## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (56-42) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (59-37)

SATURDAY, JULY 20, 2019 — TARGET FIELD — 6:10 P.M. CDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Beat Minnesota 5-3 last night and have won seven of their last eight...have not lost back-to-back games since they were swept in the day/night doubleheader at Texas on June 8...have won seven of their last eight, nine of the last 11, 13 of the last 16, and 20 of the last 26...are 56-42 (.571) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...the 14 games over .500 match the season high (55-41 on July 17)...have a run differential of +97, which is fourth best in the AL and fifth best in the majors...have won each of the previous six series and are unbeaten over the previous eight...are in second place in the AL West for the 14th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...are in sole possession of the second Wild Card spot and trail Cleveland for the first spot by one game...have spent 23 days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

**SINCE MAY 16:** The A's are 37-17 (.685) dating back to May 16, which is tied with the Yankees for the best record in the majors over that span...have a 3.66 ERA (201 er in 493.2 ip), which is second lowest to the Dodgers (3.27)...lead the majors in home runs (104), slugging (.491), and extra base hits (226), tied for second in runs (321), and are fifth in OPS (.824)...have outscored the opposition 321-215 for a run differential of +106.

**SINCE THE BREAK:** The A's won last night and are now 6-1 following the All-Star Break...won each of the first five games following the break, which was the longest winning streak to start post-break play in Athletics history...have outscored the opposition 48-18...are batting .310 (75-for-242) with 15 doubles, three triples, 15 home runs and 48 runs scored in seven games...lead the majors in slugging (.583) and OPS (.946), rank third in batting and tied for fourth in home runs...have the fewest strikeouts (46)...rank second in the majors with a 2.47 ERA (17 er in 62.0 ip) and second in opponents OPS (.669).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have homered in 19 consecutive games (39 home runs total), which is tied for the second longest streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 19-game streak from Sept. 13, 2017-March 29, 2018...the record is 23 games from July 2-27, 1996...have 160 home runs for the season, which ranks sixth in the majors.

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** The A's are 14-3 (.824) against American League Central teams and have outscored them 108-54 (+54)...are batting .278 (177-for-636) with 108 runs (6.00 per game) and 32 home runs in 18 games (includes May 19 suspended game)...the pitching staff has a 2.80 ERA (51 er in 164.0 ip) and .230 (138-for-600) opponents batting average...are now 66-22 (.750) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 2.83 ERA (51 er in 162.0 ip) over the last 18 games and have walked just 35 batters over that stretch (1.94 per nine innings)...rank second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.395) and fewest home runs (111), third in OPS (.704), fourth in opponents batting average (.241) and fifth in ERA (3.95).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Mike Fiers walked four batters Thursday night, snapping a streak of 16 consecutive games with two walks or fewer by A's starting pitchers...starters have issued 18 walks in 105.2 innings over the last 18 games (1.53 per nine innings)...are 6-0 with a 2.34 ERA (13 er in 50.0 ip) over the last eight games and 16-4 with a 3.42 ERA (61 er in 160.2 ip) over the last 28 contests...now have 42 wins for the season, which is tied for first in the majors with Minnesota...rank fourth in the AL in ERA (3.99) and OPS (.706).

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank fourth in the American League in home runs (160) and extra base hits (351), and fifth in slugging (.451) and runs scored (515)...have the third fewest strikeouts (758)...are tied for the fewest sacrifice hits (2), rank third in hit by pitches (47) and fourth in most grounded into double plays (83)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (13), tied for second in doubles (4), extra base hits (7), and RBI (14), third in home runs (3) and plate appearances (60), and tied for third in walks (7).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this seven-game road trip to American League Central leading Minnesota (1-1) and AL West leading Houston (three games) tonight...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 20-7

over their last 28 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...went 5-0 on the last homestand against Chicago (3-0) and Seattle (2-0)...it was the A's first perfect homestand of more than three games since going 6-0 against Toronto and San Francisco from July 3-8, 2014...have a season-high six-game home winning streak and have won 13 of the last 15 home games...are 31-20 (.608) at home compared to 25-22 (.532) on the road.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 18-8 (.692) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 38-34 (.528) against right-handers...are batting .268 with an .821 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .244 with a .756 OPS against right-handers...have the third best OPS and fourth best batting average against lefties in the American League and the fifth lowest batting average against righties...have the most home runs off lefties in the AL (49).

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 13 times...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Hundley, Manaea, Piscotty), including four on the 60-day DL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Manaea)...Cotton, Hundley and Manaea are on rehab assignments...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

**AT THE BREAK:** The A's were 50-41 at the All-Star Break, which was the sixth best record in the American League and eighth best in the majors...set an Athletics franchise record for home run at the All-Star Break with 145 (previous: 137 in 1996)...that is 12th best total in Major League history before the break, but was sixth best in the majors this year...had 318 extra base hits, which was second in Athletics history to the record of 321 set last year...scored 467 runs, which was third best and the most since 2000 (522)...had the sixth best slugging percentage (.441)...the pitching staff had 721 strikeouts, which was second to the record of 728 in 2014.

**A's vs. TWINS:** The A's lead the season series 3-2...the A's have split the first two games of the series after taking two of three in Oakland earlier this month...have won eight of the last 11 games, including five of the last seven in Minnesota...are 35-16 (.686) against the Twins dating back to July 13, 2012...won the season series last year, 5-2...won two of three in Oakland and three of four in Minnesota...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 308-304 against Minnesota...that includes 172-131 in Oakland and 136-173 in Minnesota...are 19-18 at Target Field...are 365-373 all-time against the Twins and have a 1012-1009 record against the Twins/Senators...the 1012 are the A's most against any franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** ranks third in the American League in extra base hits (50), fifth in slugging (.552), tied for sixth in doubles (25), seventh in OPS (.915) and tied for eighth in home runs (22)...**Liam Hendriks** has a career-high and A's season-high 19.2 inning scoreless streak...has the lowest relief ERA in the majors (0.87)...**Ramón Laureano** is batting .455 (20-for-44) with six doubles, six home runs and 12 RBI in 13 games in July (1.000 slugging percentage)...is also hitting .343 (37-for-108) with 11 home runs and 38 RBI over his last 30 games dating back to June 12...needs one more home run to become the fourth center fielder in Oakland history with 20 home runs (Coco Crisp, Dave Henderson, Dwayne Murphy)...**Matt Olson** has a career-high 14-game hitting streak (17-for-57, .298), which is the longest hitting streak by an A's first baseman since Dan Johnson had a 15-game streak in 2007...**Marcus Semien** has a consecutive games played streak of 180 (all starts)...the consecutive games played streak is seventh longest in Oakland history and the consecutive games started streak is fourth longest.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1969, at the age of 19 years, 357 days, Vida Blue becomes the first Oakland teenage pitcher to start a game...he takes the loss in the A's 7-3 decision at California...in 1973 Jim Hunter becomes the first Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he defeats the Cleveland Indians 6-5 in the Coliseum...in 2009 the A's trail Minnesota 12-2 entering the bottom of the third inning but come back to win 14-13, setting an Oakland record for biggest come-from-behind victory...in 2011 Hideki Matsui homers at Detroit for the 500<sup>th</sup> home run in professional career...the total includes 332 in the Japanese Leagues.

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

### TEAM

14-18, 3.89 ERA (154 er in 356.0 ip)  
Saves/Opportunities: 23-for-41 (56.1%)

- The A's bullpen has a 2.01 ERA (17 er in 76.0 ip) with 75 strikeouts over its last 22 games since June 21...had a 5.60 ERA (50 ER, 80.1 IP) with 77 strikeouts in 22 games from May 28 to June 20.
- Is 23-for-41 (56.1%) in save opportunities for the season...the 18 blown saves are tied for the third most in the majors...the save percentage is tied for fifth lowest in the majors.
- Has the fourth fewest wins in the American League (14) and tied for the fourth most losses (18)...has allowed the second fewest home runs (41).
- Has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.332) among Major League bullpens.

### 52 LHP RYAN BUCHTER

Last Outing: 7/19 at Minnesota (ND, 1.1 ip, bb)  
Saves/Opportunities: 0-4

Inherited Runners/Scored: 26/10    First Hitters: 7-35, 5 bb, hbp

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 29 for his second stint with the A's and has not allowed a run in 26 of 29 games since his return...has a 1.50 ERA (3 er in 18.0 ip) and .175 (11-for-63) opponents batting average over that span...logged a 7.04 ERA and .375 opponents average over his first 13 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas April 22.
- Has allowed a .185 (12-for-65) average against left-handed hitters, .367 (11-for-30) against right-handers.
- Has pitched 8.1 scoreless innings across seven career games against the Twins.

*Last Year: Went 6-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 54 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...allowed just 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest percentage in the majors.*

### 16 RHP LIAM HENDRIKS

Last Outing: 7/19 at Minnesota (SV, 1.2 ip, 3 so)

Saves/Opportunities: 6-8

Inherited Runners/Scored: 27/10    First Hitters: 10-35, 4 bb, 2 sf, hbp

- Has a career-high and A's season-high 19.2 innings scoreless streak over his last 18 games dating back to June 6...has 33 strikeouts and just two walks over that span and opponents are batting .162 (11-for-68).
- Leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.87)...ranks second among American League relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.243), third in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.17), fourth in strikeouts (66), third in OPS (.492), fifth in innings pitched (51.2), and seventh in batting average (.181).
- Has earned seven saves since Treinen went on the injured list retroactive to June 21, tied for the most in the Majors over that span...had just one career save prior to that on Sept. 20, 2017.
- Has a 1.22 ERA (9 er in 66.2 ip) over his last 57 appearances dating back to Sept. 1 of last year.
- Has not allowed a run in 4.2 innings against Minnesota this season and has allowed just two runs over 20.0 career innings against the Twins (20.0 ip, 12 h, 2 r, 2 er, bb, 23 so, 0.90 ERA)...pitched in parts of three seasons (2011-13) with Minnesota and has a career 4.78 ERA (43 er in 81.0 ip) in 17 career games (12 starts) at Target Field.
- Was named to his first American League All-Star team and pitched the sixth inning in the All-Star Game on July 9 at Cleveland (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...the three strikeouts were the most by an Athletic in an All-Star Game since Jay Howell also had three in 1987.

*Last Year: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 7.36 ERA in 13 relief appearances before he was outrighted off the 40-man roster July 2...returned to Oakland Sept. 1 and went 0-1 with a 1.38 ERA in 12 games, including eight starts as the opener.*

### 36 RHP YUSMEIRO PETIT

Last Outing: 7/18 at Minnesota (BS, L, 0.2 ip, h, r, er, so, hr)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-1

Inherited Runners/Scored: 40/10    First Hitters: 8-47, bb

- Has not allowed a run in 13 of his last 16 games (3 er in 15.0 ip) dating back to June 15 after logging a 4.40 ERA (7 er in 14.1 ip) over his previous 12 games.
- Is first among American League relievers in games pitched (49) and ranks fourth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.01) and innings pitched (53.1), and fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.226).
- Has a 3.52 ERA (6 er in 15.1 ip) with 18 strikeouts in 10 career games against Minnesota.

*Last Year: Pitched in a team-leading and career-high 74 games in his first season in Oakland and was 7-3 with a 3.00 ERA and .221 opponents average...the wins were also a career high and his ERA was second lowest to his 2.76 with the Angels in 2017.*

### 54 RHP BRIAN SCHLITZER

Last Outing: 7/13 vs. Chicago-AL (ND, 1.0 ip)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-0

Inherited Runners/Scored: 4/2    First Hitters: 2-3, bb

- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas and made his A's debut on June 22... it was his first Major League appearance since June 14, 2015.
- Made his Major League debut in 2010 and has pitched in part of three seasons with Chicago-NL.
- Pitched 0.2 scoreless innings with one walk in his sole appearance vs. Minnesota on July 3, 2019.
- Was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in saves at the time of his promotion...his complete 2019 stats with the Aviators:

*Last Year: Spent the entire season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization where he went 7-2 with 21 saves and a 3.36 ERA in 58 relief appearances...surrendered just two home runs in 67.0 innings...ranked second in the PCL in saves.*

### 48 RHP JOAKIM SORIA

Last Outing: 7/19 at Minnesota (ND, 1.0 ip, 2 h)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-2

Inherited Runners/Scored: 3/0    First Hitters: 11-42, 2 bb

- Had eight consecutive scoreless outings from June 15-July 2 (7.1 ip) and opponents were 2-for-24 (.083) with 2 walk and 12 strikeouts over that stretch...has allowed three earned runs in seven outings since then (6.1 ip, 3 er, 4.26 ERA).
- Owns a 1.40 ERA (4 er, 25.2 ip) in 24 A's wins and an 8.69 ERA (19 er, 19.2 ip) in 19 A's losses.
- Is 3-6 with 25 saves and a 2.83 ERA (22 er in 70.0 ip) in 65 career games against Minnesota...his 25 saves against the Twins are the most among active Major League pitchers and are eighth-most all-time.
- His 684 career games pitched are the most in Major League history by a Mexican-born pitcher.

*Last Year: Began the season with the Chicago White Sox and had 16 saves and a 2.56 ERA in 40 relief appearances when he was traded to Milwaukee July 26...went 3-1 with a 4.09 ERA in 26 outings with the Brewers and combined for a 3.12 ERA overall.*

### 39 RHP BLAKE TREINEN

Last Outing: 7/17 vs. Seattle (ND, 1.0 ip, bb, so)

Saves/Opportunities: 16-18

Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/1    First Hitters: 4-28, 6 bb, hbp

- Was reinstated from the 10-day injured list July 3 after making one rehab appearance with Triple-A Las Vegas against Reno on Monday (1.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 hr)...was placed on the IL June 23 retroactive to June 21 with a strained right shoulder.
- Has converted each of his 10 save opportunities over his last 20 games but has a 6.41 ERA (19.2 ip, 22 h, 15 r, 14 er, 14 bb, hb, 16 so) over that span.
- Is tied for sixth in the American League in saves (16)...has 67 career saves with the A's, good for seventh on the Oakland career list (Isringhausen, 75).
- Is 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA (2 er in 8.2 ip) in nine career games vs. the Twins.

*Last Year: Went 9-2 with a career-high 38 saves, a career-low 0.78 ERA and a career-high 100 strikeouts to become the first pitcher in Major League history to save 30 games, compile an ERA under 1.00 and strikeout 100 batters.*

### 62 RHP LOU TRIVINO

Last Outing: 7/18 at Minnesota (ND, 0.2, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 hr)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-4

Inherited Runners/Scored: 20/4    First Hitters: 9-39, 4 bb

- Was 2-0 with a 2.42 ERA in his first 25 appearances (March 20-May 27)... was 1-5 with a 11.70 ERA in 11 appearances from May 29-June 21...since then, has allowed just two earned runs in seven games (6.2 ip).
- Has a .231 (18-for-78) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .310 (27-for-87) against left-handers.
- Has a 14.45 ERA in 4.1 career innings pitched against Minnesota...has given up four home runs in six outings.

*Last Year: Pitched in 69 games in his Major League debut and went 8-3 with four saves, a 2.92 ERA and .201 opponents batting average over two stints with the A's...tied for the lead among AL rookies in saves and ranked second in games pitched.*

### 61 LHP WEI-CHUNG WANG

Inherited Runners/Scored: 11/2    First Hitters: 3-12, bb

- First Major League win on July 4 vs. Minnesota with 2.1 shutout frames.
- Has allowed three runs over his last eight games (10.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) after allowing no runs over his first six appearances (8.1 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 6 so, 0 hr).
- Has held left-handed hitters to a .125 (4-for-32) batting average compared to .179 (5-for-28) against right-handers.
- Has not allowed a run in 2.2 innings pitched against Minnesota.
- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas on May 25 after going 1-1 with one save, a 3.75 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 16 games with the Aviators.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas June 30 for his second stint with the A's this year and has started nine of the A's 14 games at second base since his return...is 5-for-33 (.152) with 13 strikeouts.
- Hit a three-run home run Saturday and four of his nine career home runs have been three-run shots.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Tokyo on March 21 as a pinch runner...did not bat and was optioned to Las Vegas March 28.
- Hit .358 with 10 home runs, 39 RBI, a .698 slugging percentage and 1.096 OPS over his last 40 games with the Aviators after batting .209 with two home runs and nine RBI over his first 33 contests.
- Was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in runs scored (65) at the time of his promotion...was also tied for second in doubles (24), tied for fifth in extra base hits (41) and tied for seventh in triples (5)...started 40 games at second base, 23 at shortstop and nine in center field...his complete stats with Las Vegas:

**Last Year:** Had six stints with Oakland and batted .233 with five home runs and 16 RBI in 32 games...hit a career-high 18 home runs with Triple-A Nashville, which ranked third in the A's farm system despite just 77 games in the minors.

## 20 MARK CANHA

**Current Streak:** 3 games (4 for 12)  
**Minnesota Series:** 2-8, r, so  
**Homestand:** 8-18, 4 r, 3b, 3 hr, 4 rbi, 3 bb, 5 so, 2 gidp

- Has started 12 of the A's 14 games in right field since Piscotty went on the injured list June 30 and is 14-for-46 (.304) with 11 runs and nine walks (.429 on-base percentage) in 13 games total over that span since June 30.
- Has started games at five different positions (17 in right field, 11 at first base, 11 at designated hitter, eight in left field, five in center field)...the A's are 37-15 (.712) with him in the starting lineup.
- Is hitting .213 (10-for-47) with three home runs in 16 career games against Minnesota.
- Walked twice Saturday and now has 34 for the season, which matches his career high set in 122 games last year.
- Was on the 10-day injured list from April 29 to May 12 with a sprained right wrist.

**Last Year:** Started games at five different positions for the A's and batted .249 with a career-high 17 home runs and 52 RBI in 122 games...hit 13 of his home runs against left-handed pitchers, which tied for second in the American League.

## 26 MATT CHAPMAN

**Current Streak:** 0 for 1  
**Minnesota Series:** --  
**Homestand:** 9-16, 4 r, 3 2b, hr, 7 rbi, bb

- Exited Wednesday's game in the third inning with left ankle soreness...entered the game last night as a defensive replacement in the ninth inning.
- Had five RBI Tuesday night for his second career game of five or more RBI...had a six RBI game earlier this year on June 30 at Los Angeles (AL) and now has 15 RBI over his last 12 games.
- Is 9-for-16 (.563) since the All-Star Break and is now batting .362 (34-for-94) with 22 runs, 11 doubles, two triples, six home runs and 23 RBI over his last 27 games (.439 obp, .713 slug, 1.152 OPS) dating back to June 14.
- Ranks third in the American League in extra base hits (50), fifth in slugging (.552) and total bases (196), tied for sixth in doubles (25), seventh in OPS (.915), tied for eighth in home runs (22), and is tenth in multiple hit games (30)...is also tied for ninth in games played (95).
- His 22 home runs are tied for second most among Major League third basemen (Suarez, CIN 24) and are two short of his career high of 24 in 145 games last year...also leads the AL in home runs in the seventh inning or later (10) and is tied for the lead in go-ahead home runs (10).
- Is batting .326 (58-for-178) with a 1.088 OPS and 15 of his 22 home runs at home compared to .232 with a .739 OPS on the road.
- Leads Major League third basemen in total chances (301) and putouts (108), ranks tied for second in assists (186) and third in fielding percentage (.977).
- Had 46 extra base hits at the All-Star Break, which tied for third best pre-break total in Oakland history...it was the most since Mark McGwire had 50 in 1997.
