ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three at Chicago (AL) over the weekend and finished their sixgame, seven-day stay in Chicago with a 3-3 record...are 9-4 over the last 13 games, 17-10 since the All-Star Break, 31-15 dating back to June 17 and 48-26 dating back to May 16...are 67-51 (.568) overall and are a season-high 16 games over .500 for the fourth time this year... have the sixth best record in the American

League but the eighth best record in the majors...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by 10 games for the fifth time in the last six days...are two games behind Tampa Bay for the second Wild Card spot, which is their largest deficit in the Wild Card since June 28 when they were 2½ back...have spent 47 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 10-6 (.625) in interleague play, which is the sixth best mark in the majors (2-1 vs. Cincinnati, 1-2 vs. Pittsburgh, 4-0 vs. St. Louis, 2-1 vs. Milwaukee, 1-2 vs. Chicago)...have four games remaining, including tonight and tomorrow at San Francisco and two against the Giants in Oakland, Aug. 24-25...need one more win to clinch a winning record against the National League for the second consecutive season and 14th

time in 23 seasons of interleague play...rank third in ERA (3.38), opponents OPS (.656), on-base percentage (.290) and slugging percentage (.367) and seventh in batting average (.228)

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 4-for-16 (.250) with two walks, five strikeouts and a sacrifice hit and all four hits are by Brett Anderson...the four hits by pitchers are tied with Detroit for the most in the American League this year and are tied for the most by an A's team in the designated hitter era (2005)...A's pitchers are now batting .090 (38-for-424) with four doubles, 12 RBI, 14 walks and 196 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is second lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .079)...the last home run by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 20 (.400) with three walks, two home runs and eight RBI and are batting .290 (20-for-69) for the season...lead the American League in RBI (22), are tied for the lead in home runs (5), rank second in hits (20), doubles (6), extra base hits (11) and plate appearances (82), and fourth in walks (10)...the five pinch homers are tied for third most in Oakland history (8 in 1970, 6 in 2013) and the 11 extra base hits are tied for fourth (13 in 1968, 12 in 1972 and 1978).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher tonight for the fourth time in the last six games after facing just one south paw over the previous 18 contests...are 21-9 (.700) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 46-42 (.523) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (25-7) but the 30 games are third fewest in the American League...are batting .269 with an .823 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .237 with a .740 OPS against right-handers...rank third in the AL in home runs off lefties (57), fourth in OPS and fifth in batting average but have the third lowest batting average against righties...the OPS against lefties is currently the best mark in Oakland history (.816 in 1994).

PITCHING: The A's had two shutouts in the three-game series at Chicago (AL) and now have eight for the season, which is tied for third in the American League...surrendered just one home run and have 138 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL...have a 3.34 ERA (36 in 97.0 ip) over the last 11 games and a 4.05 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL...also rank third in opponents slugging percentage (.401) and fourth in OPS (.713), batting average (.243) and on-base percentage (.311).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in 12 of the last 13 games and are 6-3 with a 2.82 ERA (25 er in 79.2 ip) over that span...have walked two or fewer in 11 of those games (18 bb in 79.2 ip, 2.03

per nine innings)...starters are now 48-31 with a 4.06 ERA (295 er in 653.1 ip) for the season...rank third in the AL in wins and fifth in ERA...Mike Fiers and Brett Anderson have 10 wins each, marking the first time the A's have two 10-game winners since 2014 (Kazmir and Gray).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .215 (126-for-585) with a .373 slugging percentage (27 doubles, 1 triple, 21 home runs) and an average of 4.1 runs per game (73 runs) over the last 18 games after batting .262 with a .493 slugging percentage and 5.8 runs per game over the previous 57 contests...overall, lead the American League in hit by pitches (61), rank second in fewest sacrifice hits (3) and third in fewest strikeouts (948) and most grounded into double plays (101).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have set a franchise record for most players with 10 or more home runs with 10...are one of four teams with 10 or more players with 10 or more home runs (Blue Jays and Twins 11, Yankees 10)...have three players with 20 or more home runs and three more with 17 or more... the franchise record for most players with 20 or more home runs, sift in 2018)...the A's have hit 184 home runs, which is tied for 10th in the majors, but ranks 13th in Oakland history (12th is 186 in 2013, 11th is 189 in 2004, 10th is 195 in 2012).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this eight-game, one-hotel road trip to Chicago-NL (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-1) and San Francisco (two games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to American League Central leading Minnesota (2-2) and AL West leading Houston (1-2)...are 25-13 over their last 39 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road... begin a nine-game homestand against Houston (four games), New York-AL (three games) and San Francisco (two games) on Thursday...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Texas (2-2), Milwaukee (2-1) and St. Louis (2-0)...are 37-23 (.617) at home compared to 30-28 (.517) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 18-14 (.563) in one-run games...rank third in the American League in one-run wins and tied for third in one-run games...57 of the A's 118 finished games have been decided by two runs or fewer, which are the most in the AL...rank second in the majors in walk-off wins (8) and tied for second in walk-off losses (7)...are third in the AL in losses when leading after seven innings (6) and tied for third in extra inning losses (7).

WINS AND LOSSES: The Athletics franchise won its first game on April 29, 1901 and now has 8,998 wins in 119 seasons in the American League...will become the sixth AL franchise to win 9,000 games...the A's are 14-4 on Tuesday's, which is the best record in the majors...had yesterday off and are 13-6 (.684) following a day off, which is tied for the third best record in the majors...are 2-26 when going homerless and the wins are tied with Seattle for the fewest in the majors.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's and Giants meet for the first time in 2019...the A's won four of six last year, winning two of three in both Oakland and San Francisco...are 9-5 over the previous three years, including 5-2 in San Francisco...over the previous 22 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won eight season series, lost four and split 10...are 63-57 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 36-24 in Oakland and 27-33 in San Francisco...are 23-30 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads AL third basemen with a career-high 25 home runs and ranks second with 65 RBI...is three short of his career high for RBI... Liam Hendriks has struck out at least one batter in each of his last 26 games, which is the longest streak by an A's reliever since at least 1908... Matt Olson leads AL first basemen in home runs (23)...Marcus Semien has started each of the A's last 200 games, which is the second longest consecutive games started streak in Oakland history and the fifth longest consecutive games played streak...ranks sixth in the AL in runs (87), seventh in walks (65), tied for ninth in hits (131) and tied for 10th in doubles (30).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1977** Mitchell Page steals his 26th consecutive base without being caught, setting an American League record...the record comes to an end two days later when he is picked off by Cleveland's Rick Waits...in **1989** Dave Parker's first inning home run off California's Bert Blyleven is the 3000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2005** Dennis Eckersley becomes the fourth player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 43.

PITCHING PROBABLES

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (10-7, 3.99 ERA)

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Is 3-2 with a 3.45 ERA (17 er in 44.1 ip) and .244 (40-for-164) opponents batting average over his last seven starts and has walked just five batters in 44.1 innings over that span (1.02 per nine innings)...went 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA and .222 opponents average over his first four starts and was 4-5 with a 4.87 and .283 opponents average over his next 12 starts from April 27-June 23...the A's are 15-8 (.652) in his starting assignments

WITH THE BAT: Is 4-for-6 with a strikeout and MOST HITS IN A SEASON, a run scored, collecting two hits on May 3 at Pittsburgh and Aug. 6 at Chicago...has two of the four two-hit games by an Oakland pitcher in the designated hitter era (Tommy Milone, June 3, 2013; Edgar Gonzalez, June 19, 2009)... is the first A's pitcher with back-to-back multiple hit games since Catfish Hunter from May 22-27, 1972...joins Zack Britton (2011 with Baltimore) as the only American League pitchers in the DH era with two multiple hit games in a season...his four total hits are the most in a season by an Oakland pitcher and tied for second most by an AL pitcher in the DH era...now has five career hits as an Athletic, which is two more than any other Oakland pitcher in the DH era...is 12-for-85 (.141) with two runs. three doubles, five RBI, six walks, 47 strikeouts and 10 sacrifice hits in his career...including 5-for-14 (.357) as an Athletic...that is the highest career batting average in Oakland history by any player with 10 or more plate appearances ahead of Lenn Sakata (.353).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA (25.0 ip, 24 h, 10 r, 10 er, 8 bb, 10 so, 2 hr) in four interleague starts this year...however, is 3-8 with a 5.20 ERA (46 er in 79.2 ip) and .311 (101-for-325) opponents batting average in 15 career interleague starts.

10-GAME WINNER: Picked up his 10th win of the season in his last start. which is the third time in his 11-year career he has won 10 games...won 11 games in his rookie season with the A's in 2009 and 10 with Los Angeles (NL) in 2015...his 23 starts and 133.0 innings pitched are third best in his career and his most since 2015 with the Dodgers (31 starts, 180.1 innings pitched).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-2 with a 3.45 ERA (28 er in 73.0 ip) and .238 (67-for-281) opponents batting average in 12 starts on the road compared to 4-5 with a 4.65 ERA (31 er in 60.0 ip) and .286 (66-for-231) opponents average in 11 starts at home...is tied for eighth in the American League in road wins and ranks 10th in ERA.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 8-4 with a 3.31 ERA (34 er in 92.1 ip) and .232 (81-for-349) opponents batting average in 15 starts at night compared to 2-3 with a 5.53 ERA (25 er in 40.2 ip) and .319 (52-for-163) opponents average in eight starts during the day...ranks seventh in the American League in OPS (.651) and ERA at night and tied for eighth in wins.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today... is 8-5 with a 3.22 ERA (34 er in 95.0 ip) in 16 starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-2 with a 5.92 ERA (25 er in 38.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 15 home runs over his last 15 starts and 90.0 innings after surrendering just one home run over his first eight starts and 43.0 innings...has yielded 16 home runs overall and his average of 1.08 home runs per nine innings is seventh lowest in the American League...12 of the 16 home runs are solo shots.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received three runs of support or fewer in 12 of his last 15 starts...however, has starts with 16, 13 and 11 runs of support and his season run support average of 6.77 (100 rs in 133.0 ip) is seventh highest in the American League....is 10-3 in 18 starts with run support of two runs or more.

STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out just 67 batters in 133.0 innings and his average of 4.53 strikeouts per nine innings is the lowest mark in the majors (Nova, CWS 5.58)...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.86 is fifth lowest.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-4 victory at Chicago (NL) a week ago today...blanked the Cubs on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and had an 11-0 lead when he allowed a two run home run to Bryant in the sixth inning...those were the only two runs he would allow in six innings of work.

RHP Homer Bailey (9-8, 5.54 ERA): Was acquired from Kansas City on July 14 for minor league infielder Kevin Merrell...is 2-2 with an 8.17 ERA and .308 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's after going 7-6 with a 4.80 ERA and .250 opponents average in 18 starts with Kansas City...has a 5.54 ERA overall, which is fourth highest in the American League among pitchers with 100 or more innings...since joining the A's, he is 2-0 with a 3.38 ERA in three starts in the Coliseum and 0-2 with a 21.60 ERA in two starts on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 10-1 A's loss at Chicago (NL) last Wednesday (4.2 ip, 6 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb)...is 4-0 with a 3.57 ERA in eight career appearances, all starts, against San Francisco...last faced the Giants on June 29, 2014 at San Francisco...tossed a three-hit shutout in a 4-0 Reds win (1 bb, 7 so)...1-2 with a 7.79 ERA in four interleague starts this year and 7-12 with a 6.04 ERA in 25 career interleague starts
