OAKLAND ATHLETICS (55-42) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (59-36)

FRIDAY, JULY 19, 2019 — TARGET FIELD — 7:10 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their six-game winning streak snapped last night... have not lost back-to-back games since they were swept in the day/night doubleheader at Texas on June 8...have won six of the last seven games, eight of the last 10, 12 of the last 15 and 19 of the last 25...are 55-42 (.467) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...the 13 games over .500 are one short of the season high of 14 (55-41 on July 17)...have a run differential of +95, which is fourth best in the AL and sixth best in the majors...have won each of the previous six series and are unbeaten over the previous eight...are in second place in the AL West for the 13th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...are tied with Tampa Bay for the second Wild Card spot and trail Cleveland for the first spot by one game...have spent 22 days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

SINCE MAY 16: The A's are 36-17 (.679) dating back to May 16, which is tied with the Yankees for the best record in the majors over that span...have a 3.70 ERA (199 er in 484.2 ip), which is second lowest to the Dodgers (3.31)...lead the majors in home runs (103), rank second in slugging (.493) and extra base hits (221), fourth in runs (316) and fifth in OPS (.822)...have outscored the opposition 316-212 for a run differential of +104.

SINCE THE BREAK: The A's lost last night after winning each of their first five games following the All-Star Break...it was the longest winning streak to start post-break play in Athletics history...are now 5-1 (.833) since the break, which is tied for the third best record in the majors...have outscored the opposition 43-15...are batting .306 (63-for-206) with 12 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs and 43 runs scored in six games...lead the majors in slugging (.645) and OPS (.950), rank third in batting and fourth in home runs...have the fewest strikeouts (39)...rank second in the majors with a 2.55 ERA (15 er in 53.0 ip) and fourth in opponents OPS (.675).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in 18 consecutive games (38 home runs total), which is tied for the third longest streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 19-game streak from Sept. 13, 2017-March 29, 2018...the record is 23 games from July 2-27, 1996...have 159 home runs for the season, which ranks sixth in the majors.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 13-3 (.813) against American League Central teams and have outscored them 103-51 (+52)...are batting .275 (165-for-600) with 103 runs (6.06 per game) and 31 home runs in 17 games (includes May 19 suspended game)...the pitching staff has a 2.85 ERA (49 er in 155.0 ip) and .231 (131-for-566) opponents batting average...are now 65-22 (.747) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.88 ERA (49 er in 153.0 ip) over the last 17 games and have walked just 32 batters over that stretch (1.88 per nine innings)...rank second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.396) and fewest home runs (110), third in OPS (.705), fourth in opponents batting average (.241) and fifth in ERA (3.97).

STARTING PITCHING: Mike Fiers walked four batters last night, snapping a streak of 16 consecutive games with two walks or fewer by A's starting pitchers...starters have issued 16 walks in 100.2 innings over the last 17 games (1.43 per nine innings)...are 5-0 with a 2.20 ERA (11 er in 45.0 ip) over the last seven games and 15-4 with a 3.41 ERA (59 er in 155.2 ip) over the last 27 contests...now have 41 wins for the season, which ranks second in the majors to Minnesota (42)...rank fourth in the AL in ERA (4.00) and OPS (.705).

OFFENSE: The A's rank fourth in the American League in home runs (159) and extra base hits (346), fifth in slugging (.450) and tied for fifth in runs scored (510)...have the third fewest strikeouts (751)...are tied for the fewest sacrifice hits (2), rank third in hit by pitches (47) and fourth in most grounded into double plays (83)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (13), tied for second in doubles (4), extra base hits (7) and RBI (14), third in home runs (3) and plate appearances (60) and tied for third in walks (7).

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been caught stealing 29 times, which is the most in the majors...are tied for fifth in pickoffs (9)...however, have allowed 61 stolen bases, which is third most...on offense, the A's are 31-for-

46 (67.4%) in stolen base attempts...have the second lowest stolen base percentage in the AL and the third fewest stolen bases and attempts.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this seven-game road trip to American League Central leading Minnesota (0-1) and AL West leading Houston (three games) tonight...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 19-7 over their last 27 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...went 5-0 on the last homestand against Chicago (3-0) and Seattle (2-0)...it was the A's first perfect homestand of more than three games since going 6-0 against Toronto and San Francisco from July 3-8, 2014...have a season-high six-game home winning streak and have won 13 of the last 15 home games...are 31-20 (.608) at home compared to 24-22 (.522) on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 18-8 (.692) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 37-34 (.521) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (22-7)...are batting .268 with an .821 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .243 with a .754 OPS against right-handers...have the third best OPS and fourth best batting average against lefties in the American League and the fifth lowest batting average against righties...have the most home runs off lefties in the AL (49).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 13 times...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Hundley, Manaea, Piscotty), including four on the 60-day DL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Manaea)...Cotton, Hundley and Manaea are on rehab assignments...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

AT THE BREAK: The A's were 50-41 at the All-Star Break, which was the sixth best record in the American League and eighth best in the majors...set an Athletics franchise record for home run at the All-Star Break with 145 (previous: 137 in 1996)...that is 12th best total in Major League history before the break, but was sixth best in the majors this year...had 318 extra base hits, which was second in Athletics history to the record of 321 set last year...scored 467 runs, which was third best and the most since 2000 (522)...had the sixth best slugging percentage (.441)...the pitching staff had 721 strikeouts, which was second to the record of 728 in 2014.

A's vs. TWINS: The season series is even at two games each...the A's lost the first game in Minnesota last night after taking two of three in Oakland earlier this month...have won seven of the last 10 games, including four of the last six in Minnesota...are 34-16 (.680) against the Twins dating back to July 13, 2012...won the season series last year, 5-2...won two of three in Oakland and three of four in Minnesota...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 307-304 against Minnesota...that includes 172-131 in Oakland and 135-173 in Minnesota...are 18-18 at Target Field...are 364-373 all-time against the Twins and have a 1011-1009 record against the Twins/Senators...the 1011 are the A's most against any franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman ranks third in the American League in extra base hits (50), fourth in slugging (.552), tied for fifth in doubles (25), seventh in OPS (.915) and tied for seventh in home runs (22)...**Liam Hendriks** has a career-high and A's season-high 18.0 inning scoreless streak...has the lowest relief ERA in the majors (0.90)...**Ramón Laureano** is batting .439 (18-for-41) with four doubles, six home runs and 12 RBI in 12 games in July (.976 slugging percentage)...needs one more home run to become the fourth center fielder in Oakland history with 20 home runs (Coco Crisp, Dave Henderson, Dwayne Murphy)...**Matt Olson** has a career-high 13-game hitting streak (15-for-53, .283), which is the longest hitting streak by an A's first baseman since Dan Johnson had a 15-game streak in 2007...**Marcus Semien** has a consecutive games played streak of 179 (all starts)...the consecutive games *played* streak is seventh longest in Oakland history and the consecutive games *started* streak is fourth longest.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1992** Carney Lansford ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 6-2 win against Detroit...he adds a single to finish the day a perfect 4 for 4...in **1999** Buddy Groom ties an Oakland record by pitching in his sixth consecutive game...he retires the only batter he faces in the A's 10-5 win over Colorado...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses a one-hitter in the A's 10-0 win over Texas...it is his first of two one-hitters in 2002.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (6-4, 3.98 ERA)

LAST 10 STARTS: Is 4-3 with a 5.29 ERA (30 er in 51.0 ip) and .241 (47-for-195) opponents average over his last 10 starts after going 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first five starts...is averaging 7.59 (43 so in 51.0 ip) strikeouts per nine innings over his last 10 starts after averaging 10.47 over his first five.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .199 (33-for-166) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .240 (35-for-146) against righties... however, has surrendered nine of his 11 home runs and issued 25 of his 34 walks to lefties for a .728 OPS (.642 vs. righties)...is tied for the fourth most walks against lefties in the American League...eight of his 11 home runs have come on the road and seven have come with the bases empty...opponents are batting .171 (20-for-117) the first time through the lineup, .270 (33-for-122) the second time and .205 (15-for-73) after that...has a .270 (33-for-122) opponents average with no outs, .184 (35-for-190) with one or two outs.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in eight of his 15 starts and is 1-4 in those games...has 62 runs of support for the season (83.2 ip, 6.67 RSA) but 29 of those runs have come in two games (17, May 16 at Detroit; 12, July 13 vs. Chicago-AL)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 32 of his 45 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 3.99 (112 rs in 252.1 ip)...is 7-0 in 13 career starts with run support of three runs or more.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.00 ERA (15 er in 45.0 ip) and .179 (29-for-162) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game compared to a 5.12 ERA (22 er in 38.2 ip) and .260 (39-for-150) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-1 with a 2.82 ERA (16 er in 51.0 ip) and .198 (37-for-187) opponents batting average in eight starts during the day compared to 1-3 with a 5.79 ERA (21 er in 32.2 ip) and .248 (31-for-125) opponents average in seven starts at night...is tied for third in the American League in wins in day games...was 0-8 in 15 career day games entering the season.

CAREER BESTS: Has six wins this year, which is two more than his career total in 40 games (30 starts) entering this season...also has career highs in strikeouts (81), games started (15), runs (38), earned runs (37), home runs (11) and walks (34)...his 83.2 innings pitched are 2.1 short of his best of 86.0 in 2015... his 15 games are three short of his best of 18 from 2015.

PRE AND POST "TOMMY JOHN": Is 8-7 with a 3.63 ERA (53 er in 131.1 ip) and .219 (108-for-493) opponents batting average in 26 games (22 starts) since undergoing "Tommy John" surgery May 6, 2016...is averaging 8.36 strikeouts per nine innings (122 so in 131.1 ip)...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA, .263 opponents batting average and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contusion...went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA in three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16...was recalled by Oakland the next day when Marco Estrada went on the injured list...made his first start April 22 against Texas and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings for the win...struck out a season-high nine in his second start April 28 at Toronto (also May 9 against Cincinnati)...however, had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss in 11 innings...left his third start on May 4 at Pittsburgh after five innings with a 4-3 lead but Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss...allowed a season-high seven hits (also July 6 at Seattle) and took the loss on May 9 against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a three-game streak dating back to last year...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...the loss was his first since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits in a 17-3 win at Detroit on May 16...walked a career-high six batters in 3.2 innings in a no decision at Cleveland May 21...is the first Major League pitcher since at least 1908 with a pitching line of 3.2 innings, three hits, three runs, three earned runs, six walks and six strikeouts...allowed three runs on four hits and four walks in a season-low 3.1 innings at St. Louis on June 25 but had a no decision in the A's 7-3 win...allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high tying seven hits in 4.1 innings in a 6-3 loss at Seattle July 6.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-2 win over Chicago (AL) last Saturday in Oakland...tossed six scoreless innings and allowed four hits while walking two...allowed just one base runner into scoring position...was relieved by Treinen to start the seventh with the A's leading 12-0.
