# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (49-41) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (39-54)

SUNDAY, JULY 7, 2019 — T-MOBILE PARK — 1:10 P.M. PDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (3-1, 4.67) VS. OPENER + LHP WADE LEBLANC (5-2, 5.02) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KTRB 860 AM/KHTK 1140 AM) — A'S CAST ON TUNEIN

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last eight games, eight of the last 11 and 13 of the last 18...are 17-8 (.680) dating back to June 9, which is the third best record in the American League behind the Yankees (18-6, .750) and Indians (16-7, .696)...have a run differential of +64, which is fifth best in the AL and sixth best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the fifth consecutive day and trail first-place Houston by 7½ games...are 1½ games behind Cleveland for the second Wild Card and two games behind Tampa Bay for the first Wild Card...have spent 13 days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 17-8 (.680) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 32-33 (.492) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (20-6)... are batting .269 with an .819 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .238 with a .739 OPS against right-handers...have the third best OPS and fourth best batting average against lefties in the AL, but the fourth lowest batting average against righties...rank second in the AL in home runs off lefties (42).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 21-22 (.488) against American League West competition compared to 28-19 (.596) against all other teams...the mark against the West is second best within the division as Houston is 25-7 and everyone else is under .500...last year, the A's went 38-38 (.500) against the West, 59-27 (.686) against all other teams.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's have set an Athletics franchise record for home runs before the All-Star Break with 142 (previous: 137 in 1996)...that is tied for the 12th best total in Major League history before the break, but is tied for sixth in the majors this year...have 314 extra base hits, which is third best in A's history (321 in 2018, 317 in 1996)...have 460 runs, which is fourth best in Oakland history (522 in 2000, 494 in 1996, 466 in 2014)...the pitching staff has 716 strikeouts, which is second most in Athletics history (728 in 2014)... have clinched a winning record at the break for the second consecutive season as they are 49-41 with one game remaining.

THE LONG BALL: Marcus Semien hit the A's fourth grand slam of the season on Thursday, which is tied for third in the majors...the A's have homered in each of the last 11 games (21 home runs total)...have 91 home runs over the last 47 games dating back to May 13, which is tied for second most in the majors over that span (Minnesota, 95)...hit 51 home runs over the first 42 contests and have 142 for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL.

*OFFENSE:* The A's are batting .250 (145-for-581) with 99 runs scored over the last 17 games (5.8 runs per game)...have 35 doubles, two triples and 33 home runs over that stretch for a .487 slugging percentage...rank third in the American League in hit by pitches (45), fourth in fewest strikeouts (708) and most grounded into double plays (77) and fifth in doubles (162)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in plate appearances (57) and doubles (4), tied for second in RBI (14) and extra-base hits (7), third in home runs (3) and tied for third in walks (7).

*PITCHING:* The A's have compiled a 3.25 ERA (75 er in 208.0 ip) over the last 23 games dating back to June 11 and have a 4.06 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also rank second in fewest home runs (102) and opponents slugging percentage (.394), third in OPS (.705), tied for fourth in shutouts (6) and fourth in opponents batting average (.241).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 17 of the last 24 games and are 11-6 with a 3.82 ERA (57 er in 134.1 ip) over that span...overall, starters are tied for second in wins (36), rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.399), are tied for third in winning percentage (.600) and fourth in innings pitched (488.2), ERA (4.16), opponents batting average (.242) and OPS (.707).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed six errors over their last six games after a six-game errorless streak...have 50 errors for the season and their .985 fielding percentage is fourth best in the American League...have the third fewest double plays (57) and the fourth fewest unearned runs (24).

**ON THE BASES:** A's opponents have been caught stealing 27 times, which is tied for the most in the majors...however, Oakland has allowed 60 stolen bases, which is second most to the Mets (81)...on offense, the A's are 28-for-43 (65.1%) in stolen base attempts...have the second lowest stolen base percentage in the American League and the third fewest stolen bases and attempts.

KHRUSHING IT: Khris Davis has 24 home runs and a .544 career slugging percentage against the Mariners...his .538 slugging percentage at T-Mobile Park ranks fifth among active players and his 12 home runs at T-Mobile Park are tied for 11th-most all-time among visiting players...he averages a home run every 9.92 at-bats at T-Mobile Park, the best mark in the majors (next: Mike Trout, 12.55).

FOUR SERIES IN FOUR CITIES: This four-game series with Seattle concludes a stretch where the A's play four series in four different cities...began the stretch by sweeping a two-game series at St. Louis, won three of four at Los Angeles (AL) last weekend and two of three from Minnesota in Oakland to start this week...are 8-3 over the first 11 games of this 12-game stretch.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this three-game road trip to Seattle tonight...went 5-1 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and are now 18-6 over their last 25 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-14 on the road...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Minnesota and are 8-10 over the last 18 home games... begin post All-Star Break play next Friday with a five-game homestand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Seattle (two games)...are 26-20 (.565) at home compared to 23-21 (.523) on the road.

EXTRA INNINGS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 2-7 in extra inning games with the loss Wednesday night...the losses are the most in the majors and one more than the A's team total from last year...the nine extra inning games tie Boston, Kansas City and Tampa Bay for the most in the American League...have allowed 19 runs in extra innings, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2011 (22)...are tied with New York (NL) for the most walk-off losses in the majors (6)...are 0-29 when trailing after seven innings and are one of three teams without a win (Baltimore, Tampa Bay).

A'S IN JUNE: The A's went 17-11 (.607) in June, which was the fourth best record in the American League...it marked the second consecutive season Oakland finished with a winning record in June (were 17-10 last year)...allowed the fewest home runs in the AL (27) and had the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.376) and OPS (.682)...also ranked third in ERA (3.99), tied for third in fewest walks (77) and fourth in batting average (.243) and on-base percentage (.305)...the offense ranked second in extra base hits (106), tied for third in doubles (58) and fourth in runs (149)...the extra base hits were second in Oakland history in June to the record of 116 in 1996...hit 45 home runs, which was second only to the 1996 club (55).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 5-7 against the Mariners, which includes 4-2 in Oakland, 0-2 in Tokyo and 1-3 in Seattle...have lost each of the previous six season series after going 9-10 against Seattle last year...the last time Oakland lost six consecutive season series to one team was 1993-98 to Boston... are 51-75 (.405) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season... all-time, the A's are 355-299 against the Mariners...that includes 193-134 in Oakland, 161-162 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 85-98 at T-Mobile Park.

# TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman was named to his first American League All-Star team a week ago today...leads the AL in extra base hits (46), ranks fifth in total bases (181), tied for sixth in home runs (21), tied for ninth in doubles (22) and runs (59), 10th in slugging (.534), and tied for 11th in triples (3) and go-ahead RBI (13)...Liam Hendriks was named to his first American League All-Star team on Friday...has a career-high and A's season-high 15.2 inning scoreless streak...has the lowest relief ERA in the majors (0.94)...Matt Olson has homered 18 times in 50 games dating back to May 12, which is tied for the most in the majors over that span...Marcus Semien has started each of the A's last 172 games dating back to June 28 of last year...that is the fourth longest consecutive games started streak in Oakland history and the eighth longest consecutive games played streak.

# THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1986 the A's defeat Boston 6-4 in Tony La Russa's first game as A's manager...Dave Stewart picks up his first of 116 wins as an Oakland Athletic and Jose Canseco hits his 20th homer...in 1994 the A's use a club record eight pitchers in a 6-4, nine inning win at Baltimore...four of them face one hitter each and Bob Welch, Dave Leiper, Bill Taylor and Ed Vosberg all pitch in the seventh inning...in 2002 the A's defeat Kansas City 3-2, their Oakland record setting seventh consecutive one-run game.

# PITCHING PROBABLES

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (3-1, 4.67 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas June 26 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 2-0 with a 3.86 ERA (5 er in 11.2 ip) in two starts since his return...began the year at Las Vegas and was 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA in seven games (six starts) with the Aviators when the A's called for the first time on May 12...made three starts in then pitched twice in relief of an "opener"...was 1-1 with a 5.09 ERA in five games when he was optioned back to Las Vegas June 6...went 1-0 with a 6.10 ERA in two games, one start, at Triple-A following his option and is 4-2 with a 3.47 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in nine games, seven starts, overall with Las Vegas.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 3-1 with a 3.54 ERA (11 er in 28.0 ip) and .236 (25-for-106) opponents average in his five starting assignments and 0-0 with a 9.45 ERA (7 er in 6.2 ip) and .323 (10-for-31) opponents average in two relief appearances...the A's are 4-1 when he starts, 0-2 when he pitches in relief...his two relief appearances came in "opener" games on May 29 (Hendriks) and June 5 (Soria)...over the last two years, he is 9-7 with a 4.28 ERA (59 er in 124.0 ip) in his 22 starts and 1-0 with a 3.76 ERA (11 er in 26.1 ip) in his seven relief appearances...the A's are 15-7 (.682) in his starting assignments over the last two years and 1-6 (.143) in his relief appearances.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 0-0 with a 6.75 ERA (8 er in 10.2 ip) in three games against American League West teams compared to 3-1 with a 3.75 ERA (10 er in 24.0 ip) in four games against all other competition...is now 1-12 with a 6.26 ERA (79 er in 113.2 ip) in 24 career games against the West compared to 14-6 with a 3.44 ERA (58 er in 151.2 ip) in 26 games against the rest of baseball...has a six-game losing streak against AL West teams dating back to his only win on Oct. 1, 2017 at Texas...his loss to Cleveland in his first start this year snapped a nine-game winning streak in interdivision games...it was his first loss against a non AL West team since May 29, 2017 at Cleveland.

*OPPONENTS BATTING:* Has allowed a .181 (13-for-72) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .338 (22-for-65) against left-handers...has issued 12 of his 16 walks to lefties for a .442 on-base percentage (.221 against righties)...opponents are 5-for-36 (.139) with a walk (.162 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the opponents number three hitter is 1-for-17 against him.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed a season-high 100 pitches in his first start May 12 against Cleveland and allowed four runs in 5.1 innings for the loss...then went 1-0 with a 1.76 ERA and .203 opponents batting average over his next three games (two starts)...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings and allowed just one run on three hits and two walks for his first win on May 18 at Detroit... allowed one run in 4.0 innings in his next start May 24 against Seattle but walked a career-high tying five and threw 99 pitches in a no decision in a 6-2 A's win...pitched in relief of Liam Hendriks May 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and struck out a season-high six batters in 4.1 innings...then pitched in relief of Joakim Soria in the A's 10-9 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on June 5 and allowed a season-high six runs in a season-low 2.1 innings...was optioned to Las Vegas the next day...returned to Oakland June 26 and combined with Petit, Soria and Hendriks on a five-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win that day at St. Louis.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-6 win over Minnesota on Tuesday in Oakland...allowed five runs on a season-high eight hits in 5.2 innings...allowed a two-run home run to Sano in the second and another run in the third but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the third and four times in the fourth to take a 6-3 lead...also allowed a solo home run to Castro in the fifth and a RBI double to Arraez in the sixth and was relieved by Petit with two outs in the sixth and the A's leading 7-5

2019 WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 5-3 with a 3.47 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in nine games, including seven starts, with Las Vegas...struck out 50 batters in 49.1 innings (9.12 per nine innings)...was 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in seven games (six starts) when the A's called for the first time on May 12...then went 1-0 with a 6.10 ERA in two games, one start, following his June 6 option...his opponents batting average includes a .207 (23-for-111) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .213 (16-for-75) against left-handers...tossed at least six innings in six of his nine appearances, allowed two runs or fewer five times and yielded three hits or fewer four times.

2019 LAS VEGAS HIGHLIGHTS: Was the Aviators Opening Day starting pitcher and had a no decision in a 9-8 win at El Paso on April 4...allowed four runs in 5.0 innings and left with a 6-4 lead...made his first relief appearance on April 9 against Sacramento in relief of a rehabbing Chris Bassitt...allowed one unearned run on one hit in 6.0 innings of relief and struck out a seasonhigh nine for the win...that began a three-game winning streak where he went 3-0 with a 2.37 ERA and .149 opponents batting average over a threestart stretch from April 9-20...tossed a season-high 99 pitches and allowed five runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings April 15 against Fresno but still picked up the win...logged a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings and yielded just two hits in an 11-0 win at Fresno April 20...had his three-game winning streak snapped April 26 against El Paso when he had season highs in runs (6) and hits (8) and a season low in innings pitched (3.0) in an 8-6 loss...lost his second consecutive start May 1 at Reno...allowed just two runs in 6.0 innings in a 2-0 loss...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings in his final start before his first promotion on May 7 against Salt Lake but had a no decision...started in his first game back with the Aviators on June 10 and was the winning pitcher in a 17-7 win over San Antonio...his second relief appearance came on June 16 in relief of "opener" Brian Schlittler.

2018 RECAP: Was in the A's Opening Day starting rotation but was optioned to Triple-A Nashville following a mid-season stint on the disabled list before returning to Oakland in late August, working primarily as a long man in "opener" games...went 7-6 with a 4.05 ERA and .234 opponents batting average in 22 games, including 17 starts...struck out just 72 batters in 115.2 innings and his average of 5.60 strikeouts per nine innings was second lowest in the American League (Colon, TEX 4.98)...walked just 26 (2.02 per nine innings)...his opponents batting average broke down to .221 against lefthanded hitters compared to .244 against right-handers...held the opposition to a .185 batting average leading off an inning and issued just three walks for a .211 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage was the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 100 or more innings and the batting average was fourth lowest in the AL...went 4-1 with a 2.98 ERA in nine games, including eight starts, with Nashville...surrendered just two home runs in 45.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...walked seven, an average of 1.39 per nine innings...struck out 34 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.86... allowed a .231 opponents batting average.

- Is 20-for-37 (54.1%) in save opportunities for the season...the 17 blown saves are tied for the fourth most in the majors (also: PIT, WAS)...the save percentage is sixth lowest in the majors (COL, 53.3; KC, 53.3; SEA, 52.6; NYM, 50.0; BOS, 48.6).
- Is tied for the third fewest wins in the American League (13) and has the fifth most losses (17)...tied for the fewest home runs allowed (36).
- Has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.321) among Major League bullpens.
