OAKLAND ATHLETICS (65-50) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (51-62)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three at Wrigley Field to begin their six-game, seven-day stay in Chicago...have won four of the last six games and seven of the last 10...are 15-9 (.625) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth best record in the American League, and 29-14 (.674) dating back to June 17...are 65-50 (.565) for the season and the 15 games over .500 is one short of the season high of 16 (twice, last: 65-49 on Aug. 6)...have the sixth best record in the AL but the eighth best in the majors...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by 10 games...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since June 18 when they were 10 back...are ½ game behind Tampa Bay for the second Wild Card spot for the eighth consecutive day...have spent 43 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

SINCE MAY 16: The A's are 46-25 (.648) dating back to May 16, which is tied for the third best record in the majors over that span...have a 4.03 ERA (289 er in 645.1 ip), which is sixth best...the offense is tied for fifth in home runs (124), 7th extra base hits (273), sixth in runs (394) and seventh in slugging (.468).

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 15-4 (.789) against American League Central teams and have outscored them 119-65 (+54)...are batting .277 (195-for-704) with 119 runs (5.95 per game) and 35 home runs in 20 games (includes May 19 suspended game)...the pitching staff has a 3.07 ERA (62 er in 181.2 ip) and .238 (160-for-671) opponents batting average...are now 67-23 (.744) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the third consecutive game today after facing just one south paw over the previous 18 games...are 20-9 (.690) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 45-41 (.523) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (25-7) but the 29 games are third fewest in the American League...are batting .267 with an .814 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .238 with a .743 OPS against right-handers...rank third in the AL in home runs off lefties (54) and fifth in batting average and fourth in OPS...have the third lowest batting average against righties.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.12 ERA (96 er in 168.2 ip) over their last 19 games dating back to July 18 and have allowed 30 home runs over that span...have allowed 137 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Tampa Bay, 130)...also rank third in opponents slugging percentage (.405), fourth in batting average (.245) and OPS (.718) and fifth in ERA (4.14) and fourth in on-base percentage (.313).

STARTING PITCHING: Homer Bailey allowed seven runs Wednesday after A's starting pitchers allowed three runs or fewer in each of the previous nine games...starters are 4-2 with a 3.51 ERA (23 er in 59.0 ip) over the last 10 games...are 46-30 with a 4.17 ERA (293 er in 632.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the AL in wins and fifth in ERA...Mike Fiers and Brett Anderson have 10 wins each, marking the first time the A's have two 10-game winners since 2014 (Kazmir and Gray).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .207 (100-for-482) with a .363 slugging percentage (22 doubles, 1 triple, 17 home runs) and an average of 4.1 runs per game (62 runs) over the last 15 games after batting .262 with a .493 slugging percentage and 5.8 runs per game over the previous 57 contests...overall, rank tied for fifth in the American League in home runs (180) and have the third fewest strikeouts (918)...are second in hit by pitches (59), rank second in fewest sacrifice hits (3) and third in grounded into double plays (98).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have set a franchise record for most players with 10 or more home runs with 10...are one of four teams with 10 or more players with 10 or more home runs (Twins 11, Yankees and Blue Jays 10)...have three players with 20 or more home runs and three more with 17 or more...the franchise record for most players with 20 or more home runs is five (six times, last in 2018)...the A's have hit 180 home runs, which is 19th most in the majors and 13th most in Oakland history (12th is 186 in 2013).

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been caught stealing 32 times, which is second most in the majors (Philadelphia, 34)...however, they have stolen 69 bases, which is fourth most...A's pitchers have 11 pickoffs, which is tied for

fifth...on offense, the A's are 38-for-57 (66.7%) in stolen base attempts...have the second lowest stolen base percentage in the American League and the third fewest stolen bases and attempts.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this eight-game, one-hotel road trip to Chicago-NL (1-2), Chicago-AL (three games) and San Francisco (two games)...it marks the first time the A's have played consecutive series in Chicago...went 3-4 on the last road trip to AL Central leading Minnesota (2-2) and AL West leading Houston (1-2)...are 23-12 over their last 36 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Texas (2-2), Milwaukee (2-1) and St. Louis (2-0)...are 37-23 (.617) at home compared to 28-27 (.509) on the road.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 19 (.421) with three walks, two home runs and eight RBI and are batting .294 (20-for-68) for the season...lead the American League in RBI (22), are tied for the lead in doubles (6), home runs (5), extra base hits (11) and plate appearances (81), rank second in hits (20) and third in walks (10)...the five pinch homers are tied for third most in Oakland history (8 in 1970, 6 in 2013) and the 11 extra base hits are tied for fourth (13 in 1968, 12 in 1972 and 1978).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 18-13 (.581) in one-run games, which is the third best record in the American League...are tied with Houston and Texas for the most one-run wins and are third in one-run games (31)...55 of the A's 115 finished games have been decided by two runs or fewer, which are the most in the AL...rank second in the majors in walk-off wins (8) and tied for second in walk-off losses (7)...are third in the AL in losses when leading after seven innings (6) and tied for third in extra inning losses (7) and last at bat losses (14).

THIS AND THAT: The A's had yesterday off, which was their third of four days off over a 15-day stretch from July 29-Aug. 12...are 12-6 (.667) following a day off, which is tied for the third best record in the American League...rank fourth in the AL with a .986 fielding percentage...currently have five players on the injured list (Estrada, Gossett, Laureano, Manaea, Phegley)...have used the IL 15 times this year after using it at least 23 times in each of the previous four seasons...have used just 42 players, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the AL...employed at least 50 players in each of the previous four seasons...are 2-25 when going homerless, which matches Seattle for the fewest wins without homering in the majors...the A's went 15-9 (.625) in July, which was the third best record in the AL and the eighth best July in Oakland history.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland July 12-14...have won each of the previous two season series and are 13-3 against the White Sox over the last three years...have won five of the last seven games in Chicago and have an eight-game winning streak in Oakland, which is the second longest Coliseum winning streak against Chicago in Oakland history (10, May 18, 2001-May 6, 2003)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 315-289 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 167-138 in Oakland and 148-151 in Chicago...including 66-63 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 992-1044 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has a career-high tying 24 home runs, which are the most among American League third basemen...**Liam Hendriks** has struck out at least one batter in each of his last 24 games, which is the longest streak by an A's reliever since at least 1908...**Matt Olson** leads AL first basemen in home runs (22)...**Marcus Semien** has started each of the A's last 197 games, which is tied for the third longest consecutive games started streak in Oakland history...ranks fifth in the AL in runs (86), seventh in hits (130) and walks (63), tied for eighth in doubles (30) and ninth in extra base hits (53).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1930 George Earnshaw tosses a seven-hit shutout and Jimmie Foxx hits a three-run home run in the bottom of the eighth inning as the A's defeat Chicago 3-0 in the second game of a doubleheader...in 1968 Campy Campaneris is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 4-2 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Washington...in 2002 the A's win a 16-inning game at New York 3-2 in a game that last six hours exactly...Mark Ellis has a RBI single in the 16th inning to drive in the winning run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (10-3, 3.46 ERA)

EIGHT-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 8-0 with a 2.26 ERA (26 er in 103.1 ip) and .203 (74-for-364) opponents batting average over his last 16 starts dating back to his May 7 no-hitter against Cincinnati...the winning streak is a career high (previous: 6, July 21-Sept. 11, 2018), tied for the second longest active streak in the majors (Cole, HOU 10) and the longest by an A's pitcher over the last six years...the last longer streak is nine by Jarrod Parker from May 28-Sept. 4, 2013...has left with the lead in six of his eight no decisions during the streak only to have the bullpen blow the save...also has a no decision is the May 19 suspended game at Detroit in which he is the pitcher of record with the A's leading 5-3 in the bottom of the seventh...went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA and .297 opponents batting average over his first eight starts.

10-GAME WINNER: Picked up his 10th win of the season in his last start for his third 10-win season...won a career-high 12 games between the A's and Tigers last year and had 11 wins with Houston in 2016...is the first A's right-hander to win 10 games since Kendall Graveman won 10 in 2016.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for fourth in the American League in winning percentage (.769), ranks seventh in opponents slugging percentage (.369), eighth in OPS (.664) and 10th in ERA (3.46)...also ranks third in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (5.84), fourth in wild pitches (10), tied for third in games started (24) and seventh in fewest pitches per inning (15.5).

LEADERS DATING BACK TO THE NO-HITTER: During his current eight-game winning streak dating back to May 7, he has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.316)...also ranks first in ERA (2.26), second in OPS (.587), fourth in batting average (.203), sixth in on-base percentage (.271) and tied for tenth in wins (8).

FIVE INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Has tossed at least five innings while allowing three runs or fewer in each of his last 18 starts...that is the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1908...the previous long was 16 by Dan Haren (April 7-June 26, 2007)...is 8-1 with a 2.42 ERA (31 er in 115.1 ip) during the streak.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 6-0 with a 2.54 ERA (20 er in 71.0 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest this year and 9-0 with a 2.62 ERA (29 er in 99.2 ip) in 16 starts on five days rest in his Athletics career...is 2-1 with a 4.20 ERA (23 er in 49.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest this year and 2-2 with a 4.95 ERA (11 er in 20.0 ip) in four starts on six days rest or more.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-0 with a 2.16 ERA (8 er in 33.1 ip) in five starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-3 with a 3.87 ERA in 19 starts before the break...ranks 10th in the American League in ERA since the break...his eight wins at the break are his most ever before the break (had six in 2016 and 2018).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 8-1 with a 2.69 ERA (30 er in 100.1 ip) and .216 (79-for-366) opponents batting average in 16 starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA (24 er in 40.0 ip) and .267 (39-for-146) opponents average in eight starts during the day...has the second lowest night ERA, opponents OPS (.579) and slugging percentage (.311) in the American League and is tied for seventh in wins.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 7-2 with a 2.54 ERA (22 er in 78.0 ip) and .211 (59-for-280) opponents batting average in 13 starts at home compared to 3-1 with a 4.62 ERA (32 er in 62.1 ip) and .254 (59-for-232) opponents average in 11 starts on the road...ranks second in the American League in home ERA, tied for third in wins and fifth in OPS (.605)...is now 11-3 with a 2.86 ERA (44 er in 138.1 ip) and .215 (102-for-474) opponents batting average in 24 career appearances, 23 starts, in the Coliseum.

APRIL AND BEYOND: Went 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts in April but is 8-1 with a 2.41 ERA (29 er in 108.1 ip) and .208 (79-for-380) opponents average in 17 starts since then...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in 25 career appearances in April and 51-35 with a 3.39 ERA (287 er in 761.1 ip) from May through August.

THIS AND THAT: Went 1-0 with a 2.14 ERA in five starts in July...ranked sixth in the American League in July ERA...is 15-5 with a 3.58 ERA (77 er in 193.1 ip) in 34 games, including 33 starts, since he was acquired by Oakland Aug. 6, 2018...went 4-0 with a 2.30 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in five starts in June...opponents are hitting .150 (6-for-40) with runners in scoring position and two outs.

NO-HITTER: Tossed his second career no-hitter May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati to become the 34th pitcher in Major League history with multiple regular season no-hitters...is the seventh with a no-hitter for multiple teams...with the acquisition of Homer Bailey on July 12 the A's become the sixth team in Major League history with two pitchers with multiple no-hitter on their roster...the last was the 1988 Houston Astros (Bob Forsch and Nolan Ryan)...was named American League Co-Player of the Week with George

Springer May 13...it was his second career Player of the Week honor with the first coming Aug. 23, 2015 following his first no-hitter...this no-hitter was the 13th in Athletics history, including the eighth in Oakland history.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 victory over St. Louis last Saturday in Oakland...the A's scored twice in each of the first two innings and he blanked the Cardinals on three hits and a walk over the first five innings...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to DeJong in the sixth...that was the only run he would allowed in 5.2 innings.

FIERS vs. CHICAGO: Is 3-0 with a 1.83 ERA (44.1 ip, 42 h, 9 r, 9 er, 10 bb, 36 so, 2 hr) in seven career starts...is 2-0 with a 2.10 ERA (6 er in 25.2 ip) in four starts in his home ballparks and 1-0 with a 1.45 ERA (3 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts at Guaranteed Rate Field...

was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 5-1 A's win in Oakland on July 12...tossed 7.2 scoreless innings...walked just one but yielded eight hits and retired the side in order just twice...allowed four base runners to advance into scoring position...was 1-0 with a 3.71 ERA (17.0 ip, 20 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 14 so) in three starts last year, all with Detroit.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Tanner Roark (1-0, 1.80 ERA): Was acquired from Cincinnati on July 31 with cash considerations for minor league outfielder Jameson Hannah and picked up the win in his first start with the A's last Sunday against St. Louis, a 4-2 A's win (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...went 6-7 with a 4.24 ERA and .273 opponents batting average in 21 starts with the Reds and is 7-7 with a 4.14 ERA in 22 starts overall...allowed a .229 opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .316 against left-handers...was 5-6 with a 3.51 ERA and .249 opponents batting average in 17 starts before the All-Star Break...is 2-1 with five starts since then but has a 6.65 ERA and .347 opponents average...does not have a wild pitch and his 115.1 innings pitched are fourth most in the majors among pitchers with no wild pitches...is making his first career appearance and start against Chicago...the White Sox are one of three teams he has never faced (Cleveland, Detroit).

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 3.44 ERA (48 er in 125.2 ip) over the last 37 games since June 23 and now has a 4.09 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League.
- Have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.396), rank fifth in OPS (.715), sixth in batting average (.242), and fifth in on-base percentage (.319).
