OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-6) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (2-6)

SUNDAY, MARCH 1, 2020 – LAS VEGAS BALLPARK – 1:05 P.M. PST

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a split squad from Cleveland yesterday, winning 8-7 at Hohokam and 8-6 at Las Vegas...have now won four of the last five games after starting the spring 0-5...the A's lead the majors in walks (43)...lead the Cactus League in hits (94), rank second in batting (.277), on-base percentage (.361) and runs (56) and tied for second in doubles (19)...the pitching staff has the highest opponents batting average in the majors (.338) and the second highest ERA (7.01)...this is the A's 52nd Spring Training in Arizona, their sixth since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36-year absence...after training in Bradenton, Florida in 1968, the A's came west to Arizona in 1969 and trained in Mesa from 1969-78...moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and then spent 33 seasons at Phoenix Municipal Stadium from 1982-2014...are scheduled to play 34 games this spring, which includes 30 games in Arizona, two in Las Vegas against the Indians (Feb. 29-Mar. 1) and two in the Bay Area against the Giants (Mar. 23-24)...went 14-8 (.636) last spring, which was the best record in the majors...it marked the first time Oakland finished Spring Training with a winning record since going 22-11-2 in 2015...the .636 winning percentage was the seventh best mark in Oakland history and the best since 2015...the 22 games played were the A's fewest during the spring since 1980 when they had 20...had a .248 batting average and .320 on-base percentage, both of which were the lowest marks by an A's team during the spring since ond lowest batting average among Cactus League teams and the fourth lowest on-base percentage.

A's vs. INDIANS: This is the third of four meetings between the A's and Indians this spring...won both games yesterday, 8-7 at Hohokam and 8-6 at Las Vegas...meet again on Friday at Goodyear...the A's won the only meeting last spring on March 2 at Hohokam, 1-0...have lost four straight games at Goodyear and have not defeated the Indians there since March 19, 2014.

A's IN VEGA5: Today, the A's will conclude a two-game series against the Indians at the home ballpark of the A's Triple-A affiliate, Las Vegas Ballpark...this marks the first time the A's have played in Las Vegas since 2015 when they lost two games to the Cubs on March 13 (5-3) and 14 (3-1)...have also played in Las Vegas during the spring in 1994, 1997 and 2000 and opened the regular season with six games at Cashman Field in 1996 while the Coliseum was undergoing renovations for the return of the Raiders.

IN CAMP: The A's have 64 players on the active roster, which includes 40 players on the 40-man roster and 24 non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 32 pitchers, six catchers, 14 infielders and 12 outfielders...Oakland also has one player on the 60-day IL (Mengden).

COACHING STAFF: Bob Melvin returns for his 10th season as manager of the Oakland A's in 2020, a tenure that has included five postseason appearances and two American League Manager of the Year awards...no other active manager has a longer uninterrupted tenure with their current team... returning to Melvin's coaching staff are bench coach Ryan Christenson, hitting coach Darren Bush, pitching coach Scott Emerson, bullpen coach Marcus Jensen and quality control coach Mark Kotsay...also returning in new roles are Al Pedrique (third base coach) and Mike Aldrete (first base coach)...new to the A's staff is Eric Martins, who will be the assistant hitting coach.

HOW THE A'S WERE BUILT: Of the 40 active players on the 40-man roster, 10 were drafted by the A's (Bolt, 4th round in 2015; Brown, 19th in 2015; Chapman, 1st in 2014; Gossett, 2nd in 2014; Jefferies, competitive balance round A in 2016; Murphy, 3rd in 2016; Olson, compensation following 1st round in 2012; Pinder, competitive balance round B in 2013; Puk, 1st in 2016; Trivino, 11th in 2013)...one was signed as a non-drafted agent (Barrera), three were signed as free agents (Grossman, Petit, Soria) and one was claimed off waivers (McFarland)...the other 25 were all acquired in trades.

OFF SEASON MOVES: The A's acquired three players via trade during the offseason, including Austin Allen (Dec. 2 from San Diego for Jurickson Profar), Vimael Machín (Dec. 12 from Philadelphia/Rule 5 draft) and Tony Kemp (Jan. 13 from Cubs for minor leaguer Alfonso Rivas)...Oakland also claimed T.J. Mc-Farland off waivers from Arizona Nov. 4...Jake Diekman was re-signed as a free agent Dec. 3 after his contract option was declined following the season and Yusmeiro Petit had his contract option exercised for 2020...following the start of camp, the A's acquired Burch Smith from San Francisco on Feb. 15.

NON-ROSTER INVITEES: The Athletics have 24 non-roster invitees in Major League camp...the players include IF Nick Allen, RHP Tanner Anderson, RHP Ben Bracewell, IF Eric Campbell, RHP Wandisson Charles, IF Logan Davidson, OF Greg Deichmann, RHP Parker Dunshee, C Ronnie Freeman, RHP Ian Gardeck, IF Ryan Goins, LHP Donnie Hart, RHP Brian Howard, RHP Zach Lee, LHP Lucas Luetge, IF Nate Orf, C Carlos Pérez, OF Buddy Reed, RHP Miguel Romero, RHP Brian Schlitter, RHP Jaime Schultz, C Collin Theroux, OF Dillon Thomas and RHP Jordan Weems...nine of the 24 non-roster players have Major League experience (Anderson, Campbell, Goins, Lee, Luetge, Orf, Pérez, Schlitter, Schulz).

MINOR LEAGUE DATES: Minor League mini camp is underway...pitchers and catchers report on Saturday with the first workout scheduled for a week from today...position players report March 13 with the first workout scheduled for March 14...games begin on March 19 and run through April 3.

A's SPRING BROADCASTS: All A's Spring Training games will stream live on Tunein, with the exception of split squads today against Kansas City, Mar. 6 vs. Cleveland and Mar. 14 vs. Milwaukee...Ken Korach, Vince Cotroneo and Ray Fosse will call the action for all weekend games except Mar. 21, plus night games on Mar. 13 and 19...the father and son duo of Vince and Dom Cotroneo will team up on Mar. 2...Donny Baarns, Dom Cotroneo and Alex Jensen will call the remaining games...four games are scheduled to air on KHTK and the A's Radio Network (Mar. 8, 13, 15 and 23, schedule subject to change)...12 of the remaining games will be broadcast on television, including two by NBCSCA: tomorrow night vs. the Cubs in Mesa and Mar. 24 against the Giants in San Francisco...Glen Kuiper will provide play-by-play with Ray Fosse and Dallas Braden serving as analysts...three games (Mar. 9, 11 and 17) will air live on MLB Network while five others will be tape delayed (Mar. 5, 7, 12, 14 and 18)...the Giants will broadcast the games of Mar. 19 and 23 on NBCSBA.

ATHLETICS BATTING NOTES

#30 AUSTIN ALLEN: Has hit safely in each of his last five games (5-for-12, .417) after going 1-for-6 (.167) over his first three contests...hit his first home run last Tuesday against the Padres...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 2 with a PTBNL (Buddy Reed) for Jurickson Profar, Dec. 2, 2019...made his Major League debut with San Diego last year and hit .215 with four doubles and three RBI in 34 games over four stints.

#79 LUIS BARRERA: Was limited to just 54 games at Double-A Midland last year due to shoulder surgery, but hit .321 in 54 games...added a career-high tying 11 triples...had surgery on July 12 to repair the labrum in his right, nonthrowing, shoulder.

#1 FRANKLIN BARRETO: Has played in six games on defense, all at second base...had three stints with the A's last year and batted .123 with two home runs and five RBI in 23 games...the batting average was the lowest of his three seasons...also hit .295 with a career-high 19 home runs and a careerhigh 65 RBI in 98 games with Triple-A Las Vegas.

#49 SKYE BOLT: Made his Triple-A and Major League debut in 2019...went 1-for-10 (.100) with a double, walk and three strikeouts in five games over three stints with Oakland...batted a career-high .269 with 11 home runs and 61 RBI in 89 games with Las Vegas.

#15 SETH BROWN: Collected his fourth double yesterday, which is second most in the Cactus League...is tied for the lead with five extra base hits...has appeared in four games at first base and two in left field...made his Triple-A and Major League debut in 2019...batted .297 with 37 home runs and 104 RBI in 112 games with Las Vegas and .293 with no home runs and 13 RBI in 26 games with the A's.

#19 ERIC CAMPBELL (NR): Spent the entire 2019 season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he batted .276 with 16 home runs and 65 RBI in 94 games...added 54 walks for a .382 on-base percentage...the 16 home runs were his most as a minor leaguer and his 64 runs scored matched his best from 2010.

#20 MARK CANHA: Went 0-for-3 yesterday after reaching base safely via hit or walk in each of his first four games...has appeared in two games in right field, two in center field and one at designated hitter...started games at five different positions last year and batted a career-high .273 with a career-high $26\ home\ runs\ and\ 58\ RBI\ in\ 126\ games.$

#26 MATT CHAPMAN: Hit his first home run Wednesday against the Diamondbacks...had career highs in runs (102), home runs (36), RBI (91), walks (73) and extra base hits (75) in 2019...won his second consecutive Rawlings Gold Glove, his second straight Wilson Defensive Player of the Year and his second straight AL Platinum Glove.

#2 KHRIS DAVIS: Was off to a strong start last year as he batted .247 with 12 home runs and 29 RBI over his first 43 games before going on the injured list retroactive to May 22 with a left hip/oblique contusion...was reinstated June 1 and hit .207 with 11 home runs and 44 RBI over his final 90 games.

#11 DUSTIN FOWLER: Spent the entire 2019 season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he batted .277 with a career-high 25 home runs and a career-high 89 RBI in 130 games...also had career bests in runs (98), hits (154), walks (42) and hit by pitches (6)...tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in hits.

#23 RYAN GOINS (NR): Began the 2019 season at Triple-A Charlotte and was batting .322 with 10 home runs and 48 RBI in 83 games when he was selected by Chicago (AL) July 17 ... spent the remainder of the season with the White Sox and hit .250 with two home runs and 10 RBI in 52 games.

#8 ROBBIE GROSSMAN: Hit his first home run and collected his first three RBI yesterday against Cleveland at Hohokam...played in a career-high 138 games in his first season as an Athletic last year and batted .240 with six home runs and 38 RBI...added 59 walks for a .334 on-base percentage.

#37 JONAH HEIM: Had two hits and three RBI Wednesday against Arizona... began 2019 at Double-A Midland but was promoted to Las Vegas in June where he made his Triple-A debut...combined with both clubs to hit a careerhigh .310 with a career-high tying nine home runs and 53 RBI in 85 games.

#5 TONY KEMP: Had three hits yesterday against Cleveland in Las Vegas and has now reached base safely via hit or walk in each of his five games...was acquired from the Chicago Cubs for Alfonso Rivas, Jan. 13, 2020...began the 2019 season with Houston and was hitting .227 with seven home runs and 17 RBI in 66 games when he was traded to Chicago July 31...batted .183 with a home run and 12 RBI in 44 games with the Cubs.

#22 RAMÓN LAUREANO: Batted .288 with 24 home runs and 67 RBI in 123 games in a season interrupted by a five-week stay on the injured list with a right lower leg stress reaction...added 29 doubles for a .521 slugging percentage...tied for third among American League outfielders with 10 assists.

#39 VIMAEL MACHÍN: Has appeared in three games at second base, two at third base, one at first base at one at designated hitter...was acquired from Philadelphia for cash, Dec. 12, 2019 after the Phillies selected him from the Cubs in the Rule 5 draft...combined for a .295 average with 69 walks (.390 onbase percentage) in 129 games with Double-A Tennessee and Triple-A lowa.

#13 JORGE MATEO: Has reached base safely in five of his six games...has appeared in three games at shortstop, two at second base and one at desig-nated hitter...spent the entire 2019 season at Triple-A for the season consecutive year and batted .289 with 29 doubles, 14 triples, 19 home runs and 78 RBI in 119 games with Las Vegas.

#21 SHELDON NEUSE: Had two hits yesterday against Cleveland at Hohokam after tallying two hits over his first six games...began the 2019 season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was batting .317 with 27 home runs and 102 RBI in 126 games when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 29...hit .250 with no home runs and seven RBI in 25 games with the A's in his Major League debut. #28 MATT OLSON: Missed 34 games last year while on the injured list early in the season but still hit 36 home runs and drove in 91 runs while batting .267 in 127 games...also won his second consecutive Rawlings Gold Glove for American League first basemen...tied for seventh in the AL in home runs.

#63 CARLOS PEREZ (NR): Spent most of the 2019 season at Double-A Bowie in the Baltimore organization where he hit .251 with 14 home runs and 60 RBI in 94 games...also went 3-for-24 (.125) in eight games with Triple-A Norfolk and batted a combined .243 in 102 games overall.

#18 CHAD PINDER: Is 6-for-9 (.667) with two walks over his last four games after going 0-for-2 in his first contest...has appeared in three games in right field, one at third base and one at designated hitter...batted .240 with 13 home runs and a career-high 47 RBI in 124 games last year...started at least one game at seven different positions for the second consecutive season

#10 MARCUS SEMIEN: Finished in the top five in Oakland history in eight different categories in 2019...scored 123 runs, which tied the Oakland record set by Reggie Jackson in 1969...also tied the record for games played (162)... ranked third in extra base hits (83), tied for third in hits (187) and total bases (343) and tied for fourth in doubles (43) while hitting .285 with 33 homers.

#81 COLLIN THEROUX (NR): Spent most of the 2019 season at Double-A Midland where he hit .180 with 12 home runs and 36 RBI in 93 games...also went 3-for-18 (.167) during a five-game stay with Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a .179 batting average in 98 games...drew 49 walks for a .291 on-base pct.

#71 DILLON THOMAS (NR): Spent the entire 2019 season at Double-A Biloxi and hit .265 with 13 home runs and 71 RBI in 131 games...had career highs in runs (62), hits (119), home runs, RBI, walks (41), stolen bases (22), games and at bats (449) and matched his high in hit by pitches (11).

#44 LHP JESÚS LUZARDO: Tossed 2.0 scoreless innings in his first start last Tuesday at San Diego...had his 2019 season interrupted twice by a strained left shoulder but eventually made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents batting average in six relief appearances with the A's.

NON-ROSTER PITCHERS: #64 RHP Ben Bracewell allowed four runs in 0.1 innings in his last outing Tuesday at San Diego after retiring all four batters that he faced in his first appearance...was a combined 1-3 with two saves and a 2.96 ERA in a career-high tying 43 games with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas last year ... #74 RHP Parker Dunshee has allowed at least one run in each of his first two appearances... combined for a 6-7 record and a 4.36 ERA in 26 appearances, including 25 starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas last year....**#92 RHP Ian Gardeck** tossed a scoreless eighth inning in his last appearance Wednesday against Arizona after allowing one run in his first outing...combined for a 2-1 record, three saves and a .122 opponents batting average in 21 relief appearances in the Tampa Bay system last year after missing three months with an inflamed right elbow...#77 RHP Zach Lee tossed a scoreless eighth and ninth inning last Thursday against Colorado for the win after yielding three runs in 1.1 innings in his first outing...pitched for Triple-A Syracuse and Double-A Binghamton last year and combined for a 9-4 record, a 5.09 ERA and .296 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts...#60 LHP Lucas Luetge has not allowed a run in his first two appearances (2.0 ip)...was signed by Arizona to a minor league contract in 2019 after not pitching professionally in 2018...combined to go 9-3 with a 2.38 ERA and .231 opponents average in 55 games with Double-A Jackson and Triple-A Reno...#54 RHP Brian Schlitter has not allowed a run in his first two appearances...spent most of the 2019 season at Triple-A Las Ve-gas where he went 4-1 with 11 saves and a 4.64 ERA in 35 games...also had no decisions and a 3.72 ERA in six relief appearances with Oakland...#68 RHP Jamie Schultz allowed a run in the sixth inning of his last outing Wednesday against Arizona after retiring the side in order in the fifth inning in his first contest...had two stints with the Dodgers last year and compiled a 7.20 ERA in four relief appearances...#82 RHP Burch Smith made his A's spring debut Thursday against Colorado and retired the side in order in the sixth inning... was acquired from the San Francisco Giants Feb. 15 for cash considerations.. combined for a 0-1 record and a 5.48 ERA in 17 relief appearances with Milwaukee and San Francisco last year.
