OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-0) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (0-1)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's opened their 53rd season in Oakland last night with a 7-3 win in 10 innings...it was the third time in the last four years the A's have started the season with a win but they have gone on to lose the second game of the season following each of the previous two victories...have not started the season 2-0 since 2004...the A's have won 16 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (19), Atlanta Braves (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (18) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (7) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4313-3980 (.520) record over the previous 52 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 120th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9028-9452 (.489) in their previous 119 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

FOR OPENERS: The A's defeated the Angels 7-3 in 10 innings last night in the first game in Major League history in which extra innings began with a runner on second base...it was the eighth Opening Day extra inning game in Oakland history, the first since 2018...the A's are 4-4 in those games...it was the fifth Opening Day walk-off win in Oakland history, the first by a home run (1972 fielders choice and error, 1982 Lopes Walk, 1984 fielders choice and error, 2018 Semien single)...it was the eighth walk-off grand slam in Oakland history, the first since Khris Davis on May 17, 2016...are now 24-29 on Opening Day since moving to Oakland in 1968, including 20-14 in the Coliseum.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this season-opening six-game homestand against Los Angeles (1-0) and Colorado (two games)...will play 12 of their first 16 games at home...open a four-game series in Seattle next Friday before returing home for a pair of three-game series against Texas and Houston.

THIS AND THAT: The A's committed an error last night after finishing the 2019 season with an 11-game errorless streak...had just 80 errors all last year, which set an Athletics record for fewest errors in a season...the error last night led to an unearned run...had a Major League-low 34 unearned runs last year, which was also the fewest in Athletics history...the A's bullpen had a blown save last night...last year, had a Major League leading and Oakland record 30 blown saves.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 13-10 (.565) during the spring...it marked Oakland's second consecutive spring with a winning record after three straight losing springs...started the sping 0-5, won 13 of the final 16 games in Arizona and then went 0-2 against San Francisco in July...the A's led the majors this spring with 102 walks and 13 sacrifice flies and topped the Cactus League with a .352 on-base percentage...also ranked third in the CL in doubles (45), fourth in runs (132), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in hits (201)...had the third fewest home runs (21)...the pitching staff had the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.286) and fifth highest ERA (5.39), but tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (23)...defensively, tied for third in the CL in double plays turned (21) and ranked fifth in fielding percentage (.982).

SHORTENED SEASONS: The A's are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season...this will be the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have played fewer than 161 games in a season...in addition to 1981, the A's played 114 games in 1994, 144 in 1995 and 155 in 1972 (also strike seasons).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's open the season with 15 pitchers and 15 position players...17 players return from last years Opening Day roster (Barreto, Canha, Chapman, Davis, Fiers, Grossman, Hendriks, Laureano, Montas, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty, Semien, Soria, Trivino, Wendelken)...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...seven other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Bassitt, Brown, Diekman, Luzardo, Manaea, Mengden, Murphy) for a total of 24 players who were with the organization last year...four were acquired in a trade (Allen, Kemp, Machín, Smith), one was claimed off waivers (McFarland) and one was signed as a free agent to a minor league contract (Weems).

TENURE: None of the 30 players on the A's Opening Day roster played for Oakland prior to the 2015 season...only two players have played for Oakland in each of the previous five seasons (Canha, Semien) and of those two, only Semien has been on each of the A's last six Opening Day rosters...only two have been on the last five Opening Day rosters (Davis, Hendriks)...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest tenure in the A's organization...he is followed by Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have five rookies on the Opening Day roster (Brown, Luzardo, Machín, Murphy, Weems) after starting the year with no rookies in each of the previous two seasons...five players have six or more years of service: Soria (13 years), Petit (9 years, 16 days), Diekman (7 years, 50 days), Davis (6 years, 104 days) and Fiers (6 years, 85 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 28.77 years...Jesús Luzardo, who is 22 years and 298 days, is the youngest and he is the youngest player on an A's Opening Day roster since 2010 (Brett Anderson, 22 years and 63 days)...he is followed by Franklin Barreto (24 years, 148 days) and Sean Murphy (25 years, 294 days) ...Joakim Soria is the oldest at 36 years, 67 days...he is followed by Yusmeiro Petit (35 years, 245 days) and Mike Fiers (35 years, 39 days).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with one player on the injured list (Puk)...it marks the first time Oakland has fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...the last time the A's opened the season with one player on the IL was in 2006 when they had none...have used the IL twice this year after using it 17 time last year... the 17 IL placements in 2019 tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13).

NUMBER CHANGES: Franklin Barreto will switch to #4 and Burch Smith is now wearing #46.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2020 season...Khris Davis and Jake Diekman are signed through 2021, with Diekman having a club option for 2022...Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's won the first meeting of 2020 last night after winning the season series last year, 13-6...it was their first season series win since 2013...the 13 wins tied the A's second most against the Angels (14-6 in 2001, 13-5 in 1968)...went 7-3 in Oakland and are 6-3 in Anaheim...the wins at home matched the most in Oakland history against the Angels (seventh time, last in 2003)...have now won eight of the last nine games and 21 of the last 31...have won four straight and 12 of the last 16 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 451-382 against the Angels...that includes 236-180 in Oakland and 215-202 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 500-459 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ramón Laureano tied an Oakland record for runs scored on Opening Day with three...it was the fourth time in Oakland history a player scored three runs on Opening Day, the first since Lance Blankenship in 1993...**Matt Olson** had a walk-off grand slam in the 10th inning last night...it was the first Opening Day walk-off grand slam in the majors since Jim Presley did it for Seattle on April 8, 1986 against California...it was the first Opening Day walk-off home run in Oakland history and the third grand slam (Eric Fox, 1993; Terry Steinbach, 1994).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1930** the A's have two triple steals in the same game...Al Simmons, Bing Miller and Dib Williams turn the trick in the first inning and Mickey Cochrane, Simmons and Jimmie Foxx steal together in the fourth inning...in **1936** Frankie Hayes ties a major league record with four doubles in a game against Cleveland...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits a 488 foot home run into the fifth deck at SkyDome...at the time it was the longest home run in the majors since all home runs have been measured starting in 1992...in **2001** the A's acquire Jermaine Dye from Kansas City in a three-team trade.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (4-0, 1.21 ERA in 2019)

FOR STARTERS: Begins his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2017-18, 20)...also started the second game of the season in 2017 and 2018...took the loss in 2018 in a 1-0 decision against the Angels (7.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 7 so) after having a no decision in a 7-6 loss to the Angels in 2017 (6.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 4 so).

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Went 4-0 in five starts last year and now has a career-high tying five-game winning streak dating back to Aug. 24, 2018... also won five straight from May 20-June 10, 2017...has a 1.04 ERA (4 er in 34.2 ip) and .178 (21-for-118) oppponents batting average during his current streak, which spans six starts...his last loss came on Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with a 10.66 ERA in four games this spring, all starts...led the A's and tied for eighth in the Cactus League in strikeouts (14)...did not walk a batter in 12.2 innings...allowed a .321 (18-for-56) opponents batting average...yielded at least two runs in each of his assignments...started against San Francisco on Monday.

MANAEA vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-3 with a 4.33 ERA (43.2 ip, 38 h, 23 r, 21 er, 12 bb, 30 so, 7 hr) in eight career starts...is 0-2 with a 6.50 ERA (13 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts in Anaheim and 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA (8 er in 25.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland...did not face the Angels last year...his last start came on June 16, 2018 in Oakland when he was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-4 victory...

2019 RECAP: Began the season on the 60-day injured list as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...went 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts before he was reinstated from the IL Sept. 1...made five starts with Oakland and was 4-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .160 opponents batting average...the ERA was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched (Yates SD, 1.19) and fifth lowest in Oakland history...using the same minimum, the batting average was third lowest in the majors and sixth lowest in Oakland history...allowed two runs or fewer in all five starts, including one run or fewer four times, and four hits or fewer four times...struck out 30 batters in 29.2 innings and walked just seven (2.12 per nine innings)...had a .229 opponents on-base percentage and .280 slugging percentage.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .129 (8-for-62) against right-handed hitters compared to .211 (8-for-38) against left-handers...however, issued six of his seven walks to righties... yielded two of his three home runs to righties and has surrendered 54 of his 62 career homers to right-handers...now has a .216 opponents batting average and .584 OPS in his career against lefties, .252 with a .734 OPS against righties...opponents were 3-for-31 (.097) with runners on base, 0-for-15 with runners in scoring position and 0-for-8 with RISP and two outs...all three of the home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .073 batting average with two strikes...did not allow a hit to the opponent's eight (0-for-9) or nine (0-for-10) hitter.

2019 NIGHT AND DAY: Was 2-0 with a 0.50 ERA in three starts during the day, 2-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts at night...is now 16-4 with a 3.21 ERA (68 er in 190.2 ip) in 32 career day games, 19-24 with a 4.13 ERA (139 er in 303.0 ip) in 54 starts at night.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Did not allow a run in innings one through four (20.0 ip) and opponents were 8-for-63 (.127)...had a 3.72 ERA and .216 opponents average from the fifth inning on...went 4-0 in four starts with three runs of support or more...is now 4-26 in 43 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 31-2 in 42 starts with support of three runs or more.

2019 WITH OAKLAND: Made his first start of 2019 at New York (AL) on Sept. 1 and had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss...it was his first Major League appearance since Aug. 24, 2018 at Minnesota...tossed five scoreless innings and allowed just one hit while walking three...then picked up the win in each of his final four starts to extend his winning streak to a career-high tying five games dating back to Aug. 24, 2018 (also May 20-June 10, 2017)...has a 1.04 ERA and .178 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spans six starts...his last loss came on Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters in season-high 7.0 innings in his second start on Sept. 8 against Detroit and was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 victory...it was his third career 10-strikeout game (last: April 21, 2018 vs. Boston)...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to defeat Texas 6-1 on Sept. 15...finished September with a 4-0 record and a 1.21 ERA in five starts...ranked second in the AL in opponents OPS in September (.509), third in ERA and tied for third in wins...it was the second time he won four games in a month in his career (April 2018)...is now 8-2 with a 1.90 ERA in 13 career starts in September... made his postseason debut with a start in the American League Wild Card Game Oct. 2 against Tampa Bay...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss in Oakland (2.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 so)...it matched the second shortest start of his career...surrendered three home runs after yielding two home runs or fewer in each of his 86 career regular season appearances.

2019 IN MINORS: Started his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 8 and was 0-1 with a 9.72 ERA in three starts when he was transferred to Triple-A Las Vegas July 23...went 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA in two starts with the Aviators before his rehab assignment was halted on Aug. 2 due to a strained right oblique...returned to action Aug. 13 and went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA over his final three starts...was 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts overall...struck out 53 batters in 36.1 innings (13.13 per nine innings) and walked 10 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.3. his opponents batting average broke down to .214 (9-for-42) against lefthanded hitters compared to .226 (21-for-93) with five of his six home runs and eight of his 10 walks against right-handed hitters...allowed a seasonhigh six runs on a season-high seven hits in a season-low 2.1 innings in a 9-6 loss to Visalia in his first start on July 8...also tossed 2.1 innings and took the loss in his next start July 13 at Rancho Cucamonga...logged 3.2 scoreless innings in his final start with the Ports on July 18 against Lancaster.. was charged with the loss in his first start with Triple-A Las Vegas on July 24 against El Paso and followed that up with a no decision July 30 against New Orleans...struck out 10 batters in 5.2 innings Aug. 13 at Omaha, his first of two 10-strikeout games...combined with Ben Bracewell and J.B. Wendelken on a two-hit shutout in a 3-0 Las Vegas win at Tacoma in his final start on Aug. 23...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings and struck out a season-high 12 on a season-high 99 pitches.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Mike Fiers (15-4, 3.90 ERA in 2019): Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2013, 15-17, 19-20)...was 1-3 with a 5.51 ERA in five starts during the spring, including a loss at San Francisco on Tuesday (3.1 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...however, held the opposition to a .210 batting average...the five starts tied for the most in the majors...his 16.1 innings pitched led the Cactus League and ranked fifth in the majors...his 16.4 with a 4.99 ERA (79.1 ip, 82 h, 45 r, 44 er, 22 bb, 59 so, 15 hr) in 14 career appearances, 13 starts, against Los Angeles...went 3-0 with a 3.04 ERA (23.2 ip, 21 h, 8 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 15 so, 3 hr) in four starts last year...was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's last year...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting average (.243), tied for eighth in wins and 10th in OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304).

- The A's had a blown save last night...last year, had a Major League leading and Oakland record 30 blown saves, which were the most blown saves by an American League team since Seattle had 31 in 2008...converted 45-of-75 (60.0%) save opportunities...ranked fifth in the AL in saves but had the fifth lowest save percentage.
- Compiled a 3.89 ERA last year, which was fourth lowest in the AL...had the lowest opponents OPS (.693) and slugging percentage (.385) and ranked third in opponents batting average (.232) and on-base percentage (.308).
- Set Oakland records for holds (110) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.37). • Had the lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the majors (.342) and the fifth lowest OPS (.651)...had 156 first batter strikeouts,
- which was fourth most in the AL and the most in Oakland history. Allowed 82-of-255 (32.2%) inherited runners to score, which was sixth highest in the AL.

- Begins his ninth season in the majors and has played for five teams...is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2014-16, 18-20).
- Last night was his fifth career appearance on Opening Day (3.2 ip, 3 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 4 so, 1 hr).
- Posted an 8.53 ERA and .385 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven relief appearances during the spring...including an outing on Monday against San Francisco (0.2 ip, 2 h, 3 r 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...tied for sixth in the Cactus League in appearances (7).
- Has not allowed a run in nine of his last 10 appearances against the Angels dating back to April 11, 2018 (9.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 10 so, 1.00 ERA).

Last Year: Began the season with Kansas City and was 0-6 with a 4.75 ERA in 48 relief appearances when he was traded to Oakland on July 27...went 1-1 with a 4.43 ERA in 28 games with the A's and had a 4.65 ERA in a career-high 76 relief appearances overall.

- Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his eighth Opening Day roster (2012-13, 15-20)...it is his fifth straight with the A's.
- Had the blown save last night in his second career Opening Day appearances (2.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 3 so, 9.00 ERA).
- Struck out 13 of the 23 batters he faced during the spring...did not issue a walk in 6.0 innings and logged a 3.00 ERA in six games...including one outing in July on Monday against San Francisco when he retired the side in order in the ninth inning (1.0 ip, 2 so).
- Converted each of his two save opportunities in 10 games against Los Angeles last year (10.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 2.61 ERA).

Last Year: Began the season as a set-up man and occasional opener but took over the closer role after Treinen went on the lL retroactive to June 21...saved a ML-leading 25 games over that span after tallying just one save over his first 279 career appearances.

- Begins his second season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...his age of 22 years and 298 days on Opening Day made him the youngest player on an A's Opening Day roster since 2010 (Brett Anderson, 22 years and 63 days).
- Was 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA and .143 opponents batting average in three starts this spring...struck out 13 batters and walked just one in 8.1 innings...did not pitch in either of the two July exhibition games against San Francisco.
