OAKLAND ATHLETICS (76-56) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (47-87)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two of their last three and nine of the last 13 games and are 20 games over .500...are 76-56 (.576), which is the fifth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are 26-15 (.634) since the All-Star Break, which is third best in the AL and sixth best in the majors...have sole possession of the second AL Wild Card spot, one game ahead of Tampa Bay and 1½-games behind Cleveland for the first spot...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by 10 games...have spent 63 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

THE MIDDLE OF JUNE: The A's were 36-36 (.500) at the conclusion of play on June 16 but have gone 40-20 (.667) since then, which is the third best record in the majors...last year, the A's were 34-36 (.486) through June 15 but then went 63-29 (.685) from June 16 through the end of the season, which was the best record in the majors.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 19-6 (.760) against American League Central teams and have outscored them 155-79 (+76)...are batting .278 (256-for-920) with 155 runs (5.96 per game) and 45 home runs in 26 games (includes May 19 suspended game)...the pitching staff has a 2.89 ERA (75 er in 233.2 ip) and .238 (205-for-862) opponents batting average...are now 71-25 (.740) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.

IN AUGUST: The A's have clinched a winning record in August for the second consecutive season as they are 15-8 (.652) with three games remaining...have the third best record in the American League and the sixth best record in the majors...this is the A's fourth consecutive month with a winning record...have issued the fewest walks in the Majors (55), rank third in the AL in ERA (3.84) and opponents OPS (.723), fourth in slugging percentage (.416), tied for third in saves (8), and fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.305)...the offense ranks second in on-base percentage (.346) and fifth in OPS (.819) and batting (.263).

THE LONG BALL: The win Tuesday night was just the A's fifth this year when going homerless, which is second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 2)...the Athletics record for fewest wins in a season when going homerless is six in 2017...have hit 210 home runs, which ranks tied for eighth in the majors but is sixth most in Athletics history (5th is 227 in 2018)...have set a franchise record for most players with 10 or more home runs (10) and have tied the mark for most players with 20 or more home runs (5)...are one of three teams with at least five players with 20 or more home runs (Twins, 6; Astros, 5) and one of four with at least 10 players with 10 or more home runs (Twins, Yankees and Blue Jays 11)...have two games this year where all nine players in the starting lineup had at least 10 home runs (Aug. 21 and 24) and seven in Athletics history (the other five were in 2000)...have hit back-to-back home runs 11 times, which is tied for second most in Oakland history (13 in 2000).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-1 with a 3.77 ERA (32 er in 76.1 ip) over the last 13 games and 13-5 with a 3.27 ERA (59 er in 162.0 ip) over the last 27 contests...are 55-33 with a 4.02 ERA overall...are third in the American League in wins and rank fourth in ERA and innings pitched (735.2) ...Oakland has two 10-game winners (Fiers and Anderson) for the first time since 2014 (Kazmir and Gray).

RANKINGS: The A's pitching staff ranks second in the American League in fewest home runs (158), third in opponents slugging percentage (.405), tied for third in shutouts (8) and fourth in ERA (4.06), OPS (.716), batting average (.245), and on-base percentage (.312)...the offense ranks second in hit by pitches (69), third in fewest stolen bases (39) and most grounded into double plays (116), fourth in fewest strikeouts (1074), fifth in runs (680), extra base hits (462) and slugging percentage (.446), and sixth in home runs (210)...the defense has the third fewest errors (69) and the fourth fewest double plays (94)...the errors have led to 27 unearned runs, which is six fewer than any other team...opponents have been caught stealing 37 times, which is second most in the majors (Philadelphia, 43).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this seven-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and New York-AL (three games)...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Chicago-NL (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1)...are 28-15 over their last 44 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...are 33-30 (.524) on the road compared to 43-26 (.623) at home...have clinched a winning record at home for the third consecutive season...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-1), New York-AL (3-0) and San Francisco (0-2) and are 25-10 (.714) over the last 35 home games after starting the year 18-16 (.556).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 21-16 (.568) in one-run games with the win Tuesday night, which is tied for the second best record in the American League...are tied for second in wins and tied for third in games (37)...65 of the A's games have been decided by two runs or fewer, which is four more than any other AL team and fifth most in the majors...rank second in the majors in walk-off wins (9) but are tied for third in the AL in walk-off losses (7)...are third in the AL in most losses when leading after seven innings (7).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 23-11 (.676) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 53-45 (.541) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to Houston (29-9)...are batting .264 with an .812 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .243 with a .756 OPS against right-handers...rank fourth in the AL in OPS off lefties and fifth in batting average but have the fifth lowest batting average against righties...the OPS against lefties is just short of the best mark in Oakland history (.816 in 1994).

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored in each of the first two innings Tuesday night after scoring in each of the final eight innings the night before...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 10 consecutive innings with a run is the most in Athletics history, topping the previous mark of nine (June 9-10, 1911 and July 21-22, 1987)...have a run differential of +112, which is fourth best in the American League and fifth best in the majors...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in RBI (22), are tied for the lead in home runs (5) and rank second in hits (21), doubles (6), extra base hits (11), and are third in the American League in plate appearances (90).

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's won two of the first three meetings of 2019 after winning the season series last year by a margin of 5-2...won three of four in Oakland and two of three in Kansas City...have won 16 of the last 22 games against the Royals and have outscored Kansas City 144-68 over that span...have won 10 of the last 14 in Kansas City...all-time, the A's are 324-266 (.549) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.589)...are 175-118 in Oakland and 149-148 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha is batting .365 (31-for-97) with six home runs and 17 RBI in August (.443 obp, .624 slug, 1.067 OPS)...**Matt Chapman** has 30 home runs, which is third most in Athletics history by a third baseman (Chavez 32 in 2001, Bando 31 in 1969)...**Khrist Davis** hit his 152nd home run as an Athletic Monday night, which is one short of tying Dwayne Murphy for ninth most in Oakland history...needs one more home run to become the first Athletic with four straight 20-homer seasons since Eric Chavez had seven straight from 2000-06...**Liam Hendriks** has not allowed a run in 10 games in August and his 10.2-inning scoreless streak is his third of 10 or more innings this year...leads Major League relievers with a 1.21 ERA...**Marcus Semien** is sixth in the American League in runs (96), ranks eighth in walks (70), tied for sixth in extra base hits (64), tied for eighth in doubles (34) and triples (6), and ninth in hits (149).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1937** the A's score 12 runs in the first inning of the first game of a doubleheader against Chicago...Bob Johnson drives in six runs in the first inning...in **1989** the A's score 10 times in the fifth inning of a 19-5 win at New York...Jose Canseco has two hits in the inning, including a three run homer, and is 4 for 5 with four runs, a pair of homers and five RBI in the game...in **1998** the A's set an Oakland record with eight doubles in an 11-6 win at Cleveland...Ben Grieve ties the Oakland individual record with three doubles and Scott Spiezio adds two.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (9-5, 3.59 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 4-1 with a 2.45 ERA (13 er in 47.2 ip) and .232 (41-for-177) opponents batting average in eight starts since the All-Star Break...ranks sixth in the American League in post-break ERA...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents average over his first five starts and was 3-3 with a 6.00 ERA and .249 opponents average in nine starts in between (May 21-July 6)...has career highs in all major categories except losses.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 7-2 with a 2.96 ERA (23 er in 70.0 ip) and .211 (54-for-256) opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day compared to 2-3 with a 4.39 ERA (27 er in 55.1 ip) and .242 (51-for-211) opponents average in 11 starts at night...is tied for second in the American League in wins in day games...was 0-8 in 15 career day games entering the season.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 4-0 with a 1.52 ERA (5 er in 29.2 ip) and .189 (20-for-106) opponents batting average in five starts against American League Central teams...now has a five-game winning streak against the Central dating back to June 27, 2018 and has a 1.22 ERA (6 er in 44.1 ip) and .173 (27-for-156) opponents average over that eight start stretch...his last loss to a Central team was at Chicago on June 22, 2018.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .198 (49-for-247) batting average...has a .255 (56-for-220) average against right-handers... however, has surrendered 12 of his 18 home runs and issued 27 of his 43 walks to left-handed hitters...nine of his home runs have come with two strikes...has allowed a .193 (17-for-88) average with runners in scoring position...opponents are batting .194 (34-for-175) the first time through the lineup...273 (48-for-176) with 10 of his 18 home runs the second time and .198 (23-for-116) after that.

NINE-GAME WINNER: Picked up his ninth win of the season Aug. 17 against Houston...had a 4-14 record in 40 games over four seasons in the majors entering this year...needs one more win to give the A's three 10-game winners for the first since 2013 when they had five (Colon, Griffin, Milone, Parker, Straily).

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.25 ERA (11 er in 44.0 ip) and .186 (30-for-161) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game compared to a 4.32 ERA (39 er in 81.1 ip) and .245 (75-for-306) opponents average from the third inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-2 with a 3.22 ERA (21 er in 58.2 ip) in 10 starts at home compared to 4-3 with a 3.92 ERA (29 er in 66.2 ip) in 12 starts on the road...has yielded just five home runs in 58.2 innings in Oakland compared to 13 in 66.2 innings on the road...is 6-9 with a 2.94 ERA (46 er in 141.0 ip) in 26 career appearances in the Coliseum and has allowed just 11 home runs (0.70 per nine innings).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 22 starts this year and is 2-5 in those games...is 7-0 in nine starts with support of three runs or more...has two starts with a combined 29 runs of support and has a season RSA of 5.96 (83 rs in 125.1 ip)...entered the season with a 2.67 RSA in his career as a starter...has received two runs of support or fewer in 37 of his 52 career starts and is 4-19 in those games...is 9-0 in 15 career starts with run support of three runs or more.

PRE AND POST "TOMMY JOHN": Is 11-8 with a 3.43 ERA (66 er in 173.0 ip) in 33 games (29 starts) since undergoing "Tommy John" surgery May 6, 2016... is averaging 8.22 strikeouts per nine innings (158 so in 173.0 ip)...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contusion...went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA in three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16...was recalled by Oakland the next day when Marco Estrada went on the injured list...made his first start April 22 against Texas and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings for the win...struck out a season-high nine in his second start April 28 at Toronto (also May 9 against Cincinnati)...however, had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss in 11 innings...left his third start on May 4 at Pittsburgh after five innings with a 4-3 lead but Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss...it was the first of two times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (July 30 vs. Milwaukee)...took the loss on May 9 against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a three-game streak dating back to last year...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...the

loss was his first since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits in a 17-3 win at Detroit on May 16...walked a career-high six batters in 3.2 innings in a no decision at Cleveland May 21...is the first Major League pitcher since at least 1908 with a pitching line of 3.2 innings, three hits, three runs, three earned runs, six walks and six strikeouts...allowed three runs on four hits and four walks in a season-low 3.1 innings at St. Louis on June 25 but had a no decision in the A's 7-3 win...allowed a season-high six runs in 4.1 innings in a 6-3 loss at Seattle July 6...allowed a season-high eight hits but just two runs in a no decision in a 6-5 A's loss at Chicago (NL) on Aug. 5...tossed a career-high 116 pitches and yielded a season-high tying eight hits in an 8-4 win over Houston on Aug. 17.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-5 loss to San Francisco last Saturday in Oakland...shut out the Giants on one hit over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he surrendered a two-out solo home run to Crawford in the fifth inning...also allowed a RBI single to Longoria in the sixth and was relieved by Diekmann with two outs in the sixth and the score tied 2-2.

was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, a 2-0 A's loss in Oakland on June 9...it was his first Major League appearance since April 28, 2016 at Detroit as he had UCL reconstruction surgery on May 6, 2016...allowed a RBI single to Orlando in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...retired each of the final nine batters he faced... Duffy, McCarthy and Herrera combined to shut out the A's on four hits.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA and .242 opponents batting average on a three start rehab assignment...struck out 16 batters in 11.0 innings and walked two...his first assignment came with Stockton on April 4 against Rancho Cucamonga (3.0 ip, 7 so)...retired all nine batters he faced, the first five by strikeout...moved to Las Vegas for a start on April 9 in a 10-2 win against Sacramento (3.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...allowed just one run in three innings of work, a bases loaded walk to Michael Reed in the first inning...then had a no decision in a 6-5 loss to Fresno on April 14 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 3 er, 4 so, 2 hr).

LHP Brett Anderson (10-9, 4.08 ERA): Is 1-4 with a 4.93 ERA and .293 opponents batting average over his last six starts...was 9-5 with a 3.82 ERA over his first 20 starts...is 6-3 with a 3.42 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 13 starts on the road...ranks eighth in the American League in road ERA and tied for 10th in wins...is 8-5 with a 3.29 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 16 starts at night...ranks seventh in the AL in ERA at night, seventh in OPS (.650) and tied for 12th in wins...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss to San Francisco last Sunday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...is 0-6 with a 6.86 ERA (40.2 ip, 60 h, 35 r, 31 er, 11 bb, 30 so, 7 hr) in eight career starts against New York...the losses are his most against any team and the ERA is his highest against any team that he has faced more than three times...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, a 6-2 A's loss at Yankee Stadium on May 13 (5.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 4 so).

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 3.67 ERA (72 er in 176.2 ip) over the last 54 games since June 23 and now has a 4.11 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League.
- Has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.396), rank fourth in OPS (.714), and fifth in on-base percentage (.318) and batting average (.242).
- Is 33-for-57 (57.9%) in save opportunities...the 24 blown saves are tied for second most in the majors.
- Has allowed the second fewest home runs (56) and has the fourth fewest walks (182) among AL bullpens...has the fifth fewest wins (21).
- Has the fifth lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.357) among Major League bullpens.
