OAKLAND ATHLETICS (5-4) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (4-6)

MONDAY, AUGUST 3, 2020 — T-MOBILE PARK — 6:10 PDT RHP FRANKIE MONTAS (0-1, 3.00) VS. LHP JUSTUS SHEFFIELD (0-1, 12.00) NBCSCA — A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO — A'S RADIO NETWORK (960 AM, 103.7 FM HD2 AND 1140 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won back-to-back games for the second time this year after losing a season-high three in a row...are now 5-4, which marks the fifth time in the last six years the A's have been either one game over .500 or one game under .500 after nine games...are tied with Houston for first place in the American League West for the seventh time in the last eight days...have spent eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third... the A's three-game losing streak from July 28-31 was their longest since July 24-26, 2019 when they also lost three straight (went the final 56 games of 2019 without losing more than two in a row)...the game Friday night began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 30 of 31 days through Aug. 30 (off on Aug. 13)...this is the A's 53rd season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (19), Atlanta Braves (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (18) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (7) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 120th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of the last four games (10 er in 36.0 ip, 2.50 ERA) and now have a 3.07 ERA for the season, which is sixth lowest in the majors...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.323) to the Dodgers (.255) and are tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (5)...have issued just 24 walks, which is the fewest among teams in the West divisions.

OFFENSE: The A's have collected eight hits or fewer in each of the first nine games, which is the longest such season-opening streak in Athletics history...have a streak of 13 consecutive games with eight hits or fewer dating back to Sept. 26 of last year, which is one short of the longest streak in Athletics history (June 3-20, 1908 and July 3-20, 2007)...are batting .188 this year, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Pittsburgh, .177)...also have the fourth lowest OPS (.589) and slugging percentage (.305) and the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.284)...are tied for the third fewest runs per game (3.33)...are 4-for-37 (.108) with runners in scoring position over the last five games and are batting .179 (10-for-56) with RISP for the season, which is fourth lowest in the majors.

STARTING PITCHING: Yesterday, Chris Bassitt became the first A's starting pitcher to record a win...that snapped a season-opening eight-game streak with a win by starters, which is the third longest season-opening streak in Oakland history (10 in 1979 and 1997)...Bassitt tossed 5.2 innings marking the third time in the first nine games starters have tossed at least five innings...starters are now 1-4 with a 4.32 ERA (20 er in 41.2 ip) and the one win is tied for fifth fewest in the majors...have issued just nine walks for an average of 1.94 per nine innings, which is third lowest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors over the first nine games, which is tied for sixth most in the majors...the errors have led to five unearned runs, which is tied for ninth most...last year, the A's set an Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80) and fewest unearned runs (34)... Oakland pitchers have committed three of the A's six errors and are tied with Pittsburgh and San Diego for the most errors among pitching staffs in the majors...the A's have turned just four double plays, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND EXTRA INNINGS: The A's have won each of the last two games by a score of 3-2, which are their first two one-run games of the season...only the Tigers (3) and Cubs (3) have more one-run wins...are 2-0 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied for second in games.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 2-1 on their first road trip of the season, which consists of this four-game series against Seattle...these are the A's only road games over the first 16 games of the season...went 3-3 on the season-opening six-game homestand against Los Angeles (3-1) and Colorado (0-2)... return home following the game today for a six-game homestand against Texas (three games) and Houston (three games).

SHORTENED SEASONS: The A's are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the

strike-shortened 1981 season...this will be the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have played fewer than 161 games in a season...in addition to 1981, the A's played 114 games in 1994, 144 in 1995 and 155 in 1972 (also strike seasons).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with one player on the injured list (Puk)...it marks the first time Oakland has fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...the last time the A's opened the season with one player on the IL was in 2006 when they had none...have used the IL twice this year after using it 17 times last year... the 17 IL placements in 2019 tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 15 pitchers and 15 position players...the roster must be reduced to 28 players on Thursday and 26 on Aug. 20...17 players returned from last years Opening Day roster...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...seven other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year for a total of 24 players who were with the organization last year...four were acquired in a trade (Allen, Kemp, Machín, Smith), one was claimed off waivers (McFarland) and one was signed as a free agent to a minor league contract (Weems)...only two players on the A's Opening Day roster have played for Oakland in each of the previous five seasons (Canha, Semien) and of those two, only Semien has been on each of the A's last six Opening Day rosters...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest tenure in the A's organization... the A's have five rookies on the Opening Day roster (Brown, Luzardo, Machín, Murphy, Weems) after starting the year with no rookies in each of the previous two seasons...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 28.77 years...Jesús Luzardo, who is 22 years and 298 days, is the youngest and he is the youngest player on an A's Opening Day roster since 2010 (Brett Anderson, 22 years and 63 days)...Joakim Soria is the oldest at 36 years, 67 days.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 13-10 (.565) during the spring...it marked Oakland's second consecutive spring with a winning record after three straight losing springs...started the sping 0-5, won 13 of the final 16 games in Arizona and then went 0-2 against San Francisco in July...the A's led the majors with 102 walks and topped the Cactus League with a .352 on-base percentage...also ranked third in the CL in doubles (45), fourth in runs (132), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in hits (201)...had the third fewest home runs (21)...the pitching staff had the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.286) and fifth highest ERA (5.39), but tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (23)...defensively, tied for third in the CL in double plays turned (21) and ranked fifth in fielding percentage (.982).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have won two of the first three meetings of 2020 after going 10-9 against the Mariners last year...it was their first season series win over Seattle since 2012...went 6-2 in Oakland, 0-2 in Tokyo and 4-5 in Seattle...have won 12 of their last 18 games but are 58-78 (.426) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 362-302 against the Mariners...that includes 195-134 in Oakland, 166-165 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 90-101 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Liam Hendriks has converted the save in each of his last three outings after being charged with the blown save in his first appearance on Opening Night...is tied for second in the majors in saves...*Ramón Laureano* hit the go-ahead home run yesterday and five of his seven RBI have either tied the game (three) or put the A's ahead (two)...*Marcus Semien* has a consecutive games played streak of 252 dating back to June 28, 2018 (all starts)...has started each of the A's last 142 games in the leadoff spot.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1933 Lefty Grove became the first pitcher since August 2, 1931, a span of 308 games, to shutout the New York Yankees, winning 7-0...in 1991 Dave Henderson hits three home runs and the A's blast a total of six, but all are solo shots as the A's lose 8-6 to Minnesota...the Twins score seven runs in the eighth and add an insurance run in the ninth...in 2002 Mark Ellis ties an Oakland record with two triples in an 8-4 win over Detroit...in 2018 Ramón Laureano becomes the first player in Athletics history with a walk-off RBI for his first Major League hit when he singles in the bottom of the 13th inning of the A's 1-0 win over Detroit.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (0-1, 3.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...is in his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2017, 19-20)...is 14-7 with a 2.81 ERA (53 er in 170.0 ip) in 31 games, 29 starts, over the last three years after going 1-3 with a 6.32 ERA in 30 games, two starts, over his first two seasons.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day, July 24 in Oakland...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 13th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 15 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers)...was just the second foreign-born Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Ariel Prieto, April 2, 1997)...scattered two hits, a walk and hit a batter over the first three innings before allowing his only run in the fourth inning on a Goodwin RBI single...was relieved by Petit to start the fifth inning with the scored tied 1-1

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Colorado last Wednesday in Oakland...it was his first loss since April 29, 2019 at Boston and it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to May 17, 2019... the A's scored a run in the first andhe allowed a RBI single to Wolters in the second inning...also surrendered a sacrifice fly to Hampson in the fourth and was relieved by Luzardo to start the sixth with the A's trailing 2-1.

(8 er in 14.1 ip) in four games in Oakland...was the winning pitcher in his only start last year, an 11-2 A's win in Oakland on June 15...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a Williamson ground out in the second...the A's increased the lead to 9-1 before he allowed a RBI single to Crawford in the fifth...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh with the A's leading 11-2.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-0 and did not allow an earned run in three starts...yielded two unearned runs in 5.2 innings...opponents went 4-for-22 (.182) and he walked just one batter in 5.2 innings...his final outing came on Mar. 8 against Milwaukee in Mesa...is now 3-0 with a 0.42 ERA in eight games, five starts, over the last two springs.

2019 RECAP: Went 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA in 16 starts in a season shortened due to an 80-game suspension for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...his ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.282) and OPS (.646)...had career highs in wins, starts, strikeouts (103), innings (96.0), hits (84), runs (35), walks (23) and hit batters (4) and matched his high in earned runs (28) and wild pitches (4)...averaged 2.16 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.48 was a career high...surrendered eight home runs (0.75 per nine innings).

90 OR MORE INNINGS RANKINGS: His 2.63 ERA was third lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 90 innings...using the same minimum, he ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings, fifth in opponents OPS, sixth in slugging percentage (.364), ninth in on-base percentage and 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio...averaged 9.66 strikeouts per nine innings, which was second highest in Oakland history (Gio Gonzalez, 9.94 in 2009) and third highest in Athletics history (Wes Stock, 9.77 in 1964) among

pitchers with 90 or more innings...his 4.48 strikeout-to-walk ratio was fourth highest in Oakland history.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .229 (38-for-166) opponents batting average and .647 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 (46-for-199) with a .645 OPS against left-handers...allowed a .207 average to batters leading off an inning and .115 with two strikes...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...only one came the first time through the batting order...opponents were 4-for-7 (.571) with the bases loaded.

2019 SPLITS: Was 4-0 with a 3.00 ERA in seven starts at home, 5-2 with a 2.33 ERA in nine starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 42.0 innings in Oakland compared to six in 54.0 innings on the road...had a 3-0 record and a 1.50 ERA in four starts during the day, 6-2 with a 3.00 ERA in 12 starts at night...went 5-2 with a 3.00 ERA in 11 starts on four or five days rest, 4-0 with a 1.91 ERA in five starts on six days rest or more...is now 7-2 with a 2.39 ERA (19 er in 71.2 ip) in 11 career starts on six days rest or more.

2019 RUN SUPPORT: Received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 16 starts but had six starts with seven runs of support or more...had a 6.84 RSA overall...was 7-1 in nine starts with three runs of support or more and is 10-1 in 13 such starts in his career.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Allowed just one run in the first inning for a 0.56 ERA... had a 5.63 ERA in the second inning and a 2.39 ERA from the third inning on...the A's were 12-4 (.750) in his starting assignments and are 20-9 (.690) when he starts in his career...committed three errors, which tied for the most among AL pitchers...went 0-for-1 with a walk as a hitter and is 0-for-6 with a walk and five strikeouts in his career...pitched for Escogido in the Dominican Winter League following the season and was 3-0 with a 1.44 ERA in five starts.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the Opening Day roster and was available in the bullpen for the two games against Seattle in Japan but did not pitch...was inserted into the fourth spot in the rotation when the season resumed and picked up the win in his first start March 31 against Los Angeles (AL)...took the loss in his second start on April 5 at Houston...then went 3-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .224 opponents average over this next three starts from April 10 to 23...the first win came on April 10 at Baltimore when he retired the first 12 batters he faced...surrendered two home runs in the game, giving him four in his first three starts...did not allow another home run until June 4 at Los Angeles-AL (Ohtani) for an eight-game, 53.0-inning, 228-batter faced homerless streak...allowed a season-high nine hits but extended his winning streak to three games in an 11-5 win over Texas April 23...had his three-game winning streak snapped April 29 at Boston when he allowed a season-high seven runs in 4.1 innings...only one of the runs was earned and the six unearned runs tied for second most in Oakland history...they were the most since Brett Anderson also had six on May 15, 2009 vs. Detroit...finished April with a 3-2 record and a 3.29 ERA in five starts...tied for fifth in the American League in wins...then went 2-0 with a 2.64 ERA in five starts in May...tied for eighth in the AL in May ERA...left his start on May 10 against Cleveland with a 3-2 lead but Trivino blew the save in a game the A's would win 4-3 in 12 innings...had career highs in strikeouts (10), innings pitched (8.2) and pitches (109) in a 7-2 win at Detroit on May 17...did not walk a batter, which marked the 27th time in Oakland history a pitcher struck out 10 or more and did not issue a walk...it was the first since Jeff Samardzija on Sept. 17, 2014 vs. Texas (10 so)...that began a career-high and season-ending five-game winning streak...compiled a 2.49 ERA (14 er in 50.2 ip) and .201 (38-for-189) opponents batting average over that eight start stretch...walked a career-high five batters in a season-low 4.0 innings in a no decision against Los Angeles (AL) May 28...had his second career 10-strikeout game in a 9-8 win at Texas June 9...allowed a run on four hits in 8.0 innings on June 20 against Tampa Bay but had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win...was suspended for 80 games the next day for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...was 9-2 with a 2.70 ERA in 15 starts at the time...was tied for third in the AL in wins and winning percentage (.818) and ranked fifth in ERA...was reinstated Sept. 25 and started that day at Los Angeles (AL) when he had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 6 so)... was not eligible for the postseason.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Jesús Luzardo (0-0, 1.35 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third appearance of the season...it will be the first start of his career after eight relief appearances...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he is the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...his last outing came in relief last Wednesday in Oakland against Colorado in the A's 5-1 loss (3.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 0-0 with a save and a 2.25 ERA (4.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances against Texas, both in relief last year...was 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA and .143 opponents batting average in three starts this spring...struck out 13 batters and walked just one in 8.1 innings...made his Major League debut in 2019 and had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents batting average in six relief appearances during a September call-up...combined to go 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA in 11 games (nine starts) with three minor league teams

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in five of the first nine games and has the fourth lowest ERA in the majors (1.79)...compiled a 3.89 ERA last year, which was fourth lowest in the American League.
- Has the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors (.277), the fifth lowest OPS (.542) and on-base percentage (.265) and the seventh lowest batting average (.196)...last year, had the lowest opponents OPS (.693) and slugging percentage (.385) and ranked third in opponents batting average (.232) and on-base percentage (.308).
- Has converted each of its last four save opportunities after being charged
 with a blown save in the opener...is tied for second in the majors in saves
 (Minnesota, 5)...had a Major League leading and Oakland record 30 blown
 saves last year, which were the most blown saves by an American League
 team since Seattle had 31 in 2008...converted 45-of-75 (60.0%) save opportunities...ranked fifth in the AL in saves but had the fifth lowest save
 percentage.
- Is tied for third in the majors in wins (4) and is one of six pens without a loss.

Last Year: Began the season with Kansas City and was 0-6 with a 4.75 ERA in 48 relief appearances when he was traded to Oakland on July 27...went 1-1 with a 4.43 ERA in 28 games with the A's and had a 4.65 ERA in a career-high 76 relief appearances overall.
