OAKLAND ATHLETICS (57-44) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (65-37)

TUESDAY, JULY 23, 2019 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 P.M. CDT RHP MIKE FIERS (9-3, 3.64) VS. LHP WADE MILEY (8-4, 3.25) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KTRB 860 AM/KHTK 1140 AM) — A'S CAST ON TUNEIN

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost back-to-back games for the first time since they were swept in the day/night doubleheader at Texas on June 8...have not lost more than two straight since losing five in a row from May 28-June 2...have won eight of the last 11 games and 14 of the last 19 and are 21-8 (.724) dating back to June 17...are 57-44 (.570) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...have a run differential of +87, which is fourth best in the AL and fifth best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the 18th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 7½ games...have the second Wild Card spot, one game ahead of Tampa Bay and two games behind first place Cleveland...split a four-game series with Minnesota over the weekend to snap a streak of six consecutive series wins...are unbeaten over the previous nine series (seven wins, two splits) and have not lost a series since dropping two of three to Seattle June 14-16...have spent 26 days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

SINCE MAY 16: The A's are 38-19 (.667) dating back to May 16, which is tied with the Yankees and Dodgers for the best record in the majors over that span...have a 3.86 ERA (223 er in 519.1 ip), which is second lowest to the Dodgers (3.20)...rank second in the majors in home runs (107) and extra base hits (235), fourth in runs (333) and doubles (120) and fifth in slugging (.488) and OPS (.816)...have outscored the opposition 333-237 for a run differential of +96.

SINCE THE BREAK: The A's are 7-3 (.700) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the second best record in the American League (Cleveland, 8-3)...are batting .279 (95-for-340) with 60 runs (6.0 per game), 21 doubles, three triples and 18 home runs...rank second in the AL in slugging (.518) and OPS (.867) and fourth in batting...have a 4.00 ERA (39 er in 87.2 ip), which ranks fifth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 18-8 (.692) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 39-36 (.520) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (23-7)... are batting .270 with an .824 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .242 with a .752 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the American League and the fourth lowest batting average against righties...have the second most home runs off lefties (49).

THE LONG BALL: The A's had their streak of 21 consecutive games with a home run end yesterday...it was the second longest streak in Athletics history and fell two short of the record of 23 (July 2-27, 1996)...hit 42 home runs during the streak...have not gone homerless in back-to-back games since May 4-5 at Pittsburgh...Josh Phegley hit his 10th home run of the season Sunday, giving the A's eight players with 10 or more home runs...only the Twins (10), Astros (9) and Yankees (9) have more...the Athletics record is nine (2000 and 2017)... Ramón Laureano hit his 20th home run of the season Saturday, giving the A's three players with 20 or more home runs...only the Cubs (4) have more...the Athletics record is five (six times, last: 2018)...have 163 home runs for the season, which ranks seventh in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's were held to a season-low two hits last night, both doubles...it marked the first time they have not had a single in a game since May 26, 2018 against Arizona...now have a streak of 82 consecutive games with an extra base hit, which is fifth longest in Oakland history...it is the longest since an 86-game streak from July 28, 2017-April 27, 2018...rank fourth in the American League in extra base hits (360) and fifth in runs (527), home runs (163) and slugging (.448)...are tied for the third fewest strikeouts (792)...are tied for the fewest sacrifice hits (2), rank third in hit by pitches (50) and fourth in most grounded into double plays (85)...A's pinch hitters are tied for the AL lead in doubles (5), rank second in hits (15), RBI (16), extra base hits (8) and plate appearances (65), third in home runs (3) and tied for third in walks (7).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.33 ERA (30 er in 42.2 ip) in the first five games of the road trip...have walked 27 batters in 42.2 innings (5.70 per nine innings) and surrendered 11 home runs (2.32 per nine innings)...however, have a 3.48 ERA (76 er in 196.2 ip) over the last 22 contests...overall, rank second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.402) and fewest home runs (118), third in OPS (.715) and fourth in opponents batting average (.244).

STARTING PITCHING: The loss by Homer Bailey yesterday was the first by an A's starter since July 6 at Seattle (Bassitt)...A's starting pitchers are now 11-2 with a 3.90 ERA (47 er in 108.1 ip) over the last 19 games...have 42 wins for the season, which is tied for second most in the majors to the Astros (43)... rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.410) and fourth in OPS (.721).

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been caught stealing 30 times, which is the most in the majors...however, they have stolen 61 bases, which is tied for fourth most...pitchers have 10 pickoffs, which is tied for fourth...on offense, the A's are 33-for-49 (67.3%) in stolen base attempts...have the second lowest stolen base percentage in the American League and the third fewest stolen bases and attempts.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this seven-game road trip to American League Central leading Minnesota (2-2) and AL West leading Houston (0-1)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 21-9 over their last 31 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...went 5-0 on the last homestand against Chicago (3-0) and Seattle (2-0)...it was the A's first perfect homestand of more than three games since going 6-0 against Toronto and San Francisco from July 3-8, 2014...return home following the game tomorrow for a nine-game homestand against Texas (four games), Milwaukee (three games) and St. Louis (two games)...have a season-high six-game home winning streak and have won 13 of the last 15 home games...are 31-20 (.608) at home compared to 26-24 (.520) on the road.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 13 times...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Hundley, Manaea, Piscotty), including four on the 60-day DL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Manaea)...Cotton, Hundley and Manaea are on rehab assignments...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 24-23 (.511) against American League West competition compared to 33-21 (.611) against all other teams...the mark against the West is second best within the division as Houston is 34-11 and everyone else is under .500...last year, the A's went 38-38 (.500) against the West, 59-27 (.686) against all other teams.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 1-8 against the Astros and 56-36 (.609) against all other teams...have been outscored 53-21 (-32) compared to a run differential of +119 against everyone else...are batting .186 (55-for-295) and have a 5.91 ERA (53 er in 80.2 ip)...are 1-4 in Oakland and 0-4 in Houston...now have a five-game losing streak at Minute Maid Park, which matches the A's longest ever in Houston...have lost nine of the last 10 games and 20 of the last 27 overall...have lost 11 of the last 14 in Oakland...lost the season series for the fourth consecutive season last year as they went 7-12 against Houston...went 2-7 in Oakland, which was their worst home mark ever against the Astros, and 5-5 in Houston...are 30-55 (.353) against the Astros over the last five years, which is the second worst mark by an American League team against Houston over that span (Baltimore, 7-23, .233)...are 61-68 all-time, including 32-33 in Oakland and 29-35 in Houston..

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman ranks fourth in the American League in extra base hits (52), tied for fifth in doubles (27), sixth in slugging (.549), tied for ninth in home runs (22) and 10th in OPS (.911)...*Liam Hendriks* had his career-high and A's season-high 20.2-inning scoreless streak snapped Sunday...has the lowest relief ERA in the AL (1.18)...*Ramón Laureano* is batting .411 (23-for-56) with seven doubles, seven home runs and 13 RBI in 16 games in July (.911 slugging percentage)...is tied for second in the AL in extra base hits in July (14), tied for third in doubles and tied for fourth in home runs..... *Marcus Semien* has a consecutive games played streak of 183 (all starts)... the consecutive games *played* streak is fourth longest.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1964** Bert Campaneris homers twice in his major league debut as the A's defeat Minnesota, 4-3...the first home run comes on the first pitch he sees from Jim Kaat...in **1976** Vida Blue tosses a six-hit shutout and strikes out 13 in the A's 2-0 win over Kansas City to record his 100th career victory... he would go on to win 124 games in an Oakland uniform, second only to Catfish Hunter's 131...in **1996** Terry Steinbach hits his eighth career grand slam in the A's 8-4 win at Chicago...it was his fifth homer in three days.

PITCHING PROBABLES

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (9-3, 3.64 ERA)

SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK: IS 7-0 with a 2.25 ERA (21 er in 84.0 ip) and .197 (58-for-294) opponents batting average over his last 13 starts dating back to his May 7 no-hitter against Cincinnati...the winning streak is a career high (previous: 6, July 21-Sept. 11, 2018), tied for the second longest active streak in the American League (Workman, BOS 8) and the longest by an A's pitcher over the last six years...the last longer streak is nine by Jarrod Parker from May 28-Sept. 4, 2013...has left with the lead in five of his six no decisions during the streak only to have the bullpen blow the save...his other no decision is the May 19 suspended game at Detroit in which he is the pitcher of record with the A's leading 5-3 in the bottom of the seventh... went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA and .297 opponents batting average over his first eight starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.362), tied for fourth in winning percentage (.750), seventh in OPS (.656) and tied for 10th in wins (9)...also ranks third in the AL in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (5.80), tied for third in wild pitches (9), fifth in fewest pitches per inning (15.5), tied for fifth in games started (21) and tied for eighth in hit batters (7).

LEADERS DATING BACK TO THE NO-HITTER: During his current seven-game winning streak dating back to May 7, he has the lowest ERA (2.25), opponents OPS (.557) and slugging percentage (.293) in the American League... also ranks third in batting average (.197), fourth in on-base percentage (.265) and tied for sixth in wins (7).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 7-1 with a 2.79 ERA (27 er in 87.0 ip) and .212 (67-for-316) opponents batting average in 14 starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 5.82 ERA (22 er in 34.0 ip) and .278 (35-for-126) opponents average in seven starts during the day...has the lowest night OPS (.572) and slugging percentage (.307) in the American League and ranks second in the ERA..

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-2 with a 2.58 ERA (19 er in 66.1 ip) and .206 (49-for-238) opponents batting average in 11 starts at home compared to 3-1 with a 4.94 ERA (30 er in 54.2 ip) and .260 (53-for-204) opponents average in 10 starts on the road...has the lowest home opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.307), ranks second in OPS (.576), tied for third in wins and fourth in ERA...is now 10-3 with a 2.91 ERA (41 er in 126.2 ip) and .213 (92-for-432) opponents batting average in 22 career appearances, 21 starts, in the Coliseum.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 4-1 with a 5.28 ERA (27 er in 46.0 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition compared to 5-2 with a 2.64 ERA (22 er in 75.0 ip) in 12 starts against all other teams...is now 13-14 with a 5.46 ERA (151 er in 249.0 ip) in 47 career appearances against the AL West, 50-44 with a 3.52 ERA (301 er in 770.0 ip) in 146 games against all other teams.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-1 with a 4.79 ERA (19 er in 35.2 ip) in seven starts on four days rest, 5-0 with a 2.62 ERA (19 er in 65.1 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest and 2-2 with a 4.95 ERA (11 er in 20.0 ip) in four starts on six days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has not allowed a home run in his last six starts after surrendering 15 over his first 15...has surrendered five home runs in 227 at bats against left-handed hitters, 10 in 215 at bats against right-handers...10 of the 15 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...walked three batters to lead off an inning in his last start after walking just five batters to lead off an inning over his first 20 starts...opponents are hitting .147 (5-for-34) with runners in scoring and two outs.

APRIL AND BEYOND: Went 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts in April but is 7-1 with a 2.43 ERA (24 er in 89.0 ip) and .203 (63-for-310) opponents average in 14 starts since then...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in 25 career appearances in April and 50-35 with a 3.42 ERA (282 er in 742.0 ip) from May through August.

THIS AND THAT: Had eight wins at the All-Star Break, which are his most ever before the break (had six in 2016 and 2018)...has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his last 15 starts...is 14-5 with a 3.72 ERA (72 er in 174.0 ip) in 31 games, including 30 starts, since he was acquired by Oakland Aug. 6, 2018... the wins are tied for fourth most in the American League over that span... went 4-0 with a 2.30 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in five starts in June...it was the third time in his career he won four games in a month (4-2 in Aug. 2012 and 4-1 in Aug. 2014)...had the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League in June (.283), tied for the lead in wins, had the fourth lowest OPS (.561) and ranked fifth in ERA.

NO-HITTER: Tossed his second career no-hitter May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati to become the 34th pitcher in Major League history with multiple regular season no-hitters...is the seventh with a no-hitter for multiple teams...with the acquisition of Homer Bailey on July 12 the A's become the

sixth team in Major League history with two pitchers with multiple no-hitter on their roster...the last was the 1988 Houston Astros (Bob Forsch and Nolan Ryan)...was named American League Co-Player of the Week with George Springer May 13...it was his second career Player of the Week honor with the first coming Aug. 23, 2015 following his first no-hitter...this no-hitter was the 13th in Athletics history, including the eighth in Oakland history.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 loss at Minnesota last Thursday...walked a season-high tying four batters...allowed a run to score in the third inning on a wild pitch but Oakland tied the game in the fourth and scored twice in the sixth to take a 3-1 lead...was relieved by Petit with runners on first and second and one out in the seventh and he allowed a three-run ome run to Rosario for the blown save and loss.

Astros from 2015-17 and is 10-11 with 3.95 ERA (93 er in 212.0 ip) in 37 career appearances, all starts, at Minute Maid Park...is 0-0 with an 8.64 ERA (8.1 ip, 11 h, 8 r, 8 er, 7 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year...the first no decision came in a 9-8 A's loss at Houston on April 7...tossed 1.2 innings, which matched the shortest start of his career (June 2, 2013 at Philadelphia)...allowed five runs in the bottom of the first on RBI singles by Brantley and Correa and a three-run home run by Diaz...also walked Diaz with two outs and the bases loaded in the bottom of the second...the A's came back to take an 8-6 lead to get him off the hook before the bullpen allowed three runs over the final two innings for the loss...then had a no decision in a 3-2 A's loss in Oakland on May 31...blanked the Astros on three hits and two walks and had a 2-0 lead entering the seventh...allowed a solo home run to Reddick and walked White with two outs...was relieved by Trivino who allowed a Kemp RBI double for the blown save.

RHP Chris Bassitt (7-4, 3.96 ERA): Is 5-3 with a 5.14 ERA and .242 opponents average over his last 11 starts after going 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first five starts...is averaging 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings over his last 11 starts after averaging 10.47 over his first five...has a run support average of 6.80, which is seventh highest in the American League among pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched...had a 2.67 RSA in his career as a starter entering this season...has allowed a .190 batting average with runners in scoring position...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-3 A's win at Minnesota last Friday (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 1-0 with a 3.27 ERA (22.0 ip, 16 h, 10 r, 8 er, 7 bb, 15 so, 2 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, against Houston...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-4 A's loss in 12 innings in Oakland on June 2 (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so).
