OAKLAND ATHLETICS (9-6) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (5-9)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won seven straight and nine of the last 10 games after starting the spring 0-5...the seven-game winning streak is the A's longest during the spring since an eight-game streak from March 26-April 2, 2015...are 9-6 (.600) overall, which is the fourth best record in the Cactus League...the A's lead the majors in hits (140), doubles (29) and walks (71) and are tied for the lead in runs scored (90)...rank second in the CL in on-base percentage (.367), third in batting (.276) and tied for third in triples (4)...the pitching staff has the highest opponents batting average in the majors (.311) and the fourth highest ERA (5.91)...this is the A's 52nd Spring Training in Arizona, their sixth since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36-year absence...after training in Bradenton, Florida in 1968, the A's came west to Arizona in 1969 and trained in Mesa from 1969-78...moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and then spent 33 seasons at Phoenix Municipal Stadium from 1982-2014...are scheduled to play 34 games this spring, which includes 30 games in Arizona, two in Las Vegas against the Indians (Feb. 29-Mar. 1) and two in the Bay Area against the Giants (Mar. 23-24)...went 14-8 (.636) last spring, which was the best record in the majors...it marked the first time Oakland finished Spring Training with a winning record since going 22-11-2 in 2015...the .636 winning percentage was the seventh best mark in Oakland history and the best since 2015...the 22 games played were the A's fewest during the spring since 1980 when they had 20...had a .248 batting average and .320 on-base percentage, both of which were the lowest marks by an A's team during the spring since 1991 (the earliest year spring stats are available)...the previous lows were a .256 average in 2011 and a .325 on-base percentage last year...had the second lowest batting average among Cactus League teams and the fourth lowest on-base percentage.

A's vs. INDIANS: This is the fourth and final meeting between the A's and Indians this spring...Oakland has won each of the first three games, sweeping two games at Las Vegas last weekend, 8-6 and 8-5, and winning at Hohokam last Saturday, 8-7...are 4-0 against the Reds over the last two springs...however, have lost four straight games at Goodyear and have not defeated the Indians there since March 19, 2014.

IN CAMP: The A's have 58 players on the active roster...that breaks down to 37 players on the 40-man roster, which is full, and 21 non-roster invitees...have 26 pitchers, six catchers, 14 infielders and 12 outfielders...Oakland also has one player on the 60-day IL (Mengden).

COACHING STAFF: Bob Melvin returns for his 10th season as manager of the Oakland A's in 2020, a tenure that has included five postseason appearances and two American League Manager of the Year awards...no other active manager has a longer uninterrupted tenure with their current team...returning to Melvin's coaching staff are bench coach Ryan Christenson, hitting coach Darren Bush, pitching coach Scott Emerson, bullpen coach Marcus Jensen and quality control coach Mark Kotsay...also returning in new roles are Al Pedrique (third base coach) and Mike Aldrete (first base coach)...new to the A's staff is Eric Martins, who will be the assistant hitting coach.

OFF SEASON MOVES: The A's acquired three players via trade during the off-season, including Austin Allen (Dec. 2 from San Diego for Jurickson Profar), Vimal Machin (Dec. 12 from Philadelphia/Rule 5 draft) and Tony Kemp (Jan. 13 from Cubs for minor leaguer Alfonso Rivas)...Oakland also claimed T.J. McFarland off waivers from Arizona Nov. 4...Jake Diekman was re-signed as a free agent Dec. 3 after his contract option was declined following the season and Yusmeiro Petit had his contract option exercised for 2020...following the start of camp, the A's acquired Burch Smith from San Francisco on Feb. 15.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2020 season...Khris Davis and Jake Diekman are signed through 2021, with Diekman having a club option for 2022...Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

NON-ROSTER INVITEES: Following yesterday's roster moves, the A's now have 21 non-roster invitees in Major League camp...the players include IF Nick Allen, RHP Ben Bracewell, IF Eric Campbell, IF Logan Davidson, OF Greg Deichmann, RHP Parker Dunshee, C Ronnie Freeman, RHP Ian Gardeck, IF Ryan Goins, LHP Donnie Hart, RHP Brian Howard, RHP Zach Lee, LHP Lucas Luetge, IF Nate Orf, C Carlos Pérez, OF Buddy Reed, RHP Brian Schlitter, RHP Jaime Schultz, C Collin Theroux, OF Dillon Thomas and RHP Jordan Weems...eight of those 21 have Major League experience (Campbell, Goins, Lee, Luetge, Orf, Pérez, Schlitter, Schulz).

A's TOP PROSPECTS: Eight of the A's top 10 prospects according to *Baseball America* are in major league camp this spring: Jesus Luzardo (#1), A.J. Puk (#2), Sean Murphy (#3), Daulton Jefferies (#4), Sheldon Neuse (#7), Jorge Mateo (#8), Logan Davidson (#9) and Nick Allen (#10)...the others are Austin Beck (#5) and Robert Puason (#6).

MINOR LEAGUE DATES: Minor League mini camp is underway...pitchers and catchers report tomorrow with the first workout scheduled for Sunday...position players report Friday, March 13 with the first workout scheduled for Saturday, March 14...games begin on March 19 and run through April 3.

A's SPRING BROADCASTS: All A's Spring Training games will stream live on Tunein, with the exception of split squads today at Cleveland and Mar. 14 vs. Milwaukee...Ken Korach, Vince Cotroneo and Ray Fosse will call the action for all weekend games except Mar. 21, plus night games on Mar. 13 and 19...Donny Baarns, Dom Cotroneo and Alex Jensen will call the remaining games...four games are scheduled to air on KHTK and the A's Radio Network (Mar. 8, 13, 15 and 23, schedule subject to change)...10 of the remaining games will be broadcast on television, including one by NBCSCA on Mar. 24 against the Giants in San Francisco...Glen Kuiper will provide play-by-play with Ray Fosse and Dallas Braden serving as analysts...three games (Mar. 9, 11 and 17) will air live on MLB Network while four others will be tape delayed (Mar. 7, 12, 14 and 18)...the Giants will broadcast the games of Mar. 19 and 23 on NBCSBA...two games will be streamed by NBCSCA: today and Mar. 14 vs. Seattle with A's Cast providing audio.

ATHLETICS BATTING NOTES

#30 AUSTIN ALLEN: Is 0-for-3 with a walk over his last two games after hitting safely in each of his previous six contests (6-for-14, .429)...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 2 with a PTBNL (Buddy Reed) for Jurickson Profar, Dec. 2, 2019...made his Major League debut with San Diego last year and hit .215 with four doubles and three RBI in 34 games over four stints.

#79 LUIS BARRERA: Is 2-for-12 (.167) over his last seven games after going 5-for-12 (.417) over his first four contests...was limited to just 54 games at Double-A Midland last year due to shoulder surgery, but hit .321 in 54 games...added a career-high tying 11 triples...had surgery on July 12 to repair the labrum in his right, non-throwing, shoulder.

#1 FRANKLIN BARRETO: Is 4-for-12 (.333) with three walks over his last five games after going 3-for-13 (.231) with no walks over his first five contests...has appeared in eight games at second base and one in center field...had three stints with the A's last year and batted .123 with two home runs and five RBI in 23 games...also hit .295 with a career-high 19 home runs and a career-high 65 RBI in 98 games with Triple-A Las Vegas.

#49 SKYE BOLT: Is 2-for-6 (.333) over his last three games after going 1-for-10 (.100) over his first six contests...made his Triple-A and Major League debut in 2019...went 1-for-10 (.100) with a double, walk and three strikeouts in five games over three stints with Oakland...batted a career-high .269 with 11 home runs and 61 RBI in 89 games with Las Vegas.

#15 SETH BROWN: Seven of his 10 hits are for extra bases, including a grand slam last Sunday at Kansas City...is tied for the Cactus League lead in hits (10), doubles (5) and extra base hits (7), ranks second in total bases (20) and tied for fourth in RBI (8)...has appeared in eight games at first base and two in left field...batted .297 with 37 home runs and 104 RBI in 112 games with Triple-A Las Vegas last year and .293 with no home runs and 13 RBI in 26 games with the A's.

#20 MARK CANHA: Is tied for third in the Cactus League in walks (6)...has appeared in four games in right field, three in center field and one at designated hitter...started games at five different positions last year and batted a career-high .273 with a career-high 26 home runs and 58 RBI in 126 games.

#26 MATT CHAPMAN: Hit his second home run yesterday against Los Angeles (NL) and has six RBI over his last five games...had career highs in runs (102), home runs (36), RBI (91), walks (73) and extra base hits (75) in 2019...won his second consecutive Rawlings Gold Glove and his second straight AL Platinum Glove.

#2 KHRIS DAVIS: Is 2-for-4 (.500) over his last two games after going 1-for-6 (.167) over his first three contests...was off to a strong start last year as he batted .247 with 12 home runs and 29 RBI over his first 43 games before going on the injured list retroactive to May 22 with a left hip/oblique contusion...was reinstated June 1 and hit .207 with 11 home runs and 44 RBI over his final 90 games.

#11 DUSTIN FOWLER: Doubled in the third inning Sunday against Cleveland at Las Vegas for his only hit...started the spring 0-for-15...spent the entire 2019 season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he batted .277 with a career-high 25 home runs and a career-high 89 RBI in 130 games...also had career bests in runs (98), hits (154), walks (42) and hit by pitches (6).

#8 ROBBIE GROSSMAN: Is 4-for-9 (.444) with a home run and four RBI over his last four games after going 1-for-7 (.143) over his first four contests...played in a career-high 138 games in his first season as an Athletic last year and batted .240 with six home runs and 38 RBI...added 59 walks for a .334 on-base percentage.

#37 JONAH HEIM: Had three hits Tuesday at Chicago (AL) and is 5-for-8 (.625) with two doubles and four RBI over his last four games...began 2019 at Double-A Midland but was promoted to Las Vegas in June where he made his Triple-A debut...combined with both clubs to hit a career-high .310 with a career-high tying nine home runs and 53 RBI in 85 games.

#5 TONY KEMP: Went 0-for-4 Tuesday at Chicago (AL) after reaching base safely via hit or walk in each of his first six games...has played four games at second base, two in left field and one at designated hitter...was acquired from the Chicago Cubs for Alfonso Rivas, Jan. 13, 2020...batted a combined .212 with home runs and 29 RBI in 110 games with Houston and the Cubs last year.

#22 RAMÓN LAUREANO: Went 2-for-3 yesterday against the Dodgers after going 2-for-14 (.143) over his first six games...batted .288 with 24 home runs and 67 RBI in 123 games last year in a season interrupted by a five-week stay on the injured list with a right lower leg stress reaction...tied for third among American League outfielders with 10 assists.

#39 VIMAEI MACHÍN: Is 6-for-15 (.400) over his last six games after going 1-for-7 over his first three...has appeared in five games at second base, three at third base, one at first base and one at designated hitter...was acquired from Philadelphia for cash, Dec. 12, 2019 after the Phillies selected him from the Cubs in the Rule 5 draft...combined for a .295 average with 69 walks (.390 on-base percentage) in 129 games with Double-A Tennessee and Triple-A Iowa.

#13 JORGE MATEO: Had three hits Tuesday at Chicago (AL) after going 0-for-5 over his previous three games...has appeared in five games at shortstop, two at second base and one at designated hitter...spent the entire 2019 season at Triple-A for the season consecutive year and batted .289 with 29 doubles, 14 triples, 19 home runs and 78 RBI in 119 games with Las Vegas.

#12 SEAN MURPHY: Walked in each of his two plate appearances Monday night against the Cubs in his spring debut...played in just 41 minor league games last year due to two stints on the injured list with a strained left knee...was selected by Oakland on Sept. 1 when rosters expanded and hit .245 with four home runs and eight RBI in 20 games.

#21 SHELDON NEUSE: Is 4-for-11 (.364) over his last five games after going 2-for-12 (.167) over his first six contests...has appeared in nine games at third base and three at second base...batted .317 with 27 home runs and 102 RBI in 126 games with Triple-A Las Vegas last year...also hit .250 with no home runs and seven RBI in 25 games with the A's in his Major League debut.

#28 MATT OLSON: Has two hits this spring, both doubles...missed 34 games last year while on the injured list early in the season but still hit 36 home runs and drove in 91 runs while batting .267 in 127 games...also won his second consecutive Rawlings Gold Glove for American League first basemen.

#18 CHAD PINDER: Is 1-for-8 (.125) over his last three games after going 6-for-9 (.667) with two walks over his previous four contests...has appeared in four games in right field, two at third base and two at designated hitter...batted .240 with 13 home runs and 47 RBI in 124 games last year...started at least one game at seven different positions for the second consecutive season.

#10 MARCUS SEMIEN: Is 1-for-6 (.167) over his last three games after going 4-for-9 (.444) over his first five contests...finished in the top five in Oakland history in eight different categories in 2019...scored 123 runs, which tied the Oakland record set by Reggie Jackson in 1969...also tied the record for games played (162).

#58 RHP PAUL BLACKBURN: Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his last outing, a start on Saturday against Cleveland at Hohokam, after allowing four runs on seven hits in 1.2 innings of relief in his first outing...was 0-2 with a 10.64 ERA in four games over three stints with Oakland last year...spent the balance of the season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he went 11-3 with a 4.34 ERA in 24 games, including 22 starts.

NON-ROSTER INVITEES: #74 RHP PARKER DUNSHEE: Has allowed at least one run in each of his first three appearances...spent the first five weeks of the 2019 season at Double-A Midland and was promoted to Triple-A Las Vegas May 12... combined for a 6-7 record and a 4.36 ERA in 26 appearances, including 25 starts, overall... **#80 LHP DONNIE HART:** Has allowed at least one run in each of his three appearances...spent most of 2019 in the Milwaukee organization before he was claimed off waivers by New York (NL) Aug 1... did not allow a run in seven games and 5.0 innings with the Brewers and the Mets...was 4-3 with a 4.43 ERA in 48 games with the two clubs Triple-A affiliates... **#76 RHP BRIAN HOWARD:** Has not allowed an earned run in his first two appearances (4.1 ip)...spent most of 2019 with Double-A Midland, where he was 8-8 with a 3.25 ERA in 23 games, all starts...also made four starts during a three-week stay with Triple-A Las Vegas and combined to go 8-9 with a 4.30 ERA in a career-high 27 starts overall... **#77 RHP ZACH LEE:** Has not allowed a run in his last two outings (4.0 ip) after yielding three runs in 1.1 innings in his first appearance...pitched for Triple-A Syracuse and Double-A Binghamton last year and combined for a 9-4 record, a 5.09 ERA and .296 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in a season shortened by four stints on the injured list... **#70 RHP JORDAN WEEMS:** Has not allowed a run in his first four appearances (4.0 ip)...spent most of the 2019 season at Double-A Portland in the Red Sox organization...also pitched in eight games with Triple-A Pawtucket and combined to go 0-3 with eight saves and a 4.37 ERA in 41 games, including one start, overall.
