## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-44) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (65-38)

WEDNESDAY, JULY 24, 2019 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 1:10 P.M. CDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's beat the Astros last night by a score of 4-3 in 11 innings, snapping a two-game losing streak...had lost back-to-back games for the first time since they were swept in the day/night doubleheader at Texas on June 8...have not lost more than two straight since losing five in a row from May 28-June 2...have won nine of the last 12 games and 15 of the last 20 and are 22-8 (.733) dating back to June 17...are 58-44 (.570) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...have a run differential of +88, which is fourth best in the AL and fifth best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the 19th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 6½ games...have the second Wild Card spot, two games ahead of Tampa Bay and Boston, and one game behind first place Cleveland...split a four-game series with Minnesota over the weekend to snap a streak of six consecutive series wins...are unbeaten over the previous nine series (seven wins, two splits) and have not lost a series since dropping two of three to Seattle June 14-16...have spent 27 days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

**SINCE MAY 16:** The A's are 39-19 (.672) dating back to May 16, which is tied with the Yankees and for the best record in the majors over that span...have a 3.84 ERA (226 er in 530.1 ip), which is second lowest to the Dodgers (3.24)...rank tied for second in the majors in home runs (108), third in extra base hits (237), fourth in runs (337), tied for fourth in doubles (121), fifth in slugging (.484), and seventh in OPS (.811)...have outscored the opposition 337-240 for a run differential of +97.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 19-8 (.704) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 39-36 (.520) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (23-7)...are batting .266 with an .810 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .242 with a .753 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the American League and the fourth lowest batting average against righties...have the second most home runs off lefties (49).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's had their streak of 21 consecutive games with a home run end Monday...it was the second longest streak in Athletics history and fell two short of the record of 23 (July 2-27, 1996)...hit 42 home runs during the streak...hit a home run yesterday...have not gone homerless in back-to-back games since May 4-5 at Pittsburgh...Josh Phegley hit his 10th home run of the season Sunday, giving the A's eight players with 10 or more home runs...only the Twins (10), Astros (9) and Yankees (9) have more...the Athletics record is nine (2000 and 2017)...Ramón Laureano hit his 20th home run of the season Saturday, giving the A's three players with 20 or more home runs...only the Cubs (4) have more...the Athletics record is five (six times, last: 2018)...have 164 home runs for the season, which ranks seventh in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's were held to a season-low two hits Monday night, both doubles...it marked the first time they have not had a single in a game since May 26, 2018 against Arizona...homered and doubled yesterday...now have a streak of 83 consecutive games with an extra base hit, which is fifth longest in Oakland history...it is the longest since an 86-game streak from July 28, 2017-April 27, 2018...rank fourth in the American League in extra base hits (362) and sixth in runs (531), fifth in home runs (164) and slugging (.447)...are tied for the third fewest strikeouts (800)...are tied for the fewest sacrifice hits (2), rank third in hit by pitches (50) and fourth in most grounded into double plays (86)...A's pinch hitters are tied for the AL lead in doubles (5), rank second in hits (16), RBI (16), extra base hits (8), tied for first in plate appearances (67), third in home runs (3), and tied for third in walks (7).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 5.53 ERA (33 er in 53.2 ip) in the first six games of the road trip...have walked 29 batters in 53.2 innings (4.86 per nine innings) and surrendered 12 home runs (2.01 per nine innings)...however, have a 3.42 ERA (79 er in 207.2 ip) over the last 23 contests...overall, rank second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.401) and fewest home runs (119), third in OPS (.713), and fourth in opponents batting average (.243).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Mike Fiers pitched 7.2 innings yesterday, allowing only two runs...was the first time an A's starter lasted more than seven innings since July 12 when Fiers pitched 7.2 IP at home against Chicago-AL...was just the eighth time this season an A's starter pitched more than 7.0 innings...the loss by Homer Bailey on Monday was the first by an A's starter since July 6 at Seattle (Bassitt)...A's starting pitchers are now 12-2 with a 3.80 ERA (49 er in 116.0 ip) over the last 20 games...have 42 wins for the season, which is tied for second most in the majors to the Astros (43)...rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.410) and fourth in OPS (.720).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-3 on this seven-game road trip to American League Central leading Minnesota (2-2) and AL West leading Houston (1-1)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Seattle and are now 22-9 over their last 32 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...went 5-0 on the last homestand against Chicago (3-0) and Seattle (2-0)...it was the A's first perfect homestand of more than three games since going 6-0 against Toronto and San Francisco from July 3-8, 2014...return home following the game today for a nine-game homestand against Texas (four games), Milwaukee (three games) and St. Louis (two games)...have a season-high six-game home winning streak and have won 13 of the last 15 home games...are 31-20 (.608) at home compared to 27-24 (.529) on the road.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 13 times...currently have six players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Hundley, Manaea, Piscotty), including four on the 60-day DL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Manaea)...Cotton, Hundley and Manaea are on rehab assignments...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 25-23 (.521) against American League West competition compared to 33-21 (.611) against all other teams...the mark against the West is second best within the division as Houston is 34-12 and everyone else is under .500...last year, the A's went 38-38 (.500) against the West, 59-27 (.686) against all other teams.

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's are 2-8 against the Astros and 56-36 (.609) against all other teams...have been outscored 56-25 (-31) compared to a run differential of +119 against everyone else...are 1-4 in Oakland and 1-4 in Houston...snapped a five-game losing streak at Minute Maid Park, which matched the A's longest ever in Houston...have lost nine of the last 11 games and 20 of the last 28 overall...have lost 11 of the last 14 in Oakland...lost the season series for the fourth consecutive season last year as they went 7-12 against Houston...went 2-7 in Oakland, which was their worst home mark ever against the Astros, and 5-5 in Houston...are 31-55 (.360) against the Astros over the last five years, which is the second worst mark by an American League team against Houston over that span (Baltimore, 7-23, .233)...are 62-68 all-time, including 32-33 in Oakland and 30-35 in Houston.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** ranks fourth in the American League in extra base hits (52), tied for sixth in doubles (27), sixth in slugging (.546), tied for ninth in home runs (22), and 11th in OPS (.909)...**Liam Hendriks** had his career-high and A's season-high 20.2-inning scoreless streak snapped Sunday...has the lowest relief ERA in the AL (1.18)...**Ramón Laureano** is batting .410 (25-for-61) with eight doubles, seven home runs, and 14 RBI in 17 games in July (.885 slugging percentage)...is second in the AL in extra base hits in July (15), tied for second in doubles and tied for fourth in home runs...**Marcus Semien** has a consecutive games played streak of 184 (all starts)...the consecutive games *played* streak is seventh longest in Oakland history and the consecutive games *started* streak is fourth longest.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1990** Dave Henderson, Mark McGwire and Mike Gallego each homered in the sixth inning of the A's 5-3 win against California...it is the third time in 1990 that the A's hit three homers in one inning...in **1999** Jason Giambi hits a pair of three-run home runs in a game at Kansas City and has six RBI...he hit a grand slam against the Royals the night before...in **2018**, the A's trail 10-2 after six innings at Texas but come back to win 13-10 in 10 innings...Jed Lowrie, Khris Davis, Stephen Piscotty and Mark Canha homered, giving the A's a Major League record tying three consecutive games with four or more home runs.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (7-4, 3.96 ERA)

**LAST 11 STARTS:** Is 5-3 with a 5.14 ERA (32 er in 56.0 ip) and .242 (52-for-215) opponents average over his last 11 starts after going 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first five starts...is averaging 7.23 (45 so in 56.0 ip) strikeouts per nine innings over his last 11 starts after averaging 10.47 over his first five.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has a run support average of 6.80 (67 rs in 88.2 ip), which is seventh highest in the American League among pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched...had a 2.67 RSA in his career as a starter entering this season... has received two runs of support or fewer in eight of his 16 starts this year and is 1-4 in those games...has received two runs of support or fewer in 32 of his 46 career starts and is 3-18 in those games...is 8-0 in 14 career starts with run support of three runs or more.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are batting .177 (22-for-124) the first time through the lineup, .271 (35-for-129) the second time and .203 (16-for-79) after that...has allowed a .190 (12-for-63) batting average with runners in scoring position...has held the opponents first, second and third hitters in the order to a .198 (25-for-126) average...has surrendered 10 of his 12 home runs and issued 25 of his 36 walks to left-handed hitters...has issued the fifth most walks against lefties in the American League...nine of his 12 home runs have come on the road

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 3.18 ERA (17 er in 48.0 ip) and .183 (32-for-175) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game compared to a 4.87 ERA (22 er in 40.2 ip) and .261 (41-for-157) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 5-1 with a 2.82 ERA (16 er in 51.0 ip) and .198 (37-for-187) opponents batting average in eight starts during the day compared to 2-3 with a 5.50 ERA (23 er in 37.2 ip) and .248 (36-for-145) opponents average in eight starts at night...is tied for fourth in the American League in wins in day games...was 0-8 in 15 career day games entering the season.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** Is 3-3 with a 5.30 ERA (22 er in 37.1 ip) in seven starts against American League West teams compared to 4-1 with a 2.98 ERA (17 er in 51.1 ip) in nine starts against all other teams.

**CAREER BESTS:** Has seven wins this year, which is three more than his career total in 40 games (30 starts) entering this season...also has career highs in strikeouts (83), games started (16), innings pitched (88.2), runs (41), earned runs (39), home runs (12) and walks (36)...his 16 games are two short of his best of 18 from 2015.

**PRE AND POST "TOMMY JOHN":** Is 9-7 with a 3.63 ERA (55 er in 136.1 ip) and .220 (113-for-513) opponents batting average in 27 games (23 starts) since undergoing "Tommy John" surgery May 6, 2016...is averaging 8.19 strikeouts per nine innings (124 so in 136.1 ip)...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA, .263 opponents batting average and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

**2019 HIGHLIGHTS:** Made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contusion...went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA in three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16...was recalled by Oakland the next day when Marco Estrada went on the injured list...made his first start April 22 against Texas and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings for the win...struck out a season-high nine in his second start April 28 at Toronto (also May 9 against Cincinnati)...however, had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss in 11 innings...left his third start on May 4 at Pittsburgh after five innings with a 4-3 lead but Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss...allowed a season-high seven hits (also July 6 at Seattle) and took the loss on May 9 against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a three-game streak dating back to last year...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...the loss was his first since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits in a 17-3 win at Detroit on May 16...walked a career-high six batters in 3.2 innings in a no decision at Cleveland May 21...is the first Major League pitcher since at least 1908 with a pitching line of 3.2 innings, three hits, three runs, three earned runs, six walks and six strikeouts...allowed three runs on four hits and four walks in a season-low 3.1 innings at St. Louis on June 25 but had a no decision in the A's 7-3 win...allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high tying seven hits in 4.1 innings in a 6-3 loss at Seattle July 6.

**LAST START:** He won his second consecutive start in the A's 5-3 win at Minnesota last Friday...Oakland scored twice in the first but he allowed an unearned run in the second and a two-run home run to Gonzalez in the third...the A's scored once if the fifth to tie the game and two more times in the
