ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight, five of the last six and 16 of the last 23 to improve to a season-high 25 games over .500 at 84-59 (.587)...that is the fifth best record in the American League and the seventh best in the majors...are 33-18 (.647) since the All-Star Break, which is the third best record in the AL...have the second AL Wild Card spot, 1½ games ahead of third place Cleveland and one game behind first place Tampa Bay...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by 9½ games...have spent 74 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth...have clinched a winning record for the second consecutive season and fifth time in Bob Melvin's eight full seasons with the A's

STRIKEOUTS: The A's pitching staff struck out 13 batters yesterday after fanning 19 Saturday night, which is an Athletics record for strikeouts in a nine-inning game...this is the second time in Oakland history the A's have struck out at least 13 batters in back-to-back games (June 28-29, 2009)...the 32 strikeouts are the most over a two-game stretch since they had 35 from July 9-10, 1971 (26 in 20 innings and 9)...Sean Manaea struck out 10 yesterday after Chris Bassitt fanned 11 on Saturday...it was the first time the A's had back-to-back games with a 10-strikeout performance by a pitcher since June 25-26, 1971 (Blue, 12 and Hunter, 10)...the A's now have 1133 strikeouts for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League but ninth most in Athletics history.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-0 with a 3.21 ERA (37 er in 103.2 ip) over the last 18 games...the 18-game unbeaten streak is the longest single-season streak by Oakland starters since a 20-game streak from Aug. 13-Sept. 4, 2002...the nine-game winning streak is the longest since a nine-game streak from May 7-21, 2014...have not won more than nine straight since a 12-game winning streak from June 18-July 1, 2005...the last loss by an A's starter was by Brett Anderson on Aug. 18 against Houston...starters are now 60-33 with a 3.95 ERA overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins and ranks fourth in ERA and innings pitched (793.0).

THE LONG BALL: The A's did not homer yesterday but won...it was just the sixth time this year Oakland won when going homerless, which is second ewest in the majors (Seattle, 3)...the Athletics record for fewest wins in a season when going homerless is six in 2017...the A's have set a franchise record for most players with 20 or more home runs (6) and most players with 10 or more home runs (10)...are one of three teams with six players with 20 or more home runs (Twins 8, Astros 7) and one of seven with 10 players with 10 or more home runs.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .224 (50-for-223) over the first seven games of September but have 42 runs scored (6.0 per game), 34 walks and six hit by pitches (.341 on-base percentage)...have been hit by a pitch 81 times overall, which is the most in the American League, third most in the majors and second most in Athletics history to the record of 88 in 2001...also rank third in the AL in fewest strikeouts (1155) and fifth in runs (744), home runs (224), extra base hits (501), OPS (.773) and slugging (.447)...are third in most grounded into double plays (126) and fewest stolen bases (43).

PITCHING: The have compiled a 3.09 ERA (22 er in 64.0 ip) in September and now have a 4.00 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...also rank second in the AL in fewest home runs (172) and opponents slugging percentage (.401), third in OPS (.711), fourth in batting average (.243) and on-base percentage (.309), tied for fourth in shutouts (9) and fifth in fewest walks (428).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 72 errors, which is third fewest in the American League...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a non-strike season is 84 in 2006...the errors have led to 31 unearned runs, which is the fewest in the majors...the fewest in Athletics history is 39 in 1981...have turned 102 double plays, which is third fewest in the AL...are second in the majors in opponents caught stealing (38).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are batting .277 (23-for-83) with seven doubles, a triple, five home runs, 25 RBI and 12 walks...have 13 extra base

hits, which ties the Oakland record set in 1968...lead the American League in RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits, rank second in hits and doubles and tied for third in plate appearances (98)...the five homers are tied for third most in Oakland history (8 in 1970, 6 in 2013) and the 25 RBI are the most since 1990 (26).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their penultimate road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Houston (four games) and Texas (three games)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Kansas City (3-1) and New York-AL (1-2) and are now 31-17 over their last 48 road games after starting the year 5-15 on the road...are 36-32 (.529) on the road compared to 48-27 (.640) at home...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and Detroit (2-1) and are 30-11 (.732) over the last 41 home games after starting the year 18-16 (.556).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 40-31 (.563) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the games (71) are the most in the American League and third most in the majors and the wins are the most in the AL and fourth most in the majors...are 22-19 (.537) in one-run games...are tied for second in the AL in one-run games (41) and rank third in wins...have nine walk-off wins, which is tied for second in the majors (Dodgers, 12), and nine walk-off losses, which is tied for the most in the AL...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games and the losses and games (14) are tied for the most in the AL...have 10 losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Seattle for the most in the majors...they are the most such losses by an Oakland team since the 2006 club also had 10.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 48 players after using at least 50 in each of the previous four seasons...have employed 27 pitchers, which is tied for second fewest in the American League to Houston (26)...that includes 18 relievers, which is tied with Cincinnati for the fewest in the majors...have used six catchers, which ties the Oakland record set in 1978.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-12 (.692) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 57-47 (.548) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (31-9)...have a run differential of +138, which is fourth best in the AL and fifth best in the majors...finished last year with a mark of +139...have 11 series sweeps, which is fourth most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2013 when they had 12...have three 10-game winners for the first time since 2013 when they had five.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have lost the season series for the fifth consecutive year as they are 5-10 against the Astros with four games remaining...went 4-5 in Oakland and are 1-5 in Houston...have won four of the last six games after losing eight of the first nine...four of the A's five wins have been by one run...are 34-57 (.374) against Houston over the last five years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 65-70 all-time, including 35-34 in Oakland and 30-36 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha has a career-high 23-game reaching base streak and is batting .318 (27-for-85) with six home runs, 18 RBI, 14 walks and five hit by pitches (.442 on-base percentage) over that span...**Matt Chapman** has 32 home runs, which ties the Athletics franchise record for home runs as a third baseman (Eric Chavez in 2001)...**Liam Hendriks** has 110 strikeouts, which is one short of the Major League record for strikeouts by an Australian born pitcher (111, Damian Moss, ATL, 2002)...has 108 strikeouts as a reliever, which are fourth most in Oakland history by a reliever and the most since Rollie Fingers had 113 in 1976...**Marcus Semien** is one of 13 players in Major League history with at least the following in a season: 105 runs, 161 hits, 37 doubles, seven triples, 26 home runs, 77 RBI, 75 walks and nine stolen bases...the last to do it is Mike Trout in 2014.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1945** Dick Fowler no-hits the St. Louis Browns, 1-0...in **1958** Preston Ward hits three consecutive home runs in Kansas City's 8-6 win against Baltimore...in **1985** Jose Canseco hits his first major league home run off the Rangers Jeff Russell in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas...in **1988** Luis Polonia becomes the third player in Oakland history to score five runs in a game in the A's 14-6 win at Kansas City...he is a perfect 5 for 5 on the day and also drives in three runs...in **1990** the A's defeat the New York Yankees 7-3 to complete a sweep of the season series, 12-0...in **1995** Stan Javier ties an Oakland record with a pair of triples in the A's 8-2 win at Chicago.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (14-3, 3.51 ERA)

12-GAME WINNING STREAK: Extended his winning streak to 12 games on Friday when the A's completed their suspended game of May 19 against Detroit with a win...is now 12-0 with a 2.59 ERA (38 er in 132.0 ip) and .220 (104-for-473) opponents batting average over his last 21 starts dating back to his May 7 no-hitter against Cincinnati...has left with the lead in eight of the nine no decisions during the streak only to have the bullpen blow the save...the winning streak is a career-high (previous: 6, July 21-Sept. 11, 2018) and second longest in Oakland history to the record of 13 set by Catfish Hunter in 1973...it is tied for the longest streak in the majors this year with Gerrit Cole (12, May 27-present)...the last Major Leaguer with a winning streak greater than 12 games in a single season is Max Scherzer (13, April 6-July 3, 2013)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, his streak of 21 consecutive starts without a loss matches Lefty Grove (April 22-Aug. 19, 1931) for the longest in Athletics history.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is 14-3 and his .824 winning percentage is the best in the majors...the best mark in Oakland history is .821 by Barry Zito in 2002 (23-5)...is also tied for fifth in the American League in wins, ranks eighth in ERA (3.51) and opponents OPS (.690), ninth in slugging (.388) and 10th in batting average (.238)...is third in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.12), fourth in fewest pitches per inning (15.5), tied for fourth in games started (29) and stolen bases allowed (13), fifth in wild pitches (10) and tied for 10th in hit batters (9).

RECENT A'S HISTORY: Picked up his 14th win of the season Friday when the A's won the completion of the May 19 suspended game with Detroit...that is an on-going career high, two more than his 12 from last year...the wins are the most by an A's pitcher since Sonny Gray also won 14 in 2015...has 169.0 innings pitched and is the first A's pitcher with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (186.0)...is scheduled to make his career-high tying 30th start today and will become the first A's pitcher with 30 starts since Graveman in 2016 (31).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 10-1 with a 3.10 ERA (42 er in 122.0 ip) in 20 starts at night compared to 4-2 with a 4.60 ERA (24 er in 47.0 ip) in nine starts during the day...has the third lowest night ERA in the American League, has the sixth lowest opponents OPS (.648) and is tied for sixth in wins...is 15-2 with a 3.21 ERA (61 er in 171.0 ip) in 29 career appearances at night with the A's.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 10-0 with a 2.66 ERA (28 er in 94.2 ip) in 15 starts on five days rest, 2-1 with a 4.20 ERA (23 er in 49.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest and 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA (15 er in 25.0 ip) in five starts on six days rest or more...is now 13-0 with a 2.70 ERA (37 er in 123.1 ip) in 20 starts on five days rest in his Athletics career.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 5-0 with a 2.90 ERA (20 er in 62.0 ip) in 10 starts since the All-Star Break after going 9-3 with a 3.87 ERA in 19 starts before the break...ranks seventh in the American League in ERA since the break...his nine wins at the break are his most ever before the break (had six in 2016 and 2018).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-2 with a 3.15 ERA (33 er in 94.1 ip) in 16 starts at home, 6-1 with a 3.98 ERA (33 er in 74.2 ip) in 13 starts on the road...is tied for third in the American League in home wins and ranks sixth in ERA...is now 12-3 with a 3.20 ERA (55 er in 154.2 ip) and .225 (126-for-561) opponents batting average in 27 career appearances, 26 starts, in the Coliseum.

BY MONTH: Went 4-0 with a 2.76 ERA in five starts in August...it marked the second time he won four games in a month this year (June), the fourth time in his career (Aug. 2012, Aug. 2014)...tied for third in the American League in wins and ranked eighth in ERA...went 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts in April but was 11-1 with a 2.52 ERA and .217 opponents average in 21 starts from May 1 through Aug. 31...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in his career in April and 55-35 with a 3.39 ERA from May through August...is 0-0 with a 7.20 ERA (4 er in 5.0 ip) in one start in September and is now 7-13 with a 5.42 ERA (92 er in 152.2 ip) in 32 career games in September.

NO-HITTER: Tossed his second career no-hitter May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati to become the 34th pitcher in Major League history with multiple regular season no-hitters...is the seventh with a no-hitter for multiple teams...with the acquisition of Homer Bailey on July 12 the A's become the sixth team in Major League history with two pitchers with multiple no-hitter on their roster...the last was the 1988 Houston Astros (Bob Forsch and Nolan Ryan)...his no-hitter was the 13th in Athletics history, including the eighth in Oakland history.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed single runs in each of the first two innings on a Trout home run and a Simmons RBI single...the A's tied the game with two

in the bottom of the second and added three more in the third before he allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the fourth and a RBI double to Ohtani in the fifth...was relieved by Treinen to start the sixth with a 5-4 lead and Treinen allowed an Upton home run for the blown save.

FIERS vs. HOUSTON: Is 1-2 with a 5.63 ERA (40.0 ip, 46 h, 25 r, 25 er, 11 bb, 29 so, 13 hr) in seven career appearances, all starts...is 0-1 with a 6.46 ERA (11 er in 15.1 ip) in three starts in Minute Maid Park as a visitor and 1-1 with a 5.11 ERA (14 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in his home ballparks...pitched for the Astros from 2015-17 and is 10-11 with 3.89 ERA (95 er in 219.2 ip) in 38 career appearances, all starts, at Minute Maid Park...is 0-0 with a 6.14 ERA (22.0 ip, 23 h, 15 r, 15 er, 10 bb, 11 so, 7 hr) in four starts this year...the first no decision came in a 9-8 A's loss at Houston on April 7...tossed 1.2 innings, which matched the shortest start of his career (June 2, 2013 at Philadelphia)...allowed five runs in the bottom of the first and another in the second but the A's came back to take an 8-6 lead to get him off the hook...had a no decision in a 3-2 A's loss in Oakland on May 31...left with a 2-1 lead, two outs and a runner on first but Trivino allowed a Kemp RBI double for the blown save...his third no decision came in the A's 4-3, 11-inning win at Houston July 23...allowed a two-run inside-the-park home run to Gurriel in the second inning but those were the only runs he would allow in 7.2 innings...had his fourth no decision Aug. 15 in Oakland in a 7-6 A's win...yielded a career-high tying four home runs (third time, second vs. Houston)...left with a 6-5 lead but Treinen allowed a Brantley home run in the eighth for the blown save.
