ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five of the last seven games and 16 of the last 24...are 33-19 (.635) since the All-Star Break, which is the third best record in the American League...are 84-60 (.583) overall, which is the fifth best record in the AL and seventh best in the majors...the 24 games over .500 are one short of the season high of 25 (84-59 on Sept. 8)...currently have the second AL Wild Card spot, % game ahead of the data and seventh data and seven the data of the season high of Card spot, % game ahead of the data and seventh data data with a seventh data of the second AL wild Card spot, % game ahead of the data of the second and wild card spot, % game ahead of the second and wild card spot, % game ahead of the second and wild card spot, % game ahead of the second and wild card spot, % game ahead of the second spot.

the second AL Wild Card spot, ½ game ahead of third place Cleveland and 1½ game behind first place Tampa Bay...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by 10½ games...have spent 75 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth...have clinched a winning record for the second consecutive season and fifth time in Bob Melvin's eight full seasons with the A's.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have gone homerless in backto-back games for the first time since July 24-26 when they had a three-game streak...are now 6-28 when going homerless and the six wins are second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 3)...the Athletics record for fewest wins in a season when going homerless is six in 2017...have 224 home runs, which is tied for seventh in the majors and is sixth most in Athletics history...have set a franchise record for most players with 20 or more home runs (6) and most players with 10 or more home runs (10)...

are one of three teams with six players with 20 or more home runs (Twins 8, Astros 6) and one of seven with 10 players with 10 or more home runs.

OFFENSE: The A's were shut out yesterday for the first time since May 9, snapping an Oakland record-tying streak of 104 consecutive games without being shut out (June 18, 2001-April 10, 2002)...have been shut out just three times this year, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (Yankees, 1) and is currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history (2001 and 2004)... are batting .210 (53-for-252) in September but have 42 runs scored (5.3 per game), 35 walks and six hit by pitches (.320 on-base percentage)...have been hit by a pitch 81 times overall, which is the most in the American League, third most in the majors and second most in Athletics history to the record of 88 in 2001...also rank third in the AL in fewest strikeouts (1165) and fifth in runs (744), home runs (224), extra base hits (502), OPS (.770) and slugging (.445)...are third in most grounded into double plays (128) and fewest stolen bases (43).

PITCHING: The A's allowed seven home runs last night, which ties the franchise record for home runs in a game (April 11, 1985 vs. Seattle)...have allowed 179 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League but tied for sixth most in Oakland history...yielded a season-high 15 runs last night after allowing just 14 runs over the previous five games... rank third in the AL in opponents OPS (.717) and slugging percentage (.406), fourth in ERA (4.07), batting average (.244), on-base percentage (.310) and fewest strikeouts (1135), tied for fourth in shutouts (9) and fifth in fewest walks (430).

STARTING PITCHING: The loss by Mike Fiers last night was the first by an A's starting pitcher since Brett Anderson on Aug. 18, also against Houston... it snapped a streak of 18 consecutive games without a loss by A's starters, which was Oakland's longest single-season streak since a 20-game streak from Aug. 13-Sept. 4, 2002...starters are now 9-1 with a 3.96 ERA (46 er in 104.2 ip) over the last 19 games and 60-34 with a 4.05 ERA overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins and ranks fourth in ERA and innings pitched (794.0).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 73 errors, which is third fewest in the American League...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season is 81 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 84 in 2006...the errors have led to 32 unearned runs, which is the fewest in the majors...the fewest in Athletics history is 39 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 42 in 1991...have turned 105 double plays, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL...are second in the majors in opponents caught stealing (38).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are batting .274 (23-for-84) with seven doubles, a triple, five home runs, 25 RBI and 13 walks...have 13 extra base hits, which ties the Oakland record set in 1968...lead the American League in RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits, rank second in hits and

doubles, third in plate appearances (100) and tied for third in walks...the five homers are tied for third most in Oakland history (8 in 1970, 6 in 2013) and the 25 RBI are the most since 1990 (26).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on the penultimate road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Houston (0-1) and Texas (three games)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Kansas City (3-1) and New York-AL (1-2) and are now 31-18 (.633) over their last 49 road games after starting the year 5-15 (.250) on the road...are 36-33 (.522) on the road compared to 48-27 (.640) at home... went 5-1 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and Detroit (2-1) and are 30-11 (.732) over the last 41 home games after starting the year 18-16 (.556).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 40-31 (.563) in games decided by two runs or fewer... the games (71) are the most in the American League and third most in the majors and the wins are the most in the AL and fourth most in the majors... are 22-19 (.537) in one-run games...are tied for second in the AL in one-run games (41) and rank third in wins...have nine walk-off wins, which is tied for second in the majors (Dodgers, 12), and nine walk-off losses, which is tied for the most in the AL...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games and the losses and games (14) are tied for the most in the AL...have 10 losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Seattle for the most in the majors...they are the most such losses by an Oakland team since the 2006 club also had 10.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 48 players after using at least 50 in each of the previous four seasons...have employed 27 pitchers, which is tied for second fewest in the American League to Houston (26)...that includes 18 relievers, which is tied with Cincinnati for the fewest in the majors...have used six catchers, which ties the Oakland record set in 1978.

THIS AND THAT: The A's lost 15-0 last night, which was their largest shutout loss since June 25, 1984 in a 16-0 decision at Kansas City...are 17-5 (.773) on Tuesday's, which is the best record in the majors...are 27-12 (.692) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 57-48 (.543) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (31-9)...have a run differential of +123, which is fourth best in the American League and fifth best in the majors...have 11 series sweeps, which is fourth most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2013 when they had 12.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have lost the season series for the fifth consecutive year as they are 5-11 against the Astros with three games remaining...have been outscored 91-46 and have a -45 run differential against Houston compared to +168 against all other teams...are hitting .199 (107-for-539) and are averaging 2.9 runs per game...went 4-5 in Oakland and are 1-6 in Houston... have won four of the last seven games after losing eight of the first nine... four of the A's five wins have been by one run...are 34-58 (.370) against Houston over the last five years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 65-71 all-time, including 35-34 in Oakland and 30-37 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has 32 home runs, which ties the Athletics franchise record for home runs as a third baseman (Eric Chavez in 2001)...*Liam Hendriks* has 110 strikeouts, which is one short of the Major League record for strikeouts by by an Australian born pitcher (111, Damian Moss, ATL, 2002)...has 108 strikeouts as a reliever, which are fourth most in Athletics history by a reliever and the most since Rollie Fingers had 113 in 1976...*Matt Olson* has a career-high tying 29 home run...needs one more to join Mark McGwire (eight times) and Jason Giambi (two times) as the only first basemen in Oakland history to hit 30 homers...*Marcus Semien* is one of 13 players in Major League history with at least the following in a season: 105 runs, 161 hits, 37 doubles, seven triples, 26 home runs, 77 RBI, 75 walks and nine stolen bases...the last to do it is Mike Trout in 2014.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1948** Barney McCosky collects seven hits in a doubleheader sweep at Washington...he goes 4-for-4 in a 9-6 win in game one and collects three hits in four at bats in a 3-0 win in the night cap...in **1961** Dick Howser is a perfect 5-for-5 in the A's 13-1 win over Minnesota in the first game of a doubleheader...In **1976** Vida Blue strikes out Danny Thompson of Texas for his 1140th as an Athletic, breaking Catfish Hunter's Oakland record... he would go on to strike out 1315 batters in his A's career which is still an Oakland record.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tanner Roark (3-1, 2.70 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was acquired from Cincinnati on July 31 with cash considerations for minor league outfielder Jameson Hannah and is 3-1 with a 2.70 ERA (11 er in 36.2 ip) in six starts with the A's...has allowed two earned runs or fewer in five of his six starts with Oakland and 17 of 27 overall...went 6-7 with a 4.24 ERA in 21 starts with the Reds and is 9-8 with a 3.86 ERA (63 er in 147.0 ip) in 27 starts for the season.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-1 with a 1.45 ERA (5 er in 31.0 ip) and .226 (26-for-115) opponents batting average in five starts against American League West teams...is 6-5 with a 2.23 ERA (24 er in 97.0 ip) in 15 career starts against the AL West.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 19 home runs, 14 of which have come with the bases empty...nine have come to batters leading off an inning, which is tied for 10th most in the majors...has allowed 17 home runs in 90.2 innings over his last 16 starts after yielding two in 56.1 innings over his first 11 starts.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 6-2 with a 3.28 ERA (21 er in 57.2 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest compared to 3-6 with a 4.23 ERA (42 er in 89.1 ip) in 16 starts on five days rest or more.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 5-6 with a 3.51 ERA and .249 opponents batting average in 17 starts before the All-Star Break...is 4-2 in nine starts since then but has a 4.45 ERA (27 er in 54.2 ip) and .289 (63-for-218) opponents average.

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for fourth in the majors in hit batters (12)...is averaging 17.9 pitches per inning, which is the highest mark in the majors...his wild pitch on Aug. 22 was his first since July 3, 2018, snapping a streak of 37 consecutive starts without a wild pitch...has 141 strikeouts in 147.0 innings and his average of 8.63 strikeouts per nine innings is currently the highest mark of his career (8.24 in 2017).

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed three runs in each of his first two starts (5.79 ERA) but then went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA and .231 opponents batting average over his next six starts from April 13 to May 9...left with a 4-3 lead in his second start on April 6 at Pittsburgh only to have the bullpen blow the save...it was the first of two times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (July 18 vs. St. Louis)...started the Reds April 13 home game against St. Louis in Monterrey, Mexico, and had a no decision in a 5-2 win...allowed one run in 5.1 innings but left trailing 1-0...walked a season-high four batters in 3.2 innings April 29 at New York (NL)...matched that in 3.1 innings July 30 against Pittsburgh...went 1-5 with a 4.09 ERA over a six-start stretch from May 14 to June 15...struck out a season-high nine batters in 5.0 scoreless innings May 26 at Chicago (NL)...went 3-2 with a 2.28 ERA in five starts in May and did not allow a home run in 27.2 innings...it was his lowest single-month ERA since compiling a mark of 2.03 in April of 2016...drove in both of the Reds runs in a 5-2 loss to Washington on June 1...had a suicide squeeze in the second inning and then hit his first career home run in the fourth, a solo shot off Eric Fedde...went over the 1,000 career innings pitched plateau June 8 at Philadelphia...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings and a season-high 116 pitches June 15 against Texas but took the loss, allowing four runs, two earned... yielded one run in back-to-back starts on June 20 at Milwaukee and June 26 at Los Angeles (AL)...then went 1-1 with a 7.30 ERA and .346 opponents batting average in five starts in the month of July...surrendered seven home runs in 24.2 innings...allowed a season-high seven runs on a career-high 13 hits but had a no decision in the Reds 17-9 win at Colorado July 13...it was his 200th career appearance...was the losing pitcher in his final start with the Reds, an 11-4 loss to Pittsburgh on July 30...allowed five runs on six hits and four walks in a season-low 3.1 innings...finished July with a 1-1 record, a 7.30 ERA and .346 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 2-1 with a 3.30 ERA and .246 opponents average in five starts in August...picked up the win in his A's debut on Aug. 4 against St. Louis when he allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings

LAST START: He combined with Petit, Soria and Hendriks on a five-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed all five of the hits...had runners in scoring position in three of his innings, including second and third with two outs in the first and the bases loaded with two outs in the third.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (11-9, 4.08 ERA): Picked up his 11th win of the season Aug. 30, which matches his career high from his rookie season of 2009 with the A's...his 28 starts and 161.0 innings pitched are the third best totals of his career...had 31 starts and 180.1 innings pitched with the Dodgers in 2015 and 30 starts and 175.1 innings pitched as a rookie with the A's in 2009... is 9-5 with a 3.28 ERA in 17 starts at night...ranks fourth in the American League in ERA at night and fifth in OPS (.644)...is 7-3 with a 3.39 ERA in 14 starts on the road...ranks seventh in the AL in road ERA, ninth in OPS (.655) and tied for ninth in wins...had a no decision in his last start, a 10-4 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 3 er, 4 so)...is 1-5 with a save and a 6.68 ERA (31.0 ip, 45 h, 27 r, 23 er, 13 bb, 24 so, 5 hr) in seven career appearances, including six starts, against Houston...is 0-2 with a 6.10 ERA (10.1 ip, 13 h, 7 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) in two start this year.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 3.79 ERA (92 er in 218.1 ip) over the last 65 games since June 23 and now has a 4.10 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League.
- Has lowest opponents slugging mark in AL (.395), ranks third in OPS (.709) and on-base percentage (.314), and fourth in batting average (.238).
- Is 36-for-64 (56.3%) in save opportunities...the 28 blown saves are most in the Majors.
- Has allowed the third fewest home runs (64) and has the fourth fewest walks (195) among AL bullpens...is tied for the fifth fewest wins (24).


