OAKLAND ATHLETICS (3-1) VS. COLORADO ROCKIES (2-1)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's won three of four from Los Angeles (AL) to start the season and the 3-1 start is the A's best since 2010 when they were also 3-1...2010 was also the last time the A's won the first series of the season (won three of four from Seattle)...have started the season 4-1 once over the previous 15 seasons (2010)...this is the A's 53rd season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (19), Atlanta Braves (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (18) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (7) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4313-3980 (.520) record over the previous 52 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 120th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9028-9452 (.489) in their previous 119 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: After winning three of four from the Angels to open the season, the A's will play their first of 20 games against National League West competition with this two-game series against Colorado...also host Arizona (Aug. 19-20), San Diego (Sept. 4-6) and San Francisco (Sept. 18-20) and travel to San Francisco (Aug. 14-16), Arizona (Aug. 17-18), Colorado (Sept. 15-16) and Los Angeles (Sept. 22-24)...the A's went 11-9 (.550) in interleague play last year, which tied for the 10th best record in the majors...are 228-196 (.538) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this season-opening six-game home-stand against Los Angeles (3-1) and Colorado (two games)...will play 12 of their first 16 games at home...open a four-game series in Seattle on Friday before returning home for a pair of three-game series against Texas and Houston.

PITCHING: Six A's pitchers combined to shutout the Angels on nine hits in the A's 3-0 win yesterday...it was the fourth shutout in Athletics history with six or more pitchers (last: 7 vs. Toronto on July 4, 2014)...the nine hits were the A's most allowed in a shutout since May 23, 2016 against Seattle (also nine)...Oakland has a 2.43 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors...the A's pitching staff has issued 10 walks, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors and tied with the Dodgers for the fewest among teams in the West.

STARTING PITCHING: Chris Bassitt tossed 4.0 scoreless innings yesterday and A's starting pitchers have now tossed fewer than five innings in each of the first four games...that is the A's longest single-season streak since they finished the 2018 season with a five-game streak and it marks the first time in Athletics history they have started the season with a streak longer than two games...Oakland is one of three teams that has not had a starter go at least five innings (San Francisco, Seattle).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: After committing an error on Opening Night, the A's have not made any in three games since then...have a .994 fielding percentage, which is fifth best in the majors and second best in the West.

SHORTENED SEASONS: The A's are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season...this will be the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have played fewer than 161 games in a season...in addition to 1981, the A's played 114 games in 1994, 144 in 1995 and 155 in 1972 (also strike seasons).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 15 pitchers and 15 position players...the roster must be reduced to 28 players on Aug. 6 and 26 on Aug. 20...17 players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Barreto, Canha, Chapman, Davis, Fiers, Grossman, Hendriks, Laureano, Montas, Olson, Petit, Pinder, Piscotty, Semien, Soria, Trivino, Wendelken)...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...seven other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Bassitt, Brown, Diekmann, Luzardo, Manaea, Mengden, Murphy) for a total of 24 players who were with the organi-

zation last year...four were acquired in a trade (Allen, Kemp, Machin, Smith), one was claimed off waivers (McFarland) and one was signed as a free agent to a minor league contract (Weems).

TENURE: None of the 30 players on the A's Opening Day roster played for Oakland prior to the 2015 season...only two players have played for Oakland in each of the previous five seasons (Canha, Semien) and of those two, only Semien has been on each of the A's last six Opening Day rosters...only two have been on the last five Opening Day rosters (Davis, Hendriks)...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest tenure in the A's organization...he is followed by Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have five rookies on the Opening Day roster (Brown, Luzardo, Machin, Murphy, Weems) after starting the year with no rookies in each of the previous two seasons...five players have six or more years of service: Soria (13 years), Petit (9 years, 16 days), Diekmann (7 years, 50 days), Davis (6 years, 104 days) and Fiers (6 years, 85 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 28.77 years...Jesus Luzardo, who is 22 years and 298 days, is the youngest and he is the youngest player on an A's Opening Day roster since 2010 (Brett Anderson, 22 years and 63 days)...he is followed by Franklin Barreto (24 years, 148 days) and Sean Murphy (25 years, 294 days) ...Joakim Soria is the oldest at 36 years, 67 days...he is followed by Yusmeiro Petit (35 years, 245 days) and Mike Fiers (35 years, 39 days).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with one player on the injured list (Puk)...it marks the first time Oakland has fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...the last time the A's opened the season with one player on the IL was in 2006 when they had none...have used the IL twice this year after using it 17 time last year...the 17 IL placements in 2019 tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13).

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 13-10 (.565) during the spring...it marked Oakland's second consecutive spring with a winning record after three straight losing springs...started the spring 0-5, won 13 of the final 16 games in Arizona and then went 0-2 against San Francisco in July...the A's led the majors this spring with 102 walks and 13 sacrifice flies and topped the Cactus League with a .352 on-base percentage...also ranked third in the CL in doubles (45), fourth in runs (132), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in hits (201)...had the third fewest home runs (21)...the pitching staff had the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.286) and fifth highest ERA (5.39), but tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (23)...defensively, tied for third in the CL in double plays turned (21) and ranked fifth in fielding percentage (.982).

NUMBER CHANGES: Franklin Barreto will switch to #4 and Burch Smith is now wearing #46.

A's vs. ROCKIES: This is the first meeting between the A's and Rockies since 2018 when the Rockies swept a three-game series at Colorado, July 27-29...last met in Oakland in 2015 when the A's won two of three from June 29-July 1...the A's trail in the all-time series, 15-16...are 9-5 in Oakland and 6-11 in Denver...have won four of their 10 season series with the Rockies, including three 3-0 sweeps.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is scheduled to play in his 356th game as the designated hitter today, which passes Mitchell Page for second most in A's history...the record is 428 by Dave Kingman...**Yusmeiro Petit** has pitched in three of the first four games and has not allowed a run...has 265.2 innings pitched as a reliever dating back to 2017, which are the most in the majors over that span...**Marcus Semien** has a consecutive games played streak of 247 dating back to June 28, 2018 (all starts)...has started each of the A's last 137 games in the leadoff spot.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1989**, after both teams score a run in the 10th inning, Carney Lansford's 11th inning single scores Stan Javier with the winning run in the A's 8-7 victory over Seattle...in **2002** Miguel Tejada has six RBI, David Justice hits his 300th career home run and the A's score 11 times in their final two at bats to win at Texas, 12-2...in **2009** Adam Kennedy goes 5 for 7 in the A's 9-8 win at Boston...it is the first of two five-hit games for Kennedy in 2009.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (5-2, 4.83 ERA in 2019)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...it will be his first appearance of any kind since 2019 as he was on the 60-day injured list from Feb. 15 to July 22 and did not pitching during the spring or the two exhibition games against San Francisco in July...underwent right elbow surgery Feb. 10 at TMI Sports Medicine and Orthopedics in Arlington, Tex...the arthroscopic surgery was performed by Dr. Keith Meister, who debrided Mengden's elbow and shaved off a small spur on the posterior aspect of the olecranon...begins his fifth season in the majors and is on his second Opening Day roster (2018).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Tossed six scoreless innings for the win in his only interleague start last year on June 26 at St. Louis...has won each of his last four interleague starts dating back to Sept. 15, 2017 (29.0 ip, 15 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 22 so, 0.93 ERA)...has two two-hit shutouts during the streak (Sept. 15, 2017 at Philadelphia and May 26, 2018 vs. Arizona)...is 5-3 with a 2.78 ERA (18 er in 58.1 ip) in nine career interleague starts compared to 12-16 with a 5.16 ERA (133 er in 232.0 ip) in 47 games against the American League.

MENGDEN vs. COLORADO: Is making his first career appearance.

2019 RECAP: Was 5-2 with a save and a 4.83 ERA in 13 games, including nine starts, over three stints with Oakland...the save was the first of his career but his ERA, opponents batting average (.254), on-base percentage (.331), slugging percentage (.422) and OPS (.753) were his highest over the last three years...struck out 42 and walked 27 for a career-low strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.56.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: Held righthanded hitters to a .173 (18-for-104) batting average compared to .320 (41-for-128) against lefthanders...yielded 17 of his 24 extra base hits and issued 21 of his 27 walks to lefties...had a .514 OPS against right-handers, .940 against left-handers...entered the season with a .248 average and .740 OPS in his career against righties compared to .251 with a .720 OPS against lefties...allowed a .180 average against batters leading off an inning and walked just three for a .219 on-base percentage...now has a .213 average and .246 on-base percentage in that situation in his career...had a .179 opponents average with no outs, .345 with one and .229 with two...opponents hit .279 with runners in scoring position...had a .299 opponents average and six of his seven home runs over his first 45 pitches in a game, .209 after that...the opponents number three hitter was 2-for-30 (.067) off him.

2019 STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 5-2 with a 4.22 ERA and .712 OPS in his nine starting assignments and 0-0 with a 7.59 ERA and .923 OPS in four relief appearances...two of those appearances came in relief of an opener...the A's were 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments and 2-2 (.500) when he pitched in relief...over the previous two years, Oakland is 17-9 (.654) in his starts and 3-6 (.333) in his relief appearances...is 16-19 with a 4.78 ERA in 47 career starts compared to 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA in nine relief appearances.

2019 HOME AND AWAY: Was 3-0 with a 5.33 ERA in six games on the road, 2-2 with a 4.41 ERA in seven games at home...is now 12-5 with a 4.62 ERA in 25 career outings on the road compared to 5-14 with a 4.73 ERA in 31 appearances in the Coliseum.

2019 OAKLAND HIGHLIGHTS: Was recalled from Las Vegas the first time on May 12 and tossed a season-high 100 pitches in his first start that day against Cleveland...allowed four runs in 5.1 innings for the loss...it snapped a nine-game winning streak in interdivision games and was his first loss against a non-AL West team since May 29, 2017 at Cleveland...then went 1-0 with a 1.76 ERA and .203 opponents batting average over his next three games (two starts)...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings and allowed just one run on three hits and two walks for his first win on May 18 at Detroit...it began a career-high five-game winning streak that spanned eight games, including six starts, from May 18 to July 16...compiled a 3.89 ERA and .244 opponents batting average during the streak...allowed just one run in 4.0 innings in his next start May 24 against Seattle but walked a career-high tying five and threw 99 pitches in a no decision in a 6-2 A's win...pitched in relief of "opener" Liam Hendriks May 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and struck out a season-high six batters in 4.1 innings...then pitched in relief of "opener" Joakim Soria in the A's 10-9 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on June 5 and allowed a season-high six runs in 2.1 innings...was optioned to Las Vegas the next day after going 1-1 with a 5.09 ERA in three starts and two relief appearances...returned to Oakland June 26 and combined with Petit, Soria and Hendriks on a five-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win that day at St. Louis...did not walk a batter in three consecutive starts from July 2 to 16...tossed at least five innings in each start and the streak of three consecutive starts with no walks

and five or more innings tied for the third-longest such streak in Oakland history...allowed five runs on a season-high eight hits in 5.2 innings July 2 against Minnesota but picked up the win in an 8-6 A's victory...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-4 win at Seattle July 7, snapping a six-game losing streak against AL West teams...it was his first win against a division foe since Oct. 1, 2017 at Texas...tossed a season-high tying 7.0 innings in a 9-2 win over the Mariners on July 16...walked a career-high tying five batters in 3.1 innings in a no decision at Minnesota on July 21...allowed four runs that day and four more in 5.1 innings July 26 against Texas and was 4-1 with a 4.68 ERA in six starts during his second stint when he was optioned back to the Aviators Aug. 1...went 3-1 despite a 5.74 ERA in five starts in July...it was just the second time he won more than two games in a month (4 in May, 2018)...was recalled by the A's Sept. 9 when Las Vegas' season ended and pitched twice in September, both times in relief (4.50 ERA)...recorded his first Major League save Sept. 10 at Houston when he tossed the final three innings of the A's 21-7 win (4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...added a scoreless inning of relief in his final outing on Sept. 21 against Texas...was not on the A's roster for the Wild Card game.

2019 WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 4-3 with a 4.22 ERA in 13 games, including 10 starts, with Triple-A Las Vegas...the ERA was his highest as a minor leaguer...struck out 61 batters in 64.0 innings (8.58 per nine innings)...allowed a .228 opponents batting average, which broke down to .227 (22-for-97) against left-handed hitters compared to .228 (34-for-149) against right-handers...his career minor league splits are .219 against lefties, .239 against righties...yielded a .186 batting average and .262 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .281 with runners in scoring position...was 4-2 with a 3.47 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in nine games before the All-Star Break, 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA and .283 opponents average in four games after the break...is now 18-5 with a 2.47 ERA in 44 career games before the break, 12-9 with a 3.97 ERA in 38 games after the break...was 3-3 with a 3.91 ERA in his 10 starts, 1-0 with a 5.40 ERA in three relief appearances...tossed at least three innings in each of his relief appearances.

2019 LAS VEGAS HIGHLIGHTS: Was the Aviators Opening Day starting pitcher and had a no decision in a 9-8 win at El Paso on April 4...allowed four runs in 5.0 innings and left with a 6-4 lead...made his first relief appearance on April 9 against Sacramento in relief of a rehabbing Chris Bassitt...allowed one unearned run on one hit in 6.0 innings of relief and struck out a season-high nine for the win...that began a three-game winning streak where he went 3-0 with a 2.37 ERA and .149 opponents batting average over a three-start stretch from April 9-20...tossed a season-high 100 pitches and allowed five runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings April 15 against Fresno but still picked up the win...logged a seasonhigh 7.0 scoreless innings and yielded just two hits in an 11-0 win at Fresno April 20...had his three-game winning streak snapped April 26 against El Paso when he had season highs in runs (6) and hits (8) and a season low in innings pitched (3.0) in an 8-6 loss...was 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA in seven games (six starts) when the A's called for the first time on May 12...was sent back to Las Vegas June 6 and started and won June 10 against San Antonio...pitched in relief for the second time June 16 at Memphis in a game started by "opener" Brian Schlitter and allowed five runs on five hits in 4.1 innings...returned to Oakland a second time June 26 but was back with Aviators following an Aug. 1 option...went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA in four games, three starts, in August...matched his season low in innings pitched (3.0) in a start on Aug. 4 against Oklahoma City and a relief appearance Aug. 16 against Albuquerque...made one postseason start for Las Vegas and had a no decision in Game 1 of the Pacific Coast League Semifinals on Sept. 4 at Sacramento, a 9-3 Aviators win (4.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 6 so).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Frankie Montas (0-0, 2.25 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...made his first career Opening Day start in his first outing last Friday against Los Angeles (AL) and had a no decision in the A's 7-3, 10-inning win (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against the Rockies, a start in the A's in the A's 3-2 loss at Colorado on July 29, 2018 (4.1 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...went 1-0 and did not allow an earned run in three spring starts...yielded two unearned runs in 5.2 innings...opponents went 4-for-22 (.182) and he walked just one batter in 5.2 innings...went 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA in 16 starts last year in a season shortened due to an 80-game suspension for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...his ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.282) and OPS (.646).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

Saves/Opportunities: 2-for-3 (66.7%)

- The A's bullpen has a 15.1-inning scoreless streak and has allowed just two runs (one earned) in 20.1 innings for the season...has a 0.44 ERA, which is second lowest in the majors to Cleveland (no earned runs in 9.0 innings)...rank fourth in the majors in innings pitched.
- The pen has been credited with all three of the A's wins, marking the first time in Oakland history the pen has three wins in the A's first four games...are one of two pens in the majors with three wins (Tampa Bay).
- Compiled a 3.89 ERA last year, which was fourth lowest in the AL...had the lowest opponents OPS (.693) and slugging percentage (.385) and ranked third in opponents batting average (.232) and on-base percentage (.308).
- However, had a Major League leading and Oakland record 30 blown saves, which were the most blown saves by an American League team since Seattle had 31 in 2008...converted 45-of-75 (60.0%) save opportunities...ranked fifth in the AL in saves but had the fifth lowest save percentage.
- Set Oakland records for holds (110) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.37).
- Had the lowest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the majors (.342) and the fifth lowest OPS (.651)...had 156 first batter strikeouts, which was fourth most in the AL and the most in Oakland history.
- Allowed 82-of-255 (32.2%) inherited runners to score, which was sixth highest in the AL.

- Has pitched in three of the first four games and has not allowed a run (2.2 ip).
- Has a 10.67 ERA (14.1 ip, 19 h, 17 r, 17 er, 5 bb, 20 so, 2 hr) in 21 career appearances against Colorado...last faced the Rockies on Sept. 23, 2018 at Arizona (1.0 ip, 2 so).
- Begins his ninth season in the majors and has played for five teams...is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2014-16, 18-20).
- Posted an 8.53 ERA and .385 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven relief appearances during the spring...including an outing last week against San Francisco (0.2 ip, 2 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...tied for sixth in the Cactus League in appearances (7).

Last Year: Began the season with Kansas City and was 0-6 with a 4.75 ERA in 48 relief appearances when he was traded to Oakland on July 27...went 1-1 with a 4.43 ERA in 28 games with the A's and had a 4.65 ERA in a career-high 76 relief appearances overall.

16 RHP LIAM HENDRIKS

- Tossed the final 1.1 innings Sunday against Los Angeles (AL) for his first save of the season...it was his fifth career save of more than three outs (had four last year)...was tagged with the blown save in his first outing on Friday.
- Had a 0.84 ERA in 10 interleague appearances last year.
- The Rockies are one of two teams he has never faced in his career (Arizona).
- Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his eighth Opening Day roster (2012-13, 15-20)...it is his fifth straight with the A's.
