OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-1) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (1-1)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost 4-1 yesterday after winning on Opening Night... this marks the 11th time in the last 16 years Oakland has started the season 1-1 (were 0-2 in the other five)...have started eight of the previous nine seasons 1-2 (were 2-1 in 2015)...this is the A's 53rd season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (19), Atlanta Braves (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (18) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (7) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4313-3980 (.520) record over the previous 52 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 120th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9028-9452 (.489) in their previous 119 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this season-opening six-game homestand against Los Angeles (1-1) and Colorado (two games)...will play 12 of their first 16 games at home...open a four-game series in Seattle next Friday before returning home for a pair of three-game series against Texas and Houston.

THIS AND THAT: Sean Manaea tossed 4.2 inning yesterday after Frankie Montas tossed 4.0 innings Opening Day...this marks the first time A's starting pitcher have tossed fewer than five innings in each of the first two games of the season since 1997 (Ariel Prieto, 4.0; Willie Adams, 4.0)...the starters 8.2 innings pitched are second fewest in the West (AL and NL) and sixth fewest in the majors...the A's have scored seven of their eight runs this year in the seventh inning or later...are batting .346 (9-for-26) in the seventh inning or later compared to .103 (4-for-39) over innings one through six.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 13-10 (.565) during the spring...it marked Oakland's second consecutive spring with a winning record after three straight losing springs...started the spring 0-5, won 13 of the final 16 games in Arizona and then went 0-2 against San Francisco in July...the A's led the majors this spring with 102 walks and 13 sacrifice flies and topped the Cactus League with a .352 on-base percentage...also ranked third in the CL in doubles (45), fourth in runs (132), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in hits (201)...had the third fewest home runs (21)...the pitching staff had the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.286) and fifth highest ERA (5.39), but tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (23)...defensively, tied for third in the CL in double plays turned (21) and ranked fifth in fielding percentage (.982).

SHORTENED SEASONS: The A's are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season...this will be the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have played fewer than 161 games in a season...in addition to 1981, the A's played 114 games in 1994, 144 in 1995 and 155 in 1972 (also strike seasons).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's open the season with 15 pitchers and 15 position players...17 players return from last years Opening Day roster (Barreto, Canha, Chapman, Davis, Fiers, Grossman, Hendriks, Laureano, Montas, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty, Semien, Soria, Trivino, Wendelken)...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...seven other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Bassitt, Brown, Diekman, Luzardo, Manaea, Mengden, Murphy) for a total of 24 players who were with the organization last year...four were acquired in a trade (Allen, Kemp, Machin, Smith), one was claimed off waivers (McFarland) and one was signed as a free agent to a minor league contract (Weems).

TENURE: None of the 30 players on the A's Opening Day roster played for Oakland prior to the 2015 season...only two players have played for Oakland in each of the previous five seasons (Canha, Semien) and of those two, only

Semien has been on each of the A's last six Opening Day rosters...only two have been on the last five Opening Day rosters (Davis, Hendriks)...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest tenure in the A's organization...he is followed by Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have five rookies on the Opening Day roster (Brown, Luzardo, Machin, Murphy, Weems) after starting the year with no rookies in each of the previous two seasons...five players have six or more years of service: Soria (13 years), Petit (9 years, 16 days), Diekman (7 years, 50 days), Davis (6 years, 104 days) and Fiers (6 years, 85 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 28.77 years...Jesus Luzardo, who is 22 years and 298 days, is the youngest and he is the youngest player on an A's Opening Day roster since 2010 (Brett Anderson, 22 years and 63 days)...he is followed by Franklin Barreto (24 years, 148 days) and Sean Murphy (25 years, 294 days) ...Joakim Soria is the oldest at 36 years, 67 days...he is followed by Yusmeiro Petit (35 years, 245 days) and Mike Fiers (35 years, 39 days).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with one player on the injured list (Puk)...it marks the first time Oakland has fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...the last time the A's opened the season with one player on the IL was in 2006 when they had none...have used the IL twice this year after using it 17 time last year...the 17 IL placements in 2019 tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13).

NUMBER CHANGES: Franklin Barreto will switch to #4 and Burch Smith is now wearing #46.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2020 season...Chris Davis and Jake Diekman are signed through 2021, with Diekman having a club option for 2022...Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have split the first two meetings of 2020 after winning the season series last year, 13-6...it was their first season series win since 2013...the 13 wins tied the A's second most against the Angels (14-6 in 2001, 13-5 in 1968)...went 7-3 in Oakland and are 6-3 in Anaheim...the wins at home matched the most in Oakland history against the Angels (seventh time, last in 2003)...have won eight of the last 10 games and 21 of the last 32...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 451-383 against the Angels...that includes 236-181 in Oakland and 215-202 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 500-460 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Robbie Grossman stole two bases yesterday for the third two-steal game of his career (last: July 30, 2019 vs. Milwaukee)...is the first Athletic with a two-steal game in one of the first two games of the season since Jason McDonald did it in the second game of 1998 (April 2 vs. Boston)...**Ramón Laureano** is the only Athletic to hit safely in each of the first two games and has two hits in each contest...joins Jed Lowrie (2017) and Sam Fuld (2015) as the only Athletics over the last 15 years with multiple hit games in each of the first two games of the season...**Jesús Luzardo** tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his first outing of the season yesterday...closed out the 2019 season with four consecutive scoreless appearances and now has a 10.0-inning scoreless streak...has allowed just two runs in 15.0 career innings (1.20 ERA)...**J.B. Wendelken** retired the only batter he faced (Trout) in his 2020 debut yesterday...has not allowed a run over his last 11 games and 13.0 innings dating back to May 9 of last year...opponents are 2-for-40 (.050) with three walks over that stretch.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1977** Vida Blue tosses a complete game four hitter in the A's 2-1 win over California...it is the 100th complete game of his career as he becomes the first and only Oakland Athletic to reach the century mark...in **1994** Stan Javier ties an Oakland record by collecting three doubles in the A's 6-0 win at California...Steve Ontiveros, Bob Welch and Bill Taylor combine on the three-hit shutout...in **2018** the A's set an Oakland with four triples in a 7-6 win at Texas...Matt Chapman ties an Oakland record with two triples.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (15-4, 3.90 ERA in 2019)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...begins his 10th season in the majors and is with his fourth team...has pitched for Milwaukee (2011-15), Houston (2015-17), Detroit (2018) and Oakland (2018-present)...is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2013, 15-17, 19-20).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-3 with a 5.51 ERA in five starts during the spring...however, held the opposition to a .210 batting average...the five starts tied for the most in the majors...his 16.1 innings pitched led the Cactus League and ranked fifth in the majors...is now 7-11 with a 5.96 ERA (77 er in 116.1 ip) in 43 games, including 31 starts, in his career during the spring.

FIERS vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 6-4 with a 4.99 ERA (79.1 ip, 82 h, 45 r, 44 er, 22 bb, 59 so, 15 hr) in 14 career appearances, 13 starts...is 3-3 with a 7.97 ERA (31 er in 35.0 ip) in seven games in Angel Stadium and 3-1 with a 2.66 ERA (13 er in 44.0 ip) in seven starts in his home ballparks...went 3-0 with a 3.04 ERA (23.2 ip, 21 h, 8 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 15 so, 3 hr) in four starts last year...the first win came on March 28 in Oakland when he combined with Trivino, Soria and Treinen on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win...tossed six of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking three...the hit was a one-out double by La Stella in the fifth...then defeated the Angels at Anaheim 7-4 on June 6...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a Goodwin sacrifice fly in the fourth...Oakland increased its lead to 6-1 before he allowed a two-run home run to Trout in the fifth...also won at Anaheim on June 28, 7-2...blanked the Angels on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning on a RBI single by Pujols...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win on Sept. 3 in Oakland...allowed single runs in each of the first two innings on a Trout home run and a Simmons RBI single...the A's tied the game with two in the bottom of the second and added three more in the third before he allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the fourth and a RBI double to Ohtani in the fifth...was relieved by Treinen to start the sixth with a 5-4 lead and Treinen allowed an Upton home run for the blown save.

2019 RECAP: Was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting average (.243), tied for eighth in wins and 10th in OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304)...also tied for third in wild pitches (13) and tied for fifth in games started...had career highs in wins, games (33), games started, innings pitched (184.2) and winning percentage...led the A's in wins, starts, innings pitched, runs (82), walks (53) and home runs (30)...is the first A's pitcher to win 15 games since Scott Kazmir had 15 in 2014 and the first to make 33 starts since Sonny Gray had 33 in 2014...his innings pitched were the most by an A's pitcher over the last three years...his .789 winning percentage was fourth best in Oakland history among pitchers with 15 or more decisions...his 30 home runs tied for 10th most in a season in Oakland history...struck out 126 batters, an average of 6.14 per

nine innings...that was the third-lowest mark in the AL...had the fifth-lowest strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.38)...the A's were 22-11 (.667) in his starting assignments in 2019 and are 30-12 (.714) in his career...left with the lead in eight of his no decisions in 2019 only to have the bullpen blow the save...has left with the lead in 12 of his 42 career starts with the A's only to have the bullpen blow the save.

BEGINNING, MIDDLE AND END: Went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA, .297 opponents batting average and .854 OPS over his first eight starts last year, 10-0 with a 2.12 ERA, .199 opponents average and .572 OPS over his next 17 starts from May 7-Aug. 9 and 3-1 with a 6.27 ERA, .304 opponents average and .940 OPS over his final eight starts.

2019 HOME AND AWAY: Was 9-2 with a 2.90 ERA and .641 OPS in 17 starts at home compared to 6-2 with a 5.14 ERA and .796 OPS in 16 starts on the road...had the fifth-lowest home ERA in the AL and the fourth-highest road ERA...tied for fourth in the AL in home wins and ranked eighth in OPS...one of his home losses was in Tokyo and he is now 12-1 with a 2.63 (39 er in 133.1) ERA in 22 starts in the Coliseum since he was acquired from Detroit on Aug. 6, 2018...is 7-0 with a 2.36 ERA (22 er in 84.0 ip) over his last 13 home starts and has not lost at home since April 20, 2019 vs. Toronto...is 13-3 with a 3.04 ERA (55 er in 162.2 ip) and .219 (128-for-585) opponents batting average in 28 career games, including 27 starts, in the Coliseum.

2019 NIGHT AND DAY: Was 11-2 with a 3.66 ERA and .683 OPS in 24 starts at night, 4-2 with a 4.60 ERA and .800 OPS in nine starts during the day...tied for fifth in the AL in night wins and ranked seventh in ERA and OPS...is now 16-3 with a 3.62 ERA (75 er in 186.2 ip) in 33 career appearances at night with the A's.

2019 DAYS REST: Compiled an 11-1 record and a 3.21 ERA in 17 starts on five days rest and is now 14-1 with a 3.13 ERA (46 er in 132.1 ip) in 22 starts on five days rest in his A's career...went 2-1 with a 4.59 ERA in 10 starts on four days rest and 2-2 with a 5.10 ERA in six starts on six days rest or more.

2019 MONTH BY MONTH: Was 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA in five starts in April, 1-1 with a 7.84 ERA in five starts in September and 12-1 with a 2.59 ERA in 21 starts in May, June, July and August...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA (76 er in 120.1 ip) in his career in April, 8-14 with a 5.67 ERA in September and 55-35 with a 3.39 ERA in between.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: His .243 opponents batting average broke down to .239 (83-for-348) against righthanded hitters compared to .248 (83-for-335) against left-handers...yielded a .264 average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .185 with RISP and two outs...now has a .191 (75-for-392) career opponents average with RISP and two outs...allowed a .216 opponents average with two outs.

2019 DIVISIONAL PLAY: Was 5-2 with a 5.63 ERA in 17 starts against AL West competition compared to 10-2 with a 2.38 ERA in 16 starts against all other teams...is now 14-15 with a 5.54 ERA (178 er in 289.1 ip) in 55 career appearances against the AL West, 55-44 with a 3.46 ERA (305 er in 793.1 ip) in 150 games against all other opponents...was 4-0 with a 1.88 ERA in six starts against AL Central teams in 2019...is 5-0 with a 1.80 ERA (10 er in 50.0 ip) in eight starts against the Central in his A's career and 18-6 with a 2.96 ERA (81 er in 246.1 ip) in 43 games in his career.

THIS AND THAT: Averaged 87.8 pitches per start, which was fourth fewest in the AL, and 15.7 pitches per inning, which was sixth fewest...induced 17 double plays, which tied for eighth most...opponents stole 13 bases with him on the mound, which tied for fifth most in the AL...however, they were caught stealing five times, which tied for seventh most...had two pickoff errors, which tied for the most in the AL.

NO-HITTER: Tossed his second career no-hitter in the A's 2-0 win on May 7, 2019 in Oakland against Cincinnati (also Aug. 21, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...became the 34th pitcher in Major League history with multiple regular season no-hitters...is the seventh with a no-hitter for multiple teams (Ted Breitenstein, Jim Bunning, Randy Johnson, Hideo Nomo, Nolan Ryan, Cy Young) ... it was the 13th no-hitter in Athletics history, including the eighth in Oakland history.

12-GAME WINNING STREAK: His no-hitter last year began a career-high 12-game winning streak that would span 20 starts from May 7 to Aug. 27...the streak was second longest in Oakland history and fell one short of the record of 13 set by Catfish Hunter in 1973 (June 2-Sept. 5)...compiled a 2.41 ERA and .214 opponents batting average during the streak...was unbeaten in 21 consecutive starts from May 7 to Sept. 3, which matches Lefty Grove (April 22-Aug. 19, 1931) for the longest unbeaten streak by a starter in Athletics history.

WITH THE A'S: Was acquired by Oakland on Aug. 6, 2018 and is 20-6 with a 3.86 ERA (102 er in 237.2 ip) in 43 games, including 42 starts, with the A's...the wins are tied for fifth most in the American League over that span.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (10-5, 3.81 ERA in 2019): Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...went 3-0 with a 3.86 ERA (16 er in 37.1 ip) over his final nine appearances (including six starts) in 2019...the winning streak, which dates back to Aug. 11, matches his career high...went 2-1 with a 3.46 ERA in five games, including three starts, this spring...tied for fourth in the Cactus League in wins...allowed a .190 opponents batting average but issued seven walks in 13.0 innings...pitched four innings of relief last Tuesday at San Francisco (3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 so)...is 2-2 with a 6.33 ERA (21.1 ip, 26 h, 19 r, 15 er, 5 bb, 22 so, 3 hr) in six career appearances, including four starts, against Los Angeles...went 2-0 with a 5.91 ERA (10.2 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 10 so, 2 hr) in two start last year...saw the most extensive action of his five-year career last year, going 10-5 with a 3.81 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 28 games, including 25 starts.

- The A's bullpen tossed 4.1 scoreless innings yesterday and has allowed just one run in 10.1 innings (0.87 ERA)...the 10.1 innings are third most in the majors and the ERA is fifth lowest.
