OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-4) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (4-5)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their season-high three-game losing streak last night and are now 4-4 to start the season...the three-game losing streak was the A'S longest since July 24-26, 2019 when they also lost three straight (went the final 56 games of 2019 without losing more than two in a row)... are tied with Houston for first place in the American League West for the sixth time in the last seven days...have spent seven days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third...the game Friday night began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 30 of the next 31 days through Aug. 30 (off on Aug. 13)...this is the A's 53rd season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (19), Atlanta Braves (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (18) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (7) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 120th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

EXTRA INNINGS AND ONE-RUN GAMES: The A's improved to 2-0 in extra innings with the win last night...the two extra inning games are tied with Toronto for the most in the majors but the A's are the only team with two wins...the 3-2 victory last night was the A's first one-run game of the season.

STARTING PITCHING: Mike Fiers became the first A's starting pitcher to toss more than five innings last night with an outing of 6.0 innings...had a no decision and A's starting pitchers have now gone the first eight games of the season without a win...that is the third longest season-opening streak in Oakland history (10 in 1979 and 1997)...starters are now 0-4 with a 4.75 ERA (19 er in 36.0 ip) and the A's are one of five teams (Kansas City, San Francisco, Tampa Bay, Washington) without a win from their starters...have issued just nine walks for an average of 2.25 per nine innings, which is the lowest in the West and fifth lowest in the majors.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have not allowed a home run in the last three games, which matches their longest such streak over the last two years...have surrendered just four home runs overall, which is tied for third fewest in the majors...have issued just 22 walks, which is the fewest among teams in the West divisions...rank third in the West and sixth in the majors in ERA (3.21)... have the fifth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.331) and OPS (.625) in the majors .

OFFENSE: The A's have scored three runs or fewer in each of the last five games and are batting .177 (28-for-158) with 13 runs scored over that stretch...have won two of those five games...are now batting .191 for the season, which is third lowest in the majors...also have the third lowest OPS (.579) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.307)...are averaging the fourth fewest runs per game (3.38)...are 3-for-30 (.100) with runners in scoring position over the last four games and are batting .184 (9-for-49) with RISP for the season, which is fourth lowest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in three consecutive games and now have six for the season, which is tied for sixth most in the majors...the errors have led to five unearned runs, which is tied for seventh most...last year, the A's set an Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80) and fewest unearned runs (34)...Oakland pitchers have committed three of the A's five errors and are tied with Pittsburgh and San Diego for the most errors among pitching staffs in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 1-1 on their first road trip of the season, which consists of this four-game series against Seattle...these are the A's only road games over the first 16 games of the season...went 3-3 on the season-opening six-game homestand against Los Angeles (3-1) and Colorado (0-2)...return home following the game tomorrow for a six-game homestand against Texas (three games) and Houston (three games).

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for this four-game road trip to Seattle features left-handed pitcher Lucas Luetge, catcher Jonah Heim and infielder Nate Orf...Heim is the only one of the three currently on the 40-man roster and Luetge (Seattle, 2012-15) and Orf (Milwaukee, 2018) are the only ones with Major League experience.

SHORTENED SEASONS: The A's are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season...this will be the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have played fewer than 161 games in a season...in addition to 1981, the A's played 114 games in 1994, 144 in 1995 and 155 in 1972 (also strike seasons).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with one player on the injured list (Puk)...it marks the first time Oakland has fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...the last time the A's opened the season with one player on the IL was in 2006 when they had none...have used the IL twice this year after using it 17 times last year... the 17 IL placements in 2019 tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 15 pitchers and 15 position players...the roster must be reduced to 28 players on Aug. 6 and 26 on Aug. 20...17 players returned from last years Opening Day roster...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...seven other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year for a total of 24 players who were with the organization last year...four were acquired in a trade (Allen, Kemp, Machín, Smith), one was claimed off waivers (McFarland) and one was signed as a free agent to a minor league contract (Weems)...only two players on the A's Opening Day roster have played for Oakland in each of the previous five seasons (Canha, Semien) and of those two, only Semien has been on each of the A's last six Opening Day rosters...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest tenure in the A's organization...the A's have five rookies on the Opening Day roster (Brown, Luzardo, Machín, Murphy, Weems) after starting the year with no rookies in each of the previous two seasons...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 28.77 years...Jesús Luzardo, who is 22 years and 298 days, is the youngest and he is the youngest player on an A's Opening Day roster since 2010 (Brett Anderson, 22 years and 63 days)...Joakim Soria is the oldest at 36 years, 67 days...he is followed by Yusmeiro Petit (35 years, 245 days) and Mike Fiers (35 years, 39 days).

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 13-10 (.565) during the spring...it marked Oakland's second consecutive spring with a winning record after three straight losing springs...started the sping 0-5, won 13 of the final 16 games in Arizona and then went 0-2 against San Francisco in July...the A's led the majors with 102 walks and topped the Cactus League with a .352 on-base percentage...also ranked third in the CL in doubles (45), fourth in runs (132), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in hits (201)...had the third fewest home runs (21)...the pitching staff had the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.286) and fifth highest ERA (5.39), but tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (23)...defensively, tied for third in the CL in double plays turned (21) and ranked fifth in fielding percentage (.982).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have split the first two meetings of 2020 after going 10-9 against the Mariners last year...it was their first season series win over Seattle since 2012...went 6-2 in Oakland, 0-2 in Tokyo and 4-5 in Seattle...have won 11 of their last 17 games but are 57-78 (.422) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 361-302 against the Mariners...that includes 195-134 in Oakland, 165-165 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 89-101 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ramón Laureano had his first assist of the season last night...now has 20 assists since making his Major League debut on Aug. 3, 2018, which are four more than any other outfielder over that span.... Yusmeiro Petit allowed a single to the first batter he faced this year but has retired each of the 11 batters he has faced since then... Marcus Semien has a consecutive games played streak of 251 dating back to June 28, 2018 (all starts)...has started each of the A's last 141 games in the leadoff spot.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1924** Joe Hauser becomes the second American Leaguer to hit three home runs in a game...he also adds a double for a then-record **14** total bases...in **1933** Mickey Cochrane hits for the cycle for the second time in his career but the A's lose to New York, **16-3**...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches a five-hit shutout as the A's defeat Kansas City 5-0...it follows a three-hit shutout by Ken Holtzman, which followed a two-hit shutout by Vida Blue.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his second Opening Day roster...his other was in 2016 with Oakland...did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 12-8 with a 3.54 ERA (77 er in 195.2 ip) and is averaging 8.60 strikeouts per nine innings (187 so in 195.2 ip) in 40 games (33 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his first start but had a no decision...is now 3-0 with a 3.46 ERA (16 er in 41.1 ip) over his last 10 appearances (including seven starts) dating back to Aug. 11, 2019... the winning streak matches his career high...has walked just nine (1.96 per nine innings) while striking out 45 (9.80 per nine innings) in 41.1 innings during the streak...has not lost since July 24, 2019 at Houston.

LAST START: He combined with five A's relievers on a nine-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Monday in Oakland...had a no decision as he tossed four innings...allowed five of the hits and walked a batter but ended up stranding five base runners (also had a GIDP)...was relieved by Smith to start the fifth inning with the A's leading 3-0.

BASSITT vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-4 with a 4.58 ERA (35.1 ip, 33 h, 20 r, 18 er, 23 bb, 20 so, 2 hr) in eight career appearances, including six starts...is 0-2 with a 5.25 ERA (14 er in 24.0 ip) in six games in Seattle and 0-2 with a 3.97 ERA (5 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland...was 0-2 with a 7.36 ERA (11.0 ip, 12 h, 10 r, 9 er, 6 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in three games,

including two starts, last year...the first loss came in a start on June 14 in Oakland, a 9-2 A's loss...the A's scored a run in the second but he allowed a Seager sacrifice fly in the third...Oakland came back with a run in the bottom of the third but he allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a Crawford two-run double and a Gordon sacrifice fly...also lost in a start in a 6-3 decison at Seattle July 6...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth on a pair of two-run home runs by Vogelbach and Seager...was relieved by Wang with runners on first and second and one out in the fifth and Wang allowed both runners to score...also pitched in relief on Sept. 29 at Seattle in a 3-1 loss (1.0 ip, 2 bb, 2 so).

2019 RECAP: Saw the most extensive action of his five-year career, going 10-5 with a 3.81 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 28 games, including 25 starts...had career highs in every category except losses as he was 4-14 in 40 games over his first four years...had career lows in opponents onbase percentage (.303) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.94)...led the A's with 141 strikeouts, which were the most by an Oakland pitcher since Sonny Gray had 169 in 2015...tied an Oakland record and tied for third in the American League with 13 hit batters...shares the record with Barry Zito, who did it three times (2001, 2005 and 2006)...went 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents average over his first five starts through May 16 and 3-3 with a 6.00 ERA and .249 opponents average over his next nine starts leading into the All-Star Break...then went 5-1 with a 3.26 ERA in 14 games after the break...

his post-break ERA was seventh lowest in the AL among pitchers with 60 or more innings.

2019 STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season with 25 starts and concluded the year with three relief appearances...was 10-5 with a 3.95 ERA in his starting assignments, with his last coming on Sept. 13...did not allow a run in 5.0 innings in relief...is 14-19 with a 3.90 ERA (135 er in 311.2 ip) in 56 career starts, 0-0 with a 2.60 ERA in 13 relief appearances...retired all three of his first batters faced in relief and they are 1-for-10 (.100) with two walks and a hit by pitch in his career.

2019 HOME AND AWAY: Went 6-2 with a 3.01 ERA in 13 games at home in 2019 compared to 4-3 with a 4.54 ERA in 15 games on the road...surrendered five home runs in 68.2 innings at home, 16 in 75.1 innings on the road... is now 7-9 with a 2.79 ERA (48 er in 155.0 ip) in 30 career games in the Coliseum, 7-10 with a 4.64 ERA (95 er in 184.1 ip) in 39 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 11 home runs in 155.0 career innings in Oakland (0.64 per nine innings).

2019 NIGHT AND DAY: Was 7-2 with a 2.97 ERA in 14 games during the day, 3-3 with a 4.82 ERA in 14 games at night...tied for third in the AL in day wins... entered the season with a 0-8 record during the day

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING AVERAGE: His opponents batting average broke down to .209 (58-for-278) against left-handed hitters compared to .251 (67-for-267) against right-handers...the mark against lefties was sixth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings...surrendered 14 of his 21 home runs and issued 29 of his 47 walks to lefties for a .701 OPS...had a .695 OPS against righties...yielded a .221 average with runners in scoring position...had a .206 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .266 the second time and .211 after that...surrendered 12 of his 21 home runs the second time through the lineup.

2019 RUN SUPPORT: Had a run support average of 6.69, which was ninth highest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings...received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 25 starts and went 2-5 in those games... was 8-0 in 12 starts with support of three runs or more...entered the season with a 2.67 RSA in his career as a starter...has received two runs of support or fewer in 37 of his 56 career starts and is 4-19 in those games...is 10-0 in 19 career starts with run support of three runs or more.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Was 5-1 with a 2.65 ERA in 10 starts following an A's loss...had a 2.88 ERA in the first inning, 4.01 from the second inning on...did not commit an error in 19 chances and turned three double plays, which tied for third among AL pitchers...went 5-0 with a 2.23 ERA in seven starts against AL Central teams...opponents were successful in 10-of-12 (83.3%) stolen base attempts off him...the A's were 15-10 (.600) in his starting assignments.

2019 OALAND HIGHLIGHTS: Made the trip to Japan but was one of three inactive players for the two-game series against the Mariners...was placed on the 10-day injured list March 27 retroactive to March 25 with a right lower leg contusion...made one rehab start with Single-A Stockton on April 4 and two with Triple-A Las Vegas on April 9 and 14...was 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA in three starts overall when he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas April 16...was recalled by Oakland the next day when Marco Estrada went on the injured list and spent the rest of the season with the A's...made his first start April 22 against Texas and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings for the win...left his third start on May 4 at Pittsburgh after five innings with a 4-3 lead but Wendelken allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save and loss...it was the first of two times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (July 30 vs. Milwaukee)...took the loss on May 9 against Cincinnati to snap the first winning streak of his career, a threegame streak dating back to 2018...went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (seven starts) dating back to June 27, 2018...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits in a 17-3 win at Detroit on May 16...did not allow a run in three of his first six starts following the All-Star Break and was 3-1 with a 2.00 ERA over that span...picked up his eighth win of the season on Aug. 11 at Chicago (AL) and went 3-0 with a 3.86 ERA over his final nine appearances...the winning streak matches his career high...walked just eight (1.93 per nine innings) while striking out 40 (9.64 per nine innings) in 37.1 innings during the streak...tossed a career-high 116 pitches in an 8-4 win over Houston on Aug. 17...struck out a career-high 11 and did not walk a batter in 6.0 innings in a 10-2 win over Detroit on Sept. 7... it was the 13th time in Oakland history a pitcher struck out 11 or more without walking a batter, the first time since Dan Straily on April 5, 2013 (11 vs. Houston)...is the seventh pitcher in Oakland history to fan 11 or more in six innings or fewer (last: Trevor Cahill on May 5, 2018 vs. Baltimore)...pitched in relief in each of his final three appearances beginning Sept. 20 and did not allow a run (5.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 9 so)...was on the A's roster for the AL Wild Card game but did not pitch.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (0-1, 3.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...is in his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2017, 19-20)...is 14-7 with a 2.81 ERA in 31 games, 29 starts, over the last three years after going 1-3 with a 6.32 ERA in 30 games, two starts, over his first two seasons...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's loss to Colorado last Wednesday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)... is 1-1 with a 4.41 ERA (16.1 ip, 16 h, 11 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 20 so, 2 hr) in five career appearances, including two starts, against Seattle...picked up the win in his only start last year on June 15 in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 9 so...went 1-0 and did not allow an earned run in three spring starts (5.2 ip, 2 r)...opponents went 4-for-22 (.182)...went 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA in 16 starts last year in a season shortened due to an 80-game suspension for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

4-0, 1.70 ERA (7 er in 37.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 3-for-4 (75.0%)

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in five of the first eight games and has the fourth lowest ERA in the majors (1.70)...compiled a 3.89 ERA last year, which was fourth lowest in the American League.
- Has the third lowest opponents OPS in the majors (.528), the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.265) and the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.263)...last year, had the lowest opponents OPS (.693) and slugging percentage (.385) and ranked third in opponents batting average (.232) and on-base percentage (.308).
- Allowed a home run in the opener but has not allowed one in 32.0 innings since then...are tied for fourth in the majors in fewest home runs.
- Has all four of the A's wins and is tied for third in the majors in wins...are one of seven pens without a loss.
- Has converted each of its last three save opportunities after being charged with a blown save in the opener...are tied for fourth in the majors in saves...had a Major League leading and Oakland record 30 blown saves last year, which were the most blown saves by an American League team since Seattle had 31 in 2008...converted 45-of-75 (60.0%) save opportunities...ranked fifth in the AL in saves but had the fifth lowest save percentage.
