ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost back-to-back games for the first time since Aug. 31-Sept. 1 at New York (AL)...have not lost more than two in a row since July 24-26 when they dropped three straight... have won 10 of the last 13 games and are 26-11 (.703) dating back to Aug. 14...are 43-22 (.662) since the All-Star Break, which is the second best record in the majors (Houston, 46-21, .687)...are 94-63 (.599) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League and sixth best in the majors...won 97 games last year and now have 191 wins over the last two seasons, which is their most in back-to-back seasons since they had 199 from 2002-03...have won at least 90 games in each of the last two years, four of the last eight and 10 of the last 20...only the Yankees (15), Red Sox (13), Cardinals (11) and Braves (11) have more 90-win seasons over the last 20 last years...have a run differential of +164, which is fourth best in the AL and fifth best in the majors...have finished +160 or better three times in Oakland history: 239 in 2001, 180 in 1988, 163 in 1990.

MAGIC NUMBER: The A's magic number to clinch a playoff spot is five...have sole possession of the first American League Wild Card spot for the 13th consecutive day...are ½ game ahead of Tampa Bay and one game ahead of Cleveland...have won the season series with Tampa Bay (4-3) and Cleveland (5-1) and would host the Wild Card game in the event of a two-way tie for the top spot...a three-way tie would lead to two playoff games to determine the two Wild Card teams.

THE MIDDLE OF JUNE: The A's were 37-36 (.507) at the conclusion of play on June 16 but have gone 57-27 (.679) since then, which is the best record in the majors...last year, the A's were 34-36 (.486) through June 15 but then went 63-29 (.685) from June 16 through the end of the season, which was the best record in the majors.

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 15-6 (.714) in September, which is tied for the second best record in the American League (Houston, 15-5, .750)...lead the majors in runs this month (132)...lead the AL in walks (88), are tied for the lead in triples (5), tied for second in doubles (43), rank third in home runs (36) and extra base hits (84) and fourth in OPS (.814) on-base percentage (.339) and slugging percentage (.474).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 251 home runs, which is the most in Athletics history, fifth most in the majors this year and 11th most in Major League history...the previous A's record was 243 in 1996...have also set franchise records for most players with 20 or more home runs (7) and most players with 10 or more (10) and have tied the mark for most players with 30 or more (3)...are one of 11 teams in Major League history with seven or more players with 20 or more home runs...only the Twins, with eight this year, have more.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's had their streak of eight consecutive wins in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher end last night...have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in 14 of the previous 31 games and are scheduled to face a lefty in three of the final five...are 33-13 (.717) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 61-50 (.550) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (34-11)...are hitting .262 against left-handed pitchers, .246 against right-handers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on the final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-1) and Seattle (four games)...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Houston (3-1) and Texas (3-0) and are now 37-19 (.661) over their last 56 road games dating back to May 16...42-34 (.553) on the road overall and have clinched a winning record on the road for the second consecutive season...went 47-34 last year...have hit 129 home runs on the

road, which is third most in Oakland history (136 in 2018, 130 in 1996)... have 275 extra base hits, which is sixth most (300 in 2001, 296 in 2018, 287 in 2000, 281 in 2004, 280 in 1996)...have a 4.56 ERA (337 in 665.1 ip) on the road compared to 3.56 at home...went 4-2 on the final homestand of the season against Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (2-1)...were 33-12 (.733) over the final 45 home games and 52-29 (.642) overall, which tied for the seventh best home record in Oakland history.

OFFENSE: The A's rank fourth in the American League in home runs (251) and doubles (287) and fifth in runs (834), extra base hits (561), OPS (.779), on-base percentage (.328) and slugging percentage (.451)...have set a franchise record for home runs and the 561 extra base hits are eight short of the record of 569 set last year...the runs scored are fifth most in Oakland history (947 in 2000, 893 in 1999, 884 in 2001, 861 in 1996)...have been hit by a pitch 85 times, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and three short of the Athletics record of 88 set in 2001...have 1300 strikeouts, which is fifth fewest in the AL but fourth most in Athletics history (1491 in 2017, 1387 in 2012, 1381 in 2018)...are tied for second in the AL in fewest stolen bases (46) and rank third in most grounded into double plays (135).

PITCHING: The A's rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.408), tied for third in shutouts (11), fourth in ERA (4.03), OPS (.717), batting average (.244) and on-base percentage (.309) and fifth in fewest walks (463)...have a franchise record 1258 strikeouts, but that is fourth fewest in the AL...have surrendered 199 home runs, which is fourth fewest in the AL but tied for fourth most in Athletics history (220 in 1964, 210 in 2017, 205 in 1996)...have hit 64 batters, which is four short of the Oakland record of 68 set in 2004.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have taken the loss in back-to-back games for the first time since July 24-26 when they lose three straight...have walked one batter or fewer in each of the last 10 games (7 bb in 49.0 ip, 1.29 per nine innings)...are 15-3 with a 4.14 ERA (78 er in 169.2 ip) over the last 32 games and 66-36 with a 4.08 ERA overall...rank second in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA and innings pitched (859.0).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a six-game errorless streak...have committed 80 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season is 81 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 84 in 2006...the errors have led to 34 unearned runs, which is the fewest in the majors...the fewest in Athletics history is 39 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 42 in 1991.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have clinched the season series for the first time since 2013 as they lead 12-6 entering the final game...the 12 wins are the A's most against the Angels since 2003 when they went 12-8...have won more than 12 games twice: 14-6 in 2001 and 13-5 in 1968...went 7-3 in Oakland and are 5-3 in Anaheim...the wins at home match the most in Oakland history against the Angels (seventh time, last in 2003)...had their six-game winning streak against the Angels snapped last night...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 449-382 against the Angels...that includes 235-180 in Oakland and 214-202 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 498-459 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson is tied for second in the American League in RBI in September (20) and tied for third in home runs (8) and extra base hits (14)...has the most September home runs in the majors over the last two years (26) and the second most RBI (61)...**Marcus Semien** has scored 120 runs, which is three short of the Oakland record of 123 set by Reggie Jackson in 1969...is also within reach of the Oakland record for total bases (has 336, Canseco 347 in 1988), extra base hits (81, Giambi 87 in 2001) and at bats (641, Tejada 662 in 2002).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire's ninth inning game tying homer breaks Reggie Jackson's Oakland home run record as it is his 48th of the year...he would go on to hit what was then a Major League rookie record 49 home runs...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hit shutout at Kansas City to win his 22nd game and clinch the A's third consecutive AL West title.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (9-2, 2.70 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the restricted list today...was 9-2 with a 2.70 ERA in 15 starts when he was suspended on June 21 for 80 games for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...at the time, he was tied for third in the American League in wins and winning percentage (.818) and ranked fifth in ERA.

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 5-0 with a 2.62 ERA (13 er in 44.2 ip) and .202 (34-for-168) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...the winning streak is a career-high...has 55 strikeouts in 44.2 innings during the streak (11.08 strikeouts per nine innings).

NINE-GAME WINNER: Has nine wins and a win tonight would give the A's four 10-game winners (Fiers 15, Anderson 12, Bassitt 10) for just the second time over the last 13 years...had five in 2013 (Colon 18, Griffin 14, Parker 12, Milone 12, Straily 10)...it would make the A's one of seven teams this year with at least four 10-game winners.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 3.00 ERA (14 er in 42.0 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 5-2 with a 2.44 ERA (13 er in 48.0 ip) in eight starts on the road...has yielded five of his seven home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA (4 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts during the day compared to 6-2 with a 3.14 ERA (23 er in 66.0 ip) in 11 starts at night.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 11-4 (.733) in his starting assignments and are 18-8 (.692) when he starts in his career...has allowed just one run in the first inning for a 0.60 ERA (15.0 ip)...opponents are hitting .116 (21-for-181) with two strikes...has career highs in wins (9), strikeouts (97), innings pitched (90.0) and games started (15)...has committed three errors, which is tied for the most among American League pitchers.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the Opening Day roster and was available in the bullpen for the two games against Seattle in Japan but did not pitch...was inserted into the fourth spot in the rotation when the season resumed and picked up the win in his first start March 31 against Los Angeles (AL)...took the loss in his second start on April 5 at Houston...then went 3-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .224 opponents average over this next three starts from April 10 to 23...the first win came on April 10 at Baltimore when he retired the first 12 batters he faced...surrendered two home runs in the game, giving him four in his first three starts...did not allow another home run until June 4 at Los Angeles-AL (Ohtani) for an eight-game, 53.0-inning, 228-batter faced homerless streak...allowed a run on three hits in 6.2 innings for the win in a 2-1 decision over Houston on April 17...did not allow a hit until Gurriel singled with one out in the fifth...allowed a season-high nine hits but extended his winning streak to three games in an 11-5 win over Texas April 23...had his three-game winning streak snapped April 29 at Boston when he allowed a season-high seven runs in 4.1 innings...only one of the runs was earned and the six unearned runs tied for second most in Oakland history...they were the most since Brett Anderson also had six on May 15, 2009 vs. Detroit...finished April with a 3-2 record and a 3.29 ERA in five starts...tied for fifth in the American League in wins...then went 2-0 with a 2.64 ERA in five starts in May...tied for eighth in the AL in May ERA...left his start on May 10 against Cleveland with a 3-2 lead but Trivino blew the save in a game the A's would win 4-3 in 12 innings...had career highs in strikeouts (10), innings pitched (8.2) and pitches (109) in a 7-2 win at Detroit on May 17...did not walk a batter, which marked the 27th time in Oakland history a pitcher struck out 10 or more and did not issue a walk...it was the first since Jeff Samardzija on Sept. 17, 2014 vs. Texas (10 so)...walked a career-high five batters in a season-low 4.0 innings in a no decision against Los Angeles (AL) May 28...had his second career 10-strikeout game in a 9-8 win at Texas June 9.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over Tampa Bay on June 20 in Oakland...shut out the Rays on three hits over the first five innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Pham in the sixth inning...was relieved by Treinen to start the ninth inning with the score tied 1-1...Treinen allowed three runs in the ninth but the A's came back with four in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

MONTAS vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-0 with a 3.38 ERA (21.1 ip, 19 h, 8 r, 8 er, 7 bb, 17 so, 2 hr) in six career appearances, including three starts...is 1-0 with a 3.46 ERA (5 er in 13.0 ip) in four games in Oakland and 1-0 with a 3.24 ERA (3 er in 8.1 ip) in two appearances in Anaheim...is 2-0 with a 3.94 ERA (16.0 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 14 so) in three starts this year...his first win came in the A's 2-1 victory on March 31 in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed just one run on three hits...allowed a leadoff double to Calhoun, hit Trout and then retired 16 consecutive batters before Calhoun homered with two outs in the sixth...was relieved by Trivino after allowing a double to Bour to start the seventh inning...then had a no decision in a 6-5 loss in Oakland on May 28...walked a career-high five batters in 4.0 innings...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed four runs in the second on a two-run single by Fletcher and a two-run double by La Stella...left trailing 4-1 but Oakland came back to tie the game before Soriano allowed two runs in the ninth for the loss...faced the Angels again his next start on June 4 at Anaheim and was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 victory...shut out the Angels on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Ohtani in the sixth.

2018 RECAP: Went 5-4 with a 3.88 ERA in 13 games, including 11 starts, over four stints with Oakland...was 5-2 with a 3.35 ERA in eight starts during his first stint from May 27 to July 9 and 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five games over his final three stints...surrendered just five home runs in 65.0 innings after yielding 10 home runs in 32.0 innings in 2017...struck out 43 batters (5.95 per nine innings) after fanning 56 in 47.0 innings (10.72 per nine innings) over his first two seasons...allowed a .290 opponents batting average, including .276 (35-for-127) against right-handed hitters compared to .305 (39-for-128) against left-handers...yielded 20 of his 28 extra base hits to lefties and had a .378 slugging percentage against righties compared to .523 against lefties...also went 4-5 with a 4.65 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Triple-A Nashville...had a .255 opponents batting average, including .189 (18-for-95) against left-handed hitters compared to .290 (51-for-176) against right-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Sean Manaea (3-0, 1.14 ERA): Was reinstated from the 60-day injured list Sept. 1 and has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his four starts...has won each of his last three starts after taking a no decision in his first start Sept. 1 at New York when he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings...has won four games in a month in his career once (April, 2018)...is now 7-2 with a 1.94 ERA in 12 career starts in the month of September...began the season on the 60-day injured list as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...has a four-game winning streak dating back to last year, which is one short of his career high of five...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 12-3 A's win over Texas last Saturday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 5-4 with a 3.90 ERA (62.1 ip, 50 h, 27 r, 27 er, 21 bb, 46 so, 6 hr) in 10 career starts against Seattle...went 2-1 with a 3.05 ERA (20.2 ip, 13 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 12 so, 2 hr) in three starts last year.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 3.55 ERA (107 er in 271.1 ip) over the last 78 games since June 23 and now has a 3.95 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League.
- Has the lowest opponents slugging mark in AL (.390), ranks second in OPS (.699) and fourth in on-base percentage (.309) and batting average (.234).
- Is 42-for-71 (59.2%) in save opportunities...the 29 blown saves are tied with Washington for most in the Majors...they are tied for the most in ML history by a team with 90 or more wins (Colorado in 2007).
- Ranks second in fewest home runs allowed (70) and has the fourth fewest walks (214) among AL bullpens...tied for the fifth fewest wins (28).
- Has the second lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.347) among Major League bullpens.

- Was 10-5 with a 3.95 ERA (61 er in 139.0 ip) and 132 strikeouts in 25 games as a starter this season...made his first relief appearance of the season Friday night, striking out two in one perfect inning...has seven strikeouts in 4.0 innings pitched as a reliever in total this season.
- Is 6-2 with a 3.01 ERA (23 er in 68.2 ip) in 13 games at home compared to 4-3 with a 4.60 ERA (38 er in 74.1 ip) in 14 games on the road...has yielded just five home runs in 68.2 innings in Oakland.
- Has made 12 career relief appearances (8 er in 26.2 ip, 2.70), including two this year, four last year, five in 2015, and one in 2014.
