OAKLAND ATHLETICS (87-60) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (74-74)

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 13, 2019 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Won three of four at Houston to start the road trip and have now won eight of the last 10 games and 19 of the last 27... have sole possession of the first American League Wild Card spot for the first time this year...are ½ game ahead of Tampa Bay and one game ahead of Cleveland...are a season-high 27 games over .500 at 87-60 (.592), which is the fourth best record in the AL and sixth best in the majors...are 36-19 (.655) since the All-Star Break, which is the third best record in the AL...are 8-3 (.727) in September, which is tied with the Yankees and Rays for the best record in the AL...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by 7½ games...have spent 78 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

FIRST OR SECOND: With one win in this three-game series with the Rangers, the A's would clinch at least a second place finish in the American League West for the second consecutive season, sixth time in the last 10 years and 14th time in the last 21 years...over the last 21 years, only the Yankees (18) and Dodgers (15) have more first or second place finishes in their division (Cardinals could be 15 also).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on the penultimate road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Houston (3-1) and Texas (three games)...are now 34-18 (.654) over their last 52 road games dating back to May 16, which is the second best road record in the majors over that span (Minnesota, 36-17, .679)...are 39-33 (.542) on the road for the season and need two more wins to clinch a winning record on the road for the second consecutive season...return home following the game Sunday for the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Kansas City (three games) and Texas (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and Detroit (2-1) and are 29-10 (.744) over the last 39 home games dating back to June 17 and 48-27 (.640) overall.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 233 home runs, which is sixth most in the majors and fifth most in Athletics history...have set franchise records for most players with 20 or more home runs (7) and most players with 10 or more home runs (10)...have two players with 30 or more home runs (Chapman and Olson) for the 13th time in Oakland history (last: Thomas and Swisher in 2006)...Marcus Semien has 28 and the Athletics record for players with 30 or more home runs is three (1996, 1999, 2001)...are one of 10 teams in Major League history with seven or more players with 20 or more home runs...only the Twins, with eight this year, have more...have won just six games when going homerless, which is second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 3)...the Athletics record for fewest wins in a season when going homerless is six in 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's struck out 17 times last night after fanning 16 times on Wednesday but won both games...it marks the 11th time in Major League history a team has struck out at least 16 times in back-to-back games (first time for the A's) and the second time a team won both games (Detroit, April 16-17, 2013)...have 1205 strikeouts for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League but fifth most in Athletics history...have been hit by a pitch 15 times in the last 16 games and have 82 for the season, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and second most in Athletics history to the record of 88 in 2001...also rank fourth in the AL in home runs (232) and fifth in runs (773), extra base hits (517), OPS (.775) and slugging (.449)...are third in most grounded into double plays (129) and fewest stolen bases (44).

PITCHING: The A's allowed 14 home runs in the four game series at Houston, which set an Oakland record for home runs allowed in a four-game series and fell one short of the Athletics record (15 vs. Minnesota, May 1-3, 1964)...have yielded 27 home runs in the last 12 games and 186 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League but fourth most in Oakland history (210 in 2017, 205 in 1996, 197 in 1997)...rank third in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.408), fourth in ERA (4.07), OPS (.719), batting average (.245), on-base percentage (.311) and fewest strikeouts (1158), tied for fourth in shutouts (9) and fifth in fewest walks (443).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-1 with a 4.03 ERA (54 er in 120.2 ip) over the last 22 games dating back to Aug. 20...each of the A's last two losses by starting pitchers have been against Houston (Fiers on Monday, Anderson on Aug. 18)...have not lost to a team other than Houston since Aug. 13 at San Francisco (Anderson)...starters are 63-34 with a 4.06 ERA overall...rank second in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA and innings pitched (810.0).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 74 errors, which is third fewest in the American League...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season is 81 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 84 in 2006...the errors have led to 32 unearned runs, which is the fewest in the majors...the fewest in Athletics history is 39 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 42 in 1991...are second in the majors in opponents caught stealing (39).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are batting .274 (23-for-84) with seven doubles, a triple, five home runs, 25 RBI and 13 walks...have 13 extra base hits, which ties the Oakland record set in 1968...lead the American League in RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits, rank second in hits and doubles, tied for third in walks and fourth in plate appearances (100)...the five homers are tied for third most in Oakland history (8 in 1970, 6 in 2013) and the 25 RBI are the most since 1990 (26).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 42-31 (.575) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the games (73) and wins are the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...are 23-19 (.548) in one-run games...are tied for second in the AL in one-run games (42) and wins to Texas (45 games, 25 wins)...have nine walk-off wins, which is tied for second in the majors (Dodgers, 12), and nine walk-off losses, which is tied for the most in the AL...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games...the losses are tied for the most in the AL and the games (14) are tied for second...have 10 losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Seattle for the most in the majors...they are the most such losses by an Oakland team since the 2006 club also had 10.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 28-12 (.700) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 59-48 (.551) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (31-10)...have a run differential of +140, which is fourth best in the American League and fifth best in the majors...last year, the A's were +139...the A's have 11 series sweeps, which is fourth most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2013 when they had 12.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 8-5...are 5-2 in Oakland in April and 3-3 in Texas...have won 17 of the last 23 games, including seven of the last 10 in Texas...have won 20 of the last 25 in Oakland...have won each of the previous two season series and are 32-19 (.627) against the Rangers over the last three years...are 373-372 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 198-175 in Oakland and 175-197 in Texas...are 108-109 at Globe Life Park, which is the second best record by a visiting American League team at this ballpark (Yankees, 56-46, .549)...have an all-time record of 470-454 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has 32 home runs, which ties the Athletics franchise record for home runs as a third baseman (Eric Chavez in 2001)...**Liam Hendriks** has 114 strikeouts, which is the most ever by an Australian born pitcher...112 of those have come in relief, which is three short of the Athletics record for strikeouts by a reliever (115, Rollie Fingers in 1975)...**Matt Olson** has 32 home runs and joins Mark McGwire (eight times) and Jason Giambi (two times) as the only first basemen in Oakland history to hit 30 homers...**Marcus Semien** had scored two runs in each of the last three games and now has 111 for the season, which is tied for eighth in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1953** Bob Trice becomes the first African-American to appear in a major league game for the Athletics...in **1970** Bert Campaneris singles in the first game of a double-header at Kansas City for the 1000th hit of his major league career...in **1971** Rick Monday's 11th inning RBI single scores Catfish Hunter to give the A's a 2-1 win at Kansas City...Hunter pitches 10 innings, allowing a run on four hits, to become the A's second 20-game winner...in **2010** Bobby Cramer defeats the Kansas City Royals 5-3 in his Major League debut at the age of 30 to become the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to start and win in his debut.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (10-5, 3.64 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 5-1 with a 2.78 ERA (18 er in 58.1 ip) and .247 (55-for-223) opponents batting average in 10 starts since the All-Star Break...has allowed two runs or fewer in six of those starts...ranks sixth in the American League in post-break ERA...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents average over his first five starts and was 3-3 with a 6.00 ERA and .249 opponents average in nine starts in between (May 21-July 6)...has career highs in all major categories except losses...had 10 wins after going 4-14 in 40 games over his first four seasons in the majors.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has hit 12 batters, which is fourth most in the American League...does not have enough innings to qualify for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 130 innings pitched, he ranks 10th in the AL in ERA (3.64), opponents batting average (.232) and slugging percentage (.394).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .203 (53-for-261) batting average, which is fifth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 130 or more innings pitched...has a .262 (66-for-252) average against right-handers...however, has surrendered 12 of his 19 home runs and issued 27 of his 44 walks to left-handed hitters...has allowed a .196 (19-for-97) average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL among pitchers with at least 130 innings...opponents are batting .214 (41-for-192) the first time through the lineup, .264 (51-for-193) with 10 of his 19 home runs the second time and .211 (27-for-128) after that.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 4-4 with a 5.29 ERA (29 er in 49.1 ip) in nine starts against American League West teams compared to 6-1 with a 2.70 ERA (26 er in 86.2 ip) in 15 starts against all other teams...is now 5-9 with a 4.69 ERA (59 er in 113.1 ip) in 25 career appearances against the West, 9-10 with a 3.28 ERA (78 er in 214.0 ip) in 39 games against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 8-3 with a 3.33 ERA (38 er in 102.2 ip) in 18 starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-2 with a 4.59 ERA (17 er in 33.1 ip) in six starts on four days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-2 with a 3.20 ERA (23 er in 64.2 ip) in 11 starts at home compared to 4-3 with a 4.04 ERA (32 er in 71.1 ip) in 13 starts on the road...has yielded just five home runs in 64.2 innings in Oakland compared to 14 in 71.1 innings on the road...is 7-9 with a 2.94 ERA (48 er in 147.0 ip) in 27 career appearances in the Coliseum and has allowed just 11 home runs (0.67 per nine innings).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 7-2 with a 3.13 ERA (26 er in 74.2 ip) and .217 (60-for-277) opponents batting average in 12 starts during the day compared to 3-3 with a 4.26 ERA (29 er in 61.1 ip) and .250 (59-for-236) opponents average in 12 starts at night...is tied for second in the American League in wins in day games...was 0-8 in 15 career day games entering the season.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 24 starts this year and is 2-5 in those games...is 8-0 in 11 starts with support of three runs or more...has two starts with a combined 29 runs of support and has a season RSA of 6.55 (99 rs in 136.0 ip)...entered the season with a 2.67 RSA in his career as a starter...has received two runs of support or fewer in 37 of his 52 career starts and is 4-19 in those games...is 10-0 in 17 career starts with run support of three runs or more.

PRE AND POST "TOMMY JOHN": Is 12-8 with a 3.48 ERA (71 er in 183.2 ip) in 34 games (30 starts) since undergoing "Tommy John" surgery May 6, 2016...is averaging 8.33 strikeouts per nine innings (170 so in 183.2 ip)...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contusion...went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA in three rehab starts with Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16...was recalled by Oakland the next day when Marco Estrada went on the injured list...made his first start April 22 against Texas and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings for the win...left his third start on May 4 at Pittsburgh after five innings with a 4-3 lead but Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss...it was the first of two times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (July 30 vs. Milwaukee)...took the loss on May 9 against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a three-game streak dating back to last year...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...the loss was his first since June 22, 2018 at Chicago (AL)...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits in a 17-3 win at Detroit on May 16...walked a career-high six batters in 3.2 innings in a no decision at Cleveland May 21...is the first Major League pitcher since at least 1908 with a pitching line of 3.2 innings, three hits,

three runs, three earned runs, six walks and six strikeouts...allowed three runs on four hits and four walks in a season-low 3.1 innings at St. Louis on June 25 but had a no decision in the A's 7-3 win...allowed a season-high six runs in 4.1 innings in a 6-3 loss at Seattle July 6...allowed a season-high eight hits but just two runs in a no decision in a 6-5 A's loss at Chicago (NL) on Aug. 5...tossed a career-high 116 pitches and yielded a season-high tying eight hits in an 8-4 win over Houston on Aug. 17.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-2 win over Detroit last Saturday in Oakland...struck out a career-high 11 and did not walk a batter in 6.0 innings...it was the 13th time in Oakland history a pitcher struck out 11 or more without walking a batter, the first time since Dan Straily on April 5, 2013 (11 so vs. Houston)...is the seventh pitcher in Oakland history to fan 11 or more in six innings or fewer (last: Cahill on May 5, 2018 vs. Baltimore)...allowed a two-run single to Castro in the second but those were the only runs he would allow.

BASSITT vs. TEXAS: Is 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA (17.2 ip, 17 h, 10 r, 10 er, 10 bb, 18 so, 1 hr) in five career appearances, including three starts...is 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (5 er in 6.2 ip) in two games at Globe Life Park and 1-1 with a 4.09 ERA (5 er in 11.0 ip) in three games in Oakland...is 1-1 with a 2.53 ERA (10.2 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 12 so) in two starts this year...the win came in a 6-1 A's victory in Oakland on April 22...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits while walking four...retired the side in order just once...was relieved by Dull to start the sixth with the A's leading 2-0...then took the loss in a 3-1 decision at Texas in the night game of the day/night doubleheader on June 8...blanked the Rangers on one walk over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when Santana singled with one out in the fifth for the first hit...allowed two runs in the fifth on a Mathis RBI single and a DeShields sacrifice fly...Sampson tossed a complete game for Texas, holding the A's to four hits.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Mike Fiers (14-4, 3.97 ERA): Was the losing pitcher in his last start last Monday at Houston, a 15-0 A's loss (1.0 ip, 9 h, 9 r, 9 er, 1 so, 5 hr), snapping his career high winning streak at 12 games...the streak was second longest in Oakland history and fell one short of the record of 13 set by Catfish Hunter in 1973...was unbeaten in 21 consecutive starts from May 7 to Sept. 3, which matches Lefty Grove (1931) for the longest unbeaten streak by a starter in Athletics history...went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA, .297 opponents batting average and .854 OPS over his first eight starts, 10-0 with a 2.12 ERA, .199 opponents average and .572 OPS over his next 17 starts from May 7-Aug. 9 and is 2-1 with an 8.34 ERA, .367 opponents average and 1.160 OPS over his last five starts...is 3-3 with a 6.23 ERA (60.2 ip, 64 h, 42 r, 42 er, 19 bb, 59 so, 16 hr) in 11 career appearances, including 10 starts, against Texas...is 0-0 with a 6.55 ERA (11.0 ip, 11 h, 8 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 12 so, 4 hr) in two starts this year
