## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (67-52) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (60-60)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 14, 2019 — ORACLE PARK — 12:45 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Won two of three at Chicago (AL) over the weekend and finished their six-game, seven-day stay in Chicago with a 3-3 record...are 9-5 over the last 14 games, 17-11 since the All-Star Break, 31-16 dating back to June 17 and 48-27 dating back to May 16...are 67-52 (.563) overall and are 15 games over .500 for the sixth time this year...have the sixth best record in the American League but the eighth best record in the majors...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by 10½ games...are three games behind Tampa Bay for the second Wild Card spot, which is their largest deficit in the Wild Card since June 11 when they were three back...have spent 48 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

**HERE COMES THE SUN:** Oakland is 27-18 (.600) in day games this season and 21-8 (.724) since May 16 under the sun...are 11-3 in the last 14 day games...the A's have the fourth-best day record in the American League, behind New York-AL (31-16, .660), Houston (21-11, .656) and Cleveland (30-18, .625)...the A's 72 home runs in day games are tied for third-most in the majors with Milwaukee...Matt Chapman leads the team with 10 daytime home runs.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 10-7 (.588) in interleague play, which is the tied for the seventh best mark in the majors (2-1 vs. Cincinnati, 1-2 vs. Pittsburgh, 4-0 vs. St. Louis, 2-1 vs. Milwaukee, 1-2 vs. Chicago, 0-1 vs. San Francisco)...have three games remaining, including today at San Francisco and two against the Giants in Oakland, Aug. 24-25...need one more win to clinch a winning record against the National League for the second consecutive season and 14th time in 23 seasons of interleague play...rank third in ERA (3.38), opponents OPS (.655), on-base percentage (.290) and slugging percentage (.365) and seventh in batting average (.228).

**PITCHERS HITTING:** A's pitchers are 4-for-18 (.222) with two walks, six strikeouts and a sacrifice hit and all four hits are by Brett Anderson...the four hits by pitchers are tied with Detroit for the most in the American League this year and are tied for the most by an A's team in the designated hitter era (2005)...A's pitchers are now batting .089 (38-for-426) with four doubles, 12 RBI, 14 walks and 197 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is second lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .079)...the last home run by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 9 for their last 21 (.429) with three walks, two home runs and eight RBI and are batting .300 (21-for-70) for the season...lead the American League in RBI (22), are tied for the lead in home runs (5), rank second in hits (21), doubles (6), extra base hits (11) and plate appearances (83), and fourth in walks (10)...the five pinch homers are tied for third most in Oakland history (8 in 1970, 6 in 2013) and the 11 extra base hits are tied for fourth (13 in 1968, 12 in 1972 and 1978).

**PITCHING:** The A's had two shutouts in the three-game series at Chicago (AL) and now have eight for the season, which is tied for third in the American League...surrendered just one home run and have 138 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL...have a 3.34 ERA (39 in 105.0 ip) over the last 12 games and a 4.05 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL...also rank third in opponents slugging percentage (.401) and OPS (.712) and fourth in batting average (.243) and on-base percentage (.311).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in 13 of the last 14 games and are 6-4 with a 2.84 ERA (27 er in 85.2 ip) over that span...have walked two or fewer in 12 of those games (18 bb in 85.2 ip, 1.89 per nine innings)...starters are now 48-32 with a 4.05 ERA (297 er in 659.1 ip) for the season...rank third in the AL in wins and fifth in ERA...Mike Fiers and

Brett Anderson have 10 wins each, marking the first time the A's have two 10-game winners since 2014 (Kazmir and Gray).

**GOING THE DISTANCE:** Dating back to 2012, Homer Bailey is 3-0 with a 1.48 ERA (5 er in 30.1 ip) in four games against San Francisco...pitched a three-hit shutout in his last outing at Oracle Park on June 29, 2014, his second career shutout of the Giants...on July 2, 2013, Bailey threw a no-hitter against the Giants in Cincinnati, allowing just one walk while striking out nine batters.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .213 (131-for-616) with a .367 slugging percentage (27 doubles, 1 triple, 22 home runs) and an average of 3.9 runs per game (75 runs) over the last 19 games after batting .262 with a .493 slugging percentage and 5.8 runs per game over the previous 57 contests...overall, are tied for the American League lead in hit by pitches (61), rank second in fewest sacrifice hits (3) and third in fewest strikeouts (961) and most grounded into double plays (102).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have set a franchise record for most players with 10 or more home runs with 10...are one of four teams with 10 or more players with 10 or more home runs (Blue Jays and Twins 11, Yankees 10)...have three players with 20 or more home runs and three more with 17 or more...the franchise record for most players with 20 or more home runs is five (six times, last in 2018)...the A's have hit 185 home runs, which is 11th in the majors, but ranks 13th in Oakland history (12th is 186 in 2013, 11th is 189 in 2004, 10th is 195 in 2012).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-4 on this eight-game, one-hotel road trip to Chicago-NL (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-1) and San Francisco (0-1)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to American League Central leading Minnesota (2-2) and AL West leading Houston (1-2)...are 25-14 over their last 40 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...begin a nine-game homestand against Houston (four games), New York-AL (three games) and San Francisco (two games) on Thursday...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Texas (2-2), Milwaukee (2-1) and St. Louis (2-0)...are 37-23 (.617) at home compared to 30-29 (.508) on the road.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 18-15 (.545) in one-run games...rank third in the American League in one-run wins and in one-run games...58 of the A's 119 finished games have been decided by two runs or fewer, which are the most in the AL...rank second in the majors in walk-off wins (8) and tied for second in walk-off losses (7)...are third in the AL in losses when leading after seven innings (6) and tied for fourth in extra inning losses (7).

**WINS AND LOSSES:** The Athletics franchise won its first game on April 29, 1901 and now has 8,998 wins in 119 seasons in the American League...will become the sixth AL franchise to win 9,000 games...are 2-26 when going homerless and the wins are tied with Seattle for the fewest in the majors.

**A's vs. GIANTS:** The A's are 0-1 against the Giants in 2019...the A's won four of six last year, winning two of three in both Oakland and San Francisco...are 9-6 dating back to 2016, including 5-3 in San Francisco...over the previous 22 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won eight season series, lost four and split 10...are 63-58 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 36-24 in Oakland and 27-34 in San Francisco...are 23-31 at Oracle Park.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** leads AL third basemen with a career-high 25 home runs and ranks second with 65 RBI...is three short of his career high for RBI...**Liam Hendriks** has struck out at least one batter in each of his last 26 games, which is the longest streak by an A's reliever since at least 1908...**Matt Olson** leads AL first basemen in home runs (23)...**Marcus Semien** has started each of the A's last 201 games, which is the second longest consecutive games started streak in Oakland history and the fifth longest consecutive games played streak...ranks sixth in the AL in runs (87), seventh in walks (65), 10th in hits (132) and tied for 10th in doubles (30).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire breaks the Major League rookie home run record with his 39th of the season, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of the A's 7-6 win at California...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 round trippers.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Homer Bailey (9-8, 5.54 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was acquired from Kansas City on July 14 for minor league infielder Kevin Merrell minutes before he was scheduled to start for the Royals against Detroit...is 2-2 with an 8.17 ERA (23 er in 25.1 ip) and .308 (33-for-107) opponents batting average in five starts with the A's after going 7-6 with a 4.80 ERA and .250 opponents average in 18 starts with Kansas City...has a 5.54 ERA overall, which is fifth highest in the American League among pitchers with 100 or more innings...has tossed five innings or fewer in 12 of his 23 starts.

**INTERLEAGUE:** Is 1-2 with a 7.79 ERA (17.1 ip, 19 h, 15 r, 15 er, 9 bb, 11 so, 3 hr) in four interleague starts...is now 7-12 with a 6.04 ERA (90 er in 134.0 ip) in 25 career interleague starts...the ERA is highest in interleague history among pitchers with 100 or more innings (Shane Reynolds, 5.97).

**WITH THE BAT:** Is 0-for-2 this year, including 0-for-1 with the A's...is a .159 (59-for-370) career hitter with eight doubles, 17 RBI, 11 walks, 55 sacrifice hits and 144 strikeouts in his career.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Since joining the A's, he is 2-0 with a 3.38 ERA (7 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts in the Coliseum and 0-2 with a 21.60 ERA (16 er in 6.2 ip) in two starts on the road...for the season, he is 6-3 with a 4.05 ERA (33 er in 73.1 ip) in 13 starts in his home ballparks compared to 3-5 with an 8.14 ERA (38 er in 42.0 ip) in 10 starts on the road.

**WINNING STREAK SNAPPED:** Had his winning streak snapped at four games July 22 at Houston...posted a 2.57 ERA and .227 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned six starts from June 13 to July 17...it was his longest winning streak since May 23-June 8, 2014, when he also won four in a row.

**CAREER NOTES:** Is scheduled to make his 24th start of the season today, which are his most since 2013 when he made 32...has nine wins, which are also his most since 2014 when he had nine with Cincinnati...was a combined 9-27 over his previous four seasons...has won 10 games twice in his career: 13 in 2012 and 11 in 2013...has 101 strikeouts, which are his most since 2014 (124).

**2019 HIGHLIGHTS:** Struck out a season-high eight batters in 5.0 innings in his Kansas City debut April 3 against Minnesota but had a no decision in a 7-6 loss...left with a 6-3 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of three times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 7 vs. Chicago-AL, July 4 vs. Cleveland)...picked up his first win as a Royal April 13 against Cleveland when he tossed 7.0 scoreless innings...it was his first win since May 12, 2018 at Los Angeles (NL) and it snapped a career-high 10-game losing streak...posted a 6.88 ERA and .333 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 13 starts from May 18, 2018 to April 8, 2019...was 2-1 with a 4.30 ERA and .220 opponents batting average over his first four starts through April 18...then went 2-5 with a 6.87 ERA and .310 opponents batting average over his next nine starts from April 23 to June 7...walked a season-high four batters (also May 16 vs. Texas and June 29 at Toronto) in a season-low 1.0 innings April 23 at Tampa Bay...it was his shortest start since Aug. 28, 2016 at Arizona, also 1.0 inning...had a season-high three-game losing streak that spanned four starts from May 16 to June 1...had a 9.64 ERA and .350 opponents batting average during the streak...then won three consecutive starts from June 13 to 23 and allowed just one run in 19.0 innings (0.47 ERA)...did not allow a run in back-to-back starts on June 13 against Detroit (6.0 ip) and June 18 at Seattle (7.2 ip) as part of a 16.2-inning scoreless streak from June 13 to 23...combined with Lopez and McCarthy on a six-hit shutout in the latter contest against the Mariners...tossed a season-high 7.2 innings, which was his longest scoreless outing since a complete-game on June 29, 2014 at San Francisco...also had a season-high 121 pitches...finished June 3-1 with a 3.48 ERA...it was his first three-win month since June of 2014 (3-1)...then had a no decision in his final start as a Royal on July 4 against Cleveland...was the winning pitcher in his A's debut, allowing two runs in 6.0 innings in a 10-2 victory over Seattle in Oakland on July 17...allowed a season-high nine runs on a season-high eight hits in 2.0 innings in an 11-1 loss at Houston July 22...became the eighth pitcher in Oakland history to allow nine or more runs in two innings or fewer, the first since Jesse Hahn on June 22, 2017, also against Houston (10 r in 2.0 ip).

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss at Chicago (AL) last Wednesday...blanked the Cubs on one hit over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed five runs in the bottom of the fourth on a Baez RBI single and a Happ grand slam...then allowed two of the Cubs four runs in the fifth and left after yielding seven runs in 4.2 innings.

**BAILEY vs. SAN FRANCISCO:** Is 4-0 with a 3.57 ERA (53.0 ip, 43 h, 22 r, 21 er, 12 bb, 42 so, 4 hr) in eight career appearances, all starts...that includes 2-0 with a 3.33 ERA (10 er in 27.0 ip) in four starts at home and 2-0 with a 3.81 ERA (11 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts in San Francisco...last faced the Giants on June 29, 2014 at San Francisco...tossed a three-hit shutout in a 4-0 Reds win (1 bb, 7 so)...retired each of the first nine batters before Blanco walked to lead off the fourth...did not allow a hit until Posey singled with two outs in the seventh inning...it was his second career complete game against San Francisco as he tossed a no-hitter on July 2, 2013 at Cincinnati, a 3-0 win (1 bb, 9 so).

**2018 RECAP:** Was on the Reds' Opening Day roster for the first time since 2014...recorded 20 starts, his highest total since 2014, while he tied for second in the National League with 14 losses...had the lowest run support (2.54) in the majors among pitchers that worked at least 100.0 innings...missed nearly seven weeks of action with right knee inflammation, going on the disabled list June 2...was reinstated on July 23...did not pitch after Sept. 5...was traded to the Los Angeles Dodgers Dec. 21 with infielder Jeter Downs in exchange for catcher/infielder Kyle Farmer, outfielder Matt Kemp, outfielder Yasiel Puig and cash considerations...was released later that day.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
