OAKLAND ATHLETICS (8-4) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (3-7)

THURSDAY, AUGUST 6, 2020 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:40 PDT RHP MIKE FIERS (0-0, 5.40) VS. LHP MIKE MINOR (0-2, 5.91) NBCSCA — A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO — A'S RADIO NETWORK (960 AM, 103.7 FM HD2, 1140 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their winning streak to five games last night, which is an on-going season high...are now 8-4, which is their best record after 12 games since 2014...with a win today, the A's would match their best record after 13 games over the last 30 years (1992, 2010, 2013, 2014)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the third consecutive day and are a season-high 1½ games ahead of second place Houston...have held at least a share of first place for 11 of 13 days this year (three days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...the current winning streak comes on the heels of a three-game losing streak, which marked the first time the A's lost more than two in a row since July 24-26, 2019 when they also lost three straight (went the final 56 games of 2019 without losing more than two in a row)...are 5-1 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 when they are scheduled to play 30 games in 31 days...this is the A's 53rd season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 120th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 3-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 5-4 when they start a right-hander...last year, the A's went 35-14 (.714) against lefties, 62-51 (.549) against righties... the record against south paws was second best in the majors to Houston (38-11..776).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed seven hits or fewer in each of the last five games and have a 1.96 ERA (10 er in 46.0 ip) and .161(26-for-161) opponents batting average over that span...have 55 strikeouts against 12 walks...now have a 2.97 ERA for the season, which is sixth lowest in the majors...have the second lowest opponents OPS (.577) and slugging percentage (.301) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.275)...are fourth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.56)...have surrendered just six home runs, which is tied with the Marlins (6 games) for second fewest in the majors (Cardinals, 5 in 5 games).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-0 with a 2.67 ERA (8 er in 27.0 ip) over the last five games after going 0-4 with a 5.10 ERA over the first seven contests...are now 2-4 with a 3.95 ERA (25 er in 57.0 ip) for the season... have surrendered just four home runs, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's hit a season-high four home runs last night after hitting two home runs or fewer in each of the first 11 games...are batting .197 (44-for-223) over the last seven games but are 5-2 over that stretch...are hitting .206 for the season, which is the fifth lowest batting average in the majors... have the sixth lowest slugging percentage (.350)...are tied for third in hit by pitches (9) and rank fourth in walks (53)...have been successful in 7-of-8 (87.5%) stolen base attempts...are tied for fifth in the majors in stolen base percentage and tied for sixth in steals...A's designated hitters are a combined 3-for-39 (.077), which is the second lowest batting average in the majors (Marlins, .048).

THE BIG INNING: The A's have scored at least four runs in an inning four times this year...have scored 21 runs of their 52 runs (40.4%) in those four innings... are batting .667 (14-for-21) in those four innings and .179 (64-for-358) in the other 103 innings...have scored 13 runs in the fifth inning, but no runs in the second and just one in the sixth.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their Major League leading second walk-off win of the season Tuesday night and both have been grand slams (Piscotty last night, Olson on Opening Night)...this marks the 17th time in Major League history a team has two walk-off grand slams in one season, the first time the A's have done it (last: Cubs in 2018)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it's the third time a team has done it in the span of 11 games...the 1952 Red Sox also did it in 11 games and the 2017 Blue Jays did it in four contests...the A's are the first team with multiple walk-off grand slams within their first 30 games of a season...are 3-0 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are tied with the Yankees for the most in the majors...are 2-0 in extra innings...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied for third in games...are 2-0 in one-run games and the wins are tied for fourth in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are one of three teams that are 5-0 in August (Cubs, Twins)...are 8-1 when homering, 0-3 when going homerless...have used 12 different lineups in the first 12 games...have turned just four double plays, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (Cardinals, 1)...A's outfielders have three assists, which is tied for third most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this six-game homestand against Texas (2-0) and Houston (three games)...went 3-3 on the season-opening six-game homestand against Los Angeles (3-1) and Colorado (0-2) and are 5-3 at home for the season...are scheduled to play 12 of their first 16 games at home... went 3-1 on their first road trip to Seattle over the weekend...embark on an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), San Francisco (three games) and Arizona (two games) beginning Monday.

SHORTENED SEASONS: The A's are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season...this will be the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have played fewer than 161 games in a season...in addition to 1981, the A's played 114 games in 1994, 144 in 1995 and 155 in 1972 (also strike seasons).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's placed Jordan Weems on the 10-day injured list Tuesday and now have two players on the IL (Puk)...have used the IL three times this year after using it 17 times last year...the 17 IL placements in 2019 tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13)...began the season with one player on the injured list (Puk), which marked the first time Oakland had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...the last time the A's opened the season with one player on the IL was in 2006 when they had none.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 13-10 (.565) during the spring...it marked Oakland's second consecutive spring with a winning record after three straight losing springs...started 0-5, won 13 of the final 16 games in Arizona and then went 0-2 against San Francisco in July...led the majors with 102 walks and topped the Cactus League with a .352 on-base percentage...also ranked third in the CL in doubles (45), fourth in runs (132), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in hits (201)...the pitching staff had the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.286) and fifth highest ERA (5.39)...defensively, tied for third in the CL in double plays turned (21) and ranked fifth in fielding percentage (.982).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's have won the first two meetings of 2020 after winning the season series last year, 13-6...it was their third consecutive season series win...went 6-3 in Texas and 7-3 in Oakland...have homered six times in the first two games after tying an Athletics record for most home runs vs. one team in a season last year with 35 (also Seattle in 2019)...scored 125 runs last year which were three short of the Oakland record (128 vs. Texas in 2003)...have won nine of the last 10 games and are 24-7 over the last 31 contests...have won six of the last seven and 24 of the last 30 in Oakland... are 39-20 (.661) over the last four years and are 380-373 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 202-176 in Oakland and 178-197 in Texas...went 111-109 at Globe Life Park, which was the second best record by a visiting American League team (Yankees, 57-48, .543)...have an all-time record of 477-455 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha is tied for second in the majors in hit by pitches (3), ranks fifth in on-base percentage (.457) and tied for fifth in walks (10)...Khris Davis is a .272 (74-for-272) career hitter against the Rangers with 32 home runs and 77 RBI in 74 games...31 of those home runs have come with the A's, which ties Mark McGwire for the most in Athletics history against Rangers/Senators franchise...Joakim Soria has 11 strikeouts in 6.2 innings and is tied for fourth among Major League relievers in strikeouts.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1923** Joe Hauser has five hits and Sammy Hale and Bing Miller add four each as the A's collect 22 hits in a 14-4 win over Chicago...in **1933** Pinky Higgins hits for the cycle in the A's 12-8 win over the Washington Senators...in **2001** the A's defeat the Tigers 6-3 to complete a four-game sweep of Detroit, their first four-game sweep of the Tigers since July 1-3, 1955.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (0-0, 5.40 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...does not have a decision over his first two starts, both Oakland wins...the A's are now 32-12 (.727) when he starts in his career...is in his 10th season in the majors and is with his fourth team...has pitched for Milwaukee (2011-15), Houston (2015-17), Detroit (2018) and Oakland (2018-present)...is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2013, 15-17, 19-20).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Los Angeles (AL) July 26 in Oakland...did not walk or strikeout a batter in 4.0 innings...it was his first career start with no walks and no strikeouts...the A's scored five times in the first and he allowed a three-run home run to Trout in the third inning... was relieved by Petit with runners on first and third and no outs in the fifth and Petit allowed one of those runners to score.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 10-inning win at Seattle last Saturday...allowed a two-run single to Seager in the third inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...the A's tied the game with two runs in the seventh and he was relieved by Diekman to start the bottom of the seventh.

FIERS vs. TEXAS: Is 4-3 with a 5.76 ERA (70.1 ip, 69 h, 45 r, 45 er, 20 bb, 65 so, 17 hr) in 13 career appearances, including 12 starts...is 4-0 with a 3.23 ERA (14 er in 39.0 ip) over his last seven starts after going 0-3 with an 8.90 ERA over his first six games...went 1-1 with a 9.23 ERA (27 er in 26.1 ip) in six games at Globe Life Park and 3-2 with a 3.68 ERA (18 er in 44.0 ip) in seven starts in his home ballparks...went 1-0 with a 4.79 ERA (20.2 ip, 16 h, 11 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 18 so, 5 hr) in four starts last year, all A's wins...the first no decision

came in an 8-6 A's win at Texas April 12...allowed two runs in the first inning, a solo home run to Cabrera in the fourth and a three-run home run to Andrus in the fifth...left trailing 6-5, but the A's scored once in each of the final three innings for the win...also had a no decision in a 6-5 A's win in Oakland on July 28...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a pair of solo home runs to Santana and Mazara in the sixth...left after six innings with a 4-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs in the eighth for the blown save...also had a no decision in an 8-6 win at Texas on Sept. 14...left after tossing 1.2 innings with nerve irritation in his right arm...then picked up the win Sept. 20 in Oakland when he combined with Bassitt on a two-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win...tossed eight of the innings and allowed two hits (0 bb, 5 so)...retired each of the final 16 hatters that he faced

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-3 with a 5.51 ERA in five starts during the spring...however, held the opposition to a .210 batting average...the five starts tied for the most in the majors...his 16.1 innings pitched led the Cactus League and ranked fifth in the majors...is now 7-11 with a 5.96 ERA (77 er in 116.1 ip) in 43 games, including 31 starts, in his career during the spring.

2019 RECAP: Was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting average (.243), tied for eighth in wins and 10th in OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304)...also tied for third in wild pitches (13) and tied for fifth in games started...had career highs in wins, games (33), games started, innings pitched (184.2) and winning percentage...led the A's in wins, starts, innings pitched, runs (82), walks (53) and home runs (30)...is the first A's pitcher to win 15 games since Scott Kazmir had 15 in 2014 and the first to make 33 starts since Sonny Gray had 33 in 2014...his innings pitched were the most by an A's pitcher over the last three years... his .789 winning percentage was fourth best in Oakland history among pitchers with 15 or more decisions...his 30 home runs tied for 10th most in a season in Oakland history...struck out 126 batters, an average of 6.14 per nine innings...that was the third-lowest mark in the AL...had the fifth-lowest strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.38)...the A's were 22-11 (.667) in his starting assignments in 2019 and are 32-12 (.727) in his career...left with the lead in eight of his no decisions in 2019 only to have the bullpen blow the save...has left with the lead in 12 of his 44 career starts with the A's only to have the bullpen blow the save.

BEGINNING, MIDDLE AND END: Went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA, .297 opponents batting average and .854 OPS over his first eight starts last year, 10-0 with a 2.12 ERA, .199 opponents average and .572 OPS over his next 17 starts from May 7-Aug. 9 and 3-1 with a 6.27 ERA, .304 opponents average and .940 OPS over his final eight starts.

2019 HOME AND AWAY: Was 9-2 with a 2.90 ERA and .641 OPS in 17 starts at home compared to 6-2 with a 5.14 ERA and .796 OPS in 16 starts on the road...had the fifth-lowest home ERA in the AL and the fourth-highest road ERA...tied for fourth in the AL in home wins and ranked eighth in OPS...one of his home losses was in Tokyo and he is now 12-1 with a 2.82 (43 er in 137.1) ERA in 23 starts in the Coliseum since he was acquired from Detroit on Aug. 6, 2018...is 7-0 with a 2.66 ERA (26 er in 88.0 ip) over his last 14 home starts and has not lost at home since April 20, 2019 vs. Toronto...is 13-3 with a 3.19 ERA (59 er in 166.2 ip) and .224 (135-for-604) opponents batting average in 29 career games, including 28 starts, in the Coliseum.

2019 NIGHT AND DAY: Was 11-2 with a 3.66 ERA and .683 OPS in 24 starts at night, 4-2 with a 4.60 ERA and .800 OPS in nine starts during the day...tied for fifth in the AL in night wins and ranked seventh in ERA and OPS...is now 16-3 with a 3.60 ERA (77 er in 192.2 ip) in 35 career appearances at night with the A's.

2019 DAYS REST: Compiled an 11-1 record and a 3.21 ERA in 17 starts on five days rest and is now 14-1 with a 3.12 ERA (48 er in 138.1 ip) in 23 starts on five days rest in his A's career...went 2-1 with a 4.59 ERA in 10 starts on four days rest and 2-2 with a 5.10 ERA in six starts on six days rest or more.

2019 MONTH BY MONTH: Was 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA in five starts in April, 1-1 with a 7.84 ERA in five starts in September and 12-1 with a 2.59 ERA in 21 starts in May, June, July and August...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in his career in April, 8-14 with a 5.67 ERA in September and 55-35 with a 3.42 ERA (302 er in 795.0) in between.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: His .243 opponents batting average broke down to .239 (83-for-348) against righthanded hitters compared to .248 (83-for-335) against left-handers...yielded a .264 average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .185 with RISP and two outs...now has a .193 (76-for-394) career opponents average with RISP and two outs...allowed a .216 opponents average with two outs.

2019 DIVISIONAL PLAY: Was 5-2 with a 5.63 ERA in 17 starts against AL West competition compared to 10-2 with a 2.38 ERA in 16 starts against all other teams...is now 14-15 with a 5.53 ERA (184 er in 299.1 ip) in 57 career appearances against the AL West, 55-44 with a 3.46 ERA (305 er in 793.1 ip) in 150 games against all other opponents.

THIS AND THAT: Averaged 87.8 pitches per start, which was fourth fewest in the AL, and 15.7 pitches per inning, which was sixth fewest...induced 17 double plays, which tied for eighth most...opponents stole 13 bases with him on the mound, which tied for fifth most in the AL...however, they were caught stealing five times, which tied for seventh most...had two pickoff errors, which tied for the most in the AL...had a career-high 12-game winning streak that spanned 20 starts from May 7 to Aug. 27...the streak was second longest in Oakland history and fell one short of the record of 13 set by Catfish Hunter in 1973 (June 2-Sept. 5)...compiled a 2.41 ERA and .214 opponents batting average during the streak...was unbeaten in 21 consecutive starts from May 7 to Sept. 3, which matches Lefty Grove (April 22-Aug. 19, 1931) for the longest unbeaten streak by a starter in Athletics history

WITH THE A'S: Was acquired by Oakland on Aug. 6, 2018 and is 20-6 with a 3.92 ERA (108 er in 247.2 ip) in 45 games, including 44 starts, with the A's... the wins are tied for fifth most in the American League over that span.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (1-0, 0.93 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-2 A's win at Seattle last Sunday (5.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 7 so)...the win extended his winning streak to a career-high four games dating back to Aug. 11, 2019...has a 3.26 ERA and .240 opponents batting average during the streak, which spans 11 games, including eight starts...is 2-1 with a 3.97 ERA (34.0 ip, 29 h, 17 r, 15 er, 9 bb, 26 so, 5 hr) in six career appearances, including five starts, against Houston...went 1-1 with a 5.00 ERA (18.0 ip, 19 h, 10 r, 10 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in three starts last year...went 2-1 with a 3.46 ERA in five games, including three starts, this spring...allowed a .190 opponents batting average but issued seven walks in 13.0 innings...saw the most extensive action of his five-year career last year, going 10-5 with a 3.81 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 28 games, including 25 starts.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

6-0, 1.90 ERA (11 er in 52.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 5-for-6 (83.3%)

- The A's bullpen tossed 5.2 scoreless innings last night, the third time this year they have worked at least five innings without allowing a run...had just four such games all last year...has allowed just two runs over the last six games (22.2 ip, 0.79 ERA) and has a 1.90 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the majors.
- Ranks second in the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.239), third
 in OPS (.490) and fourth in slugging percentage (.251) and batting average (.182).
- Has converted each of its last five save opportunities after being charged with a blown save in the opener...is tied for fourth in the majors in saves.
- Has six of the A's eight wins and is tied with the Braves for the most wins by a bullpen in the majors...is one of five pens without a loss (Cubs, White Sox, Twins, Yankees).
