OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-4) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (6-7)

SATURDAY, AUGUST 8, 2020 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:10 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won each of the first four games of the homestand to extend their winning streak to seven games...are now 10-4, which is tied for the fourth best record in the majors...that matches the A's best 14-game record over the last 30 years (1992, 2013, 2014)...with a win today, the A's would match the 2014 club for their best record after 15 games over the last 30 years...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the fifth consecutive day and are a season-high 3½ games ahead of second place Houston...that is the A's largest lead in the West since Aug. 12, 2014 when they also led by 3½ games (last lead by 4½ games on July 8, 2014)...it is the A's largest lead after 14 games or fewer since game 14 of the 1990 season (led by 3½ on April 25)...have held at least a share of first place for 13 of 15 days this year (five days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 12 days in first from 2016-19...swept a three-game series from Texas to start the homestand for their first series sweep of the season.

SIX-GAME WINNING STREAK: The A's seven-game winning streak matches the longest in the majors this year (Yankees, July 26-Aug. 3)...it matches the A's second longest winning streak over the last seven years (11, May 16-27, 2019)...have outscored the opposition 37-16 during the streak...the pitching staff has a 1.99 ERA (15 er in 68.0 ip) with 69 strikeouts and 18 walks in 68.0 innings...the bullpen has allowed just three runs (two earned) in 28.0 innings (0.64 ERA)...are batting .221 (52-for-235) with 39 walks and eight hit by pitches (.350 on-base percentage)...have homered in each of the seven games (11 total).

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their Major League leading third walk-off win of the season last night...no other team has more than one...two of the walk-off wins have been grand slams (Piscotty Tuesday night, Olson on Opening Night), which marks the 17th time in Major League history a team has two walk-off grand slams in one season (last: Cubs in 2018)...it is the first time the A's have done it...played 13 innings last night, which matches the longest game by innings in the majors this year (Dodgers defeated the Astros 4-2 on July 29)...are now 3-0 in extra inning games...no other team has more than one extra inning win and only the Astros (4) have more extra inning games...have scored seven runs in extra innings, which is the most in the majors...stranded 18 base runners last night, which tied for third most in Oakland history and was the most since Aug. 4, 2018 against Tampa Bay when they stranded 18 in a 10-inning, 3-2 win...are 4-0 in games decided in the last at bat and have the most last at bat wins in the majors...are 3-0 in one-run games and the wins are tied for third most in the majors.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 4-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-4 when they start a right-hander...the four wins against left-handed starters is tied with the Cubs and Rockies for the most in the majors...went 35-14 (.714) against south paws last year, which was the second best record in the majors to Houston (38-11, .776).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in five of the last seven games and have a 1.99 ERA (15 er in 68.0 ip) and .185 (45-for-243) opponents batting average over that span...have a 2.82 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the majors behind Cleveland (2.06) and the Dodgers (2.39)...also rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.320) and fourth in OPS (.597) and on-base percentage (.276)...have surrendered just eight home runs, which is second fewest to St. Louis (5 in 5 games)...rank fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.54).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-0 with a 2.93 ERA (13 er in 40.0 ip) over the last seven games after going 0-4 with a 5.10 ERA over the first seven contests...have tossed five innings or more in six of the last seven games after logging fewer than five innings in six of the first seven...are tied for sixth in the majors in innings pitched (70.0)...are 3-4 with a 3.86 ERA (30 er in 70.0 ip) for the season...have allowed three home runs in the last three games (16.1 ip) after surrendering just three over the first 11 (53.2 ip).

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to seven hits or fewer in seven of the last nine games and are batting .203 (60-for-296) over that span...however, have scored 41 runs (4.6 per game) and have won seven of the nine games...are batting .208 for the season, which is sixth lowest in the majors...however, rank second in the majors in walks (64) and tied for second in hit by pitches (12)...have the seventh lowest slugging percentage (.354) and 10th lowest OPS (.674)...have been successful in 7-of-8 (87.5%) stolen base attempts...rank fourth in the majors in stolen base percentage and tied for ninth in steals...are 7-for-20 (.350) with two home runs and 20 RBI with the bases loaded...lead the majors in RBI with the bases loaded and are tied for the

lead in hits and home runs...A's designated hitters are a combined 6-for-49 (.122), which is the lowest batting average in the majors (Angels, .125).

THE BIG INNING: The A's have scored at least four runs in an inning five times this year...have scored 25 runs of their 61 runs (41.0%) in those four innings...are batting .654 (17-for-26) in those four innings and .181 (77-for-426) in the other 123 innings...have scored 13 runs in the fifth inning, but just one in the second and sixth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in the last four games after making five errors over their 10 contests...have a .989 fielding percentage, which is seventh best in the majors...have turned just five double plays, which is second fewest to the Cardinals, who have one in five games...A's outfielders have three assists, which is tied for third most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-0 on this six-game homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (1-0)...went 3-3 on the season-opening six-game homestand against Los Angeles (3-1) and Colorado (0-2) and are 7-3 at home for the season...are scheduled to play 12 of their first 16 games at home...went 3-1 on their first road trip to Seattle last weekend...leave following the game tomorrow for an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), San Francisco (three games) and Arizona (two games).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-0 in August and one of two teams that are undefeated this month (Marlins, 5-0)...the opponent has scored first in 10 of the A's 14 games, but the A's are 7-3 in those games...are 10-1 when homering, 0-3 when going homerless...are one of five teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Cardinals, Phillies, Yankees)...have used 14 different lineups in the first 14 games...are 7-1 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 when they are scheduled to play 30 games in 31 days...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's placed Jordan Weems on the 10-day injured list Tuesday and now have two players on the IL (Puk)...have used the IL three times this year after using it 17 times last year...the 17 IL placements in 2019 tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13)...began the season with one player on the injured list (Puk), which marked the first time Oakland had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's won the first game of 2020 last night and have now won eight of their last 11 games from Houston...lost the season series last year for the fifth consecutive season as they went 8-11...the eight wins were the A's most against the Astros since 2015 (9-10)...went 4-5 in Oakland and 4-6 in Houston...hit 28 home runs but allowed 41, which was second most in Athletics history against one Team (48 vs. New York in 1956)...the two teams combined for 69 home runs, an average of 3.6 per game...are 38-58 (.396) against Houston over the last six years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 69-71 all-time, including 36-34 in Oakland and 33-37 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Liam Hendriks has four saves and a win over his last six outings (6.1 ip, 3 h, 9 so) and is tied for second in the majors in saves (Britton, NYY 5)...**Matt Olson** ranks second in the majors in walks (14) and tied for eighth in home runs (4)...**Yusmeiro Petit** is tied for second in the majors with eight games pitched (Barlow, KC 9)...has pitched in 162 games over the last three seasons, which are the most in the majors...**Burch Smith** has not allowed a run in his first four appearances (7.1 ip) and his innings pitched are fifth most in the majors among pitchers that have not allowed a run...**Joakim Soria** has struck out at least two batters in each of his last five appearances, which matches the longest such streak of his career (May 1-9, 2017)...now has 13 strikeouts in 7.2 innings for the season and is tied for second among Major League relievers in strikeouts.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1986** Dave Kingman's eighth inning homer in the A's 5-2 win over Minnesota gives him homers in five consecutive games, an Oakland A's record at the time...in **2004** the A's defeat Minnesota 6-5 in 18 innings in the longest A's game since 1972...Oakland scores three times in the top of the 18th on RBI singles by Jermaine Dye, Erubiel Durazo and Damian Miller before the Twins score twice in the bottom of the 18th...in **2006** Nick Swisher hits his 24th home run of the season in the A's 7-6 win over Texas, setting an all-time Athletics record for home runs by a switch hitter.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (1-1, 2.25 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...is in his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2017, 19-20)...is 15-7 with a 2.75 ERA (54 er in 177.0 ip) in 32 games, 30 starts, over the last three years after going 1-3 with a 6.32 ERA in 30 games, two starts, over his first two seasons.

THIS AND THAT: Right-handed hitters are 1-for-22 (.045) with two walks against him (.199 OPS)...left-handed hitters are batting .314 (11-for-35) with a .800 OPS...opponents are 1-for-12 when leading off an inning but he has issued four walks...yielded a .207 average to batters leading off an inning last year...has not allowed a run in the first inning (3.0 ip) after surrendering just one run in the first inning last last year (16.0 ip).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day, July 24 in Oakland...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 13th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 15 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers)...was just the second foreign-born Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Ariel Prieto, April 2, 1997)...scattered two hits, a walk and hit a batter over the first three innings before allowing his only run in the fourth inning on a Goodwin RBI single...was relieved by Petit to start the fifth inning with the scored tied 1-1

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Colorado July 29 in Oakland...it was his first loss since April 29, 2019 at Boston and it snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to May 17, 2019...the A's scored a run in the first and he allowed a RBI single to Wolters in the second inning...also surrendered a sacrifice fly to Hampson in the fourth and was relieved by Luzardo to start the sixth with the A's trailing 2-1.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 victory at Seattle on Monday...allowed a RBI double to Seager in the third inning but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...Oakland scored eight times in the fifth inning and he retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced.

MONTAS vs. HOUSTON: Is 2-2 with a 4.74 ERA (24.2 ip, 29 h, 15 r, 13 er, 12 bb, 16 so, 3 hr) in six career appearances, including four starts...is 1-1 with a 3.75 ERA (5 er in 12.0 ip) in three games at Minute Maid Park and 1-1 with a 5.65 ERA (8 er in 12.2 ip) in three games in the Coliseum...was 1-1 with a 2.38 ERA (11.1 ip, 10 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 11 so) in two starts last year...was the losing pitcher in his first start, a 3-2 A's loss at Houston April 5...allowed a Bregman RBI single in the third but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...surrendered a lead off home run to Correa in the bottom of the fourth to give Houston the lead for good...then picked up the win in a 2-1 decision in Oakland on April 17...did not allow a hit until Gurriel singled with one out in the fifth...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Brantley in the sixth...the A's came back with a run in the bottom of the sixth and he was relieved by Trivino with one out and a runner on first in the seventh.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-0 and did not allow an earned run in three starts...yielded two unearned runs in 5.2 innings...opponents went 4-for-22 (.182) and he walked just one batter in 5.2 innings...his final outing came on Mar. 8 against Milwaukee in Mesa...is now 3-0 with a 0.42 ERA in eight games, five starts, over the last two springs.

2019 RECAP: Went 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA in 16 starts in a season shortened due to an 80-game suspension for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...his ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.282) and OPS (.646)...had career highs in wins, starts, strikeouts (103), innings (96.0), hits (84), runs (35), walks (23) and hit batters (4) and matched his high in earned runs (28) and wild pitches (4)...averaged 2.16 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.48 was a career high...surrendered eight home runs (0.75 per nine innings).

90 OR MORE INNINGS RANKINGS: His 2.63 ERA was third lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 90 innings...using the same minimum, he ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings, fifth in opponents OPS, sixth in slugging percentage (.364), ninth in on-base percentage and 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio...averaged 9.66 strikeouts per nine innings, which was second highest in Oakland history (Gio Gonzalez, 9.94 in 2009) and third highest in Athletics history (Wes Stock, 9.77 in 1964) among pitchers with 90 or more innings...his 4.48 strikeout-to-walk ratio was fourth highest in Oakland history.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .229 (38-for-166) opponents batting average and .647 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 (46-for-199) with a .645 OPS against left-handers...allowed a .207 average to batters leading off an inning and .115 with two strikes...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...only one came the first time through the batting order...opponents were 4-for-7 (.571) with the bases loaded.

2019 SPLITS: Was 4-0 with a 3.00 ERA in seven starts at home, 5-2 with a 2.33 ERA in nine starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 42.0 innings in Oakland compared to six in 54.0 innings on the road...had a 3-0 record and a 1.50 ERA in four starts during the day, 6-2 with a 3.00 ERA in 12 starts at night...went 5-2 with a 3.00 ERA in 11 starts on four or five days rest, 4-0 with a 1.91 ERA in five starts on six days rest or more...is now 7-2 with a 2.39 ERA (19 er in 71.2 ip) in 11 career starts on six days rest or more.

2019 RUN SUPPORT: Received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 16 starts but had six starts with seven runs of support or more...had a 6.84 RSA overall...was 7-1 in nine starts with three runs of support or more and is 11-1 in 14 such starts in his career.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Allowed just one run in the first inning for a 0.56 ERA...had a 5.63 ERA in the second inning and a 2.39 ERA from the third inning on...the A's were 12-4 (.750) in his starting assignments and are 21-9 (.700) when he starts in his career...committed three errors, which tied for the most among AL pitchers...pitched for Escogido in the Dominican Winter League following the season and was 3-0 with a 1.44 ERA in five starts.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the Opening Day roster and was available in the bullpen for the two games against Seattle in Japan but did not pitch...was inserted into the fourth spot in the rotation when the season resumed and picked up the win in his first start March 31 against Los Angeles (AL)...took the loss in his second start on April 5 at Houston...then went 3-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .224 opponents average over this next three starts from April 10 to 23...had his three-game winning streak snapped April 29 at Boston when he allowed a season-high seven runs in 4.1 innings...only one of the runs was earned and the six unearned runs tied for second most in Oakland history...they were the most since Brett Anderson also had six on May 15, 2009 vs. Detroit...finished April with a 3-2 record and a 3.29 ERA in five starts...tied for fifth in the American League in wins...then went 2-0 with a 2.64 ERA in five starts in May...tied for eighth in the AL in May ERA...left his start on May 10 against Cleveland with a 3-2 lead but Trivino blew the save in a game the A's would win 4-3 in 12 innings...had career highs in strikeouts (10), innings pitched (8.2) and pitches (109) in a 7-2 win at Detroit on May 17...that began a career-high and season-ending five-game winning streak...compiled a 2.49 ERA and .201 opponents batting average over that eight start stretch...had his second career 10-strikeout game in a 9-8 win at Texas June 9...allowed a run on four hits in 8.0 innings on June 20 against Tampa Bay but had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win...was suspended for 80 games the next day for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...was 9-2 with a 2.70 ERA in 15 starts at the time...was tied for third in the AL in wins and winning percentage (.818) and ranked fifth in ERA...was reinstated Sept. 25 and started that day at Los Angeles (AL) when he had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...was not eligible for the postseason.
