OAKLAND ATHLETICS (94-62) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (70-86)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last five games, 10 of the last 12, 15 of the last 19 and are 26-10 dating back to Aug. 14...are 43-21 (.682) since the All-Star Break, which is the second best record in the majors (Houston, 45-21, .682)...are 94-62 (.603) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League and sixth best in the majors...the 32 games over .500 are one short of the season high of 33 (94-61 on Sept. 21)...won 97 games last year and now have 191 wins over the last two seasons, which is their most in back-to-back seasons since they had 199 from 2002-03...have won at least 90 games in each of the last two years, four of the last eight and 10 of the last 20.

MAGIC NUMBER: The A's magic number to clinch a playoff spot is five...have sole possession of the first American League Wild Card spot for the 12th consecutive day...are 1½ games ahead of Tampa Bay and two games ahead of Cleveland...have won the season series with Tampa Bay (4-3) and Cleveland (5-1) and would host the Wild Card game in the event of a two-way tie for the top spot...were officially eliminated from the AL West in game 156 on Sunday.

THE MIDDLE OF JUNE: The A's were 37-36 (.507) at the conclusion of play on June 16 but have gone 57-26 (.678) since then, which is the best record in the majors...last year, the A's were 34-36 (.486) through June 15 but then went 63-29 (.685) from June 16 through the end of the season, which was the best record in the majors.

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 15-5 (.750) in September, which is the second best record in the majors to the Brewers (17-4, .810)...lead the majors in runs this month (130)...lead the American League in walks (87), are tied for the lead in doubles (43) and triples (5) and rank third in home runs (35), extra base hits (83) and on-base percentage (.345)...the pitching staff ranks third in opponents batting average (.236) and on-base percentage (.297).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 250 home runs, which is the most in Athletics history, fifth most in the majors this year and 11th most in Major League history...the previous A's record was 243 in 1996...have also set franchise records for most players with 20 or more home runs (7) and most players with 10 or more (10) and have tied the mark for most players with 30 or more (3)...are one of 11 teams in Major League history with seven or more players with 20 or more home runs...only the Twins, with eight this year, have more.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher in each game of this two game series...have faced a left-handed starter in eight of the previous 18 games and have won all eight of those games...for the season, Oakland is 33-12 (.733) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 61-50 (.550) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (34-11)...are hitting .262 against left-handed pitchers, .246 against right-handers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin the final road trip of the season today, a six-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (two games) and Seattle (four games)...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Houston (3-1) and Texas (3-0) and are now 37-18 (.673) over their last 55 road games dating back to May 16...42-33 (.560) on the road overall and have clinched a winning record on the road for the second consecutive season...went 47-34 last year...have hit 128 home runs on the road, which is third most in Oakland history (136 in 2018, 130 in 1996)...have 274 extra base hits, which is sixth most (300 in 2001, 296 in 2018, 287 in 2000, 281 in 2004, 280 in 1996)...have a 4.57 ERA (334 in 657.1 ip) on the road compared to 3.56 at home...went 4-2 on the final homestand of the season against Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (2-1)...were 33-12 (.733) over the final 45 home games and 52-29 (.642) overall, which tied for the seventh best home record in Oakland history.

OFFENSE: The A's rank fourth in the American League in home runs (250) and doubles (287) and fifth in runs (832), extra base hits (560), OPS (.780), on-base percentage (.328) and slugging percentage (.452)...have set a franchise record for home runs and the 560 extra base hits are nine short of the record of 569 set last year...the runs scored are fifth most in Oakland history (947 in 2000, 893 in 1999, 884 in 2001, 861 in 1996)...have been hit by a pitch 85 times, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and three short of the Athletics record of 88 set in 2001...have 1293 strikeouts, which is fifth fewest in the AL but fourth most in Athletics history (1491 in 2017, 1387 in 2012, 1381 in 2018)...are tied for second in the AL in fewest stolen bases (46) and rank third in most grounded into double plays (134).

PITCHING: Chris Bassitt struck out Danny Santana in the sixth inning Sunday for the A's 1,245th strikeout of the season...that breaks the franchise record of 1244 set in 2014...now have 1249 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League...allowed five home runs Sunday and now have 199 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the AL but tied for fourth most in Athletics history (220 in 1964, 210 in 2017, 205 in 1996)...have hit 64 batters, which is four short of the Oakland record of 68 set in 2004...are tied for second in the AL in shutouts (11), rank third in opponents slugging (.408), fourth in ERA (4.03), OPS (.716), batting average (.243) and on-base percentage (.309) and fifth in fewest walks (462).

STARTING PITCHING: The loss by Tanner Roark on Sunday was the first by an A's starter against a team other than Houston since Brett Anderson on Aug. 13 at San Francisco...starters are now 15-2 with a 4.10 ERA (75 er in 75 er in 164.2 ip) over the last 31 games and 66-34 with a 4.07 ERA overall...rank second in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA and innings pitched (854.0).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 80 errors, which is third fewest in the AL...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season is 81 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 84 in 2006...the errors have led to 34 unearned runs, which is the fewest in the majors...the fewest in Athletics history is 39 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 42 in 1991.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have won 14 of their last 15 games on a Tuesday and are 19-5 (.792) on Tuesday for the season, which is the best record in the majors...had yesterday off and are 16-8 (.667) following an off day, which is the third best record in the American League...have a run differential of +165, which is fourth best in the AL and fifth best in the majors...have finished +160 or better three times in Oakland history: 239 in 2001, 180 in 1988, 163 in 1990...A's pinch hitters have 13 extra base hits, which ties the Oakland record set in 1968.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have clinched the season series for the first time since 2013 as they lead 12-5 entering this final two-game series...the 12 wins are the A's most against the Angels since 2003 when they went 12-8...have won more than 12 games twice: 14-6 in 2001 and 13-5 in 1968...have a six-game winning streak, which is the A's longest against the Angels since June 23-Sept. 24, 2004 when they also won six straight...last won more than six in a row Sept. 25, 2001-April 13, 2002 when they had a nine-game winning streak...went 7-3 in Oakland this year and are 5-2 in Anaheim...the wins at home match the most in Oakland history against the Angels (seventh time, last in 2003)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 449-381 against the Angels...that includes 235-180 in Oakland and 214-201 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 498-458 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson ranks second in the American League in RBI in September (20) and tied for third in home runs (8) and extra base hits (14)...has the most September home runs (26) and RBI (61) in the majors over the last three years...**Marcus Semien** has scored 120 runs, which is three short of the Oakland record of 123 set by Reggie Jackson in 1969...is also within reach of the Oakland record for total bases (has 335, Canseco 347 in 1988), extra base hits (81, Giambi 87 in 2001) and at bats (638, Tejada 662 in 2002).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1975 Vida Blue wins his 21st game and Reggie Jackson hits two home runs as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 13-2 to clinch their fifth consecutive AL West title...in 1988 Dave Stewart strikes out 11 in the A's 5-2 win at Milwaukee to win his 20th game of the season...in 2000 Jason Giambi hits the 5000th home run in Oakland history, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of a 3-2 A's loss at Seattle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Homer Bailey (13-8, 4.55 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was acquired from Kansas City on July 14 for minor league infielder Kevin Merrell minutes before he was scheduled to start for the Royals against Detroit...is 6-2 with a 4.21 ERA (32 er in 68.1 ip) in 12 starts with Oakland after going 7-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 18 starts with Kansas City...has allowed three runs or fewer in 10 of his 12 starts with the A's but yielded seven and nine runs in his other two...Oakland is 8-4 (.667) in his starting assignments.

SIX WINS WITH THE A's: Made his first start with Oakland on July 17 and his six wins match the most by an Athletic acquired in an in-season trade over the last 20 years (Jon Lester, 6 in 2014)...the last time an Athletic had more than six was in 1999 when Kevin Appier and Omar Olivares had seven each.

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 1.88 ERA (9 er in 43.0 ip) and .201 (32-for-159) opponents batting average over his last seven starts and has walked just seven batters in 43.0 innings (1.47 per nine innings)...the four-game winning streak matches the second longest of his career...his career high is six from July 31-Sept. 14, 2013...went 2-2 with an 8.17 ERA and .308 opponents average over his first five starts with the A's and walked eight batters in 25.1 innings (2.84 per nine innings).

CAREER NOTES: Has 13 wins, which matches his career high from 2012 with Cincinnati...this is his third career 10-win season...was a combined 9-27 over his previous four seasons...his 146 strikeouts, 158.1 innings pitched and 30 starts are the third best totals of his career and his most since 2013 (199 so, 209.0 ip, 32 gs)...his 53 walks are one short of his career high of 54 in 2013.

IN SEPTEMBER: Is 1-0 with a 1.45 ERA (3 er in 18.2 ip) and .169 (11-for-65) opponents batting average in three starts in September...is now 16-9 with a 3.14 ERA (84 er in 240.2 ip) and .221 (195-for-881) opponents average in 39 career starts in September...the ERA and opponents average are his best for any month of the season and the wins are second to his 17 in August.

HOME AND AWAY: Since joining the A's, he is 3-0 with a 2.39 ERA (10 er in 37.2 ip) in six starts in the Coliseum and 3-2 with a 6.46 ERA (22 er in 30.2 ip) in six starts on the road...for the season, he is 7-3 with a 3.51 ERA (36 er in 92.1 ip) in 16 starts in his home ballparks compared to 6-5 with a 6.00 ERA (44 er in 66.0 ip) in 14 starts on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 4-5 with a 6.75 ERA (35 er in 46.2 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition compared to 9-3 with a 3.63 ERA (45 er in 111.2 ip) in 21 starts against all other teams...is now 6-6 with a 6.33 ERA (50 er in 71.0 ip) in 13 career starts against the AL West.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has a .193 (26-for-135) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters with the A's compared to .298 (39-for-131) against right-handers...his season splits are .215 (68-for-316) against lefties, .292 (86-for-295) against righties.

RUN SUPPORT: Has a season run support average of 6.54 (115 rs in 158.1 ip), which is sixth highest in the American League...has received one run of support or fewer in 10 of his 30 starts and is 0-7 in those starts...is 13-1 in 20 starts with two runs of support or more.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in his Royals debut a 7-6 loss against Minnesota on April 3...left with a 6-3 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of four times he left with the lead in one of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 7 vs. Chicago-AL, July 4 vs. Cleveland, Sept. 6 vs. Detroit)...picked up his first win as a Royal April 13 against Cleveland when he tossed 7.0 scoreless innings...it was his first win since May 12, 2018 at Los Angeles (NL) and it snapped a career-high 10-game losing streak...posted a 6.88 ERA and .333 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 13 starts from May 18, 2018 to April 8, 2019...was 2-1 with a 4.30 ERA and .220 opponents batting average over his first four starts through April 18...then went 2-5 with a 6.87 ERA and .310 opponents batting average over his next nine starts from April 23 to June 7...walked a season-high four batters (also May 16 vs. Texas and June 29 at Toronto) in a season-low 1.0 innings April 23 at Tampa Bay...it was his shortest start since Aug. 28, 2016 at Arizona, also 1.0 inning...had a season-high three-game losing streak that spanned four starts from May 16 to June 1...had a 9.64 ERA and .350 opponents batting average during the streak...then went 4-0 with a 2.57 ERA and .227 opponents batting average over a six-start stretch from June 13 to July 17...the four-game winning streak was his longest since May 23-June 8, 2014, when he also won four in a row...won three consecutive starts from June 13 to 23 and allowed just one run in 19.0 innings (0.47 ERA)...did not allow a run in back-to-back starts on June 13 against Detroit (6.0 ip) and June 18 at Seattle (7.2 ip) as part of a 16.2-inning scoreless streak from June 13 to 23...combined with Lopez and McCarthy on a six-hit shutout in the latter contest against the Mariners...tossed a season-high 7.2 innings, which was his longest scoreless outing since a complete-game on June 29, 2014 at San Francisco...also had a season-high 121 pitches...finished June 3-1 with a 3.48 ERA...it was his first three-win month since June of 2014

(3-1)...then had a no decision in his final start as a Royal on July 4 against Cleveland...was the winning pitcher in his A's debut, allowing two runs in 6.0 innings in a 10-2 victory over Seattle in Oakland on July 17...allowed a season-high nine runs on a season-high eight hits in 2.0 innings in an 11-1 loss at Houston July 22...became the eighth pitcher in Oakland history to allow nine or more runs in two innings or fewer, the first since Jesse Hahn on June 22, 2017, also against Houston (10 r in 2.0 ip)...walked one batter or fewer in six consecutive starts from Aug. 7 to Sept. 6 (4 bb in 35.1 ip, 1.05 per nine innings), which was the longest such streak of his career...tossed seven scoreless innings in a 9-5 win at San Francisco Aug. 14 and went 2-for-3 with a RBI at the plate for his sixth career multiple hit game.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 1-0 win over Kansas City in 11 innings last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed seven innings and allowed just three hits and an intentional walk while striking out a season-high 11...it was his ninth career 10-strikeout game...allowed just one base runner past first base, a one-out double by Soler in the seventh...Duffy shutout the A's on two hits in seven innings.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 3.59 ERA (107 er in 268.1 ip) over the last 77 games since June 23 and now has a 3.97 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League.
- Has the lowest opponents slugging mark in AL (.390), ranks second in OPS (.699) and third in on-base percentage (.310) and batting average (.234).
- Is 42-for-71 (59.2%) in save opportunities...the 29 blown saves are tied with Washington for most in the Majors...they are tied for the most in ML history by a team with 90 or more wins (Colorado in 2007).
- Ranks second in fewest home runs allowed (70) and has the fourth fewest walks (213) among AL bullpens...tied for the fifth fewest wins (28).
- Has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.341) among Major League bullpens.
