in go-ahead RBI (13)...*Liam Hendriks* was named to his first American League All-Star team yesterday...has a career-high and A's seasonhigh 15.2 inning scoreless streak...has the lowest relief ERA in the majors (0.94)...*Matt Olson* has homered 17 times in 49 games dating back to May 12, which is tied for the third most in the majors over that span...*Marcus Semien* has started each of the A's last 171 games dating back to June 28 of last year...that is the fourth longest consecutive games started streak in Oakland history and the eighth longest consecutive games played streak.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1990** the A's hit seven home runs in the second game of a doubleheader to defeat the Cleveland Indians 12-1...Mark McGwire and Rickey Henderson hit two each and Carney Lansford, Jose Canseco and Jamie Quirk chip in one each...in **2001** Mark Mulder takes a perfect game into the eighth inning and finishes with a complete game one-hitter in the A's 3-0 win at Arizona...in **2009** Brett Anderson tosses a two-hit shutout at Fenway Park in a 6-0 A's win and Nomar Garciaparra drives in the go-ahead run in his return to Boston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (5-3, 3.80 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season today, which is a new career high, surpassing his previous best of 13 from 2015...has five wins, which is one more than his career total in 40 games (30 starts) entering this season...also has a career-high 72 strikeouts.

LAST EIGHT/FIRST FIVE: Is 3-2 with a 5.31 ERA (24 er in 40.2 ip) and .235 (36for-153) opponents average over his last eight starts after going 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first five starts...is averaging 7.52 (34 so in 40.2 ip) strikeouts per nine innings over his last seven starts after averaging 10.47 over his first five.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .211 opponents batting average, which is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched...has a .203 (28-for-138) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .220 (29-for-132) against righties...however, has surrendered seven of his nine home runs and issued 24 of his 32 walks to lefties for a .747 OPS (.616 vs. righties)...has the fourth most walks against lefties in the AL...seven of his home runs have come with the bases empty... opponents are batting .196 (22-for-112) with runners on base and .180 (18for-100) the first time through the lineup...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .129 (4-for-31) batting average.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-1 with a 3.20 ERA (16 er in 45.0 ip) in seven starts during the day compared to 1-2 with a 4.76 ERA (15 er in 28.1 ip) in six starts at night...was 0-8 in 15 career day games entering the season.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 13 starts and is 1-3 in those games...has 48 runs of support for the season (73.1 ip, 5.89 RSA) but 17 of those runs came in one game on May 16 at Detroit... last year, he received two runs of support or fewer in five of his seven starts and his RSA as a starter was 3.19...has received two runs of support or fewer in 31 of his 43 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 3.64 (98 rs in 242.0 ip)...is 6-0 in 12 career starts with run support of three runs or more.

PRE AND POST "TOMMY JOHN": Is 7-6 with a 3.50 ERA (47 er in 121.0 ip) and .215 (97-for-451) opponents batting average in 24 games (20 starts) since undergoing "Tommy John" surgery May 6, 2016...is averaging 8.40 strikeouts per nine innings (113 so in 121.0 ip)...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA, .263 opponents batting average and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contu-sion...went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA in three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16...was recalled by Oakland the next day when Marco Estrada went on the injured list...made his first start April 22 against Texas and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings for the win...struck out a season-high nine in his second start April 28 at Toronto (also May 9 against Cincinnati)...however, had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss in 11 innings...left his third start on May 4 at Pittsburgh after five innings with a 4-3 lead but Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss...allowed a season-high seven hits and took the loss on May 9 against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a three-game streak dating back to last year...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...the loss was his first since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)... tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits in a 17-3 win at Detroit on May 16...walked a career-high six batters in 3.2 innings in a no decision at Cleveland May 21...is the first Major League pitcher since at least 1908 with a pitching line of 3.2 innings, three hits, three runs, three earned runs, six walks and six strikeouts...allowed a season-high five runs in 5.0 innings on May 27 against Los Angeles (AL) but picked up the win in an 8-5 decision...allowed three runs on four hits and four walks in a season-low 3.1 innings at St. Louis on June 25 but had a no decision in the A's 7-3 win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 12-3 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday...blanked the Angels on a hit and a walk over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Ohtani in the fourth...had a 5-1 lead when Calhoun had a RBI single in the sixth...was relieved by Petit with two outs in the sixth.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA and .242 opponents batting average on a three start rehab assignment...struck out 16 batters in 11.0 innings and walked two...his first assignment came with Stockton on April 4 against Rancho Cucamonga...retired all nine batters he faced, the first five by strikeout...moved to Las Vegas for a start on April 9 in a 10-2 win against Sacramento...allowed just one run in three innings of work, a bases loaded walk to Michael Reed in the first inning...then had a no decision in a 6-5 loss to Fresno on April 14...allowed five runs on five hits in five innings of work.

2018 RECAP: Had seven stints with Oakland in his return to the majors following "Tommy John" surgery in 2016...went 2-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games, including seven starts...the ERA and opponents batting average were the lowest of his four seasons as was his .309 on-base percentage, .315 slugging percentage and .624 OPS...the two wins matched his career total entering the season as he was 2-11 over his first three seasons...struck out 41 batters in 47.2 innings for a career-best average of 7.74 strikeouts per nine innings...also went 5-5 with a 4.30 ERA in 18 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...was 2-3 with a 6.10 ERA and .314 opponents batting average over his first 10 games (seven starts) through June 2...then went 3-2 with a 2.70 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final eight games (seven starts) following his July 12 option from Oakland...surrendered six home runs in 81.2 innings, an average of 0.66 per nine innings...struck out 83, an average of 9.15 per nine innings, and walked 25 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.32...allowed a .271 opponents batting average, including .215 (29-for-135) against left-handed hitters compared to .313 (57-for-182) against right-handers...had a .573 OPS against lefties, .817 against righties.

RHP Daniel Mengden (3-1, 4.67 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas June 26 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 2-0 with a 3.86 ERA in two starts since his return...is 3-1 with a 3.54 ERA and .236 opponents average in his five starting assignments and 0-0 with a 9.45 ERA and .323 opponents average in two relief appearances...has allowed a .181 opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .338 against left-handers...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-6 A's win over Minne sota on Tuesday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 0 bb, 5 so)...is 0-2 with a 5.24 ERA (22.1 ip, 24 h, 14 r, 13 er, 12 bb, 19 so, 4 hr) in five career appearances, including four starts, against Seattle...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-2 A's win in Oakland on May 24 (4.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 4 so)...was 5-3 with a 3.47 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in nine games, including seven starts, with Las Vegas.


