OAKLAND ATHLETICS (57-43) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (64-37)

ABOUT THE A'S: Split a four-game series with Minnesota over the weekend to snap a streak of six consecutive series wins...remain unbeaten over the last nine series (seven wins, two splits) and have not lost a series since dropping two of three to Seattle June 14-16...have not lost back-to-back games since they were swept in the day/night doubleheader at Texas on June 8...have won eight of the last 10 games and 14 of the last 18...trailed Houston by 12 games at the conclusion of play on June 16 but have gone 21-7 (.750) since then, which is tied with the Yankees for the best record in the majors...have gained 5½ games on the Astros over that stretch and are 6½ games out of first in the American League West...have the second Wild Card spot, one game ahead of Tampa Bay and one game behind first place Cleveland...are 57-43 (.570) overall, which is the fifth best record in the AL and seventh best in the majors...the 14 games over .500 are one short of the season high of 15 (57-42 on July 20)...have a run differential of +97, which is fourth best in the AL and fifth best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the 16th consecutive day...have spent 25 days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in 21 consecutive games (42 home runs total), which is the second longest streak in Oakland history and tied for the second longest streak in the majors this year (Yankees, 31)...Josh Phegley hit his 10th home run of the season yesterday, giving the A's eight players with 10 or more home runs...only the Twins (10) and Astros (9) have more...the Athletics record is nine (2000 and 2017)...Ramón Laureano hit his 20th home run of the season Saturday, giving the A's three players with 20 or more home runs...only the Cubs (4) have more...the Athletics record is five (six times, last: 2018)...have 163 home runs for the season, which ranks seventh in the majors.

SINCE MAY 16: The A's are 38-18 (.679) dating back to May 16, which is tied with the Yankees for the best record in the majors over that span...have a 3.73 ERA (212 er in 511.1 ip), which is second lowest to the Dodgers (3.20)...lead the majors in home runs (107), rank second in slugging (.493) and extra base hits (233), third in runs (332), fourth in doubles (118) and fifth in OPS (.825)...have outscored the opposition 332-226 for a run differential of +106.

SINCE THE BREAK: The A's are 7-2 (.778) since the All-Star Break, which is the best record in the American League and tied with the Cubs for second best in the majors to the Giants (9-2)...lead the majors in on-base percentage (.371), slugging percentage (.555) and OPS (.926) and are tied with the Royals for the best batting average (.300)...rank fifth in ERA (3.16)...have outscored the opposition by 30 runs (59-29), an average of 3.3 per game.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-0 with a 3.03 ERA (20 er in 59.1 ip) over the last 10 games and 16-4 with a 3.60 ERA (68 er in 170.0 ip) over the last 30 contests...have 42 wins for the season, which is tied with the Astros, Twins and Dodgers for the most in the majors...rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.405) and fourth in ERA (4.04) and OPS (.712)

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.10 ERA (65 er in 188.2 ip) over the last 21 games...overall, rank second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.399) and fewest home runs (115), third in OPS (.710) and fourth in opponents batting average (.242).

OFFENSE: The A's rank fourth in the American League in runs (526) and extra base hits (358) and fifth in home runs (163) and slugging (.451)...have the third fewest strikeouts (781)...are tied for the fewest sacrifice hits (2), rank third in hit by pitches (50) and fourth in most grounded into double plays (85)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in plate appearances (65), are tied for the lead in doubles (5), rank second in hits (15), RBI (16) and extra base hits (8), third in home runs (3) and tied for third in walks (7).

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been caught stealing 30 times, which is the most in the majors...however, they have stolen 61 bases, which is fourth most...pitchers have 10 pickoffs, which is tied for fourth most...on offense,

the A's are 33-for-49 (67.3%) in stolen base attempts...have the second lowest stolen base percentage in the American League and the third fewest stolen bases and attempts.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this seven-game road trip to American League Central leading Minnesota (2-2) and AL West leading Houston (three games)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 21-8 over their last 30 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...went 5-0 on the last homestand against Chicago (3-0) and Seattle (2-0)...it was the A's first perfect homestand of more than three games since going 6-0 against Toronto and San Francisco from July 3-8, 2014...return home following the game Wednesday for a nine-game homestand against Texas (four games), Milwaukee (three games) and St. Louis (two games)...have a season-high six-game home winning streak and have won 13 of the last 15 home games...are 31-20 (.608) at home compared to 26-23 (.531) on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 24-22 (.522) against American League West competition compared to 33-21 (.611) against all other teams...the mark against the West is second best within the division as Houston is 33-11 and everyone else is under .500...however, four of the five teams in the West have a winning record overall...last year, the A's went 38-38 (.500) against the West, 59-27 (.686) against all other teams.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 18-8 (.692) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 39-35 (.527) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (23-7)...are batting .270 with an .824 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .244 with a .758 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the American League and the fifth lowest batting average against righties...have the second most home runs off lefties (49).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 13 times...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Hundley, Manaea, Piscotty), including four on the 60-day DL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Manaea)...Cotton, Hundley and Manaea are on rehab assignments...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 1-7 against the Astros...are 1-4 in Oakland and 0-3 in Houston...have lost eight of the last nine games and 19 of the last 26...have dropped four straight at Minute Maid Park and 11 of the last 14 in Oakland...lost the season series for the fourth consecutive season last year as they went 7-12 against Houston...went 2-7 in Oakland, which was their worst home mark ever against the Astros, and 5-5 in Houston...are 30-54 (.357) against the Astros over the last five years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...are 61-67 all-time, including 32-33 in Oakland and 29-34 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman ranks fourth in the American League in extra base hits (51) and slugging (.547), tied for sixth in doubles (26), eighth in OPS (.908) and tied for eighth in home runs (22)...**Liam Hendriks** had his career-high and A's season-high 20.2-inning scoreless streak snapped yesterday...has the lowest relief ERA in the AL (1.18)...**Ramón Laureano** is batting .434 (23-for-53) with seven doubles, seven home runs and 13 RBI in 15 games in July (.962 slugging percentage)...is tied for second in the AL in extra base hits in July (14), tied for third in doubles and ranks fourth in home runs...**Matt Olson** has a career-high 16-game hitting streak (19-for-64, .297), which is the longest hitting streak by an A's first baseman since Jason Giambi had an 18-game streak in 1999...**Marcus Semien** has a consecutive games played streak of 182 (all starts)...the consecutive games played streak is seventh longest in Oakland history and the consecutive games started streak is fourth longest.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1905** Weldon Henley no hits the St. Louis Browns, 6-0...it is one of just four wins for Henley all year...in **1996** Mark McGwire singles off Kevin Tapani in the second inning of the A's 6-5 win at Chicago for his 1000th career hit...he becomes the eighth Oakland Athletic to reach the 1000 mark...in **2012** Coco Crisp has a RBI single in the bottom of the 12th inning to lead the A's to a 5-4 win over New York...the win completes the A's second four-game series sweep of the Yankees since 1914.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Homer Bailey (8-6, 4.69 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was acquired from Kansas City on July 14 for minor league infielder Kevin Merrell minutes before he was scheduled to start for the Royals against Detroit...picked up the win in his A's debut last Wednesday against Seattle...went 7-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 18 starts with Kansas City...was 2-1 with a 4.30 ERA and .220 opponents batting average over his first four starts, 2-5 with a 7.31 ERA and .313 opponents average over an eight-start stretch from April 23 to June 1 and is 4-0 with a 2.85 ERA (13 er in 41.0 ip) and .237 (37-for-156) opponents average in seven starts since then.

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 2.57 ERA (10 er in 35.0 ip) and .227 (30-for-132) opponents batting average over his last six starts...the winning streak is his best since May 23-June 8, 2014, when he also won four in a row...the only time he had a winning streak longer than four games was a six-game streak from July 31-Sept. 14, 2013.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-4 with a 6.06 ERA (22 er in 32.2 ip) in six starts against American League West competition compared to 6-2 with a 3.98 ERA (28 er in 63.1 ip) in 13 starts against all other teams...is now 4-5 with a 5.84 ERA (37 er in 57.0 ip) in 10 career starts against the AL West.

THIS AND THAT: Has a record of 8-6 after going 9-27 over his previous four seasons...his eight wins are his most since winning nine games for Cincinnati in 2014...has 87 strikeouts, which are also his most since 2014 (124)...his teams are 9-10 (.474) in his starting assignments, including 1-0 with the A's...has tossed five innings or fewer in 10 of his 19 starts.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a season-high eight batters in 5.0 innings in his Kansas City debut April 3 against Minnesota but had a no decision in a 7-6 loss...left with a 6-3 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of three times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 7 vs. Chicago-AL, July 4 vs. Cleveland)...then surrendered a season-high seven runs on a season-high eight hits in his second start, a 13-5 loss to Seattle on April 8...picked up his first win as a Royal April 13 against Cleveland when he tossed 7.0 scoreless innings...it was his first win since May 12, 2018 at Los Angeles (NL) and it snapped a career-high 10-game losing streak...posted a 6.88 ERA and .333 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from May 18, 2018 to April 8, 2019...walked a season-high four batters (also May 16 vs. Texas and June 29 at Toronto) in a season-low 1.0 innings April 23 at Tampa Bay...it was his shortest start since Aug. 28, 2016 at Arizona, also 1.0 inning...matched his season-high in hits (8) in a 16-1 loss to Texas May 16...that started a season-high three-game losing streak that spanned four starts through June 1...had a 9.64 ERA and .350 opponents batting average during the streak...then won three consecutive starts from June 13 to 23 and allowed just one run in 19.0 innings (0.47 ERA)...did not allow a run in back-to-back starts on June 13 against Detroit (6.0 ip) and June 18 at Seattle (7.2 ip) as part of a 16.2-inning scoreless streak from June 13 to 23...combined with Lopez and McCarthy on a six-hit shutout in the latter contest against the Mariners...tossed a season-high 7.2 innings, which was his longest scoreless outing since a complete-game on June 29, 2014 at San Francisco...also had a season-high 121 pitches...finished June 3-1 with a 3.48 ERA...it was his first three-win month since June of 2014 (3-1)...then had a no decision in his final start as a Royal on July 4 against Cleveland.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in his A's debut, a 10-2 decision over Seattle last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the second inning on a RBI triple by Moore and a RBI single by Gordon...then shut out the Mariners on two hits over his final four innings of work...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 7-2.

ERA (55.1 ip, 36 h, 12 r, 9 er, 15 bb, 51 so, 3 hr) and .181 (36-for-199) opponents batting average in eight career starts...the ERA is his lowest against any team...is 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA (2 er in 30.0 ip) in four starts at Minute Maid Park and 2-0 with a 2.49 ERA (7 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts in Cincinnati...last faced the Astros on Sept. 7, 2012 at Cincinnati, a no decision in a 5-3 loss...allowed a two-run home run to Maxwell in the first inning but then blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over his final 5.2 innings.

2018 RECAP: Was on the Reds' Opening Day roster for the first time since 2014...recorded 20 starts, his highest total since 2014, while he tied for second in the National League with 14 losses...had the lowest run support (2.54) in the majors among pitchers that worked at least 100.0 innings...missed nearly seven weeks of action with right knee inflammation, going on the disabled list June 2...was reinstated on July 23...did not pitch after Sept. 5, a 3-2 loss to Pittsburgh...his nine-game losing streak (May 18-Sept. 5) was the longest in the Majors during the 2018 season...collected his 1,000th career strikeout in his final start of the year, Sept. 5 at Pittsburgh, fanning Jameson Taillon in the fourth inning...was traded to the Los Angeles Dodgers Dec. 21 with infielder Jeter Downs in exchange for catcher/infielder Kyle Farmer, outfielder Matt Kemp, outfielder Yasiel Puig and cash considerations...was released by the Dodgers later that day

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Mike Fiers (9-3, 3.61 ERA): Is 7-0 with a 2.25 ERA (21 er in 84.0 ip) and .197 (58-for-294) opponents batting average over his last 13 starts dating back to his May 7 no-hitter against Cincinnati...the winning streak is a career high (previous: 6, July 21-Sept. 11, 2018), the second longest active streak in the American League and the longest by an A's pitcher over the last six years...has left with the lead in five of his six no decisions during the streak only to have the bullpen blow the save...is tied for fourth in the AL in winning percentage (.750), ranks fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.362), seventh in OPS (.656) and tied for 10th in wins (9)...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss at Minnesota on Thursday (6.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...is 1-2 with a 6.15 ERA (26.1 ip, 34 h, 18 r, 16 er, 8 bb, 23 so, 8 hr) in five career appearances, all starts against Houston...is 0-0 with an 8.64 ERA (8.1 ip, 11 h, 8 r, 8 er, 7 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year.

- Is 24-for-43 (55.8%) in save opportunities for the season...the 18 blown saves are tied for the second most in the majors...the save percentage is fourth lowest in the majors.
- Has the fourth fewest wins in the American League (15) and is tied for the fourth most losses (19)...has allowed the second fewest home runs (41).
- Has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.331) among Major League bullpens.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 29 for his second stint with the A's and has not allowed a run in 27 of 30 games since his return...has a 1.42 ERA (3 er in 19.0 ip) and .185 (12-for-65) opponents batting average over that span...logged a 7.04 ERA and .375 opponents average over his first 13 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas April 22.
- Has allowed a .194 (13-for-67) average against left-handed hitters, .367 (11-for-30) against right-handers.
- Has allowed two earned runs over 4.2 innings of work in six career games against Houston.

Last Year: Went 6-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 54 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...allowed just 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest percentage in the majors.

- Allowed two runs yesterday, snapping a career-high and A's season-high scoreless streak at 20.2 innings, stretching from June 6-July 21...had 34 strikeouts and just three walks over that span and opponents batted .181 (13-for-72).
- Ranks second among Major League relievers in ERA (1.81)...ranks third among American League relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.274) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.17), fourth in strikeouts (68), fifth in innings pitched (53.1) and seventh in OPS (.540)
- Has earned eight saves since Treinen went on the injured list retroactive to June 21, tied for the most in the Majors over that span...had just one career save prior to that on Sept. 20, 2017.
- Has a 1.45 ERA (11 er in 68.1 ip) over his last 59 appearances dating back to Sept. 1 of last year.
- Is 1-2 with two saves and a 5.27 ERA (16 er in 27.1 ip) across 21 career games against Houston...has allowed just one earned run and has struck out nine over his last seven games (8.2 ip) vs. the Astros.
- Was named to his first American League All-Star team and pitched the sixth inning in the All-Star Game on July 9 at Cleveland (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...the three strikeouts were the most by an Athletic in an All-Star Game since Jay Howell also had three in 1987.
