ABOUT THE A'S: Lost yesterday and are 2-3 on this trip through Chicago (1-2 vs. CWC, 1-1 vs. CWS)...have won five of the last eight games and eight of the last 12...are 16-10 (.615) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth best record in the American League, and 30-16 (.667) dating back to June 17...are 66-51 (.564) for the season and the 15 games over .500, is one short of a season high of 16 (3x, last: 66-50 on Aug. 9)...have the sixth best record in the AL but the eighth best in the majors...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by 11 games...are 1½ games behind Tampa Bay for the second Wild Card spot for the ninth consecutive day...have spent 45 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

WALKING ON SUNSHINE: Oakland is 26-18 in day games this season, but 20-8 since May 16 under the sun...are 10-3 in the last 13 day games...Oakland has the 4th-best record during the day in the American League behind Houston (20-9/.690), New York-AL (29-16/.644) and Cleveland (29-18/.617)...from the active roster, Marcus Semien is leading the team, hitting .290 (53-for-183) with 34 runs, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 9 home runs, 24 RBI and an .894 OPS...Matt Chapman leads the club with 10 day game home runs.

TAKE THE SERIES: Oakland is 15-0-2 in their last 17 series against the AL Central, going 45-13 in that span...have not lost a series to an AL Central opponent since dropping 2 of 3 to Kansas City from Aug. 14-16.

CENTRAL SUCCESS: Chris Bassitt is 4-0 with a 1.45 ERA (6 ER, 37.1 IP) with 34 strikeouts and a .173 (23-for-133) opponents batting average in his last 7 games, including 6 starts against the AL Central (since 6/27/18)...Oakland has won each of those seven outings...has allowed zero runs in four of those outings, and two or fewer in six of them.

BLANK SOX: Oakland starters are 4-1 with a 1.06 ERA (4 ER, 34.0 IP) with 28 strikeouts and a .224 (28-for-125) opponent batting average...each of the starters (Fiers, Bassitt, Anderson, Fiers, Roark) has tossed at least 6.0 innings...overall this season, Oakland hurlers have a 1.43 ERA (7 ER, 44.0 IP) with 39 strikeouts in the five games.

LEADING MAN: Marcus Semien is hitting .293 (34-for-116) with 30 runs, 9 doubles, 2 triples, 8 home runs, 13 RBI, 21 walks, a .406 on-base percentage, .612 slugging mark and a 1.018 OPS in 30 games since July 4...his .612 slugging is the 12th-best in the Majors in that span, while his OPS is 13th.

FINDING HOLES IN SOX: Mark Canha has hit safely in each of his last 11 games against the White Sox, hitting .462 (18-for-39) with 10 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs, 7 RBI, 11 walks, a .569 on-base percentage, .795 slugging mark and a 1.363 OPS...in those 11 games, Canha has reached base 29 times via hit or walk...since 2018, only Mike Trout (.600) has a higher average against Chicago (minimum 25 plate appearances) than Canha.

SINCE MAY 16: The A's are 47-26 (.644) dating back to May 16, which is the fourth best record in the majors over that span...have a 3.95 ERA (291 er in 662.1 ip), which is fourth best...the offense is 5th in home runs (127), 5th extra base hits (279), fourth in runs (403) & sixth in slugging (.467).

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 16-5 (.762) against American League Central teams and have outscored them 128-68 (+60)...are batting .277 (214-for-773) with 128 runs (5.82 per game) and 38 home runs in 22 games (includes May 19 suspended game)...the pitching staff has a 2.90 ERA (64 er in 198.2 ip) and .234 (171-for-731) opponents batting average...are now 68-24 (.739) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.75 ERA (98 er in 185.2 ip) over their last 21 games dating back to July 18 and have allowed 31 home runs over that span...have allowed 138 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Tampa Bay, 132)...also rank third in opponents slugging percentage (.403), fourth in batting average (.244) and OPS (.715) and fourth in ERA (4.09) and fourth in on-base percentage (.312).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in 11 of the last 12 games...starters are 5-3 with a 3.01 ERA (25 er in 74.2 ip) over the last 12 games...are 47-31 with a 4.10 ERA (295 er in 647.2 ip) for the season...rank third in the AL in wins and fifth in ERA...Mike Fiers (11) and Brett Anderson (10) have 10+ wins each, marking the first time the A's have two 10-game winners since 2014 (Kazmir and Gray).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .216 (119-for-551) with a .374 slugging percentage (25 doubles, 1 triple, 20 home runs) and an average of 4.2 runs per game (71 runs) over the last 17 games after batting .262 with a .493 slugging percentage and 5.8 runs per game over the previous 57 contests...overall, rank sixth in the American League in home runs (183) and have the third fewest strikeouts (932)...are T1st in hit by pitches (60), rank second in fewest sacrifice hits (3) and third in grounded into double plays (101).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have set a franchise record for most players with 10 or more home runs with 10...are one of four teams with 10 or more players with 10 or more home runs (Twins and Blue Jays 11, Yankees 10)...have three players with 20 or more home runs and three more with 17 or more...the franchise record for most players with 20 or more home runs is five (six times, last in 2018)...the A's have hit 183 home runs, which is 10th most in the majors and 13th most in Oakland history (12th is 186 in 2013).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this eight-game, one-hotel road trip to Chicago-NL (1-2), Chicago-AL (1-1) and San Francisco (two games)...it marks the first time the A's have played consecutive series in Chicago...went 3-4 on the last road trip to AL Central leading Minnesota (2-2) and AL West leading Houston (1-2)...are 24-13 over their last 38 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Texas (2-2), Milwaukee (2-1) and St. Louis (2-0)...are 37-23 (.617) at home compared to 29-28 (.509) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 18-14 (.563) in one-run games, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are tied with Texas for the second-most one-run wins and are T3rd in one-run games (31)...57 of the A's 117 finished games have been decided by two runs or fewer, which are the most in the AL...rank second in the majors in walk-off wins (8) and tied for second in walk-off losses (7)...are third in the AL in losses when leading after seven innings (6) and tied for third in extra inning losses (7) and last at bat losses (14).

THIS AND THAT: The A's had Thursday off, which was their third of four days off over a 15-day stretch from July 29-Aug. 12...are 13-6 (.684) following a day off, which is the second best record in the American League...rank fourth in the AL with a .986 fielding percentage...currently have five players on the injured list (Estrada, Gossett, Laureano, Manaea, Phegley)...have used the IL 15 times this year after using it at least 23 times in each of the previous four seasons...have used just 42 players, which is the fewest in the AL...employed at least 50 players in each of the previous four seasons...are 2-26 when going homerless, which matches Seattle for the fewest wins without homering in the majors...the A's went 15-9 (.625) in July, which was the third best record in the AL and the eighth best July in Oakland history.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's lead the season series 4-1 after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland July 12-14...have won each of the previous two season series and are 14-4 against the White Sox over the last three years...have won six of the last nine games in Chicago and have an eight-game winning streak in Oakland, which is the second longest Coliseum winning streak against Chicago in Oakland history (10, May 18, 2001-May 6, 2003)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 316-290 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 167-138 in Oakland and 149-152 in Chicago...including 67-64 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 993-1045 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has a career-high tying 25 home runs, which are the most among American League third basemen...**Liam Hendriks** has struck out at least one batter in each of his last 25 games, which is the longest streak by an A's reliever since at least 1908...**Matt Olson** leads AL first basemen in home runs (22)...**Marcus Semien** has started each of the A's last 199 games, which is the second longest consecutive games started streak in Oakland history...ranks sixth in the AL in runs (87), ninth in hits (131), seventh in walks (65), tied for ninth in doubles (30) and T12th in extra base hits (53).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1920 the A's score 10 times in the seventh inning to defeat Detroit 13-4...In 1978 Rick Langford tosses a three-hit shutout in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota in a 2-0 A's victory...in 2003 Tim Hudson tosses a complete game two-hit shutout and needs just 93 pitches to defeat Boston, 4-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (7-5, 3.80 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-1 with a 2.48 ERA (8 er in 29.0 ip) and .231 (25-for-108) opponents batting average in five starts since the All-Star Break...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents average over his first five starts and was 3-3 with a 6.00 ERA and .249 opponents average in nine starts in between (May 21-July 6)...has career highs in all major categories except losses.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-2 with a 3.16 ERA (20 er in 57.0 ip) and .201 (42-for-209) opponents batting average in nine starts during the day compared to 2-3 with a 4.53 ERA (25 er in 49.2 ip) and .249 (47-for-189) opponents average in 10 starts at night...is tied for fifth in the American League in wins in day games...was 0-8 in 15 career day games entering the season.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .194 (42-for-217) batting average, which is sixth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...had a .260 (47-for-181) average against right-handers...however, has surrendered 10 of his 16 home runs and issued 26 of his 39 walks to left-handed hitters...nine of his home runs have come with two strikes, which is T7th most in the AL...opponents are batting .187 (28-for-150) the first time through the lineup, .275 (42-for-153) with nine of his 16 home runs the second time and .200 (19-for-95) after that...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .170 (8-for-47) batting average.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 3-0 with a 1.99 ERA (5 er in 22.2 ip) and .193 (16-for-83) opponents batting average in four starts against American League Central teams...now has a four-game winning streak against the Central dating back to June 27, 2018 and has a 1.45 ERA (6 er in 37.1 ip) and .173 (23-for-133) opponents average over that seven start stretch...his last loss to a Central team was here at Chicago on June 22, 2018.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.61 ERA (11 er in 38.0 ip) and .175 (24-for-137) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game compared to a 4.46 ERA (34 er in 68.2 ip) and .249 (65-for-261) opponents average from the third inning on.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 11 of his 19 starts this year and is 1-5 in those games...is 6-0 in eight starts with support of three runs or more...has two starts with a combined 29 runs of support and has a season RSA of 5.99 (71 rs in 106.2 ip)...entered the season with a 2.67 RSA in his career as a starter...has received two runs of support or fewer in 35 of his 49 career starts and is 3-19 in those games...is 8-0 in 14 career starts with run support of three runs or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 3.06 ERA (16 er in 47.0 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 4.37 ERA (29 er in 59.2 ip) in 11 starts on the road...has yielded just three home runs in 47.0 innings in Oakland compared to 13 in 59.2 innings on the road...is 5-9 with a 2.85 ERA (41 er in 129.1 ip) in 24 career appearances in the Coliseum and has allowed just nine home runs (0.62 per nine innings).

PRE AND POST "TOMMY JOHN": Is 9-8 with a 3.56 ERA (61 er in 154.1 ip) in 30 games (26 starts) since undergoing "Tommy John" surgery May 6, 2016...is averaging 8.28 strikeouts per nine innings (142 so in 154.1 ip)...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contusion...went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA in three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16...was recalled by Oakland the next day when Marco Estrada went on the injured list...made his first start April 22 against Texas and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings for the win...struck out a season-high nine in his second start April 28 at Toronto (also May 9 against Cincinnati)...however, had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss in 11 innings...left his third start on May 4 at Pittsburgh after five innings with a 4-3 lead but Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss...it was the first of two times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (July 30 vs. Milwaukee)...took the loss on May 9 against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a three-game streak dating back to last year...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...the loss was his first since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits in a 17-3 win at Detroit on May 16...walked a career-high six batters in 3.2 innings in a no decision at Cleveland May 21...is the first Major League pitcher since at least 1908 with a pitching line of 3.2 innings, three hits, three runs, three earned runs, six walks and six strikeouts...allowed three runs on four hits and four walks in a season-low 3.1 innings at St. Louis on June 25 but had a no decision in the A's 7-3 win...allowed a season-high six runs in 4.1 innings in a 6-3 loss at Seattle July 6.

BASSITT vs. CHICAGO: Is 1-1 with a 4.32 ERA (16.2 ip, 18 h, 9 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 14 so, 1 hr) in three career starts...is 1-0 with a 3.18 ERA (4 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (4 er in 5.1 ip) in one start at Guaranteed Rate Field as a visitor...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 13-2 A's win in Oakland on July 13...tossed six scoreless innings and allowed four hits while walking two...allowed just one base runner into scoring position...was relieved by Treinen to start the seventh with the A's leading 12-0...made his Major League debut with Chicago in 2014 and is 0-2 with a 5.16 ERA (13 er in 22.2 ip) in four career starts at Guaranteed Rate Field.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA and .242 opponents batting average on a three start rehab assignment...struck out 16 batters in 11.0 innings and walked two...his first assignment came with Stockton on April 4 against Rancho Cucamonga (3.0 ip, 7 so)...retired all nine batters he faced, the first five by strikeout...moved to Las Vegas for a start on April 9 in a 10-2 win against Sacramento (3.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...allowed just one run in three innings of work, a bases loaded walk to Michael Reed in the first inning...then had a no decision in a 6-5 loss to Fresno on April 14 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 3 er, 4 so, 2 hr).

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Brett Anderson (10-7, 3.99 ERA): Is 3-2 with a 3.45 ERA and .244 opponents batting average over his last seven starts and has walked just five batters in 44.1 innings over that span (1.02 per nine innings)...went 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA and .222 opponents average over his first four starts and was 4-5 with a 4.87 and .283 opponents average over his next 12 starts from April 27-June 23...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 11-4 A's win at Chicago (NL) last Tuesday (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 2-4 with a 4.78 ERA (49.0 ip, 58 h, 26 r, 26 er, 11 bb, 30 so, 2 hr) in 10 career appearances, all starts, against the Giants...had a no decision in his only start last year, a 4-3 A's win at San Francisco on July 14 (3.1 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 1 so)...is 4-for-6 (.667) with a strikeout and a run scored as a hitter this year and his four hits are tied for second most in a season by an American League pitcher in the designated hitter era.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 3.35 ERA (48 er in 129.0 ip) over the last 39 games since June 23 and now has a 4.06 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League.
- Have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.395), rank fifth in OPS (.713), sixth in batting average (.242), and fifth in on-base percentage (.318).
