OAKLAND ATHLETICS (76-55) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (46-87)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 28, 2019 — KAUFFMAN STADIUM — 7:15 CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and nine of the last 12 games and are a season-high tying 21 games over .500 for the second time this year (74-53 on Aug. 22)...are 76-55 (.580), which is the fifth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are 26-14 (.650) since the All-Star Break, which is third best in the AL and fifth best in the majors...have sole possession of the second AL Wild Card spot, one game ahead of Tampa Bay and ½-game behind Cleveland for the first spot...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by nine games...have spent 62 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

THE MIDDLE OF JUNE: The A's were 36-36 (.500) at the conclusion of play on June 16 but have gone 40-19 (.678) since then, which is the second best record in the majors...last year, the A's were 34-36 (.486) through June 15 but then went 63-29 (.685) from June 16 through the end of the season, which was the best record in the majors.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 19-5 (.792) against American League Central teams and have outscored them 151-73 (+78)...are batting .280 (248-for-885) with 151 runs (6.04 per game) and 43 home runs in 25 games (includes May 19 suspended game)...the pitching staff has a 2.75 ERA (69 er in 225.2 ip) and .236 (196-for-831) opponents batting average...are now 71-24 (.747) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.

IN AUGUST: The A's have clinched a winning record in August for the second consecutive season as they are 15-7 (.682) with four games remaining...have the third best record in the American League and the fourth best record in the majors...this is the A's fourth consecutive month with a winning record...have issued the fewest walks in the AL (53), rank third in ERA (3.73), opponents OPS (.715) and slugging percentage (.412), tied for third in saves (8) and fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.303)...the offense ranks second in on-base percentage (.348) and fifth in OPS (.823) and batting (.265).

THE LONG BALL: The win last night was just the A's fifth this year when going homerless, which is second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 2)...the Athletics record for fewest wins in a season when going homerless is six in 2017...have hit 208 home runs, which ranks eighth in the majors but is sixth most in Athletics history (5th is 227 in 2018)...have set a franchise record for most players with 10 or more home runs (10) and have tied the mark for most players with 20 or more home runs (5)...are one of three teams with at least five players with 20 or more home runs (Twins, 6; Astros, 5) and one of four with at least 10 players with 10 or more home runs (Twins, Yankees and Blue Jays 11)...have two games this year where all nine players in the starting lineup had at least 10 home runs (Aug. 21 and 24) and seven in Athletics history (the other five were in 2000)...have hit back-to-back home runs 11 times, which is tied for second most in Oakland history (13 in 2000).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-1 with a 3.58 ERA (28 er in 70.1 ip) over the last 12 games and 13-5 with a 3.17 ERA (55 er in 156.0 ip) over the last 26 contests...are 55-33 with a 4.01 ERA overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins and rank fourth in ERA and innings pitched (729.2)...Oakland has two 10-game winners (Fiers and Anderson) for the first time since 2014 (Kazmir and Gray).

RANKINGS: The A's pitching staff ranks second in the American League in fewest home runs (156), third in opponents slugging percentage (.404), tied for third in shutouts (8) and fourth in ERA (4.04), OPS (.715), batting average (.245) and on-base percentage (.311)...the offense ranks second in hit by pitches (68), third in fewest stolen bases (39) and most grounded into double plays (116), fourth in fewest strikeouts (1064) and fifth in runs (676), home runs (208), extra base hits (459) and slugging percentage (.446)...the defense has the third fewest errors (69) and are tied for the third fewest double plays (93)...the errors have led to 27 unearned runs, which is six fewer than any other team...opponents have been caught stealing 36 times, which is second most in the majors (Philadelphia, 43).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this seven-game road trip to Kansas City (2-0) and New York-AL (three games)...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Chicago-NL (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1)...are 28-14 over their last 43 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...are 33-29 (.532) on the road compared to 43-26 (.623) at home...have clinched a winning record at home for the third consecutive season...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-1), New York-AL (3-0) and San Francisco (0-2) and are 25-10 (.714) over the last 35 home games after starting the year 18-16 (.556).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 21-16 (.568) in one-run games with the win last night, which is tied for the second best record in the American League...are tied for second in wins and tied for third in games (37)...64 of the A's games have been decided by two runs or fewer, which is four more than any other AL team and sixth most in the majors...rank second in the majors in walk-off wins (9) but are tied for third in the AL in walk-off losses (7)...are third in the AL in most losses when leading after seven innings (7).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 23-11 (.676) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 53-44 (.542) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to Houston (28-9) but the 34 games are third fewest...are batting .265 with an .816 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .243 with a .755 OPS against right-handers...rank fourth in the AL in OPS off lefties and fifth in batting average but have the fifth lowest batting average against righties...the OPS against lefties is currently tied for the best mark in Oakland history (.816 in 1994).

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored in each of the first two innings last night after scoring in each of the final eight innings the night before...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 10 consecutive innings with a run is the most in Athletics history, topping the previous mark of nine (June 9-10, 1911 and July 21-22, 1987)...have a run differential of +114, which is fourth best in the American League and fifth best in the majors...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in RBI (22), are tied for the lead in home runs (5) and rank second in hits (21), doubles (6), extra base hits (11) and plate appearances (90).

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's have won the first two meetings of 2019 after winning the season series last year, 5-2...won three of four in Oakland and two of three in Kansas City...have won 16 of the last 21 games against the Royals and have outscored Kansas City 140-62 over that span (6.7 runs per game to 3.0 runs)...have won 10 of the last 13 in Kansas City...all-time, the A's are 324-265 (.532) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.589)...are 175-118 in Oakland and 149-147 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha is batting .366 (30-for-93) with five home runs and 15 RBI in August (.441 obp, .598 slug, 1.038 OPS)...**Matt Chapman** has 30 home runs, which is third most in Athletics history by a third baseman (Chavez 32 in 2001, Bando 31 in 1969)...**Khris Davis** hit his 152nd home run as an Athletic Monday night, which is one short of tying Dwayne Murphy for ninth most in Oakland history...needs one more home run to become the first Athletic with four straight 20-homer seasons since Eric Chavez had seven straight from 2000-06...**Liam Hendriks** has not allowed a run in 10 games in August and his 10.2-inning scoreless streak is his third of 10 or more innings this year...leads Major League relievers with a 1.21 ERA...**Marcus Semien** is tied for sixth in the American League in runs (95), ranks eighth in walks (70) and extra base hits (63), tied for eighth in doubles (34) and triples (6) and ninth in hits (147).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1938** the A's sweep a doubleheader from Chicago on Connie Mack Day at Shibe Park, their seventh consecutive twin bill in eight days...in **1974** the A's win at Milwaukee 3-1 as Catfish Hunter wins his 20th game of the season, his fourth consecutive 20-win season...he would go on to win 25 games, an Oakland record which stood until 1990 when Bob Welch won 27...in **2002** the A's defeat Kansas City 7-1 to extend their winning streak to an Oakland record 15, breaking the mark of 14 set in 1988...the streak would reach a then-AL record 20 before coming to an end.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tanner Roark (2-1, 2.63 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was acquired from Cincinnati on July 31 with cash considerations for minor league outfielder Jameson Hannah and is 2-1 with a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts with the A's...has allowed two earned runs or fewer in each start with the A's and in 16 of 25 starts overall...went 6-7 with a 4.24 ERA in 21 starts with the Reds and is 8-8 with a 3.95 ERA (59 er in 134.1 ip) in 25 starts for the season.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .241 (68-for-282) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .302 (74-for-245) against left-handers...has surrendered 10 of his 17 home runs and issued 26 of his 43 walks to lefties...has a .650 OPS against righties, .887 against lefties...13 of the 17 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...eight have come against batters leading off an inning...has allowed 15 home runs in 78.0 innings over his last 14 starts after yielding two in 56.1 innings over his first 11 starts...has held the opponents number one hitter to a .188 (12-for-64) average but the clean-up hitter is batting .377 (23-for-61).

IN AUGUST: Is 2-1 with a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts in August... is now 17-8 with a 2.80 ERA (62 er in 199.0 ip) in 42 career appearances in August...the wins are his most for any month and the ERA is his lowest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-2 with a 3.90 ERA (25 er in 57.2 ip) in 11 starts on the road compared to 3-6 with a 3.99 ERA (34 er in 76.2 ip) in 14 starts in his home ballparks, which includes one start at Monterrey Stadium in Mexico... is tied for eighth in the majors in losses at home.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest...is 6-2 with a 3.28 ERA (21 er in 57.2 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest compared to 2-6 with a 4.46 ERA (38 er in 76.2 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 5-6 with a 3.51 ERA and .249 opponents batting average in 17 starts before the All-Star Break...is 3-2 in seven starts since then but has a 4.93 ERA (23 er in 42.0 ip) and .312 (53-for-170) opponents average.

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for seventh in the majors in hit batters (10)...is averaging 18.0 pitches per inning, which is the highest mark in the majors ahead of teammate Homer Bailey (17.7)...had his first wild pitch since July 3, 2018 in his last start, snapping a streak of 37 consecutive starts without a wild pitch...has 131 strikeouts in 134.1 innings and his average of 8.78 strikeouts per nine innings is currently the highest mark of his career (8.24 in 2017).

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed three runs in each of his first two starts (5.79 ERA) but then went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA and .231 opponents batting average over his next six starts from April 13 to May 9...left with a 4-3 lead in his second start on April 6 at Pittsburgh only to have the bullpen blow the save...it was the first of two times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (July 18 vs. St. Louis)...started the Reds April 13 home game against St. Louis in Monterrey, Mexico, and had a no decision in a 5-2 win...allowed one run in 5.1 innings but left trailing 1-0...walked a season-high four batters in 3.2 innings April 29 at New York (NL)...matched that in 3.1 innings July 30 against Pittsburgh...went 1-5 with a 4.09 ERA over a six-start stretch from May 14 to June 15...struck out a season-high nine batters in 5.0 scoreless innings May 26 at Chicago (NL)...went 3-2 with a 2.28 ERA in five starts in May and did not allow a home run in 27.2 innings...it was his lowest single-month ERA since compiling a mark of 2.03 in April of 2016...drove in both of the Reds runs in a 5-2 loss to Washington on June 1...had a suicide squeeze in the second inning and then hit his first career home run in the fourth, a solo shot off Eric Fedde...went over the 1,000 career innings pitched plateau June 8 at Philadelphia...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings and a season-high 116 pitches June 15 against Texas but took the loss, allowing four runs, two earned...yielded one run in back-to-back starts on June 20 at Milwaukee and June 26 at Los Angeles (AL)...then went 1-1 with a 7.30 ERA and .346 opponents batting average in five starts in the month of July...surrendered seven home runs in 24.2 innings...allowed a season-high seven runs on a career-high 13 hits but had a no decision in the Reds 17-9 win at Colorado July 13...it was his 200th career appearance...was the losing pitcher in his final start with the Reds, an 11-4 loss to Pittsburgh on July 30...allowed five runs on six hits and four walks in a season-low 3.1 innings...picked up the win in his A's debut on Aug. 4 against St. Louis when he allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over New York (AL) last Thursday in Oakland...did not walk a batter for the second time in his four starts with the A's...blanked the Yankees on three hits over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead when allowed a RBI single to Tauchman in the fifth...was relieved by Diekman after yielding a one-out solo home run to Torres in the seventh.

ROARK vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 0 hr) in two career starts, both in Kansas City...his last start came on May 3, 2016, a no decision in a 7-6 Washington loss...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on an Escobar RBI single and a Hosmer two-run single...had a 6-3 lead when he was relieved by Rivero with one out in the eighth inning and runners on first and third...Rivero allowed one of those runs to score and Papelbon allowed three runs in the ninth for the blown save.

RHP Chris Bassitt (9-5, 3.59 ERA): Is 4-1 with a 2.45 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in eight starts since the All-Star Break...ranks sixth in the American League in post-break ERA...is 7-2 with a 2.96 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day compared to 2-3 with a 4.39 ERA and .242 opponents average in 11 starts at night...is tied for second in the AL in wins in day games...is 4-0 with a 1.52 ERA and .189 opponents batting average in five starts against AL Central teams...based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, he has the fourth lowest opponents average with RISP in the AL (.197)...had a no decision in his last start, a 10-5 A's loss to San Francisco last Saturday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 so)...is 0-1 with a 3.57 ERA (22.2 ip, 22 h, 9 r, 9 er, 8 bb, 18 so) in four career appearances, all starts, against Kansas City...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, a 2-0 A's loss in Oakland on June 9 (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 6 so).

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 3.61 ERA (70 er in 174.2 ip) over the last 53 games since June 23 and now has a 4.09 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League.
- Has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.396), rank fourth in OPS (.712), and fifth in on-base percentage (.316) and batting average (.241).
- Is 33-for-57 (57.9%) in save opportunities...the 24 blown saves are tied for second most in the majors.
- Has allowed the second fewest home runs (56) and has the fourth fewest walks (181) among AL bullpens...has the fifth fewest wins (21).
- Has the fourth lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.357) among Major League bullpens.

- Has not allowed a run in 34 of 41 games since he was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 29 for his second stint with the A's...has a 2.20 ERA (7 er in 28.2 ip) and .235 (24-for-104) opponents batting average over that span...logged a 7.04 ERA and .375 opponents average over his first 13 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas April 22.
- Has allowed a .244 (21-for-86) average against left-handed hitters, .300 (15-for-50) against right-handers.
- Has a 1.54 ERA (2 er in 11.2 ip) in 18 outings on no days rest, a 3.91 ERA (10 er in 23.0 ip) in his other 35 appearances
- Allowed one earned run on two hits without recording an out in his only career appearance against the Royals on June 9, 2017...spent part of that season with the Royals after they acquired him via trade from San Diego.
