## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-9) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (10-9-2)

TUESDAY, JULY 21, 2020 – ORACLE PARK – 6:45 P.M. PDT  
A'S CAST ON TUNEIN – NBCSBA

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's lost to San Francisco last night in Oakland 6-2...had won 13 of their final 16 games in Arizona after starting the spring 0-5...are now 13-9 (.591), which is the fourth best record among Cactus League teams...went 14-8 (.636) during the spring in 2019, which was the best record in the majors...played just 21 of the originally scheduled 34 games as March 11 was rained out and the final 12 games beginning March 12 were cancelled due to the Coronavirus...the 21 games played would have been the A's fewest during the spring since they played 16 games in 1990, but with two July games scheduled against the Giants, the A's will play 23 games, which is one more than last year...the A's lead the majors this spring in on-base percentage (.356), rank second in walks (97), third in doubles (45), tied for third in runs (130), fourth in hits (199) and fifth in batting (.269)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the majors (.286) but has surrendered the fourth fewest home runs in the CL (21) and has the fourth most strikeouts (191)...the defense is tied for second in the CL in double plays (20) and ranks fifth in fielding percentage (.981).

**A's vs. GIANTS:** This is the third and final meeting between the A's and Giants during the spring...the A's have lost the first two games, dropping a 5-3 decision in Mesa on Feb. 23 and a 6-2 loss in Oakland last night...the A's went 5-0 against the Giants last spring...it was the first time Oakland was undefeated against San Francisco during the spring since 2007 (5-0-1) and the first time they were unbeaten and untied since 1998 (5-0)...it was the first time the A's swept a three-game Bay Bridge series since 1989...have a seven-game winning streak at Scottsdale and have not lost there since March 21, 2014...Oakland is now 26-14 over its last 40 spring games against San Francisco.

**CAMP COLISEUM:** The A's have 41 players in Oakland for July training camp...that breaks down to 36 players on the 40-man roster and five players under minor league contract (Campbell, Luetge, Orf, Pérez, Schultz)...of the 36 players from the 40-man, four have already been optioned (Blackburn, Bolt, Gossett, Neuse) and one is on the 60-day IL (Mengden).

**COACHING STAFF:** Bob Melvin returns for his 10th season as manager of the Oakland A's in 2020, a tenure that has included five postseason appearances and two American League Manager of the Year awards...no other active manager has a longer uninterrupted tenure with their current team...returning to Melvin's coaching staff are bench coach Ryan Christenson, hitting coach Darren Bush, pitching coach Scott Emerson, bullpen coach Marcus Jensen and quality control coach Mark Kotsay...also returning in new roles are Al Pedrique (third base coach) and Mike Aldrete (first base coach)...new to the A's staff is Eric Martins, who will be the assistant hitting coach.

**ALTERNATE TRAINING CAMP:** The A's 60-man Player Pool for the 2020 season also includes 18 players that are working out at the A's alternate training camp: Excite Ballpark in San Jose...the list includes five players from the 40-man roster (Luis Barrera, Dustin Fowler, Grant Holmes, Daulton Jefferies, James Kaprielian)...once the regular season starts, players not on the active roster or taxi squad will workout in San Jose.

**2020 MEDIA GUIDELINES:** Please refer to the A's 2020 Media Guidelines at <https://pressbox.athletics.com> for a complete list of media guidelines...the following are some brief highlights from that document...media will be required to stay in their designated seating area and will not be allowed to roam the ballpark...still photographers will shoot the game from designated sections of the seating area...all media must apply for daily credentials at [credentials.mlb.com](https://credentials.mlb.com)...season passes, including BBWAA cards, will not be accepted...parking will be available in A lot free of charge...previously issued A's 2020 parking hang tags will not be accepted...credential pick up and ballpark entry and exit will be through the gated entrance located next to A's Will Call on Championship Plaza...ballpark entry will require a temperature check...media must also wear face coverings at all times and practice physical distancing and good hygiene while inside the ballpark...all manager, player, coach, and personnel interviews will be conducted via RingCentral video conference powered by Zoom...printed material will not be available...information, such as lineups, game notes, statistics, releases, audio and video, will be available on the A's virtual press box at <https://pressbox.athletics.com>.

**NUMBER CHANGES:** Franklin Barreto will switch to #4.

**REGULAR SEASON ROSTER NOTES:** Opening Day rosters will be expanded to include to 30 players...that will be reduced to 28 on day 15 of the regular season (Aug. 6) and 26 from day 29 (Aug. 20) through the end of the season...a club is permitted to carry up to three extra players on road trips as part of

a taxi squad (if a club brings three players at least one must be a catcher)...the injured list will be 10 days for players and pitchers and the 60-day IL has been reduced to 45 days...the trading deadline is Aug. 31 and the postseason eligibility date is Sept. 15.

**REGULAR SEASON SCHEDULE:** The A's are scheduled to open the 2020 season on July 24 against the Los Angeles Angels in Oakland at 7:10 pm...it will be the latest Opening Day in Athletics history (previous: April 26 in 1901 and 1995)...Frankie Montas will start the opener and Sean Manaea, Mike Fiers and Chris Bassitt will also face the Angels...the A's are scheduled to play 60 games, which will be the fewest in franchise history (previous: 109 in 1981)...will open against the Angels for the third time in the last four years and will be the home team on Opening Day for the 11th consecutive season.

## ATHLETICS BATTING NOTES

**#30 AUSTIN ALLEN:** Is batting .406 with two home runs, 10 RBI and a 1.097 OPS in 15 spring games...went 6-for-9 (.667) with two doubles, a home run and six RBI over his last four games in March...is tied for fifth in the Cactus League in hits (13) and tied for nine in RBI (10)...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 2 with a PTBNL (Buddy Reed) for Jurickson Profar, Dec. 2, 2019...made his Major League debut with San Diego last year and hit .215 with three RBI in 34 games over four stints.

**#4 FRANKLIN BARRETO:** Is batting .306 in 13 games and went 8-for-23 (.348) with three doubles, two triples and three walks over his final eight games in March...is tied for second in the Cactus League in triples (2), tied for fifth in doubles (4) and tied for ninth in extra base hits (6)...has appeared in 11 games at second base and one in center field...batted .123 with two home runs and five RBI in 23 games with Oakland last year and .295 with 19 home runs and 65 RBI in 98 games with Triple-A Las Vegas.

**#15 SETH BROWN:** Struck out in his only at bat last night and is now hitting .333 with a .611 slugging percentage and .962 OPS in 16 games...is tied for the Cactus League lead in doubles (5), tied for fifth in extra base hits (7) and tied for ninth in hits (12)...defensively, has appeared in 10 games at first base, three in left field and one in right field...batted .297 with 37 home runs and 104 RBI in 112 games with Triple-A Las Vegas last year and .293 with no home runs and 13 RBI in 26 games with the A's.

**#19 ERIC CAMPBELL (Minors):** Was a non-roster invitee this spring and is batting .241 in 16 games...five of his seven hits are doubles and he is tied for the Cactus League lead in doubles...has appeared in 12 games at first base and two at third base...spent the entire 2019 season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he batted .276 with 16 home runs and 65 RBI in 94 games.

**#20 MARK CANHA:** Went 0-for-3 with a walk last night and now has seven walks, which is tied for eighth in the Cactus League...is hitting .280 but has a .424 on-base percentage in 12 games...has appeared in six games in center field, five in right field and one at designated hitter...started games at five different positions last year and batted .273 with 26 home runs and 58 RBI in 126 games.

**#26 MATT CHAPMAN:** Went 0-for-2 with two walks last night and now has eight walks, which is tied for third in the Cactus League...is batting .217 in 11 games but has a .419 on-base percentage...had career highs in runs (102), home runs (36), RBI (91), walks (73) and extra base hits (75) in 2019...won his second consecutive Rawlings Gold Glove and his second straight AL Platinum Glove.

**#2 KHRIS DAVIS:** Went 0-for-3 with a sacrifice fly last night and is now batting .150 with no extra base hits and three RBI in nine games...has made eight of his nine starts at designated hitter...was off to a strong start last year as he batted .247 with 12 home runs and 29 RBI over his first 43 games before going on the injured list May 22...was reinstated June 1 and hit .207 with 11 home runs and 44 RBI over his final 90 games.

**#8 ROBBIE GROSSMAN:** Went 1-for-4 last night...has now reached base safely in 11 of his 13 games and is batting .296 with a .417 on-base percentage...has played exclusively in left field on defense...played in a career-high 138 games in his first season as an Athletic last year and batted .240 with six home runs, 38 RBI and a .334 on-base percentage.

**#37 JONAH HEIM:** Pinch ran and caught last night but did not have an at bat...is hitting .320 in 12 games but is 0-for-7 over his last four contests after hitting .444 over his first eight...combined with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas to hit a career-high .310 with a career-high tying nine home runs and 53 RBI in 85 games last year.

**#5 TONY KEMP:** Went 0-for-3 last night and is now hitting .313 in 11 spring games...has played six games at second base, four in left field and one at designated hitter...was acquired from the Chicago Cubs for Alfonso Rivas, Jan. 13, 2020...batted a combined .212 with home runs and 29 RBI in 110 games with Houston and the Cubs last year.

**#22 RAMÓN LAUREANO:** Is hitting .261 with nine RBI in 10 games...went 4-for-9 (.444) over his last four games in March after going 2-for-14 (.143) over his first six...batted .288 with 24 home runs and 67 RBI in 123 games last year in a season interrupted by a five-week stay on the injured list with a right lower leg stress reaction.

**#39 VIMAEEL MACHÍN:** Struck out as a pinch hitter last night and is now hitting .323 with a .432 on-base percentage in 16 games...has appeared in five games at second base, five at third base, two at first base, one at shortstop and one at designated hitter...was acquired from Philadelphia for cash, Dec. 12, 2019 after the Phillies selected him from the Cubs in the Rule 5 draft...combined for a .295 batting average and .390 on-base percentage in 129 games with Double-A Tennessee and Triple-A Iowa last year.

**#12 SEAN MURPHY:** Went 0-for-2 with a hit by pitch last night after appearing in just four games in March (3-for-8, .375)...played in just 41 minor league games last year due to two stints on the injured list with a strained left knee...was selected by Oakland on Sept. 1 when rosters expanded and hit .245 with four home runs and eight RBI in 20 games.

**#28 MATT OLSON:** Went 1-for-4 last night and is batting .207 with a home run and four RBI in 12 games...missed 34 games last year while on the injured list early in the season but still hit 36 home runs and drove in 91 runs while batting .267 in 127 games...also won his second consecutive Rawlings Gold Glove for American League first basemen.

**#45 NATE ORF (Minors):** The non-roster invitee is batting .208 with five walks (.345 on-base percentage) in 14 games this spring...went 3-for-7 (.429) with three doubles over his final three games...appeared in six games at shortstop, five at third base and three at second base...spent the entire 2019 season at Triple-A San Antonio where he hit .272 with a career-high 11 home runs and 54 RBI in 125 games.

**#63 CARLOS PÉREZ (Minors):** The non-roster invitee is batting .308 in seven games this spring...spent most of the 2019 season at Double-A Bowie in the Baltimore organization where he hit .251 with 14 home runs and 60 RBI in 94 games...also went 3-for-24 (.125) in eight games with Triple-A Norfolk and batted a combined .243 in 102 games overall.

**#18 CHAD PINDER:** Is hitting .370 in 11 games this spring...has appeared in five games in right field, two at third base, two at designated hitter, one in left field and one at first base...batted .240 with 13 home runs and 47 RBI in 124 games last year...started at least one game at seven different positions for the second consecutive season.

**#25 STEPHEN PISCOTTY:** Homered in his first at bat last night and went 2-for-3 in his first game this year (did not play in February and March)...was limited to 93 games last year due to two stints on the injured list and batted .249 with 13 home runs and 44 RBI...was out from June 30 to Aug. 2 with a sprained right knee and Aug. 25 to Sept. 25 with a sprained right ankle.

**#10 MARCUS SEMIEN:** Went 0-for-4 last night and is now hitting .179 in 12 games...finished in the top five in Oakland history in eight different categories in 2019...scored 123 runs, which tied the Oakland record set by Reggie Jackson in 1969...also tied the record for games played (162).

**#50 RHP MIKE FIERS:** Is 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA in four starts...has held the opposition to a .204 (10-for-49) batting average...ranks fourth in the Cactus League in innings pitched (13.0)...was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's last year...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting (.243) and tied for eighth in wins.
