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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (49-41) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (39-54)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last eight games, eight of the last 11 and 13 of the last 18...are 17-8 (.680) dating back to June 9, which is the third best record in the American League behind the Yankees (18-6, .750) and Indians (16-7, .696)...have a run differential of +64, which is fifth best in the AL and sixth best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the fifth consecutive day and trail first-place Houston by 7½ games...are 1½ games behind Cleveland for the second Wild Card and two games behind Tampa Bay for the first Wild Card...have spent 13 days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 17-8 (.680) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 32-33 (.492) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (20-6)...are batting .269 with an .819 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .238 with a .739 OPS against right-handers...have the third best OPS and fourth best batting average against lefties in the AL, but the fourth lowest batting average against righties...rank second in the AL in home runs off lefties (42).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 21-22 (.488) against American League West competition compared to 28-19 (.596) against all other teams...the mark against the West is second best within the division as Houston is 25-7 and everyone else is under .500...last year, the A's went 38-38 (.500) against the West, 59-27 (.686) against all other teams.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's have set an Athletics franchise record for home runs before the All-Star Break with 142 (previous: 137 in 1996)...that is tied for the 12th best total in Major League history before the break, but is tied for sixth in the majors this year...have 314 extra base hits, which is third best in A's history (321 in 2018, 317 in 1996)...have 460 runs, which is fourth best in Oakland history (522 in 2000, 494 in 1996, 466 in 2014)...the pitching staff has 716 strikeouts, which is second most in Athletics history (728 in 2014)...have clinched a winning record at the break for the second consecutive season as they are 49-41 with one game remaining.

THE LONG BALL: Marcus Semien hit the A's fourth grand slam of the season on Thursday, which is tied for third in the majors...the A's have homered in each of the last 11 games (21 home runs total)...have 91 home runs over the last 47 games dating back to May 13, which is tied for second most in the majors over that span (Minnesota, 95)...hit 51 home runs over the first 42 contests and have 142 for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .250 (145-for-581) with 99 runs scored over the last 17 games (5.8 runs per game)...have 35 doubles, two triples and 33 home runs over that stretch for a .487 slugging percentage...rank third in the American League in hit by pitches (45), fourth in fewest strikeouts (708) and most grounded into double plays (77) and fifth in doubles (162)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in plate appearances (57) and doubles (4), tied for second in RBI (14) and extra-base hits (7), third in home runs (3) and tied for third in walks (7).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.25 ERA (75 er in 208.0 ip) over the last 23 games dating back to June 11 and have a 4.06 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also rank second in fewest home runs (102) and opponents slugging percentage (.394), third in OPS (.705), tied for fourth in shutouts (6) and fourth in opponents batting average (.241).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 17 of the last 24 games and are 11-6 with a 3.82 ERA (57 er in 134.1 ip) over that span...overall, starters are tied for second in wins (36), rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.399), are tied for third in winning percentage (.600) and fourth in innings pitched (488.2), ERA (4.16), opponents batting average (.242) and OPS (.707).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors over their last six games after a six-game errorless streak...have 50 errors for the season and their .985 fielding percentage is fourth best in the American League...have the third fewest double plays (57) and the fourth fewest unearned runs (24).

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been caught stealing 27 times, which is tied for the most in the majors...however, Oakland has allowed 60 stolen bases, which is second most to the Mets (81)...on offense, the A's are 28-for-43 (65.1%) in stolen base attempts...have the second lowest stolen base percentage in the American League and the third fewest stolen bases and attempts.

KHRUSHING IT: Khris Davis has 24 home runs and a .544 career slugging percentage against the Mariners...his .538 slugging percentage at T-Mobile Park ranks fifth among active players and his 12 home runs at T-Mobile Park are tied for 11th-most all-time among visiting players...he averages a home run every 9.92 at-bats at T-Mobile Park, the best mark in the majors (next: Mike Trout, 12.55).

FOUR SERIES IN FOUR CITIES: This four-game series with Seattle concludes a stretch where the A's play four series in four different cities...began the stretch by sweeping a two-game series at St. Louis, won three of four at Los Angeles (AL) last weekend and two of three from Minnesota in Oakland to start this week...are 8-3 over the first 11 games of this 12-game stretch.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this three-game road trip to Seattle tonight...went 5-1 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and are now 18-6 over their last 25 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-14 on the road...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Minnesota and are 8-10 over the last 18 home games...begin post All-Star Break play next Friday with a five-game homestand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Seattle (two games)...are 26-20 (.565) at home compared to 23-21 (.523) on the road.

EXTRA INNINGS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 2-7 in extra inning games with the loss Wednesday night...the losses are the most in the majors and one more than the A's team total from last year...the nine extra inning games tie Boston, Kansas City and Tampa Bay for the most in the American League...have allowed 19 runs in extra innings, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2011 (22)...are tied with New York (NL) for the most walk-off losses in the majors (6)...are 0-29 when trailing after seven innings and are one of three teams without a win (Baltimore, Tampa Bay).

A'S IN JUNE: The A's went 17-11 (.607) in June, which was the fourth best record in the American League...it marked the second consecutive season Oakland finished with a winning record in June (were 17-10 last year)...allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (27) and had the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.376) and OPS (.682)...also ranked third in ERA (3.99), tied for third in fewest walks (77) and fourth in batting average (.243) and on-base percentage (.305)...the offense ranked second in extra base hits (106), tied for third in doubles (58) and fourth in runs (149)...the extra base hits were second in Oakland history in June to the record of 116 in 1996...hit 45 home runs, which was second only to the 1996 club (55).

A'S vs. MARINERS: The A's are 5-7 against the Mariners, which includes 4-2 in Oakland, 0-2 in Tokyo and 1-3 in Seattle...have lost each of the previous six season series after going 9-10 against Seattle last year...the last time Oakland lost six consecutive season series to one team was 1993-98 to Boston...are 51-75 (.405) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 355-299 against the Mariners...that includes 193-134 in Oakland, 161-162 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 85-98 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman was named to his first American League All-Star team a week ago today...leads the AL in extra base hits (46), ranks fifth in total bases (181), tied for sixth in home runs (21), tied for ninth in doubles (22) and runs (59), 10th in slugging (.534), and tied for 11th in triples (3) and go-ahead RBI (13)...**Liam Hendriks** was named to his first American League All-Star team on Friday...has a career-high and A's season-high 15.2 inning scoreless streak...has the lowest relief ERA in the majors (0.94)...**Matt Olson** has homered 18 times in 50 games dating back to May 12, which is tied for the most in the majors over that span...**Marcus Semien** has started each of the A's last 172 games dating back to June 28 of last year...that is the fourth longest consecutive games started streak in Oakland history and the eighth longest consecutive games played streak.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1986** the A's defeat Boston 6-4 in Tony La Russa's first game as A's manager...Dave Stewart picks up his first of 116 wins as an Oakland Athletic and Jose Canseco hits his 20th homer...in **1994** the A's use a club record eight pitchers in a 6-4, nine inning win at Baltimore...four of them face one hitter each and Bob Welch, Dave Leiper, Bill Taylor and Ed Vosberg all pitch in the seventh inning...in **2002** the A's defeat Kansas City 3-2, their Oakland record setting seventh consecutive one-run game.

- The A's bullpen has a 1.47 ERA (9 er in 55.0 ip) with 59 strikeouts over its last 14 games...had a 5.60 ERA (50 ER, 80.1 IP) with 77 strikeouts in 22 games from May 28 to June 20.
- Is 20-for-37 (54.1%) in save opportunities for the season...the 17 blown saves are tied for the fourth most in the majors (also: PIT, WAS)...the save percentage is sixth lowest in the majors (COL, 53.3; KC, 53.3; SEA, 52.6; NYM, 50.0; BOS, 48.6).
- Is tied for the third fewest wins in the American League (13) and has the fifth most losses (17)...tied for the fewest home runs allowed (36).
- Has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.321) among Major League bullpens.

52 LHP RYAN BUCHTER

Inherited Runners/Scored: 25/9 First Hitters: 7-33, 5 bb, hbp

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 29 for his second stint with the A's and has not allowed a run in 24 of 27 games since his return...has a 1.65 ERA (3 er in 16.1 ip) and .161 (9-for-56) opponents batting average over that span...logged a 7.04 ERA and .375 opponents average over his first 13 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas April 22.
- Is tied for eighth in the American League in games pitched (40).
- Has allowed a .167 (10-for-60) average against left-handed hitters, .393 (11-for-28) against right-handers.
- Is 3-1 with a 4.50 ERA (6 er in 12.0 ip) with 17 strikeouts in 18 career relief appearances vs. Seattle.

Last Year: Went 6-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 54 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...allowed just 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest percentage in the majors.

16 RHP LIAM HENDRIKS

Inherited Runners/Scored: 24/10 First Hitters: 10-31, 4 bb, 2 sf, hbp

- Extended his scoreless streak to a career-high and A's season-high 15.2 innings last night...has not allowed a run in 27 of his last 29 appearances (3 er in 34.2 ip, 0.78 ERA).
- Leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.94)...ranks second among Major League relievers in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.19), fifth in strikeouts (60), sixth in innings pitched (47.2) and tied for 10th in opponents slugging percentage (.256).
- Named AL Reliever of the Month for June, going 1-0 with 2 saves and a 0.60 ERA (1 ER, 15.0 IP) with 22 strikeouts in 14 relief appearance...it is his first career monthly honor.
- Has earned four saves since Treinen went on the injured list retroactive to June 21...the saves are the second, third, fourth and fifth of his career...his other came on Sept. 20, 2017.
- Has a 1.29 ERA (9 er in 62.2 ip) over his last 53 appearances dating back to Sept. 1 of last year.
- Is 0-3 with a 3.46 ERA (15 er in 39.0 ip) with 43 strikeouts in 28 career games, including 3 starts against Seattle.

Last Year: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 7.36 ERA in 13 relief appearances before he was outrighted off the 40-man roster July 2...returned to Oakland Sept. 1 and went 0-1 with a 1.38 ERA in 12 games, including eight starts as the opener.

36 RHP YUSMEIRO PETIT

Inherited Runners/Scored: 33/8 First Hitters: 6-42, bb

- Has not allowed a run in nine of his last 11 games (2 er in 11.1 ip) dating back to June 15 after logging a 4.40 ERA (7 er in 14.1 ip) over his previous 12 games.
- Is tied for first among American League relievers in games pitched (44), ranks sixth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.09), fourth in innings pitched (49.2) and sixth in opponents on-base percentage (.227).
- Is 2-2 with two saves and a 2.45 ERA (9 er in 33.0 ip) with 31 strikeouts in 26 career relief appearances vs. Seattle.

Last Year: Pitched in a team-leading and career-high 74 games in his first season in Oakland and was 7-3 with a 3.00 ERA and .221 opponents average...the wins were also a career high and his ERA was second lowest to his 2.76 with the Angels in 2017.

- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas and made his A's debut on June 22...it was his first Major League appearance since June 14, 2015.
- Made his Major League debut in 2010 and has pitched in part of three seasons with Chicago-NL.
- Has not faced Seattle during his career.
- Was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in saves at the time of his promotion...his complete 2019 stats with the Aviators:

- Is 0-2 with 21 saves in 21 opportunities with a 1.33 ERA (6 ER, 40.2 IP) with 45 strikeouts in 39 career relief appearances against Seattle while limiting them to a .124 opponent batting average.
- Owns a 0.86 ERA (2 er, 21.0 ip) in 20 A's wins and an 8.69 ERA (19 er, 19.2 ip) in 19 A's losses.

Saves/Opportunities: 16-18
Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/1 First Hitters: 4-26, 5 bb, hbp

- Was reinstated from the 10-day injured list July 3 after making one rehab appearance with Triple-A Las Vegas against Reno on Monday (1.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 hr)...was placed on the IL June 23 retroactive to June 21 with a strained right shoulder.
- Has converted each of his 10 save opportunities over his last 17 games but has a 5.94 ERA (16.2 ip, 19 h, 12 r, 11 er, 12 bb, hb, 15 so) over that span.
- Is sixth in the American League in saves (16)...has 67 career saves with the A's, good for seventh on the Oakland career list (Isringhausen, 75).
- Has a 3.68 ERA (9 er in 22.0 ip) and .235 (19-for-81) opponents batting average in 19 games at home, and a 4.91 ERA (8 er in 14.2 ip) and .268 (15-for-56) opponents average in 13 games on the road.
- Is 2-1 with seven saves in eight opportunities with a 0.89 ERA (2 ER, 20.1 IP) with 24 strikeouts in 18 career relief appearances against Seattle.

Last Year: Went 9-2 with a career-high 38 saves, a career-low 0.78 ERA and a career-high 100 strikeouts to become the first pitcher in Major League history to save 30 games, compile an ERA under 1.00 and strikeout 100 batters.

- Was 2-0 with a 2.42 ERA in his first 25 appearances...however, has allowed 18 runs (13 earned) over his last 15 games (14.0 ip) and has five losses and two blown saves over that span...snapped a five-game losing streak with a win on June 20 against Tampa Bay.
- Is tied for eighth in the American League in games pitched (40).
- Has a .219 (16-for-73) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .313 (25-for-80) with all three of his home runs against left-handers.
- Is 1-1 with a 4.38 ERA (6 ER, 12.1 IP) with 15 strikeouts in 14 career relief appearances against Seattle.

- Has held left-handed hitters to a .125 (4-for-32) batting average compared to .185 (5-for-27) against right-handers.
- Two earned runs allowed in 2.0 innings in two career games vs. Seattle.

- Has started 9 of the last 10 A's games and is 8-for-31 (.258) with eight runs scored, six walks and a hit by pitch (.395 on-base percentage) over that span.
- Has started games at five different positions (11 at first base, 11 at designated hitter, eight in left field, nine in right field, five in center field)...the A's are 30-14 (.682) with him in the starting lineup.
- Has hit eight of his 11 home runs on the road.
- Was on the 10-day injured list from April 29 to May 12 with a sprained right wrist.

Last Year: Started games at five different positions for the A's and batted .249 with a career-high 17 home runs and 52 RBI in 122 games...hit 13 of his home runs against left-handed pitchers, which tied for second in the American League.

26 MATT CHAPMAN

Last Homestand: 1-13, r, 2b, 2 bb, 3 so

- Doubled for his only hit Wednesday night and six of his last nine hits are for extra bases (two doubles, one triple, three home runs)...has an American League leading 46 extra bases hits for the season...that is tied for third most in Oakland history before the All-Star Break behind Reggie Jackson (63 in 1969) and Mark McGwire (50 in 1997).
- Was named to his first AL All-Star team on Sunday (players vote)...is the fifth third baseman in Oakland history to be named to the All-Star team (Bando, 1969, 72-74; Gross, 1977; Lansford, 1988; Donaldson, 2014).
- Leads the AL in extra base hits (46), ranks fifth in total bases (181), 10th in slugging (.534), tied for sixth in home runs (21), 9th in doubles (22), tied for 11th in triples (3), 9th in runs (59), and tied for 11th in go-ahead RBI (13)...is also tied for fifth in games played (89).
- Is batting .321 (25-for-78) with 18 runs, eight doubles, two triples, five home runs and 16 RBI over his last 21 games (.411 obp, .667 slug, 1.078 OPS) dating back to June 14.
- Is batting .302 (49-for-162) with a 1.046 OPS and 14 of his 21 home runs at home compared to .232 with a .739 OPS on the road...is tied for the AL lead in home runs at home (Trout, LAA) and ranks second in OPS.
