OAKLAND ATHLETICS (7-4) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (3-6)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 5, 2020 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:10 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a season-high four-game winning streak and are now 7-4...that is the A's best record after 11 games since 2014 when they were also 7-4 (won game 12 in 2014)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the second consecutive day and have held at least a share of first place for 10 of 12 days this year (two days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...the current winning streak comes on the heels of a three-game losing streak, which marked the first time the A's lost more than two in a row since July 24-26, 2019 when they also lost three straight (went the final 56 games of 2019 without losing more than two in a row)...are 4-1 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 when they are scheduled to play on 30 of 31 days...this is the A's 53rd season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 120th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their Major League leading second walk-off win of the season last night and both have been grand slams (Piscotty last night, Olson on Opening Night)...this marks the 17th time in Major League history a team has two walk-off grand slams in one season, the first time the A's have done it (last: Cubs in 2018)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it's the third time a team has done it in the span of 11 games...the 1952 Red Sox also did it in 11 games and the 2017 Blue Jays did it in four contests...the A's are the first team with multiple walk-off grand slams within their first 30 games of a season...are 3-0 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are the most in the majors...are 2-0 in extra innings...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied for third in games...are 2-0 in one-run games...only the Cubs (4) and Tigers (3) have more one-run wins.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed five hits or fewer in each of the last four games, which is tied for the second longest such streak in Oakland history (6, June 15-21, 2016)...opponents are 19-for-128 (.148) over that span and have scored six runs (37.0 ip, 1.46 ERA)...have allowed just one home run over the last six games and five for the season, which is tied with St. Louis for the fewest in the majors...have a .306 opponents slugging percentage, which is second lowest in the majors to the Dodgers (.285)...also rank third in the majors in opponents OPS (.585) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.70), fifth in ERA (2.88) and sixth in opponents on-base percentage (.279).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-0 with a 1.52 ERA (4 er in 23.2 ip) over the last four games after going 0-4 with a 5.10 ERA over the first seven contests...are now 2-4 with a 3.52 ERA (21 er in 53.2 ip) for the season...the ERA ranks fifth among the 10 teams in the West, but is 11th lowest in the majors...have surrendered just three home runs, which is tied or second fewest in the majors.

THE BIG INNING: The A's scored four runs in the bottom of the ninth last night, which was the fourth time this year they have scored at least four runs in an inning...have scored 21 runs of their 46 runs (45.7%) in those four innings...are batting .667 (14-for-21) in those four innings and .174 (57-for-327) in the other 95 innings...have scored 12 runs in the fifth inning this year, but no runs in the second and just one in the sixth.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .193 (37-for-192) over the last six games but are 4-2 over that stretch...are hitting .204 for the season, which is the fifth lowest batting average in the majors...also have the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.330) and fifth lowest OPS (.646)...are tied for third in walks (50), tied for fifth in stolen bases (7) and rank seventh in hit by pitches (8)

THIS AND THAT: The A's are one of five teams that are 4-0 in August (Cubs, Rockies, White Sox, Twins)...are 3-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 4-4 when they start a right-hander...last year, the A's went 35-14 (.714) against lefties, 62-51 (.549) against righties...the record against south paws was second best in the majors to Houston (38-11, .776)...are 7-1 when homering, 0-3 when going homerless...have used 11 different lineups in the first 11 games...have turned just four double plays, which is fifth fewest in the majors...A's outfielders have three assists, which is tied for second most in the majors (Pirates, 5).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Texas (1-0) and Houston (three games)...went 3-3 on the season-opening six-game homestand against Los Angeles (3-1) and Colorado (0-2) and are 4-3 at home for the season...are scheduled to play 12 of their first 16 games at home...went 3-1 on their first road trip to Seattle over the weekend...embark on an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), San Francisco (three games) and Arizona (two games) beginning Monday.

SHORTENED SEASONS: The A's are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season...this will be the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have played fewer than 161 games in a season...in addition to 1981, the A's played 114 games in 1994, 144 in 1995 and 155 in 1972 (also strike seasons).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's placed Jordan Weems on the 10-day injured list yesterday and now have two players on the IL (Puk)...have used the IL three times this year after using it 17 times last year...the 17 IL placements in 2019 tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13)...began the season with one player on the injured list (Puk), which marked the first time Oakland had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...the last time the A's opened the season with one player on the IL was in 2006 when they had none.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 13-10 (.565) during the spring...it marked Oakland's second consecutive spring with a winning record after three straight losing springs...started 0-5, won 13 of the final 16 games in Arizona and then went 0-2 against San Francisco in July...led the majors with 102 walks and topped the Cactus League with a .352 on-base percentage...also ranked third in the CL in doubles (45), fourth in runs (132), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in hits (201)...the pitching staff had the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.286) and fifth highest ERA (5.39)...defensively, tied for third in the CL in double plays turned (21) and ranked fifth in fielding percentage (.982).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's won the first meeting of 2020 last night after winning the season series last year, 13-6...it was their third consecutive season series win...went 6-3 in Texas and 7-3 in Oakland...tied an Athletics record for most home runs vs. one team in a season last year with 35 (also Seattle in 2019)...scored 125 runs which were three short of the Oakland record (128 vs. Texas in 2003)...have won eight of the last nine games and are 23-7 over the last 30 contests...have won five of the last six and 23 of the last 29 in Oakland...are 38-20 (.656) over the last four years and are 379-373 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 201-176 in Oakland and 178-197 in Texas...went 111-109 at Globe Life Park, which was the second best record by a visiting American League team (Yankees, 56-46, .549)...have an all-time record of 476-455 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha has reached base safely via hit or walk in each of his 10 games and ranks second in the majors with a .500 on-base percentage (Brantley, HOU .514)...**Khris Davis** is a .272 (74-for-272) career hitter against the Rangers with 32 home runs and 77 RBI in 74 games...31 of those home runs have come with the A's, which ties Mark McGwire for the most in Athletics history against Rangers/Senators franchise...**Stephen Piscotty** hit his eighth career home run against Texas last night, which matches his most vs. any team...is hitting .403 (31-for-77) with 18 runs, five doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 18 RBI and 11 multiple hit games over his last 19 games against the Rangers.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1952** Bobby Shantz wins his 20th game...in **1992** Jose Canseco walks in his first two at bats against the Texas Rangers after tying a club record with five walks the day before to set an Oakland record with seven consecutive walks...in **2008** Brad Ziegler tosses 2.0 scoreless innings at Toronto to extend his scoreless streak to 34.0 innings, breaking the Oakland record for consecutive scoreless innings by a reliever...the streak, which broke Paul Lindblad's record of 32.1 set in 1975, reached 39 innings before coming to an end.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (0-2, 7.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...has tossed fewer than five innings in each of his first two starts...has allowed nine runs on 11 hits but has not walked a batter in 9.0 innings...allowed 15 runs on 18 hits in 12.2 innings during the spring but did not walk a batter...begins his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2017-18, 20)...has 498.1 innings pitched and needs 1.2 more for 500 in his career.

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Has retired the side in order in the first, second and third innings in each of his first two starts but the opposition is 11-for-20 (.550) with nine runs scored in the fourth and fifth innings...in seven starts over the last two seasons, he has not allowed a run in the first through third innings (21.0 ip) and opponents are 7-for-66 (.106)...has a 5.60 ERA (11 er in 17.2 ip) and .278 (20-for-72) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) July 25 in Oakland...it was his first loss since Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston and it snapped a career-high tying five-game winning streak...retired each of the first 11 batters before Upton homered with two outs in the fourth...then allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Simmons RBI double and a Fletcher two-run double.

LAST START: He dropped his second consecutive decision in the A's 5-3 loss at Seattle last Friday...retired each of the first nine batters before allowing three runs (two earned) in the fourth inning on a Seager two-run double and an error...put runners on first and third with one out in the fifth and was relieved by Wendelken, who allowed both runners to score (one earned).

MANAEA vs. TEXAS: Is 6-2 with a 3.15 ERA (65.2 ip, 57 h, 25 r, 23 er, 15 bb, 57 so, 8 hr) in 11 career starts...including 5-0 with a 1.72 ERA (7 er in 36.2 ip) over his last six starts...is 4-0 with a 2.43 ERA (8 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts in Oakland and 2-2 with a 3.75 ERA (15 er in 36.0 ip) in six starts in Texas...was 2-0 with a 1.54 ERA in two starts last year (11.2 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 10 so)...the first win came in the A's 6-1 win at Texas on Sept. 15...tossed six scoreless innings and allowed just three hits, a walk and a hit batter...allowed just one base runner as far as second base...was relieved by Luzardo to start the seventh with the A's leading 5-0...also picked up the victory in a 12-3 decision in Oakland on Sept. 21...shut out the Rangers on three hits, a walk and a hit batter over the first five innings...had an 11-0 lead entering the sixth inning when he allowed a pair of solo home runs to Andrus and Santana...was relieved by Wendelken after tossing 5.2 innings.

2019 RECAP: Began the season on the 60-day injured list as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...went 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts before he was reinstated from the IL Sept. 1...made five starts with Oakland and was 4-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .160 opponents batting average...the ERA was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched (Yates SD, 1.19) and fifth lowest in Oakland history...using the same minimum, the batting average was third lowest in the majors and sixth lowest in Oakland history...allowed two runs or fewer in all five starts, including one run or fewer four times, and four hits or fewer four times...struck out 30 batters in 29.2 innings and walked just seven (.212 per nine innings)...had a .229 opponents on-base percentage and .280 slugging percentage.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .129 (8-for-62) against right-handed hitters compared to .211 (8-for-38) against left-handers...however, issued six of his seven walks to righties...yielded two of his three home runs to righties and has surrendered 55 of his 63 career homers to right-handers...now has a .218 opponents batting average and .586 OPS in his career against lefties, .253 with a .736 OPS against righties...opponents were 3-for-31 (.097) with runners on base, 0-for-15 with runners in scoring position and 0-for-8 with RISP and two outs...all three of the home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .073 batting average with two strikes...did not allow a hit to the opponent's eight (0-for-9) or nine (0-for-10) hitter.

2019 NIGHT AND DAY: Was 2-0 with a 0.50 ERA in three starts during the day, 2-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts at night...is now 16-5 with a 3.32 ERA (72 er in 195.1 ip) in 33 career day games, 19-25 with a 4.16 ERA (142 er in 307.1 ip) in 55 starts at night.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Did not allow a run in innings one through four (20.0 ip) and opponents were 8-for-63 (.127)...had a 3.72 ERA and .216 opponents average from the fifth inning on...went 4-0 in four starts with three runs of support or more...is now 4-28 in 45 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 31-2 in 42 starts with support of three runs or more.

2019 WITH OAKLAND: Made his first start of 2019 at New York (AL) on Sept. 1 and had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss...it was his first Major League appearance since Aug. 24, 2018 at Minnesota...tossed five scoreless innings and allowed just one hit while walking three...then picked up the win in each of his final four starts to extend his winning streak to a career-high tying five games dating back to Aug. 24, 2018 (also May 20-June 10, 2017)...had a 1.04 ERA and .178 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned six starts...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters in season-high 7.0 innings in his second start on Sept. 8 against Detroit and was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 victory...it was his third career 10-strikeout game (last: April 21, 2018 vs. Boston)...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to defeat Texas 6-1 on Sept. 15...finished September with a 4-0 record and a 1.21 ERA in five starts...ranked second in the AL in opponents OPS in September (.509), third in ERA and tied for third in wins...it was the second time he won four games in a month in his career (April 2018)...is now 8-2 with a 1.90 ERA in 13 career starts in September...made his postseason debut with a start in the American League Wild Card Game Oct. 2 against Tampa Bay...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss in Oakland (2.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 so)...it matched the second shortest start of his career...surrendered three home runs after yielding two home runs or fewer in each of his 86 career regular season appearances.

2019 IN MINORS: Started his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 8 and was 0-1 with a 9.72 ERA in three starts when he was transferred to Triple-A Las Vegas July 23...went 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA in two starts with the Aviators before his rehab assignment was halted on Aug. 2 due to a strained right oblique...returned to action Aug. 13 and went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA over his final three starts...was 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts overall...struck out 53 batters in 36.1 innings (13.13 per nine innings) and walked 10 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.3...his opponents batting average broke down to .214 against left-handed hitters compared to .226 with five of his six home runs and eight of his 10 walks against right-handed hitters...logged 3.2 scoreless innings in his final start with the Ports on July 18 against Lancaster...struck out 10 batters in 5.2 innings Aug. 13 at Omaha, his first of two 10-strikeout games...combined with Ben Bracewell and J.B. Wendelken on a two-hit shutout in a 3-0 Las Vegas win at Tacoma in his final start on Aug. 23...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings and struck out a season-high 12 on a season-high 99 pitches.

RHP Mike Fiers (0-0, 5.40 ERA):	Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...does not have a decision over his first two starts, both Oakland wins...the A's are now 32-12 (.727) when he starts in his career...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's win in 10 innings at Seattle last Saturday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 4-3 with a 5.76 ERA (70.1 ip, 69 h, 45 r, 45 er, 20 bb, 65 so, 17 hr) in 13 career appearances, including 12 starts, against Texas...is 4-0 with a 3.23 ERA over his last seven starts...went 1-0 with a 4.79 ERA (20.2 ip, 16 h, 11 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 18 so, 5 hr) in four starts last year, all A's wins...was 1-3 with a 5.51 ERA in five starts during the spring...however, held the opposition to a .210 batting average...was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's last year...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting average (.243), tied for eighth in wins and 10th in OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304).

- The A's bullpen has allowed just two runs over the last five games (17.0 ip, 1.05 ERA) and has a 2.14 ERA for the season, which is sixth lowest in the majors.
- Ranks second in the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.257), fourth in OPS (.529) and slugging percentage (.272) and sixth in batting average (.195).
- Has converted each of its last four save opportunities after being charged with a blown save in the opener...is tied for fifth in the majors in saves.
- Has five of the A's seven wins and is tied with the Giants for the second most wins by a bullpen in the majors (Braves, 6)...is one of six pens without a loss
- First batters faced are 5-for-37 (.135) with three walks and a double...rank second in the majors in opponents OPS (.357) and slugging percentage (.162) against first batters, third in on-base percentage (.195) and fourth batting average.
