ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last nine games, 12 of the last 16 and are 28-12 (.700) dating back to Aug. 14...are 45-23 (.662) since the All-Star Break, which is the second best record in the majors (Houston, 48-22, .686) and the fifth best post-break record in Athletics history...are 96-64 (.600) overall, which is tied for fourth best record in the American League and sixth best in the majors...are 32 games over .500, one short of season high (96-63 on Sept. 26)...have not been more than 33 games over .500 since finishing the 2002 season at 44 games over .500 (103-59)... won 97 games last year and now have 193 wins over the last two seasons, which is tied for sixth

most in Oakland history over a two-year stretch and the most since they had 199 from 2002-03...have won at least 90 games in each of the last two years, four of the last eight and 10 of the last 20...only the Yankees (15), Red Sox (13), Cardinals (11) and Braves (11) have more 90-win seasons over the last 20 last years...have a run differential of +166, which is fourth best in the AL and fifth best in the majors...have finished +160 or better three times in Oakland history: 239 in 2001, 180 in 1988, 163 in 1990.

A's IN POSTSEASON: The A's return to the postseason for the second consecutive season, fifth time in the last eight years and 10th time in the last 20 seasons...over the last eight years, only the Dodgers (7) have more than five postseason appearances and over the last 20 seasons only the Yankees (16), Cardinals (13), Dodgers (11) and Braves (11) have more than 10...this is the 28th postseason appearance in franchise history, which includes 20 with Oakland and eight with Philadelphia...that is fourth most all-time...have reached the postseason for the fourth time as the American League Wild Card, the third time in the two wild card era.

MAGIC NUMBER: The A's can clinch home field for Wild Card game with a combination of two A's wins or Tampa Bay losses...share at least possession of first American League Wild Card spot for 16th consecutive day...are tied with Tampa Bay...have won season series with Tampa Bay (4-3) and would host the Wild Card game in the event of a two-way tie for the top spot.

RECORD-SETTING SCORER: Marcus Semien is tied with Reggie Jackson (1969) for the most runs scored in Oakland history with 123...Semien's total is T10th-most in A's history with Jackson and Jimmie Foxx (1929)...Semien ranks 4th in Majors in runs scored behind Mookie Betts (134), Rafael Devers (128) and Ronald Acuna Jr. (127).

THE MIDDLE OF JUNE: The A's were 37-36 (.507)

MLB BEST RECORDS, at the conclusion of play on June 16 but have gone 59-28 (.678) since then, which is the best record in the majors...last year, the A's were 34-36 (.486) through June 15 but then went 63-29 (.685) from June 16 through the end of the season, which was the best record in the majors.

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 17-7 (.708) in Sep-

tember, which is the fifth best record in the majors...the 17 wins are the A's most in September since going 19-8 in 2013...rank 2nd in the majors in runs this month (141)...lead the AL in walks (102), T3rd in doubles (46), third in extra base hits (92), third in home runs (41), 4th in OPS (.810) and 3rd in on-base percentage (.341) and tied for third in triples (5)...the pitching staff is third in opponents batting average (.234) and on-base percentage (.294).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 256 home runs, which is the most in Athletics history, fifth most in the majors this year and 10th most in Major League history... the previous A's record was 243 in 1996...have also set franchise records for most players with 20 or more home runs (7) and most players with 10 or more (10) and have tied the mark for most players with 30 or more (3)...are one of 11 teams in Major League history with seven or more players with 20 or more home runs...only the Twins, with eight this year, have more.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in 16 of the previous 34 games and are scheduled to face a lefty tonight...are 34-14 (.708) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 62-50 (.554) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (36-11).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on the final road trip of the season, a sixgame trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-1) and Seattle (1-1)...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Houston (3-1) and Texas (3-0) and are now 39-20 (.661) over their last 59 road games dating back to May 16, which is the second best mark in the majors (Minnesota, 42-18, .700)...are 44-35 (.557) on the road overall and have clinched a winning record on the road for the second consecutive season...went 47-34 last year...have hit 134 home runs on the road, which is two short of the Athletics record of 136 set last year...have 283 extra base hits, which is fourth most in Athletics history (300 in 2001, 296 in 2018, 287 in 2000)...have a 4.47 ERA (344 in 692.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.56 at home...went 4-2 on the final homestand of the season against Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (2-1)...were 33-12 (.733) over the final 45 home games and 52-29 (.642) overall, which tied for 7th best home record in Oakland history.

OFFENSE: The A's rank fourth in the American League in home runs (256) and fifth in doubles (292) and fifth in runs (843), extra base hits (569), OPS (.779), on-base percentage (.328) and slugging percentage (.451)...have set a franchise record for home runs and the 569 extra base hits have tied the record of 569 set last year...the runs scored are fifth most in Oakland history (947 in 2000, 893 in 1999, 884 in 2001, 861 in 1996)...have been hit by a pitch 87 times, which is the most in the AL, tied for second most in majors and one short of the Athletics record of 88 set in 2001...have 1322 strikeouts, which is the fifth fewest in the AL but will finish fourth most in Athletics history

PITCHING: The A's rank third in the American League in opponents OPS (.714) and slugging percentage (.406), fourth in ERA (4.00), batting average (.243) and on-base percentage (.308) and fifth in fewest walks (471)...have a franchise record 1286 strikeouts, but that is fourth fewest in the AL...have surrendered 200 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL but fourth most in Athletics history (220 in 1964, 210 in 2017, 205 in 1996)...have hit 65 batters, which is three short of the Oakland record of 68 set in 2004.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-2 with a 2.79 ERA (19 er in 61.1 ip) over the last 11 games and 16-3 with a 3.95 ERA (82 er in 186.2 ip) over the last 35 contest...are 67-36 with a 4.04 ERA overall...the wins are tied for second most in the majors to Houston (77)...rank fourth in the American League in ERA and innings pitched (876.0).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series 9-8 and need one more win to clinch their first season series win over the Mariners since going 12-7 in 2012...went 6-2 in Oakland, 0-2 in Tokyo and are 3-4 in Seattle...have won nine of the last 13 games after losing each of the first four...have lost each of the previous six season series...the last time Oakland lost six consecutive season series to one team

was 1993-98 to Boston...are 55-76 (.420) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 359-300 against the Mariners... that includes 195-134 in Oakland, 163-163 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 87-99 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has scored 102 runs (100 in 2018)...is fifth player in Oakland history with two seasons of 100 or more runs (Henderson 7, Tejada and Giambi 3, Canseco 2)... Marcus Semien is within reach of the Oakland record for total bases (has 343, Canseco 347 in 1988), extra base hits (83, Giambi 87 in 2001) and at bats (653, Tejada 662 in 2002).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1971 the A's win the fastest game in Oakland history 2-1 as the A's defeat the Royals in 1 hour and 35 minutes...in 1972 the A's score six times in the final three innings to defeat Minnesota 8-7 and clinch their second consecutive AL West title...in 1975 Vida Blue, Glenn Abbott, Paul Lindblad and Rollie Fingers combine to no-hit the California Angels, 5-0...in 1995 Terry Steinbach collects his 1000th career hit at California.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (12-9, 4.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 31st start of the season today, which matches his career high from 2015 with the Dodgers...already has a career-high 12 wins, besting his total of 11 from his rookie season with the A's in 2009...his 171.0 innings pitched are third most in his career behind 180.1 in 2015 and 175.1 in 2009...has a career-high 48 walks and has matched his high with 20 home runs (also 2009).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-3 with a 3.40 ERA (34 er in 90.0 ip) and .246 (86-for-349) opponents batting average in 15 starts on the road compared to 4-6 with a 4.67 ERA (42 er in 81.0 ip) and .292 (92-for-315) opponents average in 15 starts at home...is tied for seventh in the American League in road wins, ranks seventh in ERA and ninth in opponents OPS (.674).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 10-5 with a 3.23 ERA (41 er in 114.1 ip) and .241 (105-for-435) opponents batting average in 19 starts at night compared to 2-4 with a 5.56 ERA (35 er in 56.2 ip) and .319 (73-for-229) opponents average in 11 starts during the day...ranks fourth in the American League in ERA at night, sixth in opponents OPS (.661) and tied for eighth in wins.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 19 home runs over his last 22 starts and 128.0 innings after surrendering just one home run over his first eight starts and 43.0 innings...has yielded 20 home runs overall and his average of 1.05 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest in the American League...14 of the 20 home runs are solo shots.

STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out five batters or fewer in each of his 30 starts and has just 87 strikeouts in 171.0 innings...his average of 4.58 strikeouts per nine innings is the lowest mark in the majors (Nova, CWS 5.44) and second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 19 years (Cahill, 4.53 in 2009)... his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.81 is third lowest in the majors...now has a streak of 35 consecutive starts with five strikeouts or fewer dating back to Aug. 27, 2018, which is the sixth longest such streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history and the longest since Bob Welch had a 45-game streak from Sept. 30, 1991-Aug. 24, 1993.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on 10 days rest today...is 9-6 with a 3.32 ERA (45 er in 122.0 ip) in 21 starts on five days rest or more compared to 3-3 with a 5.69 ERA (31 er in 49.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest...over the last two years, he is 13-9 with a 3.57 ERA (72 er in 181.2 ip) in 33 starts on five days rest or more compared to 3-5 with a 5.68 ERA (44 er in 69.2 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received three runs of support or fewer in 16 of his last 22 starts...however, has starts with 16, 13 and 11 runs of support and his season run support average of 6.21 (118 rs in 171.0 ip) is sixth highest in the American League...is 12-3 in 21 starts with run support of two runs or more.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was one of three inactive pitchers for the opening series in Japan...made his first start March 30 against Los Angeles (AL) and tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to extend his home scoreless streak to an Oakland record 34.1 innings...it is also the longest Athletics home scoreless streak since at least 1908...the streak ended in the first inning of his next start April 4 against Boston, marking the first time he allowed a run in the Coliseum since May 7, 2018...was 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA over his first three starts through April 9...then went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his next six starts through May 14...left with a 7-3 lead on April 14 at Texas but Soria blew the save in the eighth inning...it was his first of three starts in which the bullpen blew the save (June 12 at Tampa Bay, August 25 vs. San Francisco)...was charged with his first loss of the season April 21 against Toronto, snapping a career-high tying four-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 19, 2018 (fourth time)... went 4-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .243 opponents average during the streak, which spanned seven starts...finished April 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA and .307 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 3-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in five starts in May...picked up his 50th career win in the A's 14-1 victory at Pittsburgh May 3...left his start on May 20 at Cleveland after 5.1 innings with a cervical strain but did not miss a start...picked up the win in that start to begin a six-start stretch through June 18 where he went 3-1 with a 2.70 ERA...tossed a season-high 110 pitches in a 7-1 win over Seattle on May 26...the pitches were his most since June 26, 2015 at Miami (113)...tossed a season-high 7.2 innings and allowed two hits when he combined with Liam Hendriks on a three-hit shutout in a 4-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) on June 29...was 9-5 with a 3.86 ERA in 18 starts at the All-Star Break...had never won more than five games before the break entering this season

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win over Kansas City on Sept. 17 in Oakland...shut out the Royals on three hits over the first four innings... then allowed a leadoff double to McBroom in the fifth, who went to third on a Cuthbert single and scored on a Dini sacrifice fly...that was the only run he would allow in five innings but he left trailing 1-0...the A's scored twice in the seventh for the win.

ANDERSON vs. SEATTLE: Is 10-5 with a 2.36 ERA (129.2 ip, 120 h, 40 r, 34 er, 28 bb. 98 so, 14 hr) in 22 career appearances, including 21 starts...the wins are his most against any team...the ERA is fourth lowest ever against the Mariners by any Major League pitcher with at least 100 innings...is 4-3 with a 2.42 ERA (18 er in 67.0 ip) in 12 games at T-Mobile Park and 7-2 with a 2.30 ERA (16 er in 62.2 ip) in 10 starts in his home ballparks...is 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA (18.2 ip, 16 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 5 hr) in three starts this year...this loss came in a 4-3 decision at Seattle on May 14...surrendered a career-high tving three home runs...allowed solo home runs to Vogelbach and Beckham in the second but the A's tied the game with a two-run fifth...he then allowed a two-run home run to Haniger in the bottom of the fifth for the loss...then

picked up the win in a 7-1 A's victory in Oakland on May 26...blanked the Mariners on three hits, four walks and a hit by pitch over the first six innings and was aided by three double plays...allowed his only run on a one-out solo home run by Bruce in the seventh inning...alson won in a 5-2 A's victory at Seattle on July 5...allowed a Crawford sacrifice fly in the first inning but Oakland tied the game with a run in the third...surrendered a leadoff home run to Murphy in the fifth but the A's scored twice in the seventh for the win.
