OAKLAND ATHLETICS (77-56) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (88-47)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won three of four from Kansas City to start the road trip and are 10-4 over the last 14 games...are a season-high tying 21 games over .500 for the third time this year at 77-56 (.579)...that is the fifth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are 27-15 (.643) since the All-Star Break, which is third best in the AL and fourth best in the majors...have sole possession of the second AL Wild Card spot for the third consecutive day and are one game ahead of Tampa Bay...trail Cleveland by 1½ games for the first spot...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by nine games...have spent 64 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE BEST: The A's have played 18 of their last 37 games against teams that were leading their respective divisions entering play that day...are 11-7 in those games (3-0 vs. Yankees, 2-2 vs. Twins, 4-3 vs. Astros, 1-2 vs. Cubs, 1-0 vs. Cardinals)...for the season, the A's have a 22-16 (.579) record against teams currently holding a playoff spot.

THE MIDDLE OF JUNE: The A's were 36-36 (.500) at the conclusion of play on June 16 but have gone 41-20 (.672) since then, which is tied with the Nationals for the second best record in the majors to the Yankees...last year, the A's were 34-36 (.486) through June 15 but then went 63-29 (.685) from June 16 through the end of the season, which was the best record in the majors.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 23-11 (.676) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 54-45 (.545) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to Houston (29-9) but the 34 games are third fewest...are batting .265 with an .813 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .244 with a .757 OPS against right-handers...rank fourth in the AL in OPS off lefties and fifth in batting average but have the fifth lowest batting average against righties.

IN AUGUST: The A's have clinched a winning record in August for the second consecutive season as they are 16-8 (.667) with two games remaining...have the third best record in the American League this month and the fourth best in the majors...this is the A's fourth consecutive month with a winning record...have issued the fewest walks in the majors in August (58)...rank third in the AL in ERA (3.93), opponents OPS (.724) and saves (9) and fourth in slugging percentage (.415)...the offense ranks second in on-base percentage (.349)...have hit 40 home runs, which is tied for fourth most in August in Athletics history (55 in 1999, 43 in 2001, 41 in 2017).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 211 home runs, which is tied for sixth in the majors and is sixth most in Athletics history (5th is 227 in 2018)...have set a franchise record for most players with 10 or more home runs (10) and have tied the mark for most players with 20 or more home runs (5)...are one of four teams with at least five players with 20 or more home runs (Twins, 6; Astros and Padres, 5) and one of four with at least 10 players with 10 or more home runs (Twins, Yankees and Blue Jays 11)...have two games this year where all nine players in the starting lineup had at least 10 home runs (Aug. 21 and 24) and seven in Athletics history (the other five were in 2000)...have hit back-to-back home runs 11 times, which is tied for second most in Oakland history (13 in 2000)...have five wins when going homerless, which is second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 3)...the Athletics record for fewest wins in a season when going homerless is six in 2017.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-0 with a 3.71 ERA (21 er in 51.0 ip) over the last nine games and 13-5 with a 3.35 ERA (62 er in 166.2 ip) over the last 28 contests...are 55-33 with a 4.04 ERA overall...rank third in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA and innings pitched (740.1).

PITCHING: The A's have two 10-game winners (Fiers and Anderson) for the first time since 2014 (Kazmir and Gray)...rank second in the American League in fewest home runs (159) and opponents slugging percentage (.405), tied for third in shutouts (8) and fourth in ERA (4.07), OPS (.717), batting average (.245) and on-base percentage (.312).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .293 (91-for-311) with 60 runs scored over the last nine games (6.7 runs per game)...have scored 689 runs for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...have been hit by a pitch 71 times,

which is tied with the Twins for the most in the AL and tied for third most in Athletics history (88 in 2001, 76 in 2018)...also rank third in the AL in most grounded into double plays (117) and fewest stolen bases (39), tied for third in fewest strikeouts (1079), tied for fourth in home runs (211) and fifth in OPS (.772), slugging (.447) and extra base hits (467).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 70 errors, which is third fewest in the American League...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a non-strike season is 84 in 2006...the errors have led to 29 unearned runs, which is the fewest in the majors...the fewest in Athletics history in a non-strike season is 42 in 1991...rank fourth in the AL in fewest double plays (94)...are second in the majors in opponents caught stealing (37).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this seven-game road trip to Kansas City (3-1) and New York-AL (three games)...went 4-4 on the last road trip and are now 29-15 over their last 45 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...are 34-30 (.531) on the road compared to 43-26 (.623) at home...return home following the game Sunday for the penultimate homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Detroit (three games plus the completion of the May 19 suspended game)...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-1), New York-AL (3-0) and San Francisco (0-2) and are 25-10 (.714) over the last 35 home games after starting the year 18-16 (.556)...have clinched a winning record at home for the third consecutive season.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 22-16 (.579) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the American League (Twins 17-11, .607)...are tied with Texas for the most wins and tied for third in games (38)...66 of the A's games have been decided by two runs or fewer, which is the most in the AL and tied for fourth most in the majors...rank second in the majors in walk-off wins (9) but are tied for third in the AL in walk-off losses (7)...are third in the AL in most losses when leading after seven innings (7).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have a run differential of +113, which is fourth best in the American League and fifth best in the majors...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in RBI (22), are tied for the lead in home runs (5) and rank second in hits (21), doubles (6) and extra base hits (11).

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland last week...need one more victory to win the season series for the fifth time in the last seven years (have one loss and one split over that span)...are 27-15 (.643) against the Yankees dating back to 2013, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that stretch...have won 10 of the last 13 games but have dropped four of the last five games in New York...have won nine of the last 10 games and 21 of the last 28 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 253-281 against the Yankees...that includes 141-128 in Oakland and 112-153 in New York...are 15-22 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 794-1147 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha is batting .360 (32-for-89) with six home runs and 17 RBI in August (.441 obp, .618 slug, 1.059 OPS)...**Matt Chapman** has 30 home runs, which is third most in Athletics history by a third baseman (Chavez 32 in 2001, Bando 31 in 1969)...**Khris Davis** hit his 152nd home run as an Athletic Monday night, which is one short of tying Dwayne Murphy for ninth most in Oakland history...needs one more home run to become the first Athletic with four straight 20-homer seasons since Eric Chavez had seven straight from 2000-06...**Liam Hendriks** has 17 saves, a 1.53 ERA (5 er in 29.1 ip), 52 strikeouts and two walks (both intentional) in 27 games since taking over as the A's closer when Treinen went on the IL June 21...**Marcus Semien** ranks sixth in the American League in runs (97) and total bases (269), tied for sixth in extra base hits (64), eighth in walks (70), tied for eighth in doubles (34) and triples (6), ninth in hits (151) and tied for 10th in multiple hit games (43).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1974** Claudell Washington has five hits in five at bats, collecting three singles, a double and a triple in the A's 10-5 win at Detroit...in **1995** the A's tie a club record with three triples in a 7-2 win at Baltimore...Brent Gates has one of those triples, and adds a single and a double to fall a home run short of the cycle...in **2001** Eric Chavez homers twice and has eight RBI in the A's 15-0 win at Baltimore.

Saves/Opportunities: 34-for-58 (58.6%)

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 3.73 ERA (75 er in 181.0 ip) over the last 55 games since June 23 and now has a 4.13 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League.
- Has the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.395), rank third in OPS (.713), fifth in on-base percentage (.318), and sixth in batting average (.243).
- Is 34-for-58 (58.6%) in save opportunities...the 24 blown saves are tied for second most in the majors.
- Has allowed the second fewest home runs (56) and has the fourth fewest walks (184) among AL bullpens...has the fifth fewest wins (22).
- Has the fifth lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.359) among Major League bullpens.

52 LHP RYAN BUCHTER

Last Outing: 8/28 at Kansas City (ND, 1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)
Saves/Opportunities: 0-4
Inherited Runners/Score: 32/14 First Hitters: 12-47, 5 bb, 2 hbp

- Has not allowed a run in 21 of his last 26 games since June 5 (5 er in 19.1 ip, 2.33 ERA) and 28 of his last 34 (6 er in 24.0 ip, 2.25 ERA) since May 14.
- Has not allowed a run in 35 of 42 games since he was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas April 29 for his second stint with the A's...has a 2.12 ERA (7 er in 29.2 ip) and .234 (25-for-107) opponents batting average over that span...logged a 7.04 ERA and .375 opponents average over his first 13 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas April 22.
- Has allowed a .247 (22-for-89) average against left-handed hitters, .300 (15-for-50) against right-handers.
- Has a 1.54 ERA (2 er in 11.2 ip) in 18 outings on no days rest, a 3.75 ERA (10 er in 24.0 ip) in his other 36 appearances
- Has allowed one run over 3.1 career innings pitched against the Yankees.

Last Year: Went 6-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 54 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...allowed just 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest percentage in the majors.

35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

Last Outing: 8/29 at Kansas City (ND, 0.1 ip, h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, so)
Saves/Opportunities: 0-2
Inherited Runners/Score: 32/8 First Hitters: 10-50, 10 bb, 3 hbp, sf

- Was acquired from Kansas City on July 27 in exchange for minor league RHP Ismael Aquino and minor league OF Dairon Blanco and has pitched in 14 games with the A's (6 er in 10.2 ip, 5.06 ERA).
- Is second among American League relievers in games pitched (64).
- Had a 4.75 ERA with a .212 opponents batting average in 48 games with Kansas City.
- Has struck out 71 batters in 52.1 ip and his average of 12.21 strikeouts per nine innings ranks 14th among American League relievers.
- Is 1-1 with a 3.21 ERA (5 er in 14.0 ip) in 14 career games against the Yankees.

Last Year: Went 1-2 with two saves and a 4.73 ERA (28 er in 53.1 ip) with 66 strikeouts in 71 relief appearances with Texas and Arizona last season...was traded from Texas to Arizona on July 31, 2018.

16 RHP LIAM HENDRIKS

Last Outing: 8/29 at Kansas City (S, 1.2 ip, 3 h, r, er, 5 so)
Saves/Opportunities: 17-21
Inherited Runners/Score: 38/14 First Hitters: 13-51, 4 bb, 2 sf, hbp

- Has converted each of his eight save opportunities in 11 outings in August and has allowed just one run (12.1 ip, 6 h, r, er, 0 bb, 23 so).
- Is 1-1 with 17 saves, three blown saves and a 1.53 ERA (5 er in 29.1 ip) in 27 games since taking over as closer when Treinen went on the injured list retroactive to June 21...the saves are the most in the majors over that span...has just two walks, both intentional, in 29.1 innings and has struck out 52.
- Leads all Major League relievers in ERA (1.31) and ranks second in strikeouts (98)...among AL relievers, ranks second in home runs per nine innings (0.26), tied for fourth in innings pitched (68.2), fifth in OPS (.541), and sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.288).
- Has a 1.32 ERA (12 er in 82.0 ip) over his last 72 relief appearances dating back to Sept. 4 of last year.
- His 17 saves are third most in Major League history by an Australian-born pitcher behind Grant Balfour, who saved 38 games for the A's in 2013 and 24 in 2012...had just one career save entering this season (Sept. 20, 2017).
- Recorded a strikeout in 27 consecutive games from June 8-Aug. 15 (53 so in 29.0 ip, 16.45 per nine innings)...that was the longest streak by an A's reliever since at least 1908...walked just three batters over that span.
- Allowed two runs on July 21, snapping a career-high and A's season-high scoreless streak at 20.2 innings from June 6-July 21...had 34 strikeouts and just three walks over that span and opponents batted .181 (13-for-72).
- Is 2-2 with one save and a 5.40 ERA (11 er in 18.1 ip) in 11 career games (one start) vs. the Yankees...has not allowed a run in his last four appearances against New York-AL.
- Was named to his first American League All-Star team.

Last Year: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 7.36 ERA in 13 relief appearances before he was outrighted off the 40-man roster July 2...returned to Oakland Sept. 1 and went 0-1 with a 1.38 ERA in 12 games, including eight starts as the opener.

36 RHP YUSMEIRO PETIT

- Had a 3.09 ERA (4 er in 11.2 ip) in July...had a 2.93 ERA in April, 2.51 in May and 2.30 in June...has allowed five runs in 10.2 innings pitched in August.
- Leads American League relievers in games pitched (67), inherited runners (54), and fewest walks per nine innings (0.92), ranks third in opponents OBP (.230) and is tied for fourth in innings pitched (68.2).
- Has a 6.94 ERA (9 er in 11.2 ip) in 14 outings on no days rest, a 2.21 ERA (14 er in 57.0 ip) in his other 52 appearances.
- Is 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA (3 er in 16.2 ip) in nine career games (one start) against the Yankees.

Last Year: Pitched in a team-leading and career-high 74 games in his first season in Oakland and was 7-3 with a 3.00 ERA and .221 opponents average...the wins were also a career high and his ERA was second lowest to his 2.76 with the Angels in 2017.

31 LHP A.J. PUK

Inherited Runners/Score: 2/1 First Hitters: 0-1, 2 bb, 1 so

- Pitched 2.0 shutout innings on Aug. 26 at KC, including 1st MLB strikeout.
- Made his major league debut on Aug. 21 vs. New York-AL (0.1 ip, h, bb).
- Was the A's first-round pick and the sixth overall selection in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft...is the first A's pick from that draft to reach the majors.
- Combined to go 4-1 with a 4.97 ERA and a .226 opponents batting average in 18 minor league games (four starts) with Single-A Stockton (June 11-27), Double-A Midland (June 28-July 29) and Triple-A Las Vegas (July 23-Aug. 19)...struck out 38 batters in 25.1 innings
- Tossed two innings or fewer in all 18 minor league appearances.

Last Year: Missed the entire 2018 season after undergoing ulnar collateral ligament surgery on April 10, 2018.

48 RHP JOAKIM SORIA

Last Outing: 8/29 vs. Kansas City (ND, 1.0 ip, h, so)
Saves/Opportunities: 1-5
Inherited Runners/Score: 6/0 First Hitters: 15-59, 2 bb

- Recorded his first save of the season on Aug. 22 vs. New York-AL...his last save prior to that came on July 24, 2018 against the Angels...now has 221 career saves, fifth most among active players.
- Has a 3.77 ERA (12 er in 28.2 ip) and .196 (21-for-107) average over his last 32 games dating back to June 15...has 38 strikeouts in 28.2 innings.
- Ranks tied for third in the American League in games pitched (62).
- Owns a 3.16 ERA (13 er, 37.0 ip) in 38 A's wins and a 7.33 ERA (19 er, 23.1 ip) in 24 A's losses.
- Is 2-2 with 13 saves and a 3.71 ERA (11 er in 26.2 ip) in 27 career outings against the Yankees.
- His 701 career games pitched are the most in Major League history by a Mexican-born pitcher.

Last Year: Began the season with the Chicago White Sox and had 16 saves and a 2.56 ERA in 40 relief appearances when he was traded to Milwaukee July 26...went 3-1 with a 4.09 ERA in 26 outings with the Brewers and combined for a 3.12 ERA overall.

39 RHP BLAKE TREINEN

Last Outing: 8/28 at Kansas City (L, 0.0 ip, 4 BF, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb)
Saves/Opportunities: 16-20
Inherited Runners/Score: 12/5 First Hitters: 10-42, 8 bb, hbp

- Tagged with loss after allowing all four batters to reach (2 runs) without retiring a batter on Aug. 28 at Kansas City.
- Is 4-2 with a 6.35 ERA (12 er in 17.0 ip) since July 13, but 12 of his 19 appearances have been scoreless.
- Is tied for the fifth most wins (6) among American League relievers. Ranks 11th in the American League in saves (16).
- Was placed on the 10-day injured list June 23 retroactive to June 21 with a strained right shoulder...was reinstated from the 10-day injured list July 3.
- Has never allowed a run to the Yankees...is 1-0 with two saves in six career outings (7.2 ip) against New York-AL.

Last Year: Went 9-2 with a career-high 38 saves, a career-low 0.78 ERA and a career-high 100 strikeouts to become the first pitcher in Major League history to save 30 games, compile an ERA under 1.00 and strikeout 100 batters.

62 RHP LOU TRIVINO

Inherited Runners/Score: 25/8 First Hitters: 13-49, 5 bb, hbp

- Pitched 3.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 16, tied for the longest outing of his career (April 18, 2018).
- Was 2-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .182 opponents average in his first 25 appearances, 1-5 with a 11.70 ERA and .420 opponents average in 11 appearances from May 29-June 21 and is 1-0 with a 5.68 ERA (12 er in 19.0 ip) and .263 (20-for-76) opponents average in 19 games since then.
- Issued 18 of his 27 walks in May and June...has walked just 10 combined batters in March, April, July and August.
- Has a 1.62 ERA (6 er, 33.1 ip) in 32 A's wins and an 10.80 ERA (26 er, 21.2 ip) in 23 A's losses.
- Has pitched 3.0 scoreless innings against the Yankees in his career.

Last Year: Pitched in 69 games in his Major League debut and went 8-3 with four saves, a 2.92 ERA and .201 opponents batting average over two stints with the A's...tied for the lead among AL rookies in saves and ranked second in games pitched.

- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas Monday, making his Major League debut...went 2-for-6 with two runs and an RBI in his first game.
- Hit a career-high 37 home runs which ranked second in the minors to the Diamondbacks Kevin Cron (39) at the time of his promotion...his 104 RBI were second in the minors to the Pirates' Mason Martin (123).
- Was hitting .335 with 19 home runs and 45 RBI in 39 games since the All-Star Break.
- Was originally selected by Oakland in the 19th round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft and is a .274 hitter with 92 home runs and 391 RBI in 573 games in five seasons as a professional.
- At the time of his promotion, he was leading the Pacific Coast League in RBI (104) and total bases (286), ranked second in home runs (37), extra base hits (72) and runs (101), fourth in slugging (.634) and ninth in OPS (.986)...his complete 2019 stats with Las Vegas:

- Is batting .360 (32-for-89) with six home runs and 17 RBI in 23 games in August (.441 obp, .618 slg, 1.059 OPS)...the highest single-month batting average of his career is .309 in August of 2015.
- Is hitting .323 (50-for-155) with 11 home runs and 26 RBI in 41 games since the All-Star Break after batting .233 with 12 home runs and 22 RBI in 58 games before the break.
- Was named American League Player of the Week on Monday after going 9-for-19 (.474) with five runs, a double, four home runs, seven RBI and four multiple hit games in five games.
- Had his second career two-homer game Sunday against San Francisco (also July 17, 2019 vs. Seattle).
- Snapped a 10-game hitting streak Tuesday, which was one short of his career high (11, June 17-July 3, 2018)...went 19-for-42 (.452) with five home runs, 11 RBI, and seven multiple hit games during the streak.
- Has started 26 of the A's last 27 games in center field since the injury to Laureano and is 33-for-101 (.327) over that span...prior to that, started 19 of the A's 26 games in right field while Piscotty was on the injured list.
- Has started games at five different positions (31 in center field, 24 in right field, 12 at designated hitter, 11 at first base, eight in left field)...the A's are 57-29 (.663) with him in the starting lineup.
- Is tied for fourth in the AL in hit by pitches (11).
- Has career highs in home runs (23), walks (50), and hit by pitches (11).

Last Year: Started games at five different positions for the A's and batted .249 with 17 home runs and 52 RBI in 122 games...hit 13 of his home runs against left-handed pitchers, which tied for second in the American League.
