OAKLAND ATHLETICS (88-60) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (74-75)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won game one of this three-game set in Texas last night after taking three of four at Houston to start the road trip and have now won nine of the last 14 games and 20 of the last 28...have sole possession of the first American League Wild Card spot for the first time this year...are ½ game ahead of Tampa Bay and 1.5 games ahead of Cleveland...are a season-high 28 games over .500 at 88-60

(.595), which is the fourth best record in the AL and sixth best in the majors...are 37-19 (.661) since the All-Star Break, which is the second best record in the AL...are 9-3 (.750) in September, which is tied with the Rays for the best record in the AL...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by 7½ games...have spent 79 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

FIRST OR SECOND: With last night's win over Texas, the A's have clinched at least a second place finish in the American League West for the second consecutive season, sixth time in the last 10 years and 14th time in the last 21 years...over the last 21 years, only the Yankees (18) and Dodgers (15) have more first or second place finishes in their division (Cardinals could be 15 also).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-1 on the penultimate road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Houston (3-1) and Texas (three games, 1-0)...are now 35-18 (.660) over their last 53 road games dating back to May 16, which is the second best road record in the majors over that span (Minnesota, 36-17, .679)...are 40-33 (.548) on the road for the season and need one more win to clinch a winning record on the road for the second consecutive season...return home following the game Sunday for the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Kansas City (three games) and Texas (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and Detroit (2-1) and are 29-10 (.744) over the last 39 home games dating back to June 17 and 48-27 (.640) overall.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 238 home runs, which is fifth most in the majors and third most in Athletics history...have set franchise records for most players with 20 or more home runs (7) and most players with 10 or more home runs (10)...have two players with 30 or more home runs (Chapman and Olson) for the 13th time in Oakland history (last: Thomas and Swisher in 2006)...Marcus Semien has 29 and the Athletics record for players with 30 or more home runs is three (1996, 1999, 2001)...are one of 10 teams in Major League history with seven or more players with 20 or more home runs...only the Twins, with eight this year, have more...have won just six games when going homerless, which is second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 3)...the Athletics record for fewest wins in a season when going homerless is six in 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's struck out just seven times last night...struck out 17 times Thursday night after fanning 16 times on Wednesday but won both games...it marks the 11th time in Major League history a team has struck out at least 16 times in back-to-back games (first time for the A's) and the second time a team won both games (Detroit, April 16-17, 2013)...have 1212 strikeouts for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League but fifth most in Athletics history...have been hit by a pitch 15 times in the last 17 games and have 82 for the season, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and second most in Athletics history to the record of 88 in 2001...also rank fourth in the AL in home runs (238) and fifth in runs (787), extra base hits (525), OPS (.779), and slugging (.451)...are third in most grounded into double plays (129) and fewest stolen bases (44).

PITCHING: The A's yielded just two home runs last night at Texas after allowing 14 home runs in the four game series at Houston, which set an Oakland record for home runs allowed in a four-game series and fell one short of the Athletics record (15 vs. Minnesota, May 1-3, 1964)...have yielded 29 home runs in the last 13 games and 188 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League but fourth most in Oakland history (210 in 2017, 205 in 1996, 197 in 1997)...rank third in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.408), fourth in ERA (4.09), OPS (.719), batting average (.244), on-base percentage (.311), and fewest strikeouts (1165), tied for fourth in shutouts (9), and fifth in fewest walks (446).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-1 with a 4.37 ERA (60 er in 123.2 ip) over the last 23 games dating back to Aug. 20...each of the A's last two losses by starting pitchers have been against Houston (Fiers on Monday, Anderson on Aug. 18)...have not lost to a team other than Houston since Aug. 13 at San Francisco (Anderson)...starters are 63-34 with a 4.11 ERA overall...rank second in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA and innings pitched (813.0).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 76 errors, which is third fewest in the American League...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season is 81 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 84 in 2006...the errors have led to 33 unearned runs, which is the fewest in the majors...the fewest in Athletics history is 39 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 42 in 1991...are second in the majors in opponents caught stealing (39).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are batting .271 (23-for-85) with seven doubles, a triple, five home runs, 25 RBI and 13 walks...have 13 extra base hits, which ties the Oakland record set in 1968...lead the American League in RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits, rank second in hits and doubles, tied for third in walks and fourth in plate appearances (101)...the five homers are tied for third most in Oakland history (8 in 1970, 6 in 2013) and the 25 RBI are the most since 1990 (26).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 42-31 (.575) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the games (73) and wins are the most in the American League...are 23-19 (.548) in one-run games...are tied for second in the AL in one-run games (42) and wins to Texas (45 games, 25 wins)...have nine walk-off wins, which is tied for second in the majors (Dodgers, 12), and nine walk-off losses, which is tied for the most in the AL...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games...the losses are tied for the most in the AL and the games (14) are tied for second...have 10 losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Seattle for the most in the majors...they are the most such losses by an Oakland team since the 2006 club also had 10.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 29-12 (.707) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 59-48 (.551) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (31-10)...have a run differential of +145, which is fourth best in the American League and fifth best in the majors...last year, the A's were +139...the A's have 11 series sweeps, which is fourth most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2013 when they had 12.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 9-5...are 5-2 in Oakland in April and 4-3 in Texas...have won 18 of the last 24 games, including eight of the last 11 in Texas...have won 20 of the last 25 in Oakland...have won each of the previous two season series and are 32-19 (.627) against the Rangers over the last three years...are 374-372 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 198-175 in Oakland and 176-197 in Texas...are 109-109 at Globe Life Park, which is the second best record by a visiting American League team at this ballpark (Yankees, 56-46, .549)...have an all-time record of 471-454 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has 32 home runs, which ties the Athletics franchise record for home runs as a third baseman (Eric Chavez in 2001)...**Liam Hendriks** has 114 strikeouts, which is the most ever by an Australian born pitcher...112 of those have come in relief, which is three short of the Athletics record for strikeouts by a reliever (115, Rollie Fingers in 1975)...**Matt Olson** has 33 home runs and joins Mark McGwire (eight times) and Jason Giambi (two times) as the only first basemen in Oakland history to hit 30 homers...**Marcus Semien** had scored two runs in each of the last four games and now has 113 for the season, which is tied for seventh in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1929** the A's clinch the American League pennant with a 5-0 win over the Chicago White Sox...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hitter in the A's 9-1 victory over Minnesota to win his 20th for the fourth consecutive season...he would go on to win 22 games and combined with Bob Welch to record 49 of the A's 103 victories...in **1995** Mark McGwire hits his 269th career home run off Kansas City's Mark Gubicza, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record for home runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire homers in the first inning of both games of a double header at Cleveland, his 49th and 50th of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 49 which he previously held.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (14-4, 3.97 ERA)

12-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED:

Was the losing pitcher in his last start on Monday at Houston, snapping his career high winning streak at 12 games... the streak was second longest in Oakland history and fell one short of the record of 13 set by Catfish Hunter in 1973 (June 2-Sept. 5)...it doubled his previous career high of six (July 21-Sept. 1, 2018)...compiled a 2.41 ERA and .214 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 20 starts from May 7 to Aug. 27...was unbeaten in 21 consecutive starts from May 7 to Sept. 3, which matches Lefty Grove (April 22-Aug. 19, 1931) for the longest unbeaten streak by a starter in Athletics history.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League winning percentage (.778) and tied for seventh in wins (14)...is also third in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.14), tied for fourth in games started (30) and stolen bases allowed (13), fifth in wild pitches (10), sixth in fewest pitches per inning (15.7), seventh in fewest pitches per game (88.8), 10th in home runs (29) and tied for 10th in hit batters (9).

CAREER BESTS: Is scheduled to make his career high 31st start of the season today, surpassing his previous best of 30 in 2015 and 2018...already has a career-high 14 wins and will match his high for games pitched today with his 31st...his 170.0 innings pitched are 10.1 short of his high of 180.1 in 2015...his wins are the most by an A's pitcher since 2015 when Sonny Gray also won 14, his innings pitched are the most since 2016 when Kendall Graveman had 186.0 and his 31 starts will be the most since Graveman also had 31 in 2016.

BRIEFLY: Went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA, .297 opponents batting average and .854 OPS over his first eight starts, 10-0 with a 2.12 ERA, .199 opponents average and .572 OPS over his next 17 starts from May 7-Aug. 9 and is 2-1 with an 8.34 ERA (21 er in 22.2 ip), .367 (36-for-98) opponents average, 1.160 OPS and 11 home runs allowed over his last five starts...the A's are 20-10 (.667) in his starting assignments...has left with the lead in eight of his no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 10-2 with a 3.73 ERA (51 er in 123.0 ip) in 21 starts at night compared to 4-2 with a 4.60 ERA (24 er in 47.0 ip) in nine starts during the day...is tied for seventh in the American League in night wins (10) and ranks 11th in ERA...is 15-3 with a 3.66 ERA (70 er in 172.0 ip) in 30 career appearances at night with the A's.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 4-2 with a 6.15 ERA (49 er in 71.2 ip) in 14 starts against American League West competition compared to 10-2 with a 2.38 ERA (26 er in 98.1 ip) in 16 starts against all other teams...is now 13-15 with a 5.67 ERA (173 er in 274.2 ip) in 52 career appearances against AL West teams, 55-44 with a 3.46 ERA (305 er in 793.1 ip) in 150 games against all other opponents.

DAYS REST: Pitched on five days rest and lost in his last start, his first loss as an Athletic on five days rest...is scheduled to start on four days rest today... is 2-1 with a 4.20 ERA (23 er in 49.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest, 10-1 with a 3.48 ERA (37 er in 95.2 ip) in 16 starts on five days rest and 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA (15 er in 25.0 ip) in five starts on six days rest or more...is 13-1 with a 3.30 ERA (46 er in 124.1 ip) in 21 starts on five days rest in his A's career.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-2 with a 3.15 ERA (33 er in 94.1 ip) in 16 starts at home, 6-2 with a 5.00 ERA (42 er in 75.2 ip) in 14 starts on the road...is tied for fourth in the American League in home wins and ranks sixth in ERA...is now 12-3 with a 3.20 ERA (55 er in 154.2 ip) and .225 (126-for-561) opponents batting average in 27 career appearances, 26 starts, in the Coliseum.

APRIL, SEPTEMBER AND IN BETWEEN: Went 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA in five starts in April and is 0-1 with a 19.50 ERA (13 er in 6.0 ip) in two starts in September...combined for a 12-1 record and a 2.52 ERA in 21 starts in May, June, July and August...in his career, he is 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in April, 55-35 with a 3.39 ERA from May through August and 7-14 with a 5.92 ERA (101 er in 153.2 ip) in September.

NO-HITTER: Tossed his second career no-hitter May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati to become the 34th pitcher in Major League history with multiple regular season no-hitters...is the seventh with a no-hitter for multiple teams...his no-hitter was the 13th in Athletics history, including the eighth in Oakland history.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 15-0 loss at Houston on Monday...had career highs in runs (9) and home runs (5) and a career low in innings (1.0)...tied the Oakland record for home runs allowed in a game (fourth time, last: Ted Lilly, June 11, 2003 vs. Atlanta) and became the first Major League pitcher since at least 1908 to allow five home runs in one inning pitched or fewer...is the first A's pitcher to allow nine or more runs in one inning pitched or fewer since Lou Brissie allowed nine runs in 0.1 innings in the second

game of a June 18, 1950 doubleheader against Cleveland...was charged with six runs in the first inning on a Bregman three-run homer, an Alvarez solo homer and a Chirinos two-run homer...then allowed a two-run home run to Altuve in the second and a solo home run by Brantley and was relieved by Blackburn with no outs in the second inning and the A's trailing 9-0.

decision came in an 8-6 A's win at Texas April 12...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Forsythe RBI double and a Mazara RBI ground out, a solo home run to Cabrera in the fourth and a three-run home run to Andrus in the fifth...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning trailing 6-5...also had a no decision in a 6-5 A's win in Oakland on July 28...blanked the Rangers on two hits and four walks over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a pair of solo home runs to Santana and Mazara...left after six innings with a 4-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs in the eighth for the blown save.
