ABOUT THE A'S: The A's open their 53rd season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (19), Atlanta Braves (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (18) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (7) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4313-3980 (.520) record over the previous 52 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 120th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9028-9452 (.489) in their previous 119 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 13-10 (.565) during the spring...it marked Oakland's second consecutive spring with a winning record after three straight losing springs...started the spring 0-5, won 13 of the final 16 games in Arizona and then went 0-2 against San Francisco in July...the A's led the majors this spring with 102 walks and 13 sacrifice flies and topped the Cactus League with a .352 on-base percentage...also ranked third in the CL in doubles (45), fourth in runs (132), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in hits (201)...had the third fewest home runs (21)...the pitching staff had the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.286) and fifth highest ERA (5.39), but tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (23)...defensively, tied for third in the CL in double plays turned (21) and ranked fifth in fielding percentage (.982).

SHORTENED SEASONS: The A's are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season...this will be the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have played fewer than 161 games in a season...in addition to 1981, the A's played 114 games in 1994, 144 in 1995 and 155 in 1972 (also strike seasons).

FOR OPENERS: Today's opener is the latest in Athletics history...the previous latest date was April 26 on two occasions...in 1901 the A's played the first game in franchise history, a 5-1 loss to Washington...in 1995 the A's opened late following the strike that began in 1994 and lost to Toronto, 13-1...the A's lost to Seattle on Opening Day in Japan last year, 9-7, after winning three of the previous four openers...have now lost 12 of their last 15 openers dating back to 2005 and are 7-19 going back to 1994...this marks the 11th consecutive season the A's have been the home team on Opening Day, which includes two openers in Japan (2012 and 2019)...were originally scheduled to open against Minnesota on March 26 but will face the Los Angeles Angels today...this marks the third time in the last four years and the seventh time overall the A's have faced the Angels on Opening Day...are 4-2 over the previous six games, including 3-0 in Oakland and 1-2 in Anaheim...have won each of the last two openers, both in Oakland...won 6-5 in 11 innings in 2018 and 4-2 in 2017...the last loss came in a 3-0 decision at Anaheim in 2009...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 23-29 on Opening Day, including 19-14 in Oakland, 4-11 on the road, 0-3 in Tokyo and 0-1 in Las Vegas...all-time, the Athletics are 55-64 in openers.

OPENING DAY STARTING LINEUPS: Seven players return from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (Chapman, Davis, Laureano, Olson, Pinder, Piscotty, Semien)...Marcus Semien is scheduled to make his sixth consecutive Opening Day start at shortstop, which will set an Oakland record for consecutive Opening Day starts by a shortstop (previous: 5 by Campaneris, Bordick, Tejada and Crosby)...the six starts are second most in Oakland history by a shortstop (Campaneris, 8)...Matt Olson is scheduled to make his third straight start at first base and he joins Mark McGwire (8 from 1988-95) as the only first baseman in Oakland history with more than two straight Opening Day starts...Matt Chapman will become the first Athletic to make three straight Opening Day starts at third base since Eric Chavez had nine straight from 1999-2007...Khris Davis will join Geronimo Berroa (1995-97) and Erubiel Durazo (2003-05) as the only Athletics with three Opening Day starts at designated hitter...Frankie Montas will be the A's 13th different

starting pitcher over the last 15 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's open the season with 15 pitchers and 15 position players...17 players return from last years Opening Day roster (Barreto, Canha, Chapman, Davis, Fiers, Grossman, Hendriks, Laureano, Montas, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty, Semien, Soria, Trivino, Wendelken)...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...seven other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Bassitt, Brown, Diekman, Luzardo, Manaea, Mengden, Murphy) for a total of 24 players who were with the organization last year...four were acquired in a trade (Allen, Kemp, Machin, Smith), one was claimed off waivers (McFarland) and one was signed as a free agent to a minor league contract (Weems).

TENURE: None of the 30 players on the A's Opening Day roster played for Oakland prior to the 2015 season...only two players have played for Oakland in each of the previous five seasons (Canha, Semien) and of those two, only Semien has been on each of the A's last six Opening Day rosters...only two have been on the last five Opening Day rosters (Davis, Hendriks)...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest tenure in the A's organization...he is followed by Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have five rookies on the Opening Day roster (Brown, Luzardo, Machin, Murphy, Weems) after starting the year with no rookies in each of the previous two seasons...five players have six or more years of service: Soria (13 years), Petit (9 years, 16 days), Diekman (7 years, 50 days), Davis (6 years, 104 days) and Fiers (6 years, 85 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 28.77 years...Jesus Luzardo, who is 22 years and 298 days, is the youngest and he is the youngest player on an A's Opening Day roster since 2010 (Brett Anderson, 22 years and 63 days)...he is followed by Franklin Barreto (24 years, 148 days) and Sean Murphy (25 years, 294 days) ...Joakim Soria is the oldest at 36 years, 67 days...he is followed by Yusmeiro Petit (35 years, 245 days) and Mike Fiers (35 years, 39 days).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with one player on the injured list (Puk)...it marks the first time Oakland has fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...the last time the A's opened the season with one player on the IL was in 2006 when they had none...have used the IL twice this year after using it 17 time last year...the 17 IL placements in 2019 tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13).

NUMBER CHANGES: Franklin Barreto will switch to #4 and Burch Smith is now wearing #46.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's won the season series last year, 13-6...it was their first season series win since 2013...the 13 wins tied the A's second most against the Angels (14-6 in 2001, 13-5 in 1968)...went 7-3 in Oakland and are 6-3 in Anaheim...the wins at home matched the most in Oakland history against the Angels (seventh time, last in 2003)...have won seven of the last eight games and 20 of the last 30...have won three straight and 11 of the last 15 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 450-382 against the Angels...that includes 235-180 in Oakland and 215-202 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 499-459 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has homered in each of the last three openers, including twice in 2017, and has an Athletics-record four career Opening Day home runs...his eight RBI are tied with Dave Henderson for second most in Oakland history to Terry Steinbach (9).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1990** Dave Henderson, Mark McGwire and Mike Gallego each homer in the sixth inning of the A's 5-3 win against California...it is the third time in 1990 that the A's hit three homers in one inning...in **1999** Jason Giambi hits a pair of three-run home runs in a game at Kansas City and has six RBI...he hit a grand slam against the Royals the night before...in **2018**, the A's trail 10-2 after six innings at Texas but come back to win 13-10 in 10 innings...Jed Lowrie, Khris Davis, Stephen Piscotty and Mark Canha homer, giving the A's a Major League record tying three consecutive games with four or more home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (9-2, 2.63 ERA in 2019)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his first career Opening Day start...will become the A's 13th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 15 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers)...will be just the second foreign-born Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history...the other is Ariel Prieto, who started against Cleveland on April 2, 1997 (ND, 4.0 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 0 so)...Montas is in his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2017, 19-20)...is 14-6 with a 3.13 ERA (56 er in 161.0 ip) in 29 games, 27 starts, over the previous two years after going 1-3 with a 6.32 ERA in 30 games, two starts, over his first two seasons.

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Won each of his final five decisions of 2019, which is the longest winning streak of his career...has a 2.49 ERA (14 er in 50.2 ip) and .201 (38-for-189) opponents batting average during the streak, which spans eight starts dating back to May 17, 2019...his last loss came on April 29, 2019 at Boston.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-0 and did not allow an earned run in three starts...yielded two unearned runs in 5.2 innings...opponents went 4-for-22 (.182) and he walked just one batter in 5.2 innings...his last outing came on Mar. 8 against Milwaukee in Mesa...is now 3-0 with a 0.42 ERA in eight games, five starts, over the last two springs.

MONTAS vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-0 with a 2.96 ERA (27.1 ip, 23 h, 9 r, 9 er, 9 bb, 23 so, 3 hr) in seven career appearances, including four starts...is 1-0 with a 3.46 ERA (5 er in 13.0 ip) in four games in Oakland and 1-0 with a 2.51 ERA (4 er in 14.1 ip) in three appearances in Anaheim...went 2-0 with a 3.27 ERA (22.0 ip, 15 h, 8 r, 8 er, 8 bb, 20 so) in four starts last year...his first win came in the A's 2-1 victory on March 31 in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed just one run on three hits...allowed a leadoff double to Calhoun, hit Trout and then retired 16 consecutive batters before Calhoun homered with two outs in the sixth...was relieved by Trivino after allowing a double to Bour to start the seventh inning...then had a no decision in a 6-5 loss in Oakland on May 28...walked a career-high five batters in 4.0 innings...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed four runs in the second on a two-run single by Fletcher and a two-run double by La Stella...left trailing 4-1 but Oakland came back to tie the game before Soria allowed two runs in the ninth for the loss...faced the Angels again his next start on June 4 at Anaheim and was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 victory...shut out the Angels on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Ohtani in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 302 win at Anaheim on Sept. 25...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings of work, a one-out home run by Ward in the second inning...left with the score tied 1-1.

2019 RECAP: Went 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA in 16 starts in a season shortened due to an 80-game suspension for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...his ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.282) and OPS (.646)...had career highs in wins, starts, strikeouts (103), innings (96.0), hits (84), runs (35), walks (23) and hit batters (4) and matched his high in earned runs (28) and wild pitches (4)...averaged 2.16 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.48 was a career high...surrendered eight home runs (0.75 per nine innings).

90 OR MORE INNINGS RANKINGS: His 2.63 ERA was third lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 90 innings...using the same mini-

num, he ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings, fifth in opponents OPS, sixth in slugging percentage (.364), ninth in on-base percentage and 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio...averaged 9.66 strikeouts per nine innings, which was second highest in Oakland history (Gio Gonzalez, 9.94 in 2009) and third highest in Athletics history (Wes Stock, 9.77 in 1964) among pitchers with 90 or more innings...his 4.48 strikeout-to-walk ratio was fourth highest in Oakland history.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .229 (38-for-166) opponents batting average and .647 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 (46-for-199) with a .645 OPS against left-handers...allowed a .207 average to batters leading off an inning and .115 with two strikes...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...only one came the first time through the batting order...opponents were 4-for-7 (.571) with the bases loaded.

2019 SPLITS: Was 4-0 with a 3.00 ERA in seven starts at home, 5-2 with a 2.33 ERA in nine starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 42.0 innings in Oakland compared to six in 54.0 innings on the road...had a 3-0 record and a 1.50 ERA in four starts during the day, 6-2 with a 3.00 ERA in 12 starts at night...went 5-2 with a 3.00 ERA in 11 starts on four or five days rest, 4-0 with a 1.91 ERA in five starts on six days rest or more...is now 7-1 with a 2.40 ERA in 10 career starts on six days rest or more.

2019 RUN SUPPORT: Received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 16 starts but had six starts with seven runs of support or more...had a 6.84 RSA overall...was 7-1 in nine starts with three runs of support or more and is 10-1 in 13 such starts in his career.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Allowed just one run in the first inning for a 0.56 ERA...had a 5.63 ERA in the second inning and a 2.39 ERA from the third inning on...the A's were 12-4 (.750) in his starting assignments and are 19-8 (.704) when he starts in his career...committed three errors, which tied for the most among AL pitchers...went 0-for-1 with a walk as a hitter and is 0-for-6 with a walk and five strikeouts in his career...pitched for Escogido in the Dominican Winter League following the season and was 3-0 with a 1.44 ERA in five starts.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the Opening Day roster and was available in the bullpen for the two games against Seattle in Japan but did not pitch...was inserted into the fourth spot in the rotation when the season resumed and picked up the win in his first start March 31 against Los Angeles (AL)...took the loss in his second start on April 5 at Houston...then went 3-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .224 opponents average over his next three starts from April 10 to 23...the first win came on April 10 at Baltimore when he retired the first 12 batters he faced...surrendered two home runs in the game, giving him four in his first three starts...did not allow another home run until June 4 at Los Angeles-AL (Ohtani) for an eight-game, 53.0-inning, 228-batter faced homerless streak...allowed a season-high nine hits but extended his winning streak to three games in an 11-5 win over Texas April 23...had his three-game winning streak snapped April 29 at Boston when he allowed a season-high seven runs in 4.1 innings...only one of the runs was earned and the six unearned runs tied for second most in Oakland history...they were the most since Brett Anderson also had six on May 15, 2009 vs. Detroit...finished April with a 3-2 record and a 3.29 ERA in five starts...tied for fifth in the American League in wins...then went 2-0 with a 2.64 ERA in five starts in May...tied for eighth in the AL in May ERA...left his start on May 10 against Cleveland with a 3-2 lead but Trivino blew the save in a game the A's would win 4-3 in 12 innings...had career highs in strikeouts (10), innings pitched (8.2) and pitches (109) in a 7-2 win at Detroit on May 17...did not walk a batter, which marked the 27th time in Oakland history a pitcher struck out 10 or more and did not issue a walk...it was the first since Jeff Samardzija on Sept. 17, 2014 vs. Texas (10 so)...that began a career-high and season-ending five-game winning streak...compiled a 2.49 ERA (14 er in 50.2 ip) and .201 (38-for-189) opponents batting average over that eight start stretch...walked a career-high five batters in a season-low 4.0 innings in a no decision against Los Angeles (AL) May 28...had his second career 10-strikeout game in a 9-8 win at Texas June 9...allowed a run on four hits in 8.0 innings on June 20 against Tampa Bay but had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win...was suspended for 80 games the next day for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...was 9-2 with a 2.70 ERA in 15 starts at the time...was tied for third in the AL in wins and winning percentage (.818) and ranked fifth in ERA...was reinstated Sept. 25 and started that day at Los Angeles (AL) when he had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...was not eligible for the postseason.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Sean Manaea (4-0, 1.21 ERA in 2019): Begins his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster...also started the second game of the season in 2017 and 2018...went 4-0 in five starts last year and now has a career-high tying five-game winning streak dating back to Aug. 24, 2018...was 0-2 with a 10.66 ERA in four games this spring, all starts...led the A's and tied for eighth in the Cactus League in strikeouts (14)...did not walk a batter in 12.2 innings...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-2 A's loss to San Francisco on Monday here in Oakland (5.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so)...is 2-3 with a 4.33 ERA (43.2 ip, 38 h, 23 r, 21 er, 12 bb, 30 so, 7 hr) in eight career starts against Los Angeles...did not face the Angels last year...his last start came on June 16, 2018 in Oakland when he was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-4 victory (6.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...missed most of the 2019 season while recovering from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder.

- Compiled a 3.89 ERA last year, which was fourth lowest in the American League...had the lowest opponents OPS (.693) and slugging percentage (.385) and ranked third in opponents batting average (.232) and on-base percentage (.308).
- However, had a Major League leading and Oakland record 30 blown saves, which were the most blown saves by an AL team since Seattle had 31 in 2008...converted 45-of-75 (60.0%) save opportunities...ranked fifth in the AL in saves but had the fifth lowest save percentage.
- Set Oakland records for holds (110) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.37).
- Had the lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the majors (.342) and the fifth lowest OPS (.651)...had 156 first batter strikeouts, which was fourth most in the AL and the most in Oakland history.
- Allowed 82-of-255 (32.2%) inherited runners to score, which was sixth highest in the AL.
