OAKLAND ATHLETICS (3-4) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (4-4)

SATURDAY, AUGUST 1, 2020 — T-MOBILE PARK — 6:10 PDT RHP MIKE FIERS (0-0, 9.00) VS. LHP YUSEI KIKUCHI (0-0, 12.27) NBCSCA — A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO — A'S RADIO NETWORK (960 AM, 103.7 FM AND 1140 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost three straight after winning three of the first four games...the three-game losing streak is the A's longest since July 24-26, 2019 when they also lost three straight (went the final 56 games of 2019 without losing more than two in a row)...have not lost more than three straight games since a five-game losing streak from May 28-June 2, 2019... are 3-4, which marks the seventh consecutive season Oakland has been either one game over .500 or one game under .500 after seven games...are in third place in the American League West, one game behind Houston...have spent six days this year tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third...the game last night began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 30 of the next 31 days through Aug. 30 (off on Aug. 13)...this is the A's 53rd season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships... only the New York Yankees (19), Atlanta Braves (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (18) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (7) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)... this is the Athletics franchise 120th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 0-1 on their first road trip of the season, which consists of this four-game series against Seattle...these are the A's only road games over the first 16 games of the season...went 3-3 on the season-opening six-game homestand against Los Angeles (3-1) and Colorado (0-2)...return home following the game Monday for a six-game homestand against Texas (three games) and Houston (three games).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in each of the first seven games, which is the longest single-season streak by an A's team since Aug. 9-20, 1997 when they had an 11-game streak...starters are now 0-4 with a 5.10 ERA (17 er in 30.0 ip)...are one of five teams (Kansas City, San Francisco, Tampa Bay, Washington) without a win from their starters...have issued just eight walks for an average of 2.40 per nine innings, which is the lowest in the West and fifth lowest in the majors...Frankie Montas tossed 5.0 innings Wednesday after A's starting pitchers logged fewer than five innings in each of the first five games...prior to this year, had never gone more than two straight games without at least five innings from a starter to begin a season in Athletics history.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .177 (22-for-124) with 10 runs scored over the last four games after hitting .215 with 14 runs over the first three contests... are batting .194 overall, which is third lowest in the majors...also have the third lowest slugging percentage (.304) and OPS (.589) and the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.285)...are 1-for-20 (.050) with runners in scoring position over the last three games after going 6-for-19 (.316) in four games against Los Angeles (AL)...are batting .179 (7-for-39) with RISP for the season, which is third lowest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed just one home run over the last four games and four for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the majors...have issued just 19 walks, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors and is the fewest among teams in the West divisions...rank third in the West and seventh in the majors in ERA (3.43).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in each of the last two games, which has led to two unearned runs in each game...now have five unearned runs for the season, which is tied for fifth most in the majors... are tied for the ninth most errors (5)...last year, the A's set an Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80) and fewest unearned runs (34)...Oakland pitchers have committed three of the A's five errors and are tied with Pittsburgh for the most errors among pitching staffs in the majors.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for this four-game road trip to Seattle features left-handed pitcher Lucas Luetge, catcher Jonah Heim and infielder Nate Orf...Heim is the only one of the three currently on the 40-man roster and Luetge (Seattle, 2012-15) and Orf (Milwaukee, 2018) are the only ones with Major League experience.

SHORTENED SEASONS: The A's are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season...this will be the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have played fewer than 161 games in a season...in addition to 1981,

the A's played 114 games in 1994, 144 in 1995 and 155 in 1972 (also strike seasons).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with one player on the injured list (Puk)...it marks the first time Oakland has fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...the last time the A's opened the season with one player on the IL was in 2006 when they had none...have used the IL twice this year after using it 17 times last year... the 17 IL placements in 2019 tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 15 pitchers and 15 position players...the roster must be reduced to 28 players on Aug. 6 and 26 on Aug. 20...17 players returned from last years Opening Day roster...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...seven other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year for a total of 24 players who were with the organization last year...four were acquired in a trade (Allen, Kemp, Machin, Smith), one was claimed off waivers (McFarland) and one was signed as a free agent to a minor league contract (Weems)...only two players on the A's Opening Day roster have played for Oakland in each of the previous five seasons (Canha, Semien) and of those two, only Semien has been on each of the A's last six Opening Day rosters...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest tenure in the A's organization...the A's have five rookies on the Opening Day roster (Brown, Luzardo, Machín, Murphy, Weems) after starting the year with no rookies in each of the previous two seasons...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 28.77 years...Jesús Luzardo, who is 22 years and 298 days, is the youngest and he is the youngest player on an A's Opening Day roster since 2010 (Brett Anderson, 22 years and 63 days)...Joakim Soria is the oldest at 36 years, 67 days...he is followed by Yusmeiro Petit (35 years, 245 days) and Mike Fiers (35 years, 39 days).

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 13-10 (.565) during the spring...it marked Oakland's second consecutive spring with a winning record after three straight losing springs...started the sping 0-5, won 13 of the final 16 games in Arizona and then went 0-2 against San Francisco in July...the A's led the majors this spring with 102 walks and 13 sacrifice flies and topped the Cactus League with a .352 on-base percentage...also ranked third in the CL in doubles (45), fourth in runs (132), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in hits (201)...had the third fewest home runs (21)...the pitching staff had the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.286) and fifth highest ERA (5.39), but tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (23)...defensively, tied for third in the CL in double plays turned (21) and ranked fifth in fielding percentage (.982).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2020 last night after going 10-9 against the Mariners last year...it was their first season series win over Seattle since 2012...went 6-2 in Oakland, 0-2 in Tokyo and 4-5 in Seattle... have won 10 of their last 16 games but are 56-78 (.418) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 360-302 against the Mariners...that includes 195-134 in Oakland, 164-165 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 88-101 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yusmeiro Petit has 266.0 innings pitched as a reliever dating back to 2017, which are the most in the majors over that span....Marcus Semien has a consecutive games played streak of 250 dating back to June 28, 2018 (all starts)...has started each of the A's last 140 games in the leadoff spot...J.B. Wendelken has not allowed a run in his first three games (2.0 ip) and now has a 13-game, 14.2-inning scoreless streak dating back to May 9 of last year.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1976 the A's steal a club record 12 bases in an 8-7, 12 inning loss in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota...in that game, Craig Kusick's eighth inning homer off Vida Blue snaps Blue's club record string of 140.2 innings without a home run...in 1988 Jose Canseco hits his 100th career home run off Melido Perez in the A's 10-2 win at Chicago...in 1999 Miguel Tejada, Eric Chavez, Jason Giambi and John Jaha all homer in the fourth inning of the A's 10-6 win over Tampa Bay...the four home runs in an inning ties the Oakland record...in 2009 Rickey Henderson becomes the fifth player in Athletics history to have his uniform retired when the A's retire #24.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (0-0, 9.00 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...begins his 10th season in the majors and is with his fourth team...has pitched for Milwaukee (2011-15), Houston (2015-17), Detroit (2018) and Oakland (2018-present)...is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2013, 15-17, 19-20).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday in Oakland...did not walk or strikeout a batter in 4.0 innings...it was his first career start with no walks and no strikeouts...the A's scored five times in the first and he allowed a three-run home run to Trout in the third inning...was relieved by Petit with runners on first and third and no outs in the fifth and Petit allowed one of those runners to score.

FIERS vs. SEATTLE: Is 3-2 with a 5.93 ERA (57.2 ip, 61 h, 39 r, 38 er, 13 bb, 48 so, 16 hr) in 12 career starts...that includes 1-1 with a 4.40 ERA (15 er in 30.2 ip) in six starts at T-Mobile Park, 2-0 with a 5.74 ERA (10 er in 15.2 ip) in three starts in the Coliseum, 0-0 with an 8.64 ERA (8 er in 8.1 ip) in two starts at Minute Maid Park and 0-1 with a 15.00 ERA (5 er in 3.0 ip) in one start in the Tokyo Dome...went 1-1 with a 5.21 ERA (19.0 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 7 bb, 14 so, 4 hr) in four starts last year...the loss came in a 9-7 A's loss on Opening

Day, March 20 in Tokyo...Oakland scored single runs in each of the first two innings but he allowed five runs in the third on a Gordon RBI single and a Santana grand slam...the A's scored twice in the bottom third to narrow the gap to 5-4 and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the fourth...then had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Seattle May 13, his first start after his no-hitter...had his hitless streak broken up when Haniger homered to lead off the bottom of the first...however, that was the only run he would allow in five innings of work and he would yield just one more hit...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth with the A's leading 2-1 and Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Trivino allowed three runs in the eighth for the blown save.. picked up the win in a 6-5 victory in Oakland on May 25...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Haniger in the third...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Santana in the fourth...had a 5-2 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Haniger in the fifth...was relieved by Buchter to start the seventh with the A's leading 5-3...then had another no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle on Sept. 27...Oakland scored a run in the first but he allowed a run to score on a Seager ground out in the bottom of the first and another run in the third on a Nola RBI single...left after five innings trailing 2-1 but the A's scored twice in the seventh to get him off the hook.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-3 with a 5.51 ERA in five starts during the spring...however, held the opposition to a .210 batting average...the five starts tied for the most in the majors...his 16.1 innings pitched led the Cactus League and ranked fifth in the majors...is now 7-11 with a 5.96 ERA (77 er in 116.1 ip) in 43 games, including 31 starts, in his career during the spring.

OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304)...also tied for third in wild pitches (13) and tied for fifth in games started...had career highs in wins, games (33), games started, innings pitched (184.2) and winning percentage...led the A's in wins, starts, innings pitched, runs (82), walks (53) and home runs (30)...is the first A's pitcher to win 15 games since Scott Kazmir had 15 in 2014 and the first to make 33 starts since Sonny Gray had 33 in 2014...his innings pitched were the most by an A's pitcher over the last three years... his .789 winning percentage was fourth best in Oakland history among pitchers with 15 or more decisions...his 30 home runs tied for 10th most in a season in Oakland history...struck out 126 batters, an average of 6.14 per nine innings...that was the third-lowest mark in the AL...had the fifth-lowest strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.38)...the A's were 22-11 (.667) in his starting assignments in 2019 and are 31-12 (.721) in his career...left with the lead in eight of his no decisions in 2019 only to have the bullpen blow the save...has left with the lead in 12 of his 43 career starts with the A's only to have the bullpen blow the save.

BEGINNING, MIDDLE AND END: Went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA, .297 opponents batting average and .854 OPS over his first eight starts last year, 10-0 with a 2.12 ERA, .199 opponents average and .572 OPS over his next 17 starts from May 7-Aug. 9 and 3-1 with a 6.27 ERA, .304 opponents average and .940 OPS over his final eight starts.

2019 HOME AND AWAY: Was 9-2 with a 2.90 ERA and .641 OPS in 17 starts at home compared to 6-2 with a 5.14 ERA and .796 OPS in 16 starts on the road...had the fifth-lowest home ERA in the AL and the fourth-highest road ERA...tied for fourth in the AL in home wins and ranked eighth in OPS...one of his home losses was in Tokyo and he is now 12-1 with a 2.82 (43 er in 137.1) ERA in 23 starts in the Coliseum since he was acquired from Detroit on Aug. 6, 2018...is 7-0 with a 2.66 ERA (26 er in 88.0 ip) over his last 14 home starts and has not lost at home since April 20, 2019 vs. Toronto...is 13-3 with a 3.19 ERA (59 er in 166.2 ip) and .224 (135-for-604) opponents batting average in 29 career games, including 28 starts, in the Coliseum.

2019 NIGHT AND DAY: Was 11-2 with a 3.66 ERA and .683 OPS in 24 starts at night, 4-2 with a 4.60 ERA and .800 OPS in nine starts during the day...tied for fifth in the AL in night wins and ranked seventh in ERA and OPS...is now 16-3 with a 3.62 ERA (75 er in 186.2 ip) in 33 career appearances at night with the A's.

2019 DAYS REST: Compiled an 11-1 record and a 3.21 ERA in 17 starts on five days rest and is now 14-1 with a 3.13 ERA (46 er in 132.1 ip) in 22 starts on five days rest in his A's career...went 2-1 with a 4.59 ERA in 10 starts on four days rest and 2-2 with a 5.10 ERA in six starts on six days rest or more.

2019 MONTH BY MONTH: Was 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA in five starts in April, 1-1 with a 7.84 ERA in five starts in September and 12-1 with a 2.59 ERA in 21 starts in May, June, July and August...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in his career in April, 8-14 with a 5.67 ERA in September and 55-35 with a 3.42 ERA (300 er in 789.0) in between.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: His .243 opponents batting average broke down to .239 (83-for-348) against righthanded hitters compared to .248 (83-for-335) against left-handers...yielded a .264 average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .185 with RISP and two outs...now has a .191 (75-for-393) career opponents average with RISP and two outs...allowed a .216 opponents average with two outs.

2019 DIVISIONAL PLAY: Was 5-2 with a 5.63 ERA in 17 starts against AL West competition compared to 10-2 with a 2.38 ERA in 16 starts against all other teams...is now 14-15 with a 5.58 ERA (182 er in 293.1 ip) in 56 career appearances against the AL West, 55-44 with a 3.46 ERA (305 er in 793.1 ip) in 150 games against all other opponents.

THIS AND THAT: Averaged 87.8 pitches per start, which was fourth fewest in the AL, and 15.7 pitches per inning, which was sixth fewest...induced 17 double plays, which tied for eighth most...opponents stole 13 bases with him on the mound, which tied for fifth most in the AL...however, they were caught stealing five times, which tied for seventh most...had two pickoff errors, which tied for the most in the AL.
