OAKLAND ATHLETICS (78-57) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (89-48)

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 1, 2019 — YANKEE STADIUM — 1:05 EDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (1ST START OF 2019) VS. LHP J.A. HAPP (11-8, 5.57) NBCSCA & TBS — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KTRB 860 AM/KHTK 1140 AM) — A'S CAST ON TUNEIN

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the first six games this trip vs. Kansas City (3-1) and New York-AL (1-1) and are 11-5 over the last 16 games...are 21 games over .500, one short of a season-high tying mark...that is the fifth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are 28-16 (.636) since the All-Star Break, which is third best in the AL and sixth best in the majors...are tied for the second AL Wild Card spot with Tampa Bay...trail Cleveland by a ½ game for the first spot...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by nine games...have spent 66 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

SUSTAINED SUCCESS: Oakland is 141-86 (.621) since June 16, 2018, the 2ndbest record in the Majors during that span behind Houston (145-83, .636) and ahead of Los Angeles-NL (144-89, .618), New York-AL (144-89, .618) and Tampa Bay (137-93, .596).

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND: Oakland is 4-1 against the Yankees this season and a win today would give them an .833 winning percentage vs. New York... it would be just the 3rd time in club history to have an .833 mark against them for a season series, joining the clubs from 1990 (12-0) and 2013 (5-1).

IT'S HAPPENING: Marcus Semien is hitting .429 (9-for-210 with 3 home runs and 7 RBI in his career against Yankees starter J.A. Happ...his .429 average vs. Happ is T3rd-best among active players (min. 20 AB) behind Renato Nuñez (.579/11x19) and Nicholas Castellanos (.545/12x22)...his 3 homers against the lefty are T4th-best among active players behind Steve Pearce (6), Andrew McCutchen (4) and Nuñez (4).

ELITE COMPANY: Marcus Semien hit his 25th home run of the year (and 100th of his career) on Friday...he joins Miguel Tejada (2000-03) as only A's players with 25+ home runs as a shortstop in multiple seasons...since 2016, Semien is T5th most home runs (77) in Majors as a shortstop behind Trevor Story (116), Francisco Lindor (107), Xander Bogaerts (84) & Didi Gregorius (83).

PLAYER OF THE MONTH?: Mark Canha hit .347 (34-for-98) with 17 runs, 3 doubles, 2 triples, 6 home runs, 18 RBI with a .434 on-base percentage, a .602 slugging mark and a 1.036 OPS in August...among American Leaguers in August, he ranks 6th in on-base percentage, 11th in average, & 15th in OPS.

AGAINST THE BEST: The A's have played 20 of their last 39 games against teams that were leading their respective divisions entering play that day... are 12-8 in those games (4-1 vs. Yankees, 2-2 vs. Twins, 4-3 vs. Astros, 1-2 vs. Cubs, 1-0 vs. Cardinals)...for the season, the A's have a 23-17 (.575) record against teams currently holding a playoff spot.

THE MIDDLE OF JUNE: The A's were 36-36 (.500) at the conclusion of play on June 16 but have gone 42-21 (.667) since then, which is the 3rd best record in the majors to the Yankees & Nationals...last year, the A's were 34-36 (.486) through June 15 but then went 63-29 (.685) from June 16 through the end of the season, which was the best record in the majors.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 24-11 (.686) in

games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 54-46 (.540) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to Houston (29-9) but the 35 games are third fewest... are batting .263 with an .814 OPS against left-handed pitchers...rank fourth in the AL in OPS off lefties and fifth in batting average.

IN AUGUST: The A's clinched a winning record in August for the second consecutive season as they are 17-9 (.654)...had 3rd-best record in American League in August and the sixth best in the majors...this is the A's fourth consecutive month with a winning record...rank 2nd in opponent OPS (.713), 3rd in AL in ERA (3.85), & T3rd in saves (9) and 2nd in slugging percentage (.411)... the offense ranks 2nd in on-base percentage (.353)...have hit 43 home runs, which is T2nd-most in August in Athletics history (55 in 1999, 43 in 2001).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 214 home runs, which is tied for fifth in the majors and is sixth most in Athletics history (5th is 227 in 2018)...have set a franchise record for most players with 10 or more home runs (10) and

have tied the mark for most players with 20 or more home runs (5)...are one of four teams with at least five players with 20 or more home runs (Twins, 8; Astros and Padres, 5) and one of four with at least 10 players with 10 or more home runs (Twins, Yankees and Blue Jays 11)...have two games this year where all nine players in the starting lineup had at least 10 home runs (Aug. 21 and 24) and seven in Athletics history (the other five were in 2000)... have hit back-to-back home runs 11 times, which is tied for second most in Oakland history (13 in 2000)...have five wins when going homerless, which is second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 4)...the Athletics record for fewest wins in a season when going homerless is six in 2017.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-0 with 3.59 ERA (25 er in 62.2 ip) over last 11 games and 14-5 with a 3.33 ERA (66 er in 178.1 ip) over the last 30 games since July 27...are 56-33 with a 4.02 ERA overall...rank third in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA and innings pitched (752.0).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .286 (111-for-388) with 71 runs scored over the last 11 games (6.5 runs per game)...have scored 700 runs for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...have been hit by a pitch 75 times, which is the most in the AL and third most in Athletics history (88 in 2001, 76 in 2018)...also rank fourth in fewest strikeouts (1098), T4th in home runs (214) and fifth in OPS (.773), slugging (.447) and extra base hits (476).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 70 errors, which is third fewest in the American League...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a non-strike season is 84 in 2006...the errors have led to 29 unearned runs, which is the fewest in the majors...the fewest in Athletics history in a non-strike season is 42 in 1991...rank tied for third in the AL in fewest double plays (96)...are second in the majors in opponents caught stealing (37).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this seven-game road trip to Kansas City (3-1) and New York-AL (1-1)...went 4-4 on the last road trip and are now 30-16 over their last 47 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...are 35-31 (.530) on the road compared to 43-26 (.623) at home...return home following the game Sunday for the penultimate homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Detroit (three games plus the completion of the May 19 suspended game)...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-1), New York-AL (3-0) and San Francisco (0-2) and are 25-10 (.714) over the last 35 home games after starting the year 18-16 (.556)...have clinched a winning record at home for the third consecutive season.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's lead the season series 4-1 after sweeping a threegame series in Oakland last week...have won the season series for the fifth time in the last seven years (have one loss and one split)...are 28-16 (.636) against the Yankees dating back to 2013, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that stretch...have won 11 of the last 15 games but have dropped five of the last seven games in New York...have won nine of the last 10 games and 21 of the last 28 in Oakland... since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 254-282 against the Yankees... that includes 141-128 in Oakland and 113-154 in New York...are 16-23 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 795-1148 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has 30 home runs, which is third most in Athletics history by a third baseman (Chavez 32 in 2001, Bando 31 in 1969)...Liam Hendriks has 17 saves, a 1.53 ERA (5 er in 29.1 ip), 52 strikeouts and two walks (both intentional) in 27 games since taking over as the A's closer when Treinen went on the IL June 21... Marcus Semien ranks sixth in the American League in runs (98) and total bases (273), tied for eighth in extra base hits (65), eighth in walks (71), tied for ninth in doubles (34) and T8th in triples (6), 10th in hits (152) and tied for 10th in multiple hit games (43).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1906 Jack Coombs and Boston's Joe Harris go the distance in a 24 inning, 4-1 A's victory that lasts four hours and 47 minutes...Coombs strikes out 18 and allows 14 hits...in 1974 Sal Bando hits a two-run homer in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit...it is his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...in 2002 Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning as the A's defeat Minnesota 7-5 to set a franchise record with their 18th consecutive win...the streak would reach an AL record 20 before coming to an end.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (0-0, — ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Began the season on the 60-day injured list as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...started a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 8 and made three starts before he was transferred to Triple-A Las Vegas July 23...made two starts before his rehab assignment was halted on Aug. 2 due to a strained right oblique... returned to action Aug. 13 and made three more starts with the Aviators before being reinstated from the IL today...was 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts overall...struck out 53 batters in 36.1 innings (13.13 per nine innings) and walked 10 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.3.

REHAB HIGHLIGHTS: Began his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on July 8 and allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high seven hits in a season-low 2.1 innings in a 9-6 loss to Visalia...also tossed 2.1 innings and took the loss in his next start July 13 at Rancho Cucamonga...logged 3.2 scoreless innings in his final start with the Ports on July 18 against Lancaster...was charged with the loss in his first start with Triple-A Las Vegas on July 24 against El Paso and followed that up with a no decision July 30 against New Orleans...had his rehab assignment halted Aug. 2 with a strained right oblique...resumed his rehab assignment Aug. 13 and went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA and .136 opponents average over his final three starts...struck out 10 batters in 5.2 innings Aug. 13 at Omaha, his first of two 10-strikeout games.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He combined with Ben Bracewell and J.B. Wendelken on a two-hit shutout in a 3-0 Las Vegas win at Tacoma last Friday... tossed a season-high 7.0 innings and struck out a season-high 12 on a season-high 99 pitches...allowed leadoff doubles to Jaycob Brugman in the second and Eric Filia in the fourth and walked John Andreoli with one out in the sixth.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-1 win at Minnesota on Aug. 24, 2018...blanked the Twins on one hit and one walk over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed an unearned run in the bottom of the fourth when his own error preceded a Sano sacrifice fly...the A's got that run back in the fifth and he was relieved by Trivino with no outs and a runner on first in the bottom of the sixth with the A's leading 2-1.

twice in the second but he gave both of those runs back in the third when Merrifield scored on a wild pitch and Perez homered...those were the only runs he allowed in 7.1 innings and he retired 14 of the final 16 batters he faced...the win came on Sept. 14, 2016 when he combined with Axford, Hendriks and Smith on a four-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win at Kansas City... tossed five of the innings and allowed three of the hits...allowed just one base runner to advance into scoring position and retired each of the final eight batters he faced...was originally drafted by the Royals as a Competitive Balance pick following the first round of the 2013 draft and was traded to the A's with Aaron Brooks for Ben Zobrist and cash, July 28, 2015.

2018 RECAP: Was 12-9 with a 3.59 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in 27 starts before going on the disabled list Aug. 26 with a shoulder injury... underwent surgery Sept. 19 and missed the remainder of the season...his ERA, opponents batting average, on-base percentage (.278), slugging percentage (.385) and OPS (.663) where the lowest of his three seasons...also had career lows in strikeouts per nine innings (6.05) and walks per nine innings (1.79) and had a career-high 3.38 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had a career-high 160.2 innings pitched and 21 home runs and matched his best in wins... walked two batters or fewer in 24 of his 27 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS, 2018: Based on a minimum of 150 innings, he had the fifth fewest walks per nine innings in the American League, the seventh lowest on-base percentage and the 10th lowest OPS...using the same minimum, he had the ninth fewest walks per nine innings in Oakland history, the 10th lowest on-base percentage and 10th best strikeout-to-walk ratio...averaged 14.8 pitches per inning, which was the lowest mark in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...tied for second in the AL in most sacrifice hits allowed (4), tied for sixth in opponents reaching on an error (8) and tied for 10th in wild pitches (9).

A's 2018 LEADERS: Led the A's in wins, starts, innings, strikeouts (108), hits (141), runs (67), home runs (21) and losses (9)...this marked the second consecutive season, fourth time in Oakland history (also 1996-97) and fifth time in Athletics history (1957) the A's did not have a pitcher with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...it was just the sixth time in Oakland history the A's did not have a pitcher with at least 30 starts in a non-strike season (1979, 1986, 1996-97, 2017)...his nine losses match the fewest by a team-leader in a non-strike season in Oakland history (Hudson, 2001) and the 27 starts and 108 strikeouts were the fewest by an A's team leader since Steve Karsay had 24 starts and 92 strikeouts in 1997.

2018 TRENDS: Went 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts through the end of April, 1-4 with a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents average in six starts in May, 5-1 with a 3.12 ERA and .231 opponents average over his next 11 starts from June 5 to Aug. 1 and 2-2 with a 5.12 ERA and .316 opponents batting average over his final four starts.

2018 OPPONENTS BATTING: His .232 opponents batting average broke down to .231 (112-for-485) against right-handed hitters compared to .236 (29-for-124) against left-handers...surrendered 19 of his 21 home runs to righties and has allowed 52 of his 59 career home runs to righties...has a .746 career OPS against righties, .586 against lefties...opponents hit .197 with a .254 on-base percentage and .306 slugging percentage when leading off an inning... had a .193 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .255 after that...allowed a .189 batting average with two strikes...held the bottom four hitters in the order to a .174 average

2018 SPLITS: Was 6-1 with a 3.44 ERA in 11 starts during the day, 6-8 with a 3.69 ERA in 16 starts at night...is now 14-4 with a 3.49 ERA (67 er in 172.2 ip) in 29 career day games, 17-24 with a 4.20 ERA (136 er in 291.1 ip) in 52 starts at night...went 7-3 with a 3.27 ERA in 13 starts on the road and tied for 10th in the AL in road wins...went 3-0 with a 1.78 ERA in four starts against AL Central teams and now has a seven-game winning streak against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016...is 8-2 with a 2.50 ERA (19 er in 68.1 ip) in 11 career starts against AL Central teams.

2018 RUN SUPPORT: Received a total of eight runs of support in his nine losses (1.61 RSA) and has 28 runs of support in his 28 career losses (138.0 ip, 1.83 RSA)...received two runs of support or fewer in 14 of his 27 starts and was 2-8 in those games...was 10-1 in his other 13 starts...is now 4-26 in 42 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 27-2 in 38 starts with support of three or more

2018 AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE: Was 11-5 with a 3.18 ERA and .213 opponents batting average in 20 starts against AL teams compared to 1-4 with a 5.00 ERA and .292 opponents average in seven interleague starts...the interleague starts tied for second most in a single season in Major League history (Peavy, CWS-BOS in 2013 had 9) and are the most by an Oakland pitcher...the losses set an Oakland interleague record and tied for the most in the majors in 2018...is now 3-7 with a 4.28 ERA (36 er in 75.2 ip) in 14 career starts against the National League, 28-21 with a 3.87 ERA (167 er in 388.1 ip) in 67 games against the AL

MANAFA'S CAREER HIGHS

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Mike Fiers (12-3, 3.46 ERA): Is 11-0 with a 2.41 ERA and .214 opponents batting average over his last 20 starts dating back to his May 7 no-hitter against Cincinnati...the winning streak is a career-high (previous: 6, July 21-Sept. 11, 2018) and tied for second longest in Oakland history (13, Hunter, June 2-Sept. 5, 1973)...has left with the lead seven times only to have the bullpen blow the save...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 2-1 A's win at Kansas City on Tuesday (5.1 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...it was his 13th win of the season, which is a new career high and the most wins by an A's pitcher since Sonny Gray won 14 in 2015...now has 164.0 innings pitched and is the first A's pitcher with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (186.0)...is 3-1 with a 4.82 ERA (37.1 ip, 38 h, 21 r, 20 er, 15 bb, 36 so, 8 hr) in seven career starts against New York...including a win in his only start this year on Aug. 21 in Oakland (5.1 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 4 so).

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 3.68 ERA (77 er in 188.1 ip) over the last 57 games since June 23 and now has a 4.10 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League.
- Has lowest opponents slugging mark in AL (.395), rank 2nd in OPS (.710), fourth in on-base percentage (.316), & fifth in batting average (.241).
- Is 34-for-59 (57.6%) in save opportunities...the 25 blown saves are tied for the most in the majors.
- Has allowed the second fewest home runs (58) and has the fourth fewest walks (184) among AL bullpens...has the fifth fewest wins (22).
- Has the fourth lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.355) among Major League bullpens.

- Is batting .347 (26-for-75) with five home runs, 18 RBI, and 10 multiple hit games over his last 19 games...reached base five times yesterday for the third time in his career and for the first time since April 18, 2018 when he went 4-for-6 with two walks against the White Sox.
- Is hitting .319 (58-for-182) on the road compared to .224 at home.
- Leads American League first basemen and ranks fifth in the majors in home runs (27), despite missing 34 games while on the injured list...also leads AL first basemen in total chances (918), putouts (834), and assists (78), and ranks second in fielding percentage (.993).

- Has tossed out 19-of-64 (29.7%) attempted base stealers...the 19 caught stealings are second most in the majors (Realmuto, PHI 34) but the 45 stolen bases are seventh most...is second in the Majors with 13 passed balls, which is second most in Oakland history...the record is 14 by Terry Steinbach in 1987.
- Has seven of his 10 home runs and 38 of his 52 RBI on the road.
- Is batting .298 (28-for-94) with eight home runs and 26 RBI in 34 day games, .228 (41-for-180) with two home runs and 26 RBI in 58 night games.
- Has hit nine of his home runs while batting ninth, which is tied for the
 most in the majors and equals the Athletics record for home runs from the
 nine spot in order (Hernandez, 2000 and Semien, 2016).
- Hit .287 with seven home runs and 33 RBI over his first 44 games but batted .191 with three home runs and 14 RBI in his next 38 contests before going on the IL.

Last Year: Batted .258 with 13 home runs and 27 RBI in 110 games in a season interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...became the first player in Oakland history to start at least one game at seven different positions (LF, 2B, RF, 3B, SS, CF and 1B).

- The switch-hitter is batting .303 (27-for-89) against left-handed pitchers compared to .189 (57-for-302) with 16 of his 18 home runs against righthanders.
- Has 18 home runs, which is tied for second most in Oakland history by a second baseman (19, Ellis in 2007; 18, Lowrie in 2018).
- Is 5-for-12 (.417) with a home run and 13 RBI with the bases loaded.
- Has committed four errors in his last 81 games at second base after making eight over his first 28 games...is tied for the lead among Major League second basemen in errors (12).

Last Year: Batted .254 with 35 doubles, 20 home runs, 77 RBI and 10 stolen bases in 146 games with Texas...was one of just five players in the American League to post minimums of 35 doubles, 20 home runs, 75 RBI and 10 stolen bases.

10 MARCUS SEMIEN

- Ranks sixth in the American League in runs (98), tied for ninth in doubles (34), tied for eighth in triples (6), and extra-base hits (65), and is eighth in walks (71)...is also second in at-bats (555) and third in games played (136).
- Is second among AL shortstops in RBI (73) and ranks second in home runs (25)...this is his second career 20-homer season and he joins Miguel Tejada (five times) and Eddie Joost (twice) as the only shortstops in Athletics history with multiple 20-homer seasons.
- Leads Major League shortstops in assists (370) and leads AL shortstops in total chances (541)...ranks third among AL shortstops in fielding percentage (.980).
