OAKLAND ATHLETICS (75-55) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (46-86)

ABOUT THE A'S: Scored a season-high 19 runs on a season-high 22 hits last night to snap a two-game losing streak...have now won eight of the last 11 games...are 25-14 (.641) since the All-Star Break, which is third best in the American League and fifth best in the majors...are 75-55 (.577) overall, which is fifth best in the AL and seventh best in the majors...the 20 games over .500 are one short of the season high of 21 (74-53 on Aug. 22)...are tied with Tampa Bay for the second AL Wild Card Spot and are ½-game behind Cleveland for the first spot...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by nine games...have spent 61 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: The A's defeated Kansas City last night 19-4 and the 15 run margin of victory was Oakland's largest since a 21-3 win over Los Angeles (AL) last year on Sept. 20...it was the A's fourth win by 13 or more runs this year, which are the most such wins in one season in Athletics history...it matches the most by an American League team over the last 80 years (2008 DET, 2006 CLE, 1993 DET)...the A's now have a run differential of +113 for the season, which is fourth best in the AL and fifth best in the majors.

IN AUGUST: The A's have clinched a winning record in August for the second consecutive season as they are 14-7 (.667) with five games remaining...have the third best record in the American League and are tied for the fourth best record in the majors...this is the A's fourth consecutive month with a winning record...have issued the fewest walks in the AL (81), rank third in opponents on-base percentage (.303) and OPS (.718), fourth in slugging (.415), tied for fourth in saves (7) and fifth in ERA (3.86)...the offense ranks second in on-base percentage (.350) and fifth in runs (120), OPS (.834) and batting (.268).

THE MIDDLE OF JUNE: The A's were 36-36 (.500) at the conclusion of play on June 16 but have gone 39-19 (.672) since then, which is the third best record in the majors...last year, the A's were 34-36 (.486) through June 15 but then went 63-29 (.685) from June 16 through the end of the season, which was the best record in the majors.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 18-5 (.783) against American League Central teams and have outscored them 149-72 (+77)...are batting .284 (243-for-856) with 149 runs (6.21 per game) and 43 home runs in 24 games (includes May 19 suspended game)...the pitching staff has a 2.82 ERA (68 er in 216.2 ip) and .234 (187-for-798) opponents batting average...are now 70-24 (.745) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 22-11 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 53-44 (.542) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to Houston (28-9) but the 33 games are third fewest...are batting .266 with an .818 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .243 with a .756 OPS against right-handers...rank fourth in the AL in OPS off lefties and fifth in batting average but have the fifth lowest batting average against righties...the OPS against lefties is currently the best mark in Oakland history (.816 in 1994).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 208 home runs, which is tied for seventh in the majors but is sixth most in Athletics history (5th is 227 in 2018)...have set a franchise record for most players with 10 or more home runs (10) and have tied the mark for most players with 20 or more home runs (5)...are one of two teams with at least five players with 20 or more home runs (Twins, 6) and one of four with at least 10 players with 10 or more home runs (Twins, Yankees and Blue Jays 11)...have two games this year where all nine players in the starting lineup had at least 10 home runs (Aug. 21 and 24) and seven in Athletics history (the other five were in 2000)...have just four wins when going homerless, which is second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 2)...the Athletics record for fewest wins in a season when going homerless is six in 2017...have hit back-to-back home runs 11 times, which is tied for second most in Oakland history (13 in 2000).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-1 with a 3.74 ERA (27 er in 65.0 ip) over the last 11 games and 12-5 with a 3.23 ERA (54 er in 150.2 ip) over the last 25 contests...are 54-33 with a 4.03 ERA overall...are tied for

second in the American League in wins and rank fourth in ERA and innings pitched (724.1).

RANKINGS: The A's pitching staff ranks second in the American League in fewest home runs (156), third in opponents slugging percentage (.404) and OPS (.715), tied for third in shutouts (8) and fourth in ERA (4.06), batting average (.245), on-base percentage (.311)...the offense ranks second in hit by pitches (67), third in fewest strikeouts (1054), fewest stolen bases (39) and most grounded into double plays (114) and fifth in runs (674), home runs (208), extra base hits (457) and slugging percentage (.448)...the defense has the third fewest errors (69) and are tied for the third fewest double plays (93)...the errors have led to 27 unearned runs, which is six fewer than any other team...opponents have been caught stealing 34 times, which is the most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this seven-game road trip to Kansas City (1-0) and New York-AL (three games)...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Chicago-NL (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1)...are 27-14 over their last 42 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...are 32-29 (.525) on the road compared to 43-26 (.623) at home...have clinched a winning record at home for the third consecutive season...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-1), New York-AL (3-0) and San Francisco (0-2) and are 25-10 (.714) over the last 35 home games after starting the year 18-16 (.556).

THIS AND THAT: The A's did not score in the first inning last night but then scored at least one run in each of the next eight innings...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the first time the A's have scored in eight straight innings in a game in franchise history (1901-present)...have a 15-5 (.750) record on Tuesday, which is the best mark in the majors...A's pinch hitters lead the American League in RBI (22), are tied for the lead in home runs (5) and rank second in hits (21), doubles (6), extra base hits (11) and plate appearances (90)...the A's lead the AL and are tied for sixth in the majors with 63 games decided by two runs or fewer...rank second in the majors in walk-off wins (9) but are tied for third in the AL in walk-off losses (7)...are third in the AL in most losses when leading after seven innings (7)

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's won the first meeting of 2019 last night after winning the season series last year, 5-2...won three of four in Oakland and two of three in Kansas City...have won 15 of the last 20 games against the Royals and have outscored Kansas City 138-61 over that span (6.9 runs per game to 3.1 runs)...have won nine of the last 12 in Kansas City...all-time, the A's are 323-265 (.549) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.589)...are 175-118 in Oakland and 148-147 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha extended his hitting streak to 10 games last night, which is one short of his career high of 11...is 19-for-42 (.452) with five home runs, 11 RBI and seven multiple hit games during the streak...**Matt Chapman** hit his 30th home run of the season last night to join Sal Bando and Eric Chavez as the only players in Athletics history to hit 30 home runs as a third baseman...became the first Athletic with 30 doubles and 30 homers in a season since 2002 (Chavez and Tejada)...**Chris Davis** hit his 152nd home run as an Athletic last night, which is one short of tying Dwayne Murphy for ninth most in Oakland history...needs one more home run to become the first Athletic with four straight 20-homer seasons since Eric Chavez had seven straight from 2000-06...**Liam Hendriks** has 15 saves, a 1.35 ERA (4 er in 26.2 ip), 46 strikeouts and two walks (both intentional) in 25 games since taking over as the A's closer when Treinen went on the IL June 21...**Marcus Semien** had a career-high seven RBI last night, which are the most by an A's leadoff hitter since RBI became an official statistic in 1920.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1948 Hank Majeski has six doubles in a doubleheader against St. Louis as the A's win 6-0 and 9-1...in 1982 Rickey Henderson steals four bases against the Milwaukee Brewers, breaking Lou Brock's major league single season record of 118...he would finish the season with 130 steals...in 2010 Brett Anderson allowed four runs in 2.0 innings, ending an Athletics record tying streak of 18 games with six or more innings and three earned runs or fewer by A's starting pitchers.

Saves/Opportunities: 32-for-56 (57.1%)

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 3.68 ERA (70 er in 171.0 ip) over the last 52 games since June 23 and now has a 4.12 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League.
- Has the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.398), rank third in OPS (.715), and fifth in on-base percentage (.317) and batting average (.242).
- Is 32-for-56 (57.1%) in save opportunities...the 24 blown saves are tied for second most in the majors.
- Has allowed the second fewest home runs (56) and has the fourth fewest walks (181) among AL bullpens...has the fifth fewest wins (21).
- Has the fifth lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.360) among Major League bullpens.

52 LHP RYAN BUCHTER

Last Outing: 8/25 vs. San Francisco (ND, 0.2 ip, so)
Saves/Opportunities: 0-4
Inherited Runners/Scored: 32/14 First Hitters: 12-47, 5 bb, hbp

- Has not allowed a run in 20 of his last 25 games since June 5 (5 er in 18.1 ip, 2.45 ERA) and 27 of his last 33 (6 er in 23.0 ip, 2.35 ERA) since May 14.
- Has not allowed a run in 34 of 41 games since he was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 29 for his second stint with the A's...has a 2.20 ERA (7 er in 28.2 ip) and .235 (24-for-104) opponents batting average over that span...logged a 7.04 ERA and .375 opponents average over his first 13 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas April 22.
- Has allowed a .244 (21-for-86) average against left-handed hitters, .300 (15-for-50) against right-handers.
- Has a 1.54 ERA (2 er in 11.2 ip) in 18 outings on no days rest, a 3.91 ERA (10 er in 23.0 ip) in his other 35 appearances
- Allowed one earned run on two hits without recording an out in his only career appearance against the Royals on June 9, 2017...spent part of that season with the Royals after they acquired him via trade from San Diego.

Last Year: Went 6-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 54 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...allowed just 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest percentage in the majors.

35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

Inherited Runners/Scored: 29/7 First Hitters: 10-48, 10 bb, 3 hbp, sf

- Was acquired from Kansas City on July 27 in exchange for minor league RHP Ismael Aquino and minor league OF Dairon Blanco and has pitched in 12 games with the A's (4 er in 9.1 ip, 3.86 ERA).
- Is second among American League relievers in games pitched (62).
- Had a 4.75 ERA with a .212 opponents batting average in 48 games with Kansas City.
- Has struck out 70 batters in 51.0 ip and his average of 12.35 strikeouts per nine innings ranks 14th among American League relievers.
- Has a 1.17 ERA in 7.2 career innings pitched (1 er) against Kansas City, including eight strikeouts and one walk.

Last Year: Went 1-2 with two saves and a 4.73 ERA (28 er in 53.1 ip) with 66 strikeouts in 71 relief appearances with Texas and Arizona last season...was traded from Texas to Arizona on July 31, 2018.

16 RHP LIAM HENDRIKS

Inherited Runners/Scored: 36/13 First Hitters: 12-49, 4 bb, 2 sf, hbp

- Has converted each of his six save opportunities in nine outings in August and has not allowed a run (9.2 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 17 so).
- Is 1-1 with 15 saves, three blown saves and a 1.35 ERA (4 er in 26.2 ip) in 24 games since taking over as closer when Treinen went on the injured list retroactive to June 21...the saves are second most in the majors over that span...has just two walks, both intentional, in 26.2 innings and has struck out 46.
- Leads all Major League relievers in ERA (1.23) and ranks second in strikeouts (92)...among AL relievers, ranks second in home runs per nine innings (0.27), fifth in OPS (.536), tied for fifth in innings pitched (66.0), and sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.284).
- Has a 1.25 ERA (11 er in 79.1 ip) over his last 70 relief appearances dating back to Sept. 4 of last year.
- His 15 saves are third most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher behind Grant Balfour, who saved 38 games for the A's in 2013 and 24 in 2012...had just one career save entering this season (Sept. 20, 2017).
- Recorded a strikeout in 27 consecutive games from June 8-Aug. 15 (53 so in 29.0 ip, 16.45 per nine innings)...that was the longest streak by an A's reliever since at least 1908...walked just three batters over that span.
- Allowed two runs on July 21, snapping a career-high and A's season-high scoreless streak at 20.2 innings from June 6-July 21...had 34 strikeouts and just three walks over that span and opponents batted .181 (13-for-72).
- Is 1-2 with a 5.25 ERA in 10 career outings against Kansas City (14 er, 24.0 ip), including 19 strikeouts and three walks.
- Was named to his first American League All-Star team.

Last Year: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 7.36 ERA in 13 relief appearances before he was outrighted off the 40-man roster July 2...returned to Oakland Sept. 1 and went 0-1 with a 1.38 ERA in 12 games, including eight starts as the opener.

- Had a 3.09 ERA (4 er in 11.2 ip) in July...had a 2.93 ERA in April, 2.51 in May and 2.30 in June...has allowed five runs in 7.2 innings pitched in August.
- Leads American League relievers in games pitched (65) and inherited runners (50), is second in fewest walks per nine innings (0.96), fourth in opponents OBP (.238), and is seventh in innings pitched (65.2).
- Has a 6.94 ERA (9 er in 11.2 ip) in 14 outings on no days rest, a 2.33 ERA (14 er in 54.0 ip) in his other 50 appearances.
- Is 0-1 with a 1.64 ERA in eight career appearances against Kansas City (2 er, 11.0 ip) including nine strikeouts and one walk.

Last Year: Pitched in a team-leading and career-high 74 games in his first season in Oakland and was 7-3 with a 3.00 ERA and .221 opponents average...the wins were also a career high and his ERA was second lowest to his 2.76 with the Angels in 2017.

- 2.0 shutout innings on Aug. 26 at KC, including 1st MLB strikeout.
- Made his major league debut Wednesday night.
- Was the A's first-round pick and the sixth overall selection in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft...is the first A's pick from that draft to reach the majors.
- Combined to go 4-1 with a 4.97 ERA and a .226 opponents batting average in 18 minor league games (four starts) with Single-A Stockton (June 11-27), Double-A Midland (June 28-July 29) and Triple-A Las Vegas (July 23-Aug. 19)...struck out 38 batters in 25.1 innings
- Tossed two innings or fewer in all 18 minor league appearances.

Last Year: Missed the entire 2018 season after undergoing ulnar collateral ligament surgery on April 10, 2018.

48 RHP JOAKIM SORIA

Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/0 First Hitters: 14-57, 2 bb

- Recorded his first save of the season on Thursday night...his last save prior to that came on July 24, 2018 against the Angels...now has 221 career saves, fifth most among active players.
- Has a 4.05 ERA (12 er in 26.2 ip) and .190 (19-for-100) opponents batting average over his last 30 games dating back to June 15...has 35 strikeouts in 26.2 innings.
- Ranks tied for sixth in the American League in games pitched (60).
- Owns a 3.34 ERA (13 er, 35.0 ip) in 35 A's wins and an 7.33 ERA (19 er, 23.1 ip) in 24 A's losses.
- Is 1-0 with five saves and a 3.86 ERA in 10 career outings against Kansas City (4 er, 9.1 ip), including four strikeouts and three walks...spent seven seasons with Kansas City, including the first five of his career.
- His 699 career games pitched are the most in Major League history by a Mexican-born pitcher.

Last Year: Began the season with the Chicago White Sox and had 16 saves and a 2.56 ERA in 40 relief appearances when he was traded to Milwaukee July 26...went 3-1 with a 4.09 ERA in 26 outings with the Brewers and combined for a 3.12 ERA overall.

39 RHP BLAKE TREINEN

- Allowed multiple runs on Aug. 5 for the first time since July 13 vs. Chicago-AL...is 4-1 with a 5.29 ERA (10 er in 17.0 ip) since July 13, but 12 of his 18 appearances have been scoreless.
- Is tied for the fifth most wins (6) among American League relievers.
- Is tied for ninth in the American League in saves (16).
- Was placed on the 10-day injured list June 23 retroactive to June 21 with a strained right shoulder...was reinstated from the 10-day injured list July 3.
- Is 2-1 with one save and a 3.68 ERA in six career appearances against Kansas City (3 er, 7.1 ip), including nine strikeouts and one walk.

Last Year: Went 9-2 with a career-high 38 saves, a career-low 0.78 ERA and a career-high 100 strikeouts to become the first pitcher in Major League history to save 30 games, compile an ERA under 1.00 and strikeout 100 batters.

- Was 2-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .182 opponents average in his first 25 appearances, 1-5 with a 11.70 ERA and .420 opponents average in 11 appearances from May 29-June 21 and is 1-0 with a 5.68 ERA (12 er in 19.0 ip) and .263 (20-for-76) opponents average in 19 games since then.
- Issued 18 of his 27 walks in May and June...has walked just 10 combined batters in March, April, July and August.
- Has a 1.62 ERA (6 er, 33.1 ip) in 32 A's wins and an 10.80 ERA (26 er, 21.2 ip) in 23 A's losses.

- Hit a career-high 37 home runs which ranked second in the minors to the Diamondbacks Kevin Cron (39) at the time of his promotion...his 104 RBI were second in the minors to the Pirates' Mason Martin (123).
- Was hitting .335 with 19 home runs and 45 RBI in 39 games since the All-Star Break.
- Was originally selected by Oakland in the 19th round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft and is a .274 hitter with 92 home runs and 391 RBI in 573 games in five seasons as a professional.
- At the time of his promotion, he was leading the Pacific Coast League in RBI (104) and total bases (286), ranked second in home runs (37), extra base hits (72) and runs (101), fourth in slugging (.634) and ninth in OPS (.986)...his complete 2019 stats with Las Vegas:

- Was named American League Player of the Week on Monday after going 9-for-19 (.474) with five runs, a double, four home runs, seven RBI and four multiple hit games in five games.
- Had his second career two-homer game Sunday against San Francisco (also July 17, 2019 vs. Seattle).
- Has a 10-game hitting streak, which is one short of his career high (11, June 17-July 3, 2018)...is 19-for-42 (.452) with five home runs, 11 RBI, and seven multiple hit games during the streak.
- Is batting .380 (30-for-79) with five home runs and 15 RBI in 20 games in August (.449 obp, .620 slg, 1.070 OPS)...the highest single-month batting average of his career is .309 in August of 2015.
- Is hitting .331 (48-for-145) with 10 home runs and 24 RBI in 38 games since the All-Star Break after batting .233 with 12 home runs and 22 RBI in 58 games before the break.
- Has started 23 of the A's last 24 games in center field since the injury to Laureano and is 31-for-91 (.341) over that span...prior to that, started 19 of the A's 26 games in right field while Piscotty was on the injured list.
- Has started games at five different positions (28 in center field, 24 in right field, 12 at designated hitter, 11 at first base, eight in left field)...the A's are 55-28 (.663) with him in the starting lineup.
- Is tied for sixth in the AL in hit by pitches (10).
- Has career highs in home runs (22) and walks (48), and has matched his best in hit by pitches (10).

Last Year: Started games at five different positions for the A's and batted .249 with 17 home runs and 52 RBI in 122 games...hit 13 of his home runs against left-handed pitchers, which tied for second in the American League.

26 MATT CHAPMAN

- Is hitting .215 (20-for-93) over his last 24 games but 13 of the 20 hits are for extra bases (six doubles, seven home runs).
- Is fourth in the American League in extra base hits (66) and tied for eighth in home runs (30).
