# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (57-42) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (59-38)

SUNDAY, JULY 21, 2019 — TARGET FIELD — 1:10 P.M. CDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (5-1, 4.21) VS. RHP MICHAEL PINEDA (6-5, 4.38) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KTRB 860 AM/KHTK 1140 AM) — A'S CAST ON TUNEIN

ABOUT THE A'S: Beat Minnesota 5-4 last night and have won eight of their last nine...have not lost back-to-back games since they were swept in the day/night doubleheader at Texas on June 8...have won eight of their last nine, 10 of the last 12, 14 of the last 17, and 21 of the last 27...are 57-42 (.576) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...the 15 games over .500 are a season high...have a run differential of +98, which is fourth best in the AL and fifth best in the majors...have won each of the previous six series and are unbeaten over the previous eight...are in second place in the AL West for the 15th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...are tied with Cleveland for the first American League Wild Card spot...have spent 24 days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

SINCE MAY 16: The A's are 38-17 (.691) dating back to May 16, which is tied with the Yankees for the best record in the majors over that span...have a 3.67 ERA (205 er in 502.2 ip), which is second lowest to the Dodgers (3.26)... lead the majors in home runs (106), tied for first in slugging (.494), second in extra-base hits (229), third in runs (326), and are fifth in OPS (.825)...have outscored the opposition 331-223 for a run differential of +108.

MLB BEST RECORDS.

SINCE THE BREAK: The A's won last night and are now 7-1 following the All-Star Break...won each of the first five games following the break, which was the longest winning streak to start post-break play in Athletics history... have outscored the opposition 53-22...are batting .308 (86-for-279) with 16 doubles, three triples, 17 home runs and 53 runs scored in eight games... lead the majors in slugging (.570) and OPS (.940), rank second in batting and tied for fourth in home runs...have the second fewest strikeouts (55)...rank second in the majors with a 2.66 ERA (21 er in 71.0 ip) and fifth in opponents OPS (.707).

*THE LONG BALL:* The A's have homered in 20 consecutive games (41 home runs total), which is the second longest streak in Oakland history...passed the second longest which was a 19-game streak from Sept. 13, 2017-March 29, 2018...the record is 23 games from July 2-27, 1996...have 162 home runs for the season, which ranks tied for fifth in the majors.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 15-3 (.833) against American League Central teams and have outscored them 113-58 (+55)...are batting .279 (188-for-673) with 113 runs (5.95 per game) and 34 home runs in 19 games (includes May 19 suspended game)...the pitching staff has a 2.86 ERA (55 er in 173.0 ip) and .233 (147-for-632) opponents batting average...are now 67-22 (.753) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.

*PITCHING:* The A's have a 2.89 ERA (55 er in 171.0 ip) over the last 19 games and have walked just 39 batters over that stretch (2.05 per nine innings)... rank second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.397) and fewest home runs (114), third in OPS (.707), fourth in opponents batting average (.241) and fifth in ERA (3.95).

STARTING PITCHING: Mike Fiers walked four batters Thursday night, snapping a streak of 16 consecutive games with two walks or fewer by A's starting pitchers...starters have issued 19 walks in 111.2 innings over the last 19 games (1.53 per nine innings)...are 6-0 with a 2.57 ERA (16 er in 56.0 ip) over the last nine games and 16-4 with a 3.46 ERA (64 er in 166.2 ip) over the last 29 contests...now have 42 wins for the season, which is tied for first in the majors with Minnesota...rank fourth in the AL in ERA (4.00) and OPS (.708).

*OFFENSE:* The A's rank tied for third in the American League in home runs (162), fourth in extra base hits (354), and fifth in slugging (.451), and tied for fourth runs scored (520)...have the third fewest strikeouts (767)...are tied for the fewest sacrifice hits (2), rank third in hit by pitches (50) and fourth in most grounded into double plays (85)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (14), tied for second in doubles (4), extra base hits (7), and RBI (14), third in home runs (3), tied for first in plate appearances (63), and tied for third in walks (7).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this seven-game road trip to American League Central leading Minnesota (2-1) and AL West leading Houston (three

games) tonight...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 21-7 over their last 29 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...went 5-0 on the last homestand against Chicago (3-0) and Seattle (2-0)...it was the A's first perfect homestand of more than three games since going 6-0 against Toronto and San Francisco from July 3-8, 2014...have a season-high six-game home winning streak and have won 13 of the last 15 home games...are 31-20 (.608) at home compared to 26-22 (.542) on the road.

*LEFT AND RIGHT:* The A's are 18-8 (.692) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 39-34 (.534) against right-handers...are batting .270 with an .824 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .244 with a .757 OPS against right-handers...have the third best OPS and fourth best batting average against lefties in the American League and the fifth lowest batting average against righties...have the second most home runs off lefties in the AL (49).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 13 times...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Hundley, Manaea, Piscotty), including four on the 60-day DL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Manaea)...Cotton, Hundley and Manaea are on rehab assignments...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

AT THE BREAK: The A's were 50-41 at the All-Star Break, which was the sixth best record in the American League and eighth best in the majors...set an Athletics franchise record for home run at the All-Star Break with 145 (previous: 137 in 1996)...that is 12th best total in Major League history before the break, but was sixth best in the majors this year...had 318 extra base hits, which was second in Athletics history to the record of 321 set last year... scored 467 runs, which was third best and the most since 2000 (522)...had the sixth best slugging percentage (.441)...the pitching staff had 721 strikeouts, which was second to the record of 728 in 2014.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's clinched a season series win with a win last night, and are now 4-2 against the Twins on the year with just today's game remaining...the A's took two of the first three games of this series after taking two of three in Oakland earlier this month...have won nine of the last 12 games, including six of the last eight in Minnesota...are 36-16 (.692) against the Twins dating back to July 13, 2012...won the season series last year, 5-2...won two of three in Oakland and three of four in Minnesota...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 309-304 against Minnesota...that includes 172-131 in Oakland and 137-173 in Minnesota...are 20-18 at Target Field...are 366-373 all-time against the Twins and have a 1013-1009 record against the Twins/ Senators...the 1013 are the A's most against any franchise.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman ranks fourth in the American League in extra base hits (50), seventh in slugging (.546), tied for seventh in doubles (25), ninth in OPS (.907) and tied for eighth in home runs (22)...Liam Hendriks has a career-high and A's season-high 20.2 inning scoreless streak...has the lowest relief ERA in the majors (0.85)...Ramón Laureano is batting .469 (23for-49) with seven doubles, seven home runs and 13 RBI in 14 games in July (1.041 slugging percentage)...is also hitting .354 (40-for-113) with 12 home runs and 39 RBI over his last 31 games dating back to June 12... homered last night to become the fourth center fielder in Oakland history with 20 home runs (Coco Crisp, Dave Henderson, Dwayne Murphy)... Matt Olson has a career-high 15-game hitting streak (18-for-61, .295), which is the longest hitting streak by an A's first baseman since Dan Johnson had a 15-game streak in 2007... Marcus Semien has a consecutive games played streak of 181 (all starts)...the consecutive games played streak is seventh longest in Oakland history and the consecutive games started streak is fourth longest.

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1945** the A's and Tigers play to a 1-1 tie in a 24 inning game...in **1971** Sal Bando hits a two-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning and adds the game winning sacrifice fly in the 12th inning as the A's defeat Cleveland, 4-3...in **1996** the A's hit five home runs in an 11-8 win at Texas... Terry Steinbach has two of those homers, his first of back-to-back two-homer games.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (5-1, 4.21 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas June 26 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 4-0 with a 3.38 ERA (9 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts since his return...the wins are tied for the most in the majors over that span...began the year at Las Vegas and was 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA in seven games (six starts) with the Aviators when the A's called for the first time on May 12...made three starts in then pitched twice in relief of an "opener"... was 1-1 with a 5.09 ERA in five games when he was optioned back to Las Vegas June 6...went 1-0 with a 6.10 ERA in two games, one start, at Triple-A following his option and is 4-2 with a 3.47 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in nine games, seven starts, overall with Las Vegas.

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Took the loss in his first start this year but is 5-0 with a 3.89 ERA (18 er in 41.2 ip) in eight games, including six starts, since then...the five-game winning streak is a career high (previous: 4, May 15-31, 2018).

DON'T WALK: Has not walked a batter in his last three starts, 18.0 innings pitched and 71 batters faced...has a streak of three consecutive games of five or more innings and no walks, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...the most is four by Bartolo Colón (Aug. 18, 2012-April 17, 2013) and Sean Manaea (July 10-27, 2016)...has walked just one batter in 24.0 innings since returning from Las Vegas June 26...walked 15 batters in 23.0 innings during his first stint.

*IN JULY*: Is 3-0 with a 4.50 ERA (9 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts in July...the only other time he won more than two games in a month was in May of 2018 when he went 4-1...is tied for the American League lead in wins in July.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 5-1 with a 3.35 ERA (15 er in 40.1 ip) and .230 (35-for-152) opponents average in his seven starting assignments and 0-0 with a 9.45 ERA (7 er in 6.2 ip) and .323 (10-for-31) opponents average in two relief appearances...the A's are 6-1 when he starts, 0-2 when he pitches in relief...his two relief appearances came in "opener" games on May 29 (Hendriks) and June 5 (Soria)...over the last two years, he is 11-7 with a 4.16 ERA (63 er in 136.1 ip) in his 24 starts and 1-0 with a 3.76 ERA (11 er in 26.1 ip) in his seven relief appearances...the A's are 17-7 (.708) in his starting assignments over the last two years and 1-6 (.143) in his relief appearances.

*OPPONENTS BATTING:* Has allowed a .172 (15-for-87) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .313 (30-for-96) against left-handers...has issued 12 of his 16 walks to lefties for a .389 on-base percentage (.207 against righties)...opponents are 8-for-49 (.163) with a walk (.180 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has a .179 (30-for-168) opponents batting average and .202 (four walks, one hit batter) on-base percentage against batters leading off an inning over the last two years... the opponents number three hitter is 2-for-23 (.087) against him and the four-hitter is 4-for-21 (.190).

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed a season-high 100 pitches in his first start May 12 against Cleveland and allowed four runs in 5.1 innings for the loss...then went 1-0 with a 1.76 ERA and .203 opponents batting average over his next three games (two starts)...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings and allowed just one run on three hits and two walks for his first win on May 18 at Detroit... allowed just one run in 4.0 innings in his next start May 24 against Seattle but walked a career-high tying five and threw 99 pitches in a no decision in a 6-2 A's win...pitched in relief of Liam Hendriks May 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and struck out a season-high six batters in 4.1 innings...then pitched in relief of Joakim Soria in the A's 10-9 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on June 5 and allowed a season-high six runs in a season-low 2.1 innings...was optioned to Las Vegas the next day...returned to Oakland June 26 and combined with Petit, Soria and Hendriks on a five-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win that day at St. Louis...allowed five runs on a season-high eight hits in 5.2 innings July 2 against Minnesota but picked up the win in an 8-6 A's victory.

LAST START: He won his fourth consecutive start in the A's 9-2 win over Seattle last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed a season-high tying 7.0 innings and did not walk a batter for the third consecutive start...allowed a leadoff home run to Narvaez in the second inning and Nola doubled one out later...then retired each of the next 15 batters and 17 of the final 18.

2019 WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 5-3 with a 3.47 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in nine games, including seven starts, with Las Vegas...struck out 50 batters in 49.1 innings (9.12 per nine innings)...was 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in seven games (six starts) when the A's called for the first time on May 12...then went 1-0 with a 6.10 ERA in two games, one start, following his June 6 option...his opponents batting average includes a .207 (23-for-111) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .213 (16-for-75) against left-handers...tossed at least six innings in six of his nine appearances, allowed two runs or fewer five times and yielded three hits or fewer four times.

2019 LAS VEGAS HIGHLIGHTS: Was the Aviators Opening Day starting pitcher and had a no decision in a 9-8 win at El Paso on April 4...allowed four runs in 5.0 innings and left with a 6-4 lead...made his first relief appearance on April 9 against Sacramento in relief of a rehabbing Chris Bassitt...allowed one unearned run on one hit in 6.0 innings of relief and struck out a season-high nine for the win...that began a three-game winning streak where he went 3-0 with a 2.37 ERA and .149 opponents batting average over a three-start stretch from April 9-20...tossed a season-high 99 pitches and allowed inversion on seven hits in 6.0 innings April 15 against Fresno but still picked up the win...logged a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings and yielded just two hits in an 11-0 win at Fresno April 20...had his three-game winning streak snapped April 26 against El Paso when he had season highs in runs (6) and hits (8) and a season low in innings pitched (3.0) in an 8-6 loss...his second relief appearance came on June 16 at Memphis in relief of "opener" Brian Schlittler.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Homer Bailey (8-6, 4.69 ERA): Was acquired from Kansas City on July 14 for minor league infielder Kevin Merrell minutes before he was scheduled to start for the Royals against Detroit...picked up the win in his A's debut last Wednesday against Seattle in Oakland, a 10-2 win (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so)... went 7-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 18 starts with Kansas City...is 4-0 with a 2.57 ERA and .227 opponents batting average over his last six starts...the winning streak is his best since May 23-June 8, 2014, when he also won four in a row...has a record of 8-6 after going 9-27 over his previous four seasons...his eight wins are his most since winning nine games for Cincinnati in 2014...is 4-0 with a 1.46 ERA (55.1 ip, 36 h, 12 r, 9 er, 15 bb, 51 so, 3 hr) and .181 opponents batting average in eight career starts against Houston...the ERA is his lowest against any team...last faced the Astros on Sept. 7, 2012 at Cincinnati, a no decision in a 5-3 loss (6.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 9 so).
