OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-4) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (6-8)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won each of the first five games of the homestand to extend their winning streak to eight games...are now 11-4, which is the fourth best record in the majors...that matches the 2013 club for the A's best record after 15 games over the last 30 years (won game 16 in 2013)... are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the sixth consecutive day and are a season-high 4½ games ahead of second place Houston...that is the A's largest lead in the West since July 8, 2014 when they also led by 4½ games..last led by five games on June 30, 2014 and last led by 5½ on June 29, 2014...the only time the A's have led the AL West by at least 4½ games after 15 games or fewer was in 1981 when they led by as many as 5½ games after a 14-1 start (April 22)...have held at least a share of first place for 14 of 16 days this year (six days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 12 days in first from 2016-19...swept a three-game series from Texas to start the homestand for their first series sweep of the season.

EIGHT-GAME WINNING STREAK: The A's eight-game winning streak is the longest in the majors this year and is second longest by an A's team over the last seven years (11, May 16-27, 2019)...have outscored the opposition 40-17 during the streak...the pitching staff has a 1.87 ERA (16 er in 77.0 ip) and .182 (50-for-275) opponents batting average...has struck out 76 in 77.0 innings and walked just 18...the bullpen has allowed just four runs (three earned) in 30.0 innings (0.90 ERA)...are batting .229 (61-for-266) with 40 walks and eight hit by pitches (.346 on-base percentage)...have homered in each of the eight games (13 total)...have committed just two errors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-0 on this six-game homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (2-0) and now have a season-high five-game home winning streak...the longest home winning streak last year was six games (July 4-17 and Aug. 1-17)...with a win today, the A's would have their first undefeated homestand of six or more games since July 3-8, 2014 when they went 4-0 against Toronto and 2-0 against San Francisco...went 3-3 on the season-opening six-game homestand and are 8-3 at home for the season...today's game concludes a season-opening stretch where the A's played 12 of their first 16 games at home...are scheduled to play 18 of their next 23 games on the road...begin an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), San Francisco (three games) and Arizona (two games) tomorrow...went 3-1 on their first road trip to Seattle last weekend.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in six of the last eight games and five hits or fewer five times...have a 1.87 ERA (16 er in 77.0 ip) and .182 (50-for-275) opponents batting average over that span...have a 2.70 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the majors behind Cleveland (1.99) and the Dodgers (2.56)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.314), rank third in OPS (.584) and fourth in on-base percentage (.270)...have surrendered just eight home runs, which is second fewest to St. Louis (5 in 5 games)...rank fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.38).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last seven games and are 4-0 with a 2.41 ERA (11 er in 41.0 ip) over that span...have a 3.51 ERA (30 er in 77.0 ip) for the season, which is fifth lowest among teams in the West but 10th lowest in the majors...rank fourth in the majors in innings pitched (77.0) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs allowed (6).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .249 (50-for-201) with 34 runs scored and 11 home runs over the last six games after hititing .188 with 30 runs and seven home runs over the first nine contests...are batting .213 for the season, which is eighth lowest in the majors...however, are tied for second in the majors in walks (65) and tied for third in hit by pitches (12)...have been successful in 8-of-10 (80.0%) stolen base attempts...are tied for sixth in the majors in steals and tied for seventh in stolen base percentage...are 7-for-20 (.350) with two home runs and 20 RBI with the bases loaded...lead the majors in RBI with the bases loaded and are tied for the lead in hits and home runs...A's designated hitters are a combined 6-for-52 (.115), which is the lowest batting average in the majors (Angels, .117).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a season-high five-game errorless streak after making six errors over their first 10 contests...have a .989 fielding percentage, which is sixth best in the majors...have turned just five double plays, which is second fewest to the Cardinals, who have one in five games... A's outfielders have three assists, which is tied for fourth most in the majors.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their Major League leading third walk-off win of the season Friday night...no other team has more

than one...two of the walk-off wins have been grand slams (Piscotty Tuesday night, Olson on Opening Night), which marks the 17th time in Major League history a team has two walk-off grand slams in one season (last: Cubs in 2018)...it is the first time the A's have done it...played 13 innings Friday night, which matches the longest game by innings in the majors this year (Dodgers defeated the Astros 4-2 on July 29)...are now 3-0 in extra inning games...no other team has more than one extra inning win and only the Astros (4) have more extra inning games...have scored seven runs in extra innings, which is the most in the majors...are 4-0 in games decided in the last at bat and have the most last at bat wins in the majors...are 3-0 in one-run games and the wins are tied for fourth most in the majors...are 7-1 in games decided by two runs or fewer.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 5-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-4 when they start a right-hander...the five wins against left-handed starters is tied with the Rockies for the most in the majors...went 35-14 (.714) against south paws last year, which was the second best record in the majors to Houston (38-11, .776).

THIS AND THAT: The A's lineup yesterday was the same as Thursday's, marking the first time this year Oakland has repeated a lineup...the A's are 8-0 in August, which is the best record in the majors...the opponent has scored first in 10 of the A's 15 games, but the A's are 7-3 in those games...are 11-1 when homering, 0-3 when going homerless...are one of five teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Cardinals, Phillies, Yankees)...are 8-1 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 when they are scheduled to play 30 games in 31 days...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's placed Jordan Weems on the 10-day injured list Tuesday and now have two players on the IL (Puk)...have used the IL three times this year after using it 17 times last year...the 17 IL placements in 2019 tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13)...began the season with one player on the injured list (Puk), which marked the first time Oakland had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have won the first two games of 2020 and with a win today, would record their first series sweep of the Astros since Sept. 8-10, 2017 when they swept a four-game series in Oakland...have now won eight of their last 10 games from Houston, including five of the last six in Oakland...lost the season series last year for the fifth consecutive season as they went 8-11...the eight wins were the A's most against the Astros since 2015 (9-10)...went 4-5 in Oakland and 4-6 in Houston...hit 28 home runs but allowed 41, which was second most in Athletics history against one Team (48 vs. New York in 1956)...the two teams combined for 69 home runs, an average of 3.6 per game...are 39-58 (.402) against Houston over the last six years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 70-71 all-time, including 37-34 in Oakland and 33-37 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Liam Hendriks is tied for the Major League lead in saves (Britton, NYY)... has a streak of 27 consecutive games with a strikeout, which ties his own Athletics record for consecutive games with a strikeout by a reliever (June 8-Aug. 14, 2019)... Yusmeiro Petit is tied for second in the majors with eight games pitched (Barlow, KC 9) and leads the majors with 162 games pitched over the last three seasons...Burch Smith has not allowed a run in his first four appearances (7.1 ip) and his innings pitched are tied for sixth most in the majors among pitchers that have not allowed a run... Joakim Soria has struck out at least two batters in each of his last five appearances, which matches the longest such streak of his career...is tied for second among ML relievers in strikeouts (13).

In **1930** George Earnshaw tosses a seven-hit shutout and Jimmie Foxx hits a three-run home run in the bottom of the eighth inning as the A's defeat Chicago 3-0 in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1968** Campy Campaneris is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 4-2 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Washington...in **2002** the A's win a 16-inning game at New York 3-2 in a game that last six hours exactly...Mark Ellis has a RBI single in the 16th inning to drive in the winning run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesús Luzardo (0-0, 2.31 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth appearance and second start of the season...posted a 4.05 ERA in two relief appearances before tossing 5.0 scoreless innings in his first Major League start last Tuesday against Texas...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010... the last A's pitcher under the age of 23 to win a game was Anderson in that Oct. 2 game against Seattle...is in his second season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster.

IN RELIEF: Made his first apperance of 2020 on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...entered the game to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 4-0 and tossed what was then a career-high tying 3.0 scoreless innings... pitched in relief again July 29 against Colorado in Oakland in a 5-1 A's loss... struck out a career-high five in 3.2 innings...also had career highs in hits (5), runs (3) and earned runs (3) and matched his high in walks (2)...allowed a run in the eighth inning to snap a career-high 12.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2019.

LAST START: He had a no decision in his first Major League start, a 5-1 A's win over Texas on Tuesday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 5.0 scoreless innings and matched his high with five strikeouts and two walks...had a career-high 76 pitches...retired each of the first six batters and allowed just two base runners into scoring position...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning with the score tied 0-0.

2019 RECAP: Had his season interrupted twice by a strained left shoulder but, after going 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 11 games (nine starts) with three minor league teams, he was selected by Oakland on Sept. 9 after Las Vegas concluded its season...had no decisions, two saves, a 1.50 ERA and .119 opponents batting average in six relief appearances in his Major League debut...struck out 16 batters in 12.0 innings (12.00 per nine innings) and walked just three for a .196 on-base percentage...allowed two doubles and one home run for a .238 slugging percentage...left-handed hitters were 1-for-14 (.071) with no extra base hits, one walk and a .205 OPS...right-handed hitters batted .143 (4-for-28) with a .547 OPS...opponents hit .138 with his lone home run with the bases empty, .077 with runners on...they were 1-for-8 (.125) with runners in scoring position... allowed a .095 average with two strikes...did not inherit any runners and first batters faced were 1-for-5 (.200) with a walk.

2019 WITH OAKLAND: Made his debut on Sept. 11 at Houston and tossed a season-high 3.0 innings...allowed one run on one hit, a Martin Maldonado solo home run in the sixth inning...did not walk a batter and struck out two... fanned the first batter he faced, Aledmys Díaz...at the age of 21 years, 346 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher since Brett Anderson on Oct. 1,

tory...in his second outing, he tossed the final three innings of the A's 6-1 win at Texas on Sept. 15 for his first professional save...at the age of 21 years, 350 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to save a game since Houston Street on July 8, 2005 (21 years, 340 days)...allowed one run and struck out a season-high four...did not allow a run over his final four games and finished the season with a 7.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed 1.0 inning twice, 2.0 innings twice and 3.0 innings twice...tossed 3.0 scoreless innings of relief in the AL Wild Card game on Oct. 2 against Tampa Bay (1 h, 2 bb, 4 so)...the appearance came two days after his 22nd birthday, making him the second-youngest pitcher in Oakland postseason history...Rich Harden had two outings in 2003, with the youngest coming at 21 years and 305 days...was rated as the A's number one prospect by Baseball America following the season.

2019 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Was a non-roster invitee with the A's during the spring and had a 0.93 ERA in four games before he was shut down with a supraspinatus muscle strain...was assigned to Single-A Stockton June 11 and appeared in two games with the Ports and three with Las Vegas before going on the injured list July 4...made one rehab start with the AZL A's Green before he was reinstated from the IL Aug. 10 and sent to Stockton...moved back to Las Vegas Aug. 15...combined to strike out 57 batters in 43.0 minor league innings (11.93 per nine innings)...walked just eight (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.13...his opponents batting average broke down to .132 (5-for-38) against left-handed hitters compared to .248 (31-for-125) with all four of his home runs against right-handers...had a .379 OPS against lefties, .675 against righties...all four of the home runs were solo shots... yielded a .132 average with runners in scoring position...tossed fewer than five innings in nine of his 11 appearances, but logged at least two innings each time...surrendered one run or fewer eight times...had more strikeouts than innings pitched seven times.

- Tossed 5.2 scoreless innings Wednesday night, the third time this year the pen has worked at least five innings without allowing a run...had just four such games all last year.
