## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (6-4) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (3-5)

TUESDAY, AUGUST 4, 2020 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:10 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won a season-high three consecutive games to take over sole possession of first place in the American League West for the first time this year...have also spent eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third...the three-game winning streak comes on the heels of a three-game losing streak, which marked the first time the A's lost more than two in a row since July 24-26, 2019 when they also lost three straight (went the final 56 games of 2019 without losing more than two in a row)...are now 6-4 after 10 games for the second consecutive season...have not started the season 7-4 since 2014...are 3-1 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 when they are scheduled to play 30 of 31 days...this is the A's 53rd season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 120th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

**OFFENSE:** After collecting eight hits or fewer in each of the first nine games, the A's scored eight runs on eight hits in the fifth inning yesterday...all eight runs scored after two outs...the eight-run inning was the A's biggest since Aug. 6, 2019 at Chicago-NL (2nd)...sent 14 batters to the plate, which were their most in an inning since Sept. 12, 2018 at Baltimore (15 in the 3rd)...went 6-for-8 with runners in scoring position in the fifth inning after starting the year 10-for-58 (.172)...finished the game with 11 runs scored after combining for just 10 runs over the previous four contests...walked 11 times, which were their most in a nine-inning game since the first game of a Sept. 9, 2017 doubleheader against Houston (13)...have 45 walks for the season, which is fourth most in the majors...were also hit by a pitch three times and rank fourth in the majors with eight hit by pitches for the season...are tied for sixth in the majors in stolen bases (6)...have the fourth lowest OPS (.638) and slugging percentage (.323) in the majors and the fifth lowest batting average (.205).

**PITCHING:** A's pitchers have allowed just five runs over the last three games and have a 3.07 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the West (Dodgers, 2.14) and fifth lowest in the majors...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors (.313) to the Dodgers (.286) and are tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (5)...are averaging 2.77 walks per nine innings, which is fourth lowest.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (4 er in 18.2 ip) over the last three games after going 0-4 with a 5.10 ERA over the first seven contests...have tossed more than five innings in each of the last three games after tossing five innings or fewer in each of the first seven...are now 2-4 with a 3.88 ERA (21 er in 48.2 ip) for the season...have surrendered just three home runs, which is tied or fourth fewest in the majors.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed six errors over the first 10 games, which is tied for second most among teams in the West...last year, the A's set an Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80)...the A's have turned just four double plays, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin their second homestand of the season tonight, a six-game stand against Texas (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 3-1 on the first road trip to Seattle...after going 3-3 on the season-opening six-game homestand against Los Angeles (3-1) and Colorado (0-2).

**WINS AND LOSSES:** The A's are 3-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 3-4 when they start a right-hander...last year, the A's went 35-14 (.714) against lefties, 62-51 (.549) against righties...the record against south paws was second best in the majors to Houston (38-11, .776)...won back-to-back 3-2 decisions on Saturday and Sunday, their first one-run games of the season...only the Tigers (3) and Cubs (3) have more one-run wins...are 2-0 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied for second in games.

**SHORTENED SEASONS:** The A's are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season...this will be the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have played fewer than 161 games in a season...in addition to 1981, the A's played 114 games in 1994, 144 in 1995 and 155 in 1972 (also strike seasons).

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's placed Jordan Weems on the 10-day injured list today and now have two players on the IL (Puk)...have used the IL three times this year after using it 17 times last year...the 17 IL placements in 2019 tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13)...began the season with one player on the injured list (Puk), which marked the first time Oakland had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...the last time the A's opened the season with one player on the IL was in 2006 when they had none.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's 30-man roster must be reduced to 28 players on Thursday and 26 on Aug. 20...the A's have used five rookies this year (Brown, Luzardo, Machín, Murphy, Weems)...James Kaprielian, who was recalled today, will become the sixth...17 players returned from last years Opening Day roster and seven others played for the A's at some point last year...only two players have played for Oakland in each of the last six seasons (Canha, Semien) and of those two, only Semien has been on each of the A's last six Opening Day rosters...Matt Olson, who was drafted on June 4, 2012, has the longest tenure in the A's organization...Jesús Luzardo, who was 22 years and 298 days on Opening Day, is the youngest player on an A's Opening Day roster since 2010 (Brett Anderson, 22 years and 63 days).

**DURING THE SPRING:** The A's went 13-10 (.565) during the spring...it marked Oakland's second consecutive spring with a winning record after three straight losing springs...started 0-5, won 13 of the final 16 games in Arizona and then went 0-2 against San Francisco in July...led the majors with 102 walks and topped the Cactus League with a .352 on-base percentage...also ranked third in the CL in doubles (45), fourth in runs (132), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in hits (201)...the pitching staff had the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.286) and fifth highest ERA (5.39)...defensively, tied for third in the CL in double plays turned (21) and ranked fifth in fielding percentage (.982).

**SCORING CHANGE:** Major League Baseball has made a scoring change in the A's vs. Rockies game on July 29...in the ninth inning, credit Charlie Blackmon with a hit and take away the error from Jesús Luzardo...that makes both of the runs in that inning earned.

**A's vs. RANGERS:** The A's won the season series last year, 13-6...it was their third consecutive season series win...went 6-3 in Texas and 7-3 in Oakland...tied an Athletics record for most home runs vs. one team in a season last year with 35 (also Seattle in 2019)...scored 125 runs which were three short of the Oakland record (128 vs. Texas in 2003)...are 22-7 over the last 29 games and have won 22 of the last 28 games in Oakland...are 37-20 (.649) over the last three years and are 378-373 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 200-176 in Oakland and 178-197 in Texas...went 111-109 at Globe Life Park, which was the second best record by a visiting American League team (Yankees, 56-46, .549)...have an all-time record of 475-455 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Mark Canha** has reached base safely via hit or walk in each of his nine games and is tied for fourth in the majors in on-base percentage (.474)...**Khristian Davis** is a .272 (74-for-272) career hitter against the Rangers with 32 home runs and 77 RBI in 74 games...31 of those home runs have come with the A's, which ties Mark McGwire for the most in Athletics history against Rangers/Senators franchise...**Ramón Laureano** is tied for eighth in the majors in RBI (9)...seven of those have either tied the game or put the A's ahead and he is tied for fifth in the majors in go-ahead RBI (3)...**Marcus Semien** has hit safely in each of his last 16 games against Texas, which is the second longest hitting streak against the Rangers in Athletics history...is 27-for-66 (.409) with 21 runs, seven doubles, eight home runs and 12 walks during the streak (.500 on-base percentage, .879 slugging percentage, 1.379 OPS).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1910** Jack Coombs and Ed Walsh of the Chicago White Sox duel 16 innings to a scoreless tie...Coombs allows just three hits...in **1992** Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record when he walks five times in the A's 9-0 win at Texas...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit to extend his hitting streak to 24 games...he falls one short of Jason Giambi's Oakland record of 25.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: **Jesús Luzardo (0-0, 4.05 ERA)**

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his third appearance of the season...it will be the first start of his career after eight relief appearances...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he is the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...the last A's pitcher under the age of 23 to win a game was Anderson in that Oct. 2 game against Seattle...is in his second season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster.

**IN RELIEF:** Made his first appearance of 2020 on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...entered the game to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 4-0 and tossed what was then a career-high tying 3.0 scoreless innings...pitched in relief again last Wednesday against Colorado in Oakland in a 5-1 A's loss...logged a career-high 3.2 innings and struck out a career-high five...also had career highs in pitches (67), hits (5), runs (3) and earned runs (3) and matched his high in walks (2)...allowed a run in the eighth inning to snap a career-high 12.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2019.

**LUZARDO vs. TEXAS:** Is 0-0 with a save and a 2.25 ERA (4.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances, both in relief last year...the first outing came in Texas on Sept. 15 and he picked up his first Major League save in the A's 6-1 win (3.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...relieved Sean Manaea to start the seventh inning...allowed a run to score in the eighth when Trevino scored on a passed ball...then pitched a scoreless seventh inning in a 12-3 A's win in Oakland on Sept. 21 (1.0 ip, 1 bb, 2 so).

**2019 RECAP:** Had his season interrupted twice by a strained left shoulder but, after going 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games (nine starts) with three minor league teams, he was selected by Oakland on Sept. 9 after Las Vegas concluded its season...had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents batting average in six relief appearances in his Major League debut...struck out 16 batters in 12.0 innings (12.00 per nine innings) and walked just three for a .196 on-base percentage...allowed two doubles and one home run for a .238 slugging percentage...left-handed hitters were 1-for-14 (.071) with no extra base hits, one walk and a .205 OPS...right-handed hitters batted .143 (4-for-28) with a .547 OPS...opponents hit .138 with his lone home run with the bases empty, .077 with runners on...they were 1-for-8 (.125) with runners in scoring position...allowed a .095 average with two strikes...did not inherit any runners and first batters faced were 1-for-5 (.200) with a walk.

**2019 WITH OAKLAND:** Made his debut on Sept. 11 at Houston and tossed a season-high 3.0 innings...allowed one run on one hit, a Martin Maldonado solo home run in the sixth inning...did not walk a batter and struck out two...fanned the first batter he faced, Aledmys Díaz...at the age of 21 years, 346 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher since Brett Anderson on Oct. 1, 2009 (21 years, 242 days)...became the first player born in Peru in ML history...in his second outing, he tossed the final three innings of the A's 6-1 win at Texas on Sept. 15 for his first professional save...at the age of 21 years, 350 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to save a game since Houston Street on July 8, 2005 (21 years, 340 days)...allowed one run and struck out a season-high four...did not allow a run over his final four games and finished the season with a 7.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed 1.0 inning twice, 2.0

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
<b>LHP Sean Manaea (0-2, 7.00 ERA):</b> scheduled to make his third start of the season...has allowed nine runs on 11 hits but has not walked a batter in 9.0 innings...allowed 15 runs on 18 hits in 12.2 innings during the spring but did not walk a batter...has retired the side in order in the first, second and third innings in each of his first two starts but the opposition is 11-for-20 (.550) with nine runs scored in the fourth and fifth innings...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-3 A's loss at Seattle last Friday (4.1 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 3 er, 4 so)...is 6-2 with a 3.15 ERA (65.2 ip, 57 h, 25 r, 23 er, 15 bb, 57 so, 8 hr) in 11 career starts against Texas, including 5-0 with a 1.72 ERA over his last six starts...is 4-0 with a 2.43 ERA in five starts in Oakland...was 2-0 with a 1.54 ERA in two starts last year (11.2 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 10 so)...began the 2019 season on the 60-day injured list but made five starts with Oakland in September, going 4-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .160 opponents batting average.

Saves/Opportunities: 4-for-5 (80.0%)

- The A's bullpen allowed just one run in 13.0 innings in the four-game series at Seattle and has not allowed a run in six of the first 10 games...has the sixth lowest ERA in the majors (2.13)...compiled a 3.89 ERA last year, which was fourth lowest in the American League.
- Has the fourth lowest opponents OPS (.531), slugging percentage (.271) and on-base percentage (.260) in the majors and the sixth lowest batting average (.194)...last year, had the lowest opponents OPS (.693) and slugging percentage (.385) and ranked third in opponents batting average (.232) and on-base percentage (.308).
- Has converted each of its last four save opportunities after being charged with a blown save in the opener...is tied for third in the majors in saves (Minnesota, 5)...had a Major League leading and Oakland record 30 blown saves last year, which were the most blown saves by an American League team since Seattle had 31 in 2008...converted 45-of-75 (60.0%) save opportunities...ranked fifth in the AL in saves but had the fifth lowest save percentage.
- Is tied for third in the majors in wins (4) and is one of six pens without a loss.

### 35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

- Has not allowed a run in five appearances (4.2 ip) and opponents are 1-for-15 (.067)...however, has issued four walks (.263 on-base percentage).
- Has allowed at least one run in five of his six career appearances against Texas (5.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 9 so, 10.13 ERA).
- Begins his ninth season in the majors and has played for five teams...is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2014-16, 18-20).
- Posted an 8.53 ERA and .385 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven relief appearances during the spring (including one outing in July).

*Last Year: Began the season with Kansas City and was 0-6 with a 4.75 ERA in 48 relief appearances when he was traded to Oakland on July 27...went 1-1 with a 4.43 ERA in 28 games with the A's and had a 4.65 ERA in a career-high 76 relief appearances overall.*

### 16 RHP LIAM HENDRIKS

Saves/Opportunities: 3-4  
Inherited Runners/Scored: 1/0 First Hitters: 0-4

- Has converted the save in each of his last three outings after being charged with the blown save in his first appearance on Opening Night...is tied for third in the majors in saves.
- Had two saves and a blown save in five outings against Texas last year (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so)...
- Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his eighth Opening Day roster (2012-13, 15-20)...it is his fifth straight with the A's.
- Struck out 13 of the 23 batters he faced during the spring...did not issue a walk in 6.0 innings and logged a 3.00 ERA in six games (including one outing in July).

*Last Year: Began the season as a set-up man and occasional opener but took over the closer role after Treinen went on the IL retroactive to June 21...saved a ML-leading 25 games over that span after tallying just one save over his first 279 career appearances.*

### 56 RHP JAMES KAPRIELIAN

- Was recalled from the A's alternate site today and will be making his Major League debut.
- Was acquired from the New York Yankees on July 31, 2017 in the Sonny Gray trade in which the A's also received Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...was the Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery.
- Was 6-5 with a 2.96 ERA in 27 games, including 22 starts, in his career as a minor leaguer...has 111 strikeouts in 97.1 innings (10.26 per nine innings).
- Did not pitch during the spring.

*Last Year: Completed his comeback from elbow problems that eventually led to 2017 "Tommy John" surgery by going 4-3 with a 3.18 ERA in 19 games, including 16 starts, with Single-A Stockton, Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas.*

- Has not allowed a run in his first four appearances (3.0 ip) and has retired nine of the 10 batters he has faced.
- Faced the Rangers once last year on July 16, 2019 at Texas while pitching for Arizona (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has a 2.87 ERA (5 er in 15.2 ip) in 10 career appearances against Texas.
- Was claimed off waivers from Arizona on November 4, 2019.
- Begins his eighth season in the majors with his third team (Baltimore, 2013-16; Arizona, 2017-19)...is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2013, 16, 18, 20).
- Compiled a 6.00 ERA and .385 opponents batting average in six spring appearances (none in July)...walked just one in 6.0 innings.

*Last Year: Had no decisions, no save opportunities and a 4.82 ERA in a career-high 51 relief appearances with Arizona...since the save became a stat in 1969, he is one of three pitchers to appear in 50 or more games with no wins, losses or save opportunities.*

### 33 RHP DANIEL MENGDEN

- Began the season as the A's fifth starter and made one start a week ago today against Colorado, a loss (4.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so).
- Has made 48 starts and nine relief appearances in his career...is 16-20 with a 4.81 ERA (141 er in 264.0 ip) as a starter and 1-0 with a save and a 3.86 ERA (13 er in 30.1 ip) as a reliever...has tossed four or more innings in five of his relief appearances.
- Was 0-1 with a 5.68 ERA (6.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 5 so) in two games, one start, against Texas last year.
- Begins his fifth season in the majors and is on his second Opening Day roster (2018).
