## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (57-44) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (65-37)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost back-to-back games for the first time since they were swept in the day/night doubleheader at Texas on June 8...have not lost more than two straight since losing five in a row from May 28-June 2...have won eight of the last 11 games and 14 of the last 19 and are 21-8 (.724) dating back to June 17...are 57-44 (.570) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...have a run differential of +87, which is fourth best in the AL and fifth best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the 18th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 7½ games...have the second Wild Card spot, one game ahead of Tampa Bay and two games behind first place Cleveland...split a four-game series with Minnesota over the weekend to snap a streak of six consecutive series wins...are unbeaten over the previous nine series (seven wins, two splits) and have not lost a series since dropping two of three to Seattle June 14-16...have spent 26 days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

**SINCE MAY 16:** The A's are 38-19 (.667) dating back to May 16, which is tied with the Yankees and Dodgers for the best record in the majors over that span...have a 3.86 ERA (223 er in 519.1 ip), which is second lowest to the Dodgers (3.20)...rank second in the majors in home runs (107) and extra base hits (235), fourth in runs (333) and doubles (120) and fifth in slugging (.488) and OPS (.816)...have outscored the opposition 333-237 for a run differential of +96.

**SINCE THE BREAK:** The A's are 7-3 (.700) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the second best record in the American League (Cleveland, 8-3)...are batting .279 (95-for-340) with 60 runs (6.0 per game), 21 doubles, three triples and 18 home runs...rank second in the AL in slugging (.518) and OPS (.867) and fourth in batting...have a 4.00 ERA (39 er in 87.2 ip), which ranks fifth.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 18-8 (.692) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 39-36 (.520) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (23-7)...are batting .270 with an .824 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .242 with a .752 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the American League and the fourth lowest batting average against righties...have the second most home runs off lefties (49).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's had their streak of 21 consecutive games with a home run end yesterday...it was the second longest streak in Athletics history and fell two short of the record of 23 (July 2-27, 1996)...hit 42 home runs during the streak...have not gone homerless in back-to-back games since May 4-5 at Pittsburgh...Josh Phegley hit his 10th home run of the season Sunday, giving the A's eight players with 10 or more home runs...only the Twins (10), Astros (9) and Yankees (9) have more...the Athletics record is nine (2000 and 2017)...Ramón Laureano hit his 20th home run of the season Saturday, giving the A's three players with 20 or more home runs...only the Cubs (4) have more...the Athletics record is five (six times, last: 2018)...have 163 home runs for the season, which ranks seventh in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's were held to a season-low two hits last night, both doubles...it marked the first time they have not had a single in a game since May 26, 2018 against Arizona...now have a streak of 82 consecutive games with an extra base hit, which is fifth longest in Oakland history...it is the longest since an 86-game streak from July 28, 2017-April 27, 2018...rank fourth in the American League in extra base hits (360) and fifth in runs (527), home runs (163) and slugging (.448)...are tied for the third fewest strikeouts (792)...are tied for the fewest sacrifice hits (2), rank third in hit by pitches (50) and fourth in most grounded into double plays (85)...A's pinch hitters are tied for the AL lead in doubles (5), rank second in hits (15), RBI (16), extra base hits (8) and plate appearances (65), third in home runs (3) and tied for third in walks (7).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 6.33 ERA (30 er in 42.2 ip) in the first five games of the road trip...have walked 27 batters in 42.2 innings (5.70 per nine innings) and surrendered 11 home runs (2.32 per nine innings)...however, have a 3.48 ERA (76 er in 196.2 ip) over the last 22 contests...overall, rank second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.402) and fewest home runs (118), third in OPS (.715) and fourth in opponents batting average (.244).

**STARTING PITCHING:** The loss by Homer Bailey yesterday was the first by an A's starter since July 6 at Seattle (Bassitt)...A's starting pitchers are now 11-2 with a 3.90 ERA (47 er in 108.1 ip) over the last 19 games...have 42 wins for the season, which is tied for second most in the majors to the Astros (43)...rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.410) and fourth in OPS (.721).

**ON THE BASES:** A's opponents have been caught stealing 30 times, which is the most in the majors...however, they have stolen 61 bases, which is tied for fourth most...pitchers have 10 pickoffs, which is tied for fourth...on offense, the A's are 33-for-49 (67.3%) in stolen base attempts...have the second lowest stolen base percentage in the American League and the third fewest stolen bases and attempts.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-3 on this seven-game road trip to American League Central leading Minnesota (2-2) and AL West leading Houston (0-1)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 21-9 over their last 31 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...went 5-0 on the last homestand against Chicago (3-0) and Seattle (2-0)...it was the A's first perfect homestand of more than three games since going 6-0 against Toronto and San Francisco from July 3-8, 2014...return home following the game tomorrow for a nine-game homestand against Texas (four games), Milwaukee (three games) and St. Louis (two games)...have a season-high six-game home winning streak and have won 13 of the last 15 home games...are 31-20 (.608) at home compared to 26-24 (.520) on the road.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 13 times...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Hundley, Manaea, Piscotty), including four on the 60-day DL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Manaea)...Cotton, Hundley and Manaea are on rehab assignments...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 24-23 (.511) against American League West competition compared to 33-21 (.611) against all other teams...the mark against the West is second best within the division as Houston is 34-11 and everyone else is under .500...last year, the A's went 38-38 (.500) against the West, 59-27 (.686) against all other teams.

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's are 1-8 against the Astros and 56-36 (.609) against all other teams...have been outscored 53-21 (-32) compared to a run differential of +119 against everyone else...are batting .186 (55-for-295) and have a 5.91 ERA (53 er in 80.2 ip)...are 1-4 in Oakland and 0-4 in Houston...now have a five-game losing streak at Minute Maid Park, which matches the A's longest ever in Houston...have lost nine of the last 10 games and 20 of the last 27 overall...have lost 11 of the last 14 in Oakland...lost the season series for the fourth consecutive season last year as they went 7-12 against Houston...went 2-7 in Oakland, which was their worst home mark ever against the Astros, and 5-5 in Houston...are 30-55 (.353) against the Astros over the last five years, which is the second worst mark by an American League team against Houston over that span (Baltimore, 7-23, .233)...are 61-68 all-time, including 32-33 in Oakland and 29-35 in Houston.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** ranks fourth in the American League in extra base hits (52), tied for fifth in doubles (27), sixth in slugging (.549), tied for ninth in home runs (22) and 10th in OPS (.911)...**Liam Hendriks** had his career-high and A's season-high 20.2-inning scoreless streak snapped Sunday...has the lowest relief ERA in the AL (1.18)...**Ramón Laureano** is batting .411 (23-for-56) with seven doubles, seven home runs and 13 RBI in 16 games in July (.911 slugging percentage)...is tied for second in the AL in extra base hits in July (14), tied for third in doubles and tied for fourth in home runs...**Marcus Semien** has a consecutive games played streak of 183 (all starts)...the consecutive games *played* streak is seventh longest in Oakland history and the consecutive games *started* streak is fourth longest.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1964 Bert Campaneris homers twice in his major league debut as the A's defeat Minnesota, 4-3...the first home run comes on the first pitch he sees from Jim Kaat...in 1976 Vida Blue tosses a six-hit shutout and strikes out 13 in the A's 2-0 win over Kansas City to record his 100th career victory...he would go on to win 124 games in an Oakland uniform, second only to Catfish Hunter's 131...in 1996 Terry Steinbach hits his eighth career grand slam in the A's 8-4 win at Chicago...it was his fifth homer in three days.

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

### TEAM

15-19, 3.89 ERA (160 er in 370.1 ip)  
Saves/Opportunities: 24-for-43 (55.8%)

- The A's bullpen has a 2.29 ERA (23 er in 90.1 ip) with 83 strikeouts over its last 25 games since June 21...had a 5.60 ERA (50 ER, 80.1 IP) with 77 strikeouts in 22 games from May 28 to June 20.
- Is 24-for-43 (55.8%) in save opportunities for the season...the 18 blown saves are tied for the second most in the majors...the save percentage is fourth lowest in the majors.
- Has the fourth fewest wins in the American League (15) and is tied for the fourth most losses (19)...has allowed the second fewest home runs (41).
- Has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.330) among Major League bullpens.

### 53 RHP TANNER ANDERSON

**Last Outing:** 7/4 vs. Minnesota - GS (ND, 4.2 ip, 9 h, 2 r, er, 2 bb, 3 so)  
**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-0  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0 **First Hitters:** 0-0

- Made his first appearance with Oakland on June 10, giving up two runs and three hits in 5.2 innings of work at Tampa Bay.
- Has never faced Houston in his career.
- Has made five appearances with Oakland this season, all starts...allowed three or fewer runs in four of his five outings...gave up seven runs in the other.
- Is allowing a .255 average against righties, and a .360 average to lefties.

**Last Year:** Made his Major League debut with Pittsburgh, yielding 10 runs-eight earned-in 11.1 innings pitched, including six strikeouts and eight walks in six games pitched, good for a 6.35 ERA.

### 52 LHP RYAN BUCHTER

**Last Outing:** 7/20 at Minnesota (ND, 1.0 ip, h)  
**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-4  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 27/11 **First Hitters:** 8-36, 5 bb, hbp

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 29 for his second stint with the A's and has not allowed a run in 27 of 30 games since his return...has a 1.42 ERA (3 er in 19.0 ip) and .185 (12-for-65) opponents batting average over that span...logged a 7.04 ERA and .375 opponents average over his first 13 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas April 22.
- Has allowed a .194 (13-for-67) average against left-handed hitters, .367 (11-for-30) against right-handers.
- Has allowed two earned runs over 4.2 innings of work in six career games against Houston.

**Last Year:** Went 6-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 54 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...allowed just 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest percentage in the majors.

### 16 RHP LIAM HENDRIKS

**Last Outing:** 7/21 at Minnesota (BS, L, 0.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, so)  
**Saves/Opportunities:** 8-11  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 27/10 **First Hitters:** 10-37, 4 bb, 2 sf, hbp

- Allowed two runs Sunday, snapping a career-high and A's season-high scoreless streak at 20.2 innings, stretching from June 6-July 21...had 34 strikeouts and just three walks over that span and opponents batted .181 (13-for-72).
- Ranks second among Major League relievers in ERA (1.18)...ranks third among American League relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.274) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.17), fourth in strikeouts (68), fifth in innings pitched (53.1), and seventh in OPS (.540)
- Has earned eight saves since Treinen went on the injured list retroactive to June 21, tied for the most in the Majors over that span...had just one career save prior to that on Sept. 20, 2017.
- Has a 1.45 ERA (11 er in 68.1 ip) over his last 59 appearances dating back to Sept. 1 of last year.
- Is 1-2 with two saves and a 5.27 ERA (16 er in 27.1 ip) across 21 career games against Houston...has allowed just one earned run and has struck out nine over his last seven games (8.2 ip) vs. the Astros.
- Was named to his first American League All-Star team and pitched the sixth inning in the All-Star Game on July 9 at Cleveland (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...the three strikeouts were the most by an Athletic in an All-Star Game since Jay Howell also had three in 1987.

**Last Year:** Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 7.36 ERA in 13 relief appearances before he was outrighted off the 40-man roster July 2...returned to Oakland Sept. 1 and went 0-1 with a 1.38 ERA in 12 games, including eight starts as the opener.

### 36 RHP YUSMEIRO PETIT

**Last Outing:** 7/20 at Minnesota (ND, 0.1 ip, h, r, er)  
**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-1  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 40/10 **First Hitters:** 8-48, bb

- Has not allowed a run in 13 of his last 17 games (4 er in 15.1 ip) dating back to June 15 after logging a 4.40 ERA (7 er in 14.1 ip) over his previous 12 games.
- Is first among American League relievers in games pitched (50) and ranks third in fewest walks per nine innings (1.01), fourth in innings pitched (53.2), and fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.229).
- Has allowed just one earned run over 5.2 innings pitched against the Astros this season...overall is 2-2 with a 4.29 ERA (17 er in 35.2 ip) in 21 career games against Houston.

**Last Year:** Pitched in a team-leading and career-high 74 games in his first season in Oakland and was 7-3 with a 3.00 ERA and .221 opponents average...the wins were also a career high and his ERA was second lowest to his 2.76 with the Angels in 2017.

### 54 RHP BRIAN SCHLITZER

**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-0  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/2 **First Hitters:** 2-4, bb

- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas and made his A's debut on June 22... it was his first Major League appearance since June 14, 2015.
- Made his Major League debut in 2010 and has pitched in part of three seasons with Chicago-NL.
- Has allowed four earned runs in four career innings pitched against Houston (9.00 ERA).
- Was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in saves at the time of his promotion...his complete 2019 stats with the Aviators:

**Last Year:** Spent the entire season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization where he went 7-2 with 21 saves and a 3.36 ERA in 58 relief appearances...surrendered just two home runs in 67.0 innings...ranked second in the PCL in saves.

### 48 RHP JOAKIM SORIA

**Last Outing:** 7/21 at Minnesota (ND, 1.0 ip, so)  
**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-2  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 3/0 **First Hitters:** 11-43, 2 bb

- Dating back to June 15, 13 of his last 16 outings have been scoreless and he has compiled a 1.84 ERA (3 er in 14.2 ip) with 20 strikeouts while holding opponents to a .167 batting average (9-for-54) over that span.
- Owns a 1.40 ERA (4 er, 25.2 ip) in 24 A's wins and an 8.27 ERA (19 er, 20.2 ip) in 20 A's losses.
- Is 1-2 with three saves and a 2.39 ERA (7 er in 26.1 ip) over 28 games against the Astros.
- His 685 career games pitched are the most in Major League history by a Mexican-born pitcher.

**Last Year:** Began the season with the Chicago White Sox and had 16 saves and a 2.56 ERA in 40 relief appearances when he was traded to Milwaukee July 26...went 3-1 with a 4.09 ERA in 26 outings with the Brewers and combined for a 3.12 ERA overall.

### 39 RHP BLAKE TREINEN

**Last Outing:** 7/20 at Minnesota (W, 0.2 ip, h, 2 bb)  
**Saves/Opportunities:** 16-18  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 6/1 **First Hitters:** 4-28, 7 bb, hbp

- Was reinstated from the 10-day injured list July 3 after making one rehab appearance with Triple-A Las Vegas against Reno (1.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 hr)...was placed on the IL June 23 retroactive to June 21 with a strained right shoulder.
- Has converted each of his 10 save opportunities over his last 21 games but has a 6.20 ERA (20.1 ip, 23 h, 15 r, 14 er, 16 bb, hb, 16 so) over that span.
- Is seventh in the American League in saves (16)...has 67 career saves with the A's, good for seventh on the Oakland career list (Isringhausen, 75).
- Is 2-2 with four saves and a 2.45 ERA (3 er in 11.0 ip) over 10 career games against the Astros.

**Last Year:** Went 9-2 with a career-high 38 saves, a career-low 0.78 ERA and a career-high 100 strikeouts to become the first pitcher in Major League history to save 30 games, compile an ERA under 1.00 and strikeout 100 batters.

### 62 RHP LOU TRIVINO

**Last Outing:** 7/21 at Minnesota (ND, 2.0 ip, h, bb)  
**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-4  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 20/4 **First Hitters:** 10-40, 4 bb

- Was 2-0 with a 2.42 ERA in his first 25 appearances (March 20-May 27)... was 1-5 with a 11.70 ERA in 11 appearances from May 29-June 21...since then, has allowed just two earned runs in eight games (8.2 ip).
- Has a .238 (19-for-80) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .293 (27-for-92) against left-handers.
- Has a 6.28 ERA (10 er in 14.1 ip) over 12 career games against the Astros.

**Last Year:** Pitched in 69 games in his Major League debut and went 8-3 with four saves, a 2.92 ERA and .201 opponents batting average over two stints with the A's...tied for the lead among AL rookies in saves and ranked second in games pitched.

- First Major League win on July 4 vs. Minnesota with 2.1 shutout frames.
- Has allowed four runs over his last 10 games (13.2 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 8 bb, 7 so, 2 hr) after allowing no runs over his first six appearances (8.1 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 6 so, 0 hr).
- Has held left-handed hitters to a .132 (5-for-38) batting average compared to .222 (8-for-36) against right-handers.
- Has thrown 2.2 scoreless innings in his two career appearances against Houston.
- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas on May 25 after going 1-1 with one save, a 3.75 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 16 games with the Aviators.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas June 30 for his second stint with the A's this year and has started 10 of the A's 16 games at second base since his return...is 5-for-38 (.132) with 15 strikeouts...entered the game on Sunday as a pinch runner and ultimately scored.
- Hit a three-run home run last Saturday and four of his nine career home runs have been three-run shots.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Tokyo on March 21 as a pinch runner...did not bat and was optioned to Las Vegas March 28.
- Hit .358 with 10 home runs, 39 RBI, a .698 slugging percentage and 1.096 OPS over his last 40 games with the Aviators after batting .209 with two home runs and nine RBI over his first 33 contests.
- Was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in runs scored (65) at the time of his promotion...was also tied for second in doubles (24), tied for fifth in extra base hits (41) and tied for seventh in triples (5)...started 40 games at second base, 23 at shortstop and nine in center field...his complete stats with Las Vegas:

**Last Year:** Had six stints with Oakland and batted .233 with five home runs and 16 RBI in 32 games...hit a career-high 18 home runs with Triple-A Nashville, which ranked third in the A's farm system despite just 77 games in the minors.

**Road Trip:** 4-20, 3 r, 2b, hr, 3 rbi, 3 so

- Has started 15 of the A's 17 games in right field since Piscotty went on the injured list June 30 and is 16-for-58 (.276) with 13 runs and nine walks (.400 on-base percentage) in 16 games total over that span since June 30.
- Has started games at five different positions (20 in right field, 11 at first base, 11 at designated hitter, eight in left field, five in center field)...the A's are 38-17 (.691) with him in the starting lineup.
- Walked twice Saturday and now has 34 for the season, which matches his career high set in 122 games last year.
- Was on the 10-day injured list from April 29 to May 12 with a sprained right wrist.

**Last Year:** Started games at five different positions for the A's and batted .249 with a career-high 17 home runs and 52 RBI in 122 games...hit 13 of his home runs against left-handed pitchers, which tied for second in the American League.

## 26 MATT CHAPMAN

**Current Streak:** 2 games (3 for 7)  
**Houston Series:** 1-2, r, 2b, so  
**Road Trip:** 3-11, r, 2 2b, bb, 5 so

- Had five RBI Tuesday night for his second career game of five or more RBI... had a six RBI game earlier this year on June 30 at Los Angeles (AL)...has 15 RBI over his last 16 games.
- Is 12-for-27 (.444) since the All-Star Break and is now batting .352 (37-for-105) with 23 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, six home runs and 23 RBI over his last 30 games (.429 obp, .686 slug, 1.114 OPS) dating back to June 14.
- Ranks fourth in the American League in extra base hits (52), sixth in slugging (.549), fifth in total bases (201), tied for fifth in doubles (27), 10th in OPS (.911), tied for ninth in home runs (22), and tied for 10th in multiple hit games (31)...is also tied for ninth in games played (98).
