OAKLAND ATHLETICS (89-60) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (74-76)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won the first two games of this three-game set in Texas after taking three of four at Houston to start the road trip and have now won 10 of the last 12 games and 21 of the last 29...have sole possession of the first American League Wild Card spot for the first time this year...are ½ game ahead of Tampa Bay and 3.0 games ahead of Cleveland...are a season-high 29 games over .500 at 89-60 (.597), which is the fourth best record in the AL and sixth best in the majors...are 38-19 (.667) since the All-Star Break, which is the tied for the best record in the Majors...are 10-3 (.769) in September, which is tied with the Rays, Brewers, and Braves for the best record in the Majors...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by 7½ games...have spent 80 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

FIRST OR SECOND: The A's have clinched at least a second place finish in the American League West for the second consecutive season, sixth time in the last 10 years and 14th time in the last 21 years...over the last 21 years, only the Yankees (18) and Dodgers (15) have more first or second place finishes in their division (Cardinals could be 15 also).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-1 on the penultimate road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Houston (3-1) and Texas (three games, 2-0)...are now 36-18 (.667) over their last 54 road games dating back to May 16, which is the second best road record in the majors over that span (Minnesota, 38-17, .691)...are 41-33 (.554) on the road for the season, clinching a winning record on the road for the second consecutive season...return home following the game Sunday for the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Kansas City (three games) and Texas (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and Detroit (2-1) and are 29-10 (.744) over the last 39 home games dating back to June 17 and 48-27 (.640) overall.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 242 home runs, which is fifth most in the majors and second most in Athletics history...have set franchise records for most players with 20 or more home runs (7) and most players with 10 or more home runs (10)...have two players with 30 or more home runs (Chapman and Olson) for the 13th time in Oakland history (last: Thomas and Swisher in 2006)...Marcus Semien has 29 and the Athletics record for players with 30 or more home runs is three (1996, 1999, 2001)...are one of 10 teams in Major League history with seven or more players with 20 or more home runs...only the Minnesota Twins, with eight this year, have more...have won just six games when going without hitting a home run, which is second fewest in the majors (Seattle, 3)...the Athletics franchise record for fewest wins in a season when going homerless is six in 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's have struck out just 14 times over the last two games against the Rangers...struck out 17 times Thursday night after fanning 16 times on Wednesday but won both games...it marks the 11th time in Major League history a team has struck out at least 16 times in back-to-back games (first time for the A's) and the second time a team won both games (Detroit, April 16-17, 2013)...have 1219 strikeouts for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League but fifth most in Athletics history...have been hit by a pitch 15 times in the last 18 games and have 82 for the season, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and second most in Athletics history to the record of 88 in 2001...also rank fourth in the AL in home runs (242) and fifth in runs (795), extra base hits (531), OPS (.780), and slugging (.453)...are third in most grounded into double plays (129) and fewest stolen bases (44).

PITCHING: The A's yielded just three home runs over the first two games in Texas allowing 14 home runs in the four-game series at Houston, which set an Oakland record for home runs allowed in a four-game series and fell one short of the Athletics record (15 vs. Minnesota, May 1-3, 1964)...have yielded 30 home runs in the last 14 games and 189 for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League but fourth most in Oakland history

(210 in 2017, 205 in 1996, 197 in 1997)...rank third in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.409), fourth in ERA (4.11), OPS (.720), batting average (.245), on-base percentage (.311), and fewest strikeouts (1165), tied for fifth in shutouts (9), and fifth in fewest walks (451).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-1 with a 4.52 ERA (63 er in 125.1 ip) over the last 24 games dating back to Aug. 20...each of the A's last two losses by starting pitchers have been against Houston (Fiers on Monday, Anderson on Aug. 18)...have not lost to a team other than Houston since Aug. 13 at San Francisco (Anderson)...starters are 63-34 with a 4.13 ERA overall...rank second in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA and innings pitched (814.2).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 78 errors, which is third fewest in the American League...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season is 81 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 84 in 2006...the errors have led to 33 unearned runs, which is the fewest in the majors...the fewest in Athletics history is 39 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 42 in 1991...are second among Major League teams in opponents caught stealing (39).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are batting .267 (23-for-86) with seven doubles, a triple, five home runs, 25 RBI and 13 walks...have 13 extra base hits, which ties the Oakland record set in 1968...lead the American League in RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits, rank second in hits and doubles, tied for third in walks and fourth in plate appearances (10w)...the five homers are tied for third most in Oakland history (8 in 1970, 6 in 2013) and the 25 RBI are the most since 1990 (26).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 43-31 (.581) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the games (74) and wins are the most in the American League...are 23-19 (.548) in one-run games...are third in the AL in one-run games (42) and are tied for second in wins (23)...are 5-9 (.357) in extra inning games...the losses are tied for the most in the American League (Detroit) and the games (14) are tied for third.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 30-12 (.714) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 59-48 (.551) against right-handers...have a run differential of +147, which is fourth best in the American League and fifth best in the majors...last year, the A's were +139...the A's have 11 series sweeps, which is fourth most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2013 when they had 12.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 10-5...are 5-2 in Oakland in April and 5-3 in Texas...have won 19 of the last 25 games, including nine of the last 12 in Texas...have won 20 of the last 25 in Oakland...have won each of the previous two season series and are 33-19 (.635) against the Rangers over the last three years...are 375-372 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 198-175 in Oakland and 177-197 in Texas...are 110-109 at Globe Life Park, which is the second best record by a visiting American League team at this ballpark (Yankees, 56-46, .549)...have an all-time record of 472-454 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has 33 home runs, which is an Athletics franchise record for home runs as a third baseman (Eric Chavez in 2001)...**Liam Hendriks** has 115 strikeouts, which is the most ever by an Australian born pitcher...112 of those have come in relief, which is two short of the Athletics record for strikeouts by a reliever (115, Rollie Fingers in 1975)...**Matt Olson** has 34 home runs and joins Mark McGwire (eight times) and Jason Giambi (two times) as the only first basemen in Oakland history to hit 30 homers...**Marcus Semien** has 114 runs scored for the season, which is seventh in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1931** the A's clinch their third consecutive American League pennant as Eddie Rommel defeats Cleveland, 14-3...it is the ninth and final pennant for manager Connie Mack...in **1971** the A's score twice in the eighth inning to defeat Chicago 3-2 in the first game of a doubleheader, clinching their first AL West title...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley becomes Oakland's all-time saves leader when he saves his 137th game as an Athletic, breaking Rollie Fingers record of 136.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (1-0, 0.75 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 60-day injured list Sept. 1 and has allowed a run on three hits in 12.0 innings in two starts since his return... has walked five but struck out 15...began the season on the IL as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...started a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 8 and made three starts before he was transferred to Triple-A Las Vegas July 23...made two starts before his rehab assignment was halted on Aug. 2 due to a strained right oblique... returned to action Aug. 13 and made three more starts with the Aviators before being reinstated from the IL Sept. 1...was 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts overall...struck out 53 batters in 36.1 innings (13.13 per nine innings) and walked 10 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.3.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at New York (AL) on Sept. 1...it was his first Major League appearance since Aug. 24, 2018 at Minnesota...tossed five scoreless innings and allowed just one hit while walking three...retired each of the first nine batters before LeMahieu singled to lead off the fourth...was relieved by Petit to start the bottom of the sixth with the scored tied 0-0.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit a week ago today in Oakland...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters in 7.0 innings...it was his third career 10-strikeout game (last: April 21, 2018 vs. Boston)...blanked the Tigers on two walks and eight strikeouts over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead when allowed his only run on a Stewart lead off home run in the fifth.

MANAEA vs. TEXAS: Is 4-2 with a 3.50 ERA (54.0 ip, 48 h, 23 r, 21 er, 13 bb, 47 so, 6 hr) in nine career starts...is 3-0 with a 2.25 ERA (6 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 1-2 with a 4.50 ERA (15 er in 30.0 ip) in five starts in Texas...was 1-0 with a 2.03 ERA (13.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 6 so, 2 hr) in two starts last year...the win came in a 6-2 victory in Oakland on April 4...blanked the Rangers on two hits over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning...Mazara led off with a single, went to second on a Chirinos walk, third on a Profar sacrifice fly and scored on a Rua fielders choice...did not allow a run over his final three innings and retired each of the final 12 batters he faced...then had a no decision in a 7-4 loss at Texas on June 5...the A's scored twice in the first and he allowed a solo home run to Chirinos in the fourth...Oakland got that run back in the fifth and he allowed a Profar home run in the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Dull with one out in the sixth inning and the A's leading 3-2...the pen allowed five runs over the final two innings for the blown save and loss.

REHAB HIGHLIGHTS: Began his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on July 8 and allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high seven hits in a season-low 2.1 innings in a 9-6 loss to Visalia...also tossed 2.1 innings and took the loss in his next start July 13 at Rancho Cucamonga...logged 3.2 scoreless innings in his final start with the Ports on July 18 against Lancaster...was charged with the loss in his first start with Triple-A Las Vegas on July 24 against El Paso and followed that up with a no decision July 30 against New Orleans...had his rehab assignment halted Aug. 2 with a strained right oblique...resumed his rehab assignment Aug. 13 and went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA and .136 opponents average over his final three starts...struck out 10 batters in 5.2 innings Aug. 13 at Omaha, his first of two 10-strikeout games...combined with Ben Bracewell and J.B. 2018 RECAP: Was 12-9 with a 3.59 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in 27 starts before going on the disabled list Aug. 26 with a shoulder injury... underwent surgery Sept. 19 and missed the remainder of the season...his ERA, opponents batting average, on-base percentage (.278), slugging percentage (.385) and OPS (.663) where the lowest of his three seasons...also had career lows in strikeouts per nine innings (6.05) and walks per nine innings (1.79) and had a career-high 3.38 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had a career-high 160.2 innings pitched and 21 home runs and matched his best in wins...walked two batters or fewer in 24 of his 27 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS, 2018: Based on a minimum of 150 innings, he had the fifth fewest walks per nine innings in the American League, the seventh lowest on-base percentage and the 10th lowest OPS...using the same minimum, he had the ninth fewest walks per nine innings in Oakland history, the 10th lowest on-base percentage and 10th best strikeout-to-walk ratio...averaged 14.8 pitches per inning, which was the lowest mark in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...tied for second in the AL in most sacrifice hits allowed (4), tied for sixth in opponents reaching on an error (8) and tied for 10th in wild pitches (9).

A's 2018 LEADERS: Led the A's in wins, starts, innings, strikeouts (108), hits (141), runs (67), home runs (21) and losses (9)...it marked the second consecutive season, fourth time in Oakland history (also 1996-97) and fifth time in Athletics history (1957) the A's did not have a pitcher with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...it was just the sixth time in Oakland history the A's did not have a pitcher with at least 30 starts in a non-strike season (1979, 1986, 1996-97, 2017)...his nine losses match the fewest by a team-leader in a non-strike season in Oakland history (Hudson, 2001) and the 27 starts and 108 strikeouts were the fewest by an A's team leader since Steve Karsay had 24 starts and 92 strikeouts in 1997.

2018 TRENDS: Went 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts through the end of April, 1-4 with a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents average in six starts in May, 5-1 with a 3.12 ERA and .231 opponents average over his next 11 starts from June 5 to Aug. 1 and 2-2 with a 5.12 ERA and .316 opponents batting average over his final four starts.

2018 OPPONENTS BATTING: His .232 opponents batting average broke down to .231 (112-for-485) against right-handed hitters compared to .236 (29-for-124) against left-handers...surrendered 19 of his 21 home runs to righties and has allowed 52 of his 60 career home runs to righties...has a .737 career OPS against righties, .586 against lefties...opponents hit .197 with a .254 on-base percentage and .306 slugging percentage when leading off an inning... had a .193 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .255 after that...allowed a .189 batting average with two strikes...held the bottom four hitters in the order to a .174 average.

2018 SPLITS: Was 6-1 with a 3.44 ERA in 11 starts during the day, 6-8 with a 3.69 ERA in 16 starts at night...is now 15-4 with a 3.31 ERA (68 er in 184.2 ip) in 31 career day games, 17-24 with a 4.20 ERA (136 er in 291.1 ip) in 52 starts at night...went 7-3 with a 3.27 ERA in 13 starts on the road and tied for 10th in the AL in road wins...went 3-0 with a 1.78 ERA in four starts against AL Central teams and now has an eight-game winning streak against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016...is 9-2 with a 2.39 ERA (20 er in 75.1 ip) in 12 career starts against AL Central teams.

2018 RUN SUPPORT: Received a total of eight runs of support in his nine losses (1.61 RSA) and has 28 runs of support in his 28 career losses (138.0 ip, 1.83 RSA)...received two runs of support or fewer in 14 of his 27 starts and was 2-8 in those games...was 10-1 in his other 13 starts...is now 4-26 in 43 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 28-2 in 39 starts with support of three or more.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Tanner Roark (4-1, 3.40 ERA): Was acquired from Cincinnati on July 31 with cash considerations for minor league outfielder Jameson Hannah and is 4-1 with a 3.40 ERA in seven starts with the A's...has allowed two earned runs or fewer in five of his seven starts with Oakland...the A's are 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments...went 6-7 with a 4.24 ERA in 21 starts with the Reds and is 10-8 with a 4.01 ERA in 28 starts for the season...is tied for fourth in the majors in hit batters (12)...is averaging 17.9 pitches per inning, which is the highest in the majors...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 21-7 A's win at Houston last Tuesday (5.2 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...it was his 10th win of the season and he now has four career 10-win seasons...is 1-0 with a 3.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 10 so, 2 hr) in three career starts against the Royals, all in Kansas City...made one start this year, a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss on Aug. 28 (6.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 2 hr).

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 3.75 ERA (101 er in 242.2 ip) over the last 70 games since June 23 and now has a 4.06 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League.
- Has the lowest opponents slugging mark in AL (.394), second in OPS (.707), third in on-base percentage (.313), and fourth in batting average (.238).
- Is 40-for-68 (58.8%) in save opportunities...the 28 blown saves are tied for most in the Majors.
- Ranks tied for second in fewest home runs allowed (67) and has the fourth fewest walks (207) among AL bullpens...tied for the fifth fewest wins (25).
- Has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.338) among Major League bullpens.
