OAKLAND ATHLETICS (64-49) VS. CHICAGO CUBS (61-51)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped last night but have won six of the last eight games...are 14-8 (.667) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth best record in the American League, and 28-13 (.683) dating back to June 17...are 64-49 (.566) for the season and the 15 games over .500 is one short of the season high of 16 (64-48 on Aug. 4)...have the sixth best record in the AL but the eighth best in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the 32nd consecutive day and trail first place Houston by nine games...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since June 19 when they were also nine back...are ½ game behind Tampa Bay for the second Wild Card spot for the fifth consecutive day...have spent 40 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

SINCE MAY 16: The A's are 45-24 (.652) dating back to May 16, which is the third best record in the majors over that span...have a 3.94 ERA (275 er in 628.1 ip), which is fourth best...the offense ranks fifth in extra base hits (268), tied for fifth in home runs (122), sixth in runs (382) and seventh in slugging (.470).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher in each of the final two games of this series after facing just one south paw over the previous 18 games (Wade Miley on July 23)...have faced just six lefties over the previous 43 games and have won five of those six games...have 27 games against left-handed starters for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are 19-8 (.704) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 45-41 (.523) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (25-7)...are batting .268 with an .817 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .238 with a .745 OPS against right-handers...rank third in the AL in batting average, OPS and home runs (52) off lefties but have the third lowest batting average against righties.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 6-5 last night to fall to 18-13 (.581) in one-run games...the wins are tied for the most in the American League and the record and games (31) rank third...12 of the A's last 16 games have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 31-24 (.564) in games decided by two runs or fewer and the 55 games are the most in the AL...rank second in the majors in walk-off wins (8) and tied for second in walk-off losses (7)...are tied for second in the AL in extra inning games (11), rank third in losses when leading after seven innings (6) and tied for third in last at bat losses (14) and extra inning losses (7).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 9-5 (.643) in interleague play, which is the eighth best mark in the majors (2-1 vs. Cincinnati, 1-2 vs. Pittsburgh, 4-0 vs. St. Louis, 2-1 vs. Milwaukee, 0-1 vs. Chicago)...need two more wins to clinch a winning record against the National League for the second consecutive season and 14th time in 23 seasons of interleague play...A's pitchers have the second lowest opponents batting average (.215), slugging percentage (.339) and OPS (.620) and rank third in ERA (2.86) and on-base percentage (.280)...after this three-game series with the Cubs, the A's will conclude interleague play with a pair of two-game series against the Giants (at San Francisco, Aug. 13-14 and at Oakland Aug. 24-25).

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 2-for-12 (.167) with two walks and four strikeouts this year and are batting .086 (36-for-420) with four doubles, 12 RBI, 14 walks and 195 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is second lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .079)...the last home run by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

IN THE PINCH: Nick Martini hit the A's fifth pinch home run of the season last night, which is tied for third most in Oakland history (8 in 1970, 6 in 2013)...it was the 11th extra base hit, which is tied for fourth (13 in 1968, 12 in 1972 and 1978)...the A's lead the American League in RBI (22), are tied for the lead in doubles (6), home runs and extra base hits, rank second in hits

(20) and plate appearances (77) and third in walks (10)...A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 15 (.533) with three walks, two home runs and eight RBI and are batting .313 (20-for-64) for the season.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this eight-game, one-hotel road trip to Chicago-NL (0-1), Chicago-AL (three games) and San Francisco (two games)...it marks the first time the A's have played consecutive series in Chicago...went 3-4 on the last road trip to AL Central leading Minnesota (2-2) and AL West leading Houston (1-2)...are 22-11 over their last 34 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Texas (2-2), Milwaukee (2-1) and St. Louis (2-0)...are 37-23 (.617) at home compared to 27-26 (.509) on the road.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.33 ERA (20 er in 54.0 ip) over the last six games and a 4.08 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...also rank second in fewest home runs (133), third in opponents slugging percentage (.402), fourth in OPS (.715) and batting average (.243) and fifth in on-base percentage (.313)...A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in six of the last seven games (11 er in 41.2 ip, 2.38 ERA) and are now 19-9 with a 3.91 ERA (106 er in 244.0 ip) over the last 43 contests...are 45-29 with a 4.11 ERA (284 er in 622.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the AL in wins and fifth in ERA.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .203 (84-for-414) with a .360 slugging percentage (20 doubles, 15 home runs) and average of 3.8 runs per game (50 runs) over the last 13 games after batting .262 with a .493 slugging percentage and 5.8 runs per game over the previous 57 contests...overall, rank fifth in the American League in home runs (178) and have the third fewest strikeouts (898)...rank second in hit by pitches (58) and fewest sacrifice hits (3) and third in grounded into double plays (96).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have tied the Athletics record for most players with 10 or more home runs with nine (2000 and 2017)...can break the record with one home run from Stephen Piscotty, who has nine...are one of nine teams in the majors with nine players with 10 or more home runs and only Minnesota (11) has more...the A's have hit 178 home runs, which is seventh most in the majors and 13th most in Oakland history (12th is 186 in 2013).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 13-4 (.765) on Tuesday's, which is the best record in the majors...have used the injured list 15 times after using it at least 23 times in each of the previous four seasons...currently have five players on the IL (Estrada, Gossett, Laureano, Manaea, Phegley)...A's opponents have been caught stealing 32 times, which is tied with Philadelphia for the most in the majors.

A'S IN JULY: The A's went 15-9 (.625) in July, which was the third best record in the American League and the eighth best July in Oakland history...it was the second consecutive season the A's finished with a winning record in July (went 17-8 last year)...ranked third in the AL with a 4.09 ERA and .746 OPS...A's pitchers had the fewest strikeouts (171), the third fewest walks (67) and are tied for the third most saves (7)...the offense hit 38 home runs, which is fifth most in July in Oakland history and the most since 2000 (44).

A'S vs. CUBS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2019 last night and now have a four-game losing streak against the Cubs as they were swept in a three-game series in their last meeting in Oakland in 2016...this is the A's first trip to Wrigley Field since 2010 when they lost two of three...are 4-9 against the Cubs during the regular season...that includes 2-4 in Oakland and 2-5 in Chicago...the two clubs have also met twice in the World Series, with the A's winning in five games in both 1910 and 1929.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has a career-high tying 24 home runs, which are the most among American League third basemen...**Liam Hendriks** has struck out at least one batter in each of his last 24 games, which is the longest streak by an A's reliever since at least 1908...**Matt Olson** leads AL first basemen in home runs (22)...**Marcus Semien** ranks fifth in the AL in runs (84), seventh in hits (127) and walks (62) and ninth in doubles (29).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1923 Joe Hauser has five hits and Sammy Hale and Bing Miller add four each as the A's collect 22 hits in a 14-4 win over Chicago...in 1933 Pinky Higgins hits for the cycle in the A's 12-8 win over the Washington Senators...in 2001 the A's defeat the Tigers 6-3 to complete a four-game sweep of Detroit, their first four-game sweep of the Tigers since July 1-3, 1955.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (9-7, 4.04 ERA)

LAST SIX STARTS: Is 2-2 with a 3.52 ERA (15 er in 38.1 ip) and .237 (33-for-139) opponents batting average over his last six starts...went 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA and .222 opponents average over his first four starts and was 4-5 with a 4.87 and .283 opponents average over his next 12 starts from April 27-June 23.

WITH THE BAT: Went 2-for-3 against Pittsburgh May 3 to become just the third Oakland pitcher in the designated hitter era with a two-hit game (Tommy Milone, June 3, 2013; Edgar Gonzalez, June 19, 2009)...is just the fourth Oakland pitcher with two hits in a season since 1973 (Haren, 2005; Gonzalez, 2009; Milone, 2013)...has three career hits as an Athletic which ties Milone and Tim Hudson for the most by an A's pitcher in the DH era...is now 10-for-82 (.122) with a run, three doubles, five RBI, six walks, 46 strikeouts and 10 sacrifice hits in his career...including 3-for-11 (.273) with two strikeouts as an Athletic.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-1 with a 3.79 ERA (19.0 ip, 17 h, 8 r, 8 er, 7 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in three interleague starts this year...however, is 2-8 with a 5.38 ERA (44 er in 73.2 ip) and .313 (94-for-300) opponents batting average in 14 career interleague starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 7-4 with a 3.34 ERA (32 er in 86.1 ip) and .228 (74-for-324) opponents batting average in 14 starts at night compared to 2-3 with a 5.53 ERA (25 er in 40.2 ip) and .319 (52-for-163) opponents average in eight starts during the day...ranks sixth in the American League in OPS at night (.644), eighth in ERA and tied for ninth in wins.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 14 home runs over his last 14 starts and 84.0 innings after surrendering just one home run over his first eight starts and 43.0 innings...has yielded 15 home runs overall and his average of 1.06 home runs per nine innings is eighth lowest in the American League...12 of the 15 home runs are solo shots.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 7-5 with a 3.24 ERA (32 er in 89.0 ip) in 15 starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-2 with a 5.92 ERA (25 er in 38.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received three runs of support or fewer in 12 of his last 14 starts...however, has starts with 16 runs of support and 13 and his season run support average of 6.31 (89 rs in 127.0 ip) is 10th highest in the American League...is 9-3 in 17 starts with run support of two runs or more.

STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out just 64 batters in 127.0 innings and his average of 4.54 strikeouts per nine innings is the lowest mark in the majors (Davies, MIL 5.72)...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.83 is fifth lowest.

THIS AND THAT: Has nine wins, 22 starts and 127.0 innings pitched, all of which are his best totals since 2015 with the Dodgers when he had 10 wins, 31 starts and 180.1 innings...this is the third time in his career he has made 20 or more starts (31 in 2015 with the Dodgers, 30 in 2009 with the A's)...has won 10 games twice: 11 in his rookie season with the A's in 2009 and 10 with Los Angeles (NL) in 2015...was on the paternity list from July 22 to 24...the A's are 14-8 (.636) in his starting assignments.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was one of three inactive pitchers for the opening series in Japan...was slotted in as the A's third starter when the club returned home and made his first start March 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to extend his home scoreless streak to an Oakland record 34.1 innings...broke the previous record of 33.0 set by Matt Keough (Sept. 5, 1979-April 16, 1980)...it is also the longest Athletics home scoreless streak since at least 1908...the streak ended in the first inning of his next start April 4 against Boston, marking the first time he allowed a run in the Coliseum since May 7, 2018...then defeated the Orioles 13-2 at Baltimore on April 9 for his third win in his third start...the only other time in his career he won at least his first two starts in a season was in 2012 when he won his first four starts after missing the first 4½ months of the season following "Tommy John" surgery...was 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA over his first three starts through April 9...then went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his next six starts through May 14...left with a 7-3 lead on April 14 at Texas but Soria blew the save in the eighth inning...it was his first of two starts in which the bullpen blew the save (June 12 at Tampa Bay, Hendriks)...was charged with his first loss of the season April 21 games Toronto when he lasted a season-low 2.2 innings following an ankle injury...it snapped a career-high tying four-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 19, 2018 (fourth time)...went 4-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .243 opponents average during the streak, which spanned seven starts...made his next scheduled start April 27 at Toronto but allowed a season-high 10 hits for his second consecutive loss...finished April 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA and .307 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 3-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in five starts in May...snapped his two-game losing streak May 3 at Pittsburgh when he picked up his 50th career win in the A's 14-1 victory...walked a season-high five and had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 13-inning win over Cincinnati May 8 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter for the sixth time in his career as a starter (number seven came on June 23 against Tampa Bay)...struck out a season-high five but also sur-

rendered a career-high tying three home runs in a 4-3 loss at Seattle on May 14...left his start on May 20 at Cleveland after 5.1 innings with a cervical strain but did not miss a start...picked up the win in that start to begin a six-start stretch through June 18 where he went 3-1 with a 2.70 ERA...tossed a season-high 110 pitches in a 7-1 win over Seattle on May 26...the pitches were his most since June 26, 2015 at Miami (113)...struck out a season-high tying five batters in a no decision on June 7 at Texas...allowed a season-high seven runs on nine hits and two walks in 3.0 innings in an 8-2 loss at Tampa Bay June 23...tossed a season-high 7.2 innings and allowed two hits when he combined with Liam Hendriks on a three-hit shutout in a 4-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) on June 29...was 9-5 with a 3.86 ERA in 18 starts at the All-Star Break...had never won more than five games before the break entering this season...surrendered a career-high tying three home runs July 20 at Minnesota...did not walk a batter in three of his five starts in July and issued just two free passes in 30.2 innings (0.59 per nine innings).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Milwaukee last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a home run to Cain to start the game and then yielded a RBI double to Yelich in the third inning...the A's got one of those runs back in the bottom of the third but he allowed another run in the fourth when Grandal scored on a Moustakas ground out.

RHP Homer Bailey (9-7, 5.20 ERA): Was acquired from Kansas City on July 14 for minor league infielder Kevin Merrell minutes before he was scheduled to start for the Royals against Detroit...is 2-1 with a 6.97 ERA and .307 opponents batting average in four starts with the A's after going 7-6 with a 4.80 ERA and .250 opponents average in 18 starts with Kansas City...is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season tomorrow, which will be his most since 2014 when he also had 23 with Cincinnati...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-3 A's win over Milwaukee last Thursday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...is 8-5 with a 4.86 ERA (113.0 ip, 121 h, 69 r, 61 er, 50 bb, 102 so, 15 hr) in 20 career appearances, all starts, against Chicago...is 0-3 with a 6.91 ERA over his last six starts and has not defeated the Cubs since April 20, 2014...was 0-2 with an 8.38 ERA (9.2 ip, 18 h, 12 r, 9 er, 5 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in two starts last year.

- Have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.391), rank fourth in OPS (.708), fifth in batting average (.241), and fifth in on-base percentage (.318).
- Is 27-for-49 (55.1%) in save opportunities...the 22 blown saves are tied for most in the majors (NYM)...the save percentage is fourth lowest in the majors.
- Has the third fewest home runs (47) and fourth fewest walks (163) among AL bullpens...has the sixth fewest wins (19) and is tied for the fifth most losses (20).
- Has the fourth lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.348) among Major League bullpens.
