# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (55-41) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (58-36)

THURSDAY, JULY 18, 2019 — TARGET FIELD — 7:10 P.M. CDT RHP MIKE FIERS (9-3, 3.61) VS. RHP KYLE GIBSON (8-4, 4.03) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KTRB 860 AM/KHTK 1140 AM) — A'S CAST ON TUNEIN

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won six straight, eight of the last nine, 12 of the last 14 and 19 of the last 24 games to improve to a season-high 14 games over .500 at 55-41 (.573)...that is the A's best record after 96 completed games since 2014 (60-36)...it is also the sixth best record in the American League and eighth best in the majors...have a run differential of +98, which is the best in the AL West, tied for third best in the AL and tied for fourth best in the majors...have won each of the last six series and are unbeaten over the last eight...are in second place in the AL West for the 12th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 4½ games for the second consecutive day... that is the closest the A's have been to first place since May 3 when they were four back...are tied with Cleveland for the second Wild Card spot and trail Tampa Bay for the first spot by ½ game...have spent 21 days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

SINCE MAY 16: The A's are 36-16 (.692) dating back to May 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...have a 3.64 ERA (193 er in 476.2 ip), which is second lowest to the Dodgers (3.25)...lead the majors in home runs (102) and slugging (.497), rank second in extra base hits (219), tied for second in runs (313) and fifth in OPS (.827)...have outscored the opposition 313-206 for a run differential of +107.

SINCE THE BREAK: The A's are 5-0 since the All-Star Break, which is the longest winning streak to start post-break play in Athletics history...are the only team in the majors that is undefeated since the break...have outscored the opposition 40-9...are batting .325 (55-for-169) with 11 doubles, two triples, 13 home runs and 40 runs scored in five games...lead the majors in batting, on-base percentage (.392), slugging (.645) and OPS (1.037) and rank fourth in home runs...have the fewest strikeouts (31)...also lead the majors with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) and .601 opponents OPS.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit six home runs yesterday for the second time this year (June 18 vs. Baltimore)...it was the 14th game of six or more home runs in Athletics history and 2019 marks the first time it has happened twice in one season...the six home runs tie the Coliseum single-game record...now have six games with five or more home runs, which is one short of the Athletics record of seven in 1996...have homered in 17 consecutive games (37 home runs total), which is tied for the fifth longest streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 19-game streak from Sept. 13, 2017-March 29, 2018...have 158 home runs for the season, which ranks fifth in the majors.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 13-2 (.867) against American League Central teams and have outscored them 100-45 (+55)...are batting .279 (157-for-563) with 100 runs (6.25 per game) and 30 home runs in 16 games (includes May 19 suspended game)...the pitching staff has a 2.63 ERA (43 er in 147.0 ip) and .227 (122-for-538) opponents batting average...are now 65-21 (.756) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.

*PITCHING:* The A's have a 2.67 ERA (43 er in 145.0 ip) over the last 16 games and have walked just 27 batters over that stretch (1.68 per nine innings)... rank second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.393) and fewest home runs (107), third in OPS (.702), fourth in opponents batting average (.241) and on-base percentage (.308) and fifth in ERA (3.95)... have the fifth fewest strikeouts (752).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not walked a batter in seven of the 11 games in July and have issued just six free passes in 65.2 innings (0.82 per nine innings)...are 5-0 with a 1.86 ERA (8 er in 38.2 ip) over the last six games and 15-4 with a 3.38 ERA (56 er in 149.1 ip) over the last 26 contests...now have 41 wins for the season, which is tied with Minnesota for the most in the majors...rank fourth in the AL in ERA (3.99) and OPS (.704).

*OFFENSE:* The A's rank third in the American League in home runs (158) and fifth in runs scored (507), extra base hits (344) and slugging (.451)...have the third fewest strikeouts (743)...are tied for the fewest sacrifice hits (2), rank third in hit by pitches (47) and fourth in most grounded into double plays (83).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (13), tied for second in doubles (4), extra base hits (7) and RBI (14), third in home runs (3) and plate appearances (60) and tied for third in walks (7).

**ON THE BASES:** A's opponents have been caught stealing 29 times, which is the most in the majors...are tied for fifth in pickoffs (9)...however, have allowed 61 stolen bases, which is third most...on offense, the A's are 31-for-46 (67.4%) in stolen base attempts...have the second lowest stolen base percentage in the AL and the third fewest stolen bases and attempts.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a seven-game road trip to American League Central leading Minnesota (four games) and AL West leading Houston (three games) tonight...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 19-6 over their last 26 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...went 5-0 on the last homestand against Chicago (3-0) and Seattle (2-0)...it was the A's first perfect homestand of more than three games since going 6-0 against Toronto and San Francisco from July 3-8, 2014...have a season-high six-game home winning streak and have won 13 of the last 15 home games...are 31-20 (.608) at home compared to 24-21 (.533) on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 18-8 (.692) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 37-33 (.529) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (22-7)... are batting .269 with an .824 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .243 with a .756 OPS against right-handers...have the third best OPS and fourth best batting average against lefties in the American League and the fifth lowest batting average against righties...have the most home runs off lefties in the AL (49).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 13 times...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Hundley, Manaea, Piscotty), including four on the 60-day DL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Manaea)...Cotton, Hundley and Manaea are on rehab assignments...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

AT THE BREAK: The A's were 50-41 at the All-Star Break, which was the sixth best record in the American League and eighth best in the majors...set an Athletics franchise record for home run at the All-Star Break with 145 (previous: 137 in 1996)...that is 12th best total in Major League history before the break, but was sixth best in the majors this year...had 318 extra base hits, which was second in Athletics history to the record of 321 set last year... scored 467 runs, which was third best and the most since 2000 (522)...had the sixth best slugging percentage (.441)...the pitching staff had 721 strike-outs, which was second to the record of 728 in 2014.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after taking two of three in Oakland earlier this month...have won seven of the last nine games including four of the last five in Minnesota...are 34-15 (.694) against the Twins dating back to July 13, 2012...won the season series last year, 5-2...won two of three in Oakland and three of four in Minnesota...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 307-303 against Minnesota...that includes 172-131 in Oakland and 135-172 in Minnesota...are 18-17 at Target Field...are 364-372 all-time against the Twins and have a 1011-1008 record against the Twins/ Senators...the 1011 are the A's most against any franchise.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman ranks third in the American League in extra base hits (50), fourth in slugging (.552), tied for fifth in doubles (25), seventh in OPS (.915) and tied for seventh in home runs (22)...Liam Hendriks has a career-high and A's season-high 18.0 inning scoreless streak...has the lowest relief ERA in the majors (0.90)...Ramón Laureano is batting .405 (15-for-37) with four doubles, six home runs and 12 RBI in 11 games in July (1.000 slugging percentage)...Matt Olson has a career-high 12-game hitting streak (14-for-49, .286), which is the longest hitting streak by an A's first baseman since Dan Johnson had a 15-game streak in 2007.

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1927** Ty Cobb, who spent most of his career with Detroit, collects his 4000<sup>th</sup> career hit in an A's uniform against the Tigers...in **1983** the A's turn the fifth triple play in Oakland history vs. Detroit when John Wockenfuss hits into a Ricky Peters to Tony Phillps to Bill Almon to Wayne Gross triple play...in **1988** Stan Javier collects five hits in five at bats in the A's 7-2 victory over Cleveland...in **2004** Mark Mulder extends his winning streak to 11 games in the A's 5-3 win over Chicago...the streak, which would end in his next start, is the second longest in Oakland history.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (9-3, 3.61 ERA)

SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 7-0 with a 2.09 ERA (18 er in 77.2 ip) and .190 (52-for-274) opponents batting average over his last 12 starts dating back to his May 7 no-hitter against Cincinnati...the winning streak is a career high (previous: 6, July 21-Sept. 11, 2018), the second longest active streak in the American League (Workman, BOS 8) and the longest by an A's pitcher over the last six years...the last longer streak is nine by Jarrod Parker from May 28-Sept. 4, 2013...has left with the lead in four of his five no decisions during the streak only to have the bullpen blow the save...his other no decision is the May 19 suspended game at Detroit in which he is the pitcher of record with the A's leading 5-3 in the bottom of the seventh...went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA and .297 opponents batting average over his first eight starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks sixth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.363) and winning percentage (.750), ninth in OPS (.651) and tied for 10th in wins (9)...also ranks second in the AL in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (5.81), tied for fourth in wild pitches (8), tied for sixth in hit batters (7) and games started (20) and tied for seventh in fewest pitches per inning (15.5).

LEADERS SINCE THE NO-HITTER: During his current seven-game winning streak dating back to May 7, he has the second lowest OPS (.541) and slugging percentage (.288) in the majors (Scherzer, WAS .524 and .287)...leads the American League in ERA (2.09), ranks second in opponents on-base percentage (.252), third in batting average (.190) and tied for fifth in wins (7).

LAST FIVE STARTS: Has allowed one earned run or fewer in each of his last five starts and is 3-0 with a 1.09 ERA (4 er in 33.0 ip) over that span...has tossed at least six innings in each outing and is the first A's pitcher with five consecutive outings of six innings or more and one earned run or fewer since Sonny Gray had a six-game streak from July 3-Aug. 1, 2014...has not allowed a home run in his last five starts after surrendering 15 over his first 15.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 7-1 with a 2.68 ERA (24 er in 80.2 ip) and .206 (61-for-296) opponents batting average in 13 starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 5.82 ERA (22 er in 34.0 ip) and .278 (35-for-126) opponents average in seven starts during the day...ranks second in the American League in ERA and opponents OPS (.557) at night, tied for fourth in wins and fifth in opponents batting average.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-2 with a 2.58 ERA (19 er in 66.1 ip) and .206 (49-for-238) opponents batting average in 11 starts at home compared to 3-1 with a 5.03 ERA (27 er in 48.1 ip) and .255 (47-for-184) opponents average in nine starts on the road...is tied for third in the American League in home runs (6), ranks fourth in ERA and OPS (.576) and 10th in opponents batting average... is now 10-3 with a 2.91 ERA (41 er in 126.2 ip) and .213 (92-for-432) opponents batting average in 22 career appearances, 21 starts, in the Coliseum.

*DAYS REST:* Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 5-0 with a 2.44 ERA (16 er in 59.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest...is also 2-1 with a 4.79 ERA (19 er in 35.2 ip) in seven starts on four days rest and 2-2 with a 4.95 ERA (11 er in 20.0 ip) in four starts on six days rest or more.

*OPPONENTS BATTING:* Has allowed five home runs in 217 at bats against left-handed hitters, 10 in 205 at bats against right-handers...10 of the 15 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has walked just five batters to lead off an inning...opponents are hitting .147 (5-for-34) with runners in scoring and two outs.

APRIL AND BEYOND: Went 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts in April but is 7-1 with a 2.18 ERA (20 er in 82.2 ip) and .197 (57-for-290) opponents average in 13 starts since then...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in 25 career appearances in April and 50-35 with a 3.41 ERA (279 er in 735.2 ip) from May through August.

THIS AND THAT: Has eight wins at the All-Star Break, which are his most ever before the break (had six in 2016 and 2018)...has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his last 14 starts...is 14-5 with a 3.70 ERA (69 er in 167.2 ip) in 30 games, including 29 starts, since he was acquired by Oakland Aug. 6, 2018... the wins are tied for fourth most in the American League over that span... went 4-0 with a 2.30 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in five starts in June...it was the third time in his career he won four games in a month (4-2 in Aug. 2012 and 4-1 in Aug. 2014)...had the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League in June (.283), tied for the lead in wins, had the fourth lowest OPS (.561) and ranked fifth in ERA.

**NO-HITTER:** Tossed his second career no-hitter May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati to become the 34th pitcher in Major League history with multiple regular season no-hitters...is the seventh with a no-hitter for multiple teams...with the acquisition of Homer Bailey on July 12 the A's become the sixth team in Major League history with two pitchers with multiple no-hitter on their roster...the last was the 1988 Houston Astros (Bob Forsch and Nolan Ryan)...was named American League Co-Player of the Week with George

Springer May 13...it was his second career Player of the Week honor with the first coming Aug. 23, 2015 following his first no-hitter...this no-hitter was the 13th in Athletics history, including the eighth in Oakland history.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Chicago (AL) last Friday in Oakland...tossed 7.2 scoreless innings...walked just one but yielded eight hits and retired the side in order just twice...allowed four base runners to advance into scoring position.

- The A's bullpen has a 1.79 ERA (14 er in 70.1 ip) with 71 strikeouts over its last 20 games since June 21...had a 5.60 ERA (50 ER, 80.1 IP) with 77 strikeouts in 22 games from May 28 to June 20.
- Is 22-for-39 (56.4%) in save opportunities for the season...the 17 blown saves are tied for the seventh most in the majors...the save percentage is seventh lowest in the majors.
- Has the fourth fewest wins in the American League (14) and has the sixth most losses (17)...has allowed the fewest home runs (38).
- Has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.306) among Major League bullpens.

#### 52 LHP RYAN BUCHTER
