## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (12-4) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (5-11)

MONDAY, AUGUST 10, 2020 — ANGEL STADIUM — 6:40 PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (0-2, 8.03) VS. RHP JULIO TEHERAN (0-1, 6.75) NBCSCA — A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO — A'S RADIO NETWORK (960 AM, 103.7 FM HD2, 1140 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's swept a pair of three-game series from Texas and Houston on the last homestand to extend their winning streak to nine games... the sweeps were the A's first two sweeps of the season...are now 12-4, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cubs (10-3, .769)...it is tied for the third best record in Oakland history after 16 games...with a win tonight, the A's would have their best record after 17 games since they started the 1981 season 16-1...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the seventh

consecutive day and are a season-high five games ahead of second place Texas...that is the A's largest lead in the West since June 30, 2014 when they also led by five games...last led by 5½ games on June 29, 2014 and last led by six on June 21, 2014...the only time the A's have led the AL West by at least five games prior to the 21st game of the season was in 1981 when they led by as many as 5½ games after a 14-1 start (April 22)...have held at least a share of first place for 15 of 17 days this year (seven days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19.

NINE-GAME WINNING STREAK: The A's nine-game winning streak is the longest in the majors this year and is tied for ninth longest in Oakland history... it matches the second longest winning streak by an A's team over the last 14 years (11, May 16-27, 2019)...have outscored the opposition 47-19 during the streak...the pitching staff has a 1.88 ERA (18 er in 86.0 ip) and .183 (56-for-306) opponents batting average...has struck out 86 in 86.0 innings and walked just 21...the bullpen has allowed just four runs (three earned) in 33.0 innings (0.81 ERA)...are batting .229 (68-for-297) with 44 walks and 10 hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage)...have homered in each of the nine games (16 total)...have committed just two errors.

*PITCHING:* The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in seven of the last nine games and five hits or fewer five times...have a 2.66 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the majors behind Cleveland (2.04) and the Dodgers (2.53)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.316) and rank third in OPS (.586) and on-base percentage (.269)...have surrendered just nine home runs, which is second fewest to St. Louis (5 in 5 games)...rank third in fewest walks per nine innings (2.42) and tied for third in fewest hit batters (2).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last eight games and are 5-0 with a 2.51 ERA (13 er in 46.2 ip) over that span...have a 3.48 ERA (32 er in 82.2 ip) for the season, which is fifth lowest among teams in the West (AL and NL) but ninth lowest in the majors... rank fourth in the majors in innings pitched (82.2) and tied for fifth in fewest home runs allowed (7).

*OFFENSE:* The A's are batting .246 (57-for-232) with 41 runs scored and 14 home runs over the last seven games after hitting .188 with 30 runs and seven home runs over the first nine contests...are batting .214 for the season, which is eighth lowest in the majors...however, have been hit by a pitch 14 times, which is tied with the Cubs for second most in the majors to the Mets (15)...rank third in the majors in walks (69) and 10th in on-base percentage (.321)...are tied for eighth in the majors in home runs (21)...have been successful in 8-of-10 (80.0%) stolen base attempts...are tied for seventh in the majors in steals and stolen base percentage...are 7-for-20 (.350) with two home runs and 20 RBI with the bases loaded...lead the majors in RBI with the bases loaded and are tied for the lead in hits and home runs.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have a season-high six-game errorless streak after making six errors over their first 10 contests...have a .990 fielding percentage, which is fifth best in the majors...have turned just seven double plays, which is second fewest to the Cardinals, who have one in five games... A's outfielders have three assists, which is tied for fourth most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their second road trip of the season tonight, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), San Francisco (three games) and Arizona (two games)...went 3-1 on their first road trip to Seattle...this trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 18 of 23 games on the road...played 12 of their first 16 games at home where they are 9-3...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (3-0) for their first undefeated homestand of six or more games since July 3-8, 2014 when they went 4-0 against Toronto and 2-0 against San Francisco...

have a six-game home winning streak, which matches their longest home winning streak over the last two years (July 4-17, 2019 and Aug. 1-17, 2019).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-0 in extra inning games...no other team has more than one extra inning win and only Houston has more extra inning games (4)...have scored seven runs in extra innings, which is the most in the majors...played 13 innings Friday night, which matches the longest game by innings in the majors this year (Dodgers defeated the Astros 4-2 on July 29)... are 4-0 in games decided in the last at bat and the four wins are tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the majors...are 3-0 in one-run games and the wins are tied for fifth most in the majors...are 7-1 in games decided by two runs or fewer...lead the majors with three walk-off wins, two of which are grand slams.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 5-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 7-4 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied with the Rockies for the most in the majors...went 35-14 (.714) against south paws last year, which was the second best record in the majors to Houston (38-11, .776).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 12-1 when homering, 0-3 when going homerless...are one of five teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Cardinals, Phillies, Yankees)...the opponent has scored first in 10 of the A's 16 games, but the A's are 7-3 in those games...are 9-1 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 when they are scheduled to play 30 games in 31 days...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have two players on the injured list (Puk, Weems) and have used the IL three times this year...used in 17 times last year, which tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13)...began the season with one player on the injured list (Puk), which marked the first time Oakland had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

*TAXI SQUAD:* The A's taxi squad for this road trip to Seattle features right-handed pitchers Paul Blackburn and James Kaprielian, catcher Jonah Heim, infielder Sheldon Neuse and outfielder Seth Brown...Heim was on the taxi squad for the first trip and Kaprielian was on the active roster Aug. 4 and 5... all five players are on the A's 40-man roster.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 3-1 after taking three of four from the Angels in Oakland to start the season...following this three-game series, meet the Angels one more time in a three-game series in Oakland from Aug. 21-23...have won 10 of the last 12 games and 23 of the last 34 ... won the season series last year 13-6 for the their first season series win since 2013...the 13 wins tied the A's second most against the Angels (14-6 in 2001, 13-5 in 1968)...went 7-3 in Oakland and are 6-3 in Anaheim...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 453-383 against the Angels...that includes 238-181 in Oakland and 215-202 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 502-460 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Liam Hendriks is tied for the Major League lead in saves...has a streak of 27 consecutive games with a strikeout, which ties his own Athletics record for consecutive games with a strikeout by a reliever (June 8-Aug. 14, 2019)... Yusmeiro Petit is tied for second in the majors with nine games pitched and leads the majors with 163 games pitched over the last three seasons...Burch Smith not allowed a run in his first five appearances (10.1 ip) and opponents are 4-for-35 (.114) with a walk...his innings pitched are second most in the majors among relievers (Beeks, TB 10.2) and are second most among all pitchers that have not allowed a run (DeSclafani, CIN 11.0)...Joakim Soria has struck out at least two batters in each of his last five appearances, which matches the longest such streak of his career...is tied for fourth among ML relievers in strikeouts (13).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1972, in a game completed the next day, the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 5-3 in 19 innings...the game was suspended after 17 innings and ended the next day when Joe Rudi hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the 19th...in 1976 Joe Rudi singles for his 1000th career hit in the A's 2-1 victory over Milwaukee...in 1985 Dave Kingman hits his 400th career home run in the A's 11-5 win at Seattle...in 2009 Mark Ellis is a perfect 5 for 5 and drives in four runs in the A's 9-1 win at Baltimore.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (0-2, 8.03 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...has tossed fewer than five innings and allowed four runs or more in each of his first three starts...its the second time in his career he has pitched fewer than five innings in three consecutive starts (Aug. 1-12, 2017)...has taken the loss in two of those starts, which marks his first two-game losing streak since May 25-30, 2018...has not lost more than two in a row since a career-high tying three-game losing streak from Aug. 1-18, 2017...has allowed 13 runs on 17 hits but has issued just one walk in 12.1 innings...allowed 15 runs on 18 hits in 12.2 innings during the spring but did not walk a batter...begins his fifth season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2017-18 20)

THE FIRST THREE INNINGS: Allowed a first-pitch home run to Choo in his last start and that is the only run he has allowed over the first three innings of a game this year (1 er in 9.0 ip, 1.00 ERA)...has allowed 12 runs, 10 earned, in the fourth and fifth innings (3.1 ip, 27.00 ERA)...opponents are 3-for-30 (.100) over innings one through three and 14-for-23 (.609) in the fourth and fifth innings...in eight starts over the last two seasons, he has a 0.38 ERA (1 er in 24.0 ip) and .128 (10-for-78) opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 7.00 ERA (14 er in 18.0 ip) and .307 (23-for-75) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

*OPPONENTS BATTING:* Opponents are hitting .222 (8-for-36) with the bases empty compared to .529 (9-for-17) with runners on...they are 7-for-10 (.700) with runners in scoring position after going 0-for-15 last year...has a .074 (2-for-27) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .577 (15-for-26) after that...has allowed two home runs, both solo shots, after allowing three solo home runs last year...has not allowed a home run with a runner on base since Aug. 19, 2018 (Gurriel, HOU, three-run).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) July 25 in Oakland...it was his first loss since Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston and it snapped a career-high tying five-game winning streak...retired each of the first 11 batters before Upton homered with two outs in the fourth...then allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Simmons RBI double and a Fletcher two-run double.

**SECOND START:** He dropped his second consecutive decision in the A's 5-3 loss at Seattle July 31...retired each of the first nine batters before allowing three runs (two earned) in the fourth inning on a Seager two-run double and an error...put runners on first and third with one out in the fifth and was relieved by Wendelken, who allowed both runners to score (one earned).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a first pitch home run to Choo to start the game but then retired nine of the next 11 hitters...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a Solak RBI double, a Kiner-Falefa RBI single and a Refsnyder sacrifice fly...was relieved by Smith with one out in the fourth and the A's trailing 4-2.

MANAEA vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA (48.1 ip, 43 h, 27 r, 25 er, 12 bb, 33 so, 8 hr) in nine career starts... is 0-2 with a 6.50 ERA (13 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts in Anaheim and 2-2 with a 2.81 ERA (12 er in 30.1 ip) in five starts in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-1 A's loss in Oakland on July 25 (see first start above)...it was his first start against the Angels since June 16, 2018 in Oakland when he was the winning

pitcher in the A's 6-4 victory...retired each of the first 12 batters he faced before allowing three straight hits to start the fifth...the last of those hits was a three-run home run by Young, which gave the Angels a 3-1 lead...Oakland then scored four times in the sixth and he was relieved by Petit to start the seventh with a 5-3 lead.

2019 RECAP: Began the season on the 60-day injured list as he continued his recovery from Sept. 19, 2018 surgery on his left shoulder...went 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts before he was reinstated from the IL Sept. 1...made five starts with Oakland and was 4-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .160 opponents batting average...the ERA was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched (Yates SD, 1.19) and fifth lowest in Oakland history...using the same minimum, the batting average was third lowest in the majors and sixth lowest in Oakland history...allowed two runs or fewer in all five starts, including one run or fewer four times, and four hits or fewer four times...struck out 30 batters in 29.2 innings and walked just seven (2.12 per nine innings)...had a .229 opponents on-base percentage and .280 slugging percentage.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .129 (8-for-62) against right-handed hitters compared to .211 (8-for-38) against left-handers...however, issued six of his seven walks to righties... yielded two of his three home runs to righties and has surrendered 55 of his 64 career homers to right-handers...now has a .218 opponents batting average and .592 OPS in his career against lefties, .254 with a .739 OPS against righties...opponents were 3-for-31 (.097) with runners on base, 0-for-15 with runners in scoring position and 0-for-8 with RISP and two outs...all three of the home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .073 batting average with two strikes...did not allow a hit to the opponent's eight (0-for-9) or nine (0-for-10) hitter.

2019 NIGHT AND DAY: Was 2-0 with a 0.50 ERA in three starts during the day, 2-0 with a 2.31 ERA in two starts at night...is now 16-5 with a 3.32 ERA (72 er in 195.1 ip) in 33 career day games, 19-25 with a 4.23 ERA (146 er in 310.2 ip) in 56 starts at night.

2019 THIS AND THAT: Did not allow a run in innings one through four (20.0 ip) and opponents were 8-for-63 (.127)...had a 3.72 ERA and .216 opponents average from the fifth inning on...went 4-0 in four starts with three runs of support or more...is now 4-28 in 46 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 31-2 in 42 starts with support of three runs or more.

2019 IN MINORS: Started his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 8 and was 0-1 with a 9.72 ERA in three starts when he was transferred to Triple-A Las Vegas July 23...went 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA in two starts with the Aviators before his rehab assignment was halted on Aug. 2 due to a strained right oblique...returned to action Aug. 13 and went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA over his final three starts...was 3-3 with a 4.71 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in eight rehab starts overall...struck out 53 batters in 36.1 innings (13.13 per nine innings) and walked 10 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.3... his opponents batting average broke down to .214 against left-handed hitters compared to .226 with five of his six home runs and eight of his 10 walks against right-handed hitters.

# TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER RHP Mike Fiers (1-0, 5.63 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the

season...is 1-0 over his first three starts but the A's won in both of his no decisions...Oakland is now 33-12 (.733) when he starts in his career...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-4 A's win over Texas last Thursday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 6-4 with a 5.18 ERA (83.1 ip, 89 h, 49 r, 48 er, 22 bb, 59 so, 16 hr) in 15 career appearances, 14 starts, against Los Angeles...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-4 A's win in Oakland on July 26 (4.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 0 so)...was 1-3 with a 5.51 ERA in five starts during the spring...however, held the opposition to a .210 batting average...was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's last year...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting average (.243), tied for eighth in wins and 10th in OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304).

7-0, 1.63 ERA (12 er in 66.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 8-for-9 (88.9%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed just one earned run in the last five games (20.0 ip, 0.45 ERA) and three in the last 10 (37.0 ip, 0.73 ERA)...has a 1.63 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the majors.
- Ranks second in the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.245), third
  in OPS (.507) and slugging percentage (.261) and sixth in batting average
  (.195).
- Leads the majors with eight saves...had the blown save in the opener but has converted all eight save opportunities since then.
- Has not allowed a home run in the last seven games and has surrendered just two for the season, which is tied for second fewest (Cardinals, 0 in 18.1 innings).
- Has issued just two walks in the last seven games (25.0 ip) and is third in the majors in fewest walks per nine innings (2.31).
- Is tied with the Rays for second in the majors with seven wins (Braves, 8) and is one of two pens without a loss (Cubs)...despite the reduced schedule, the seven wins will not be the fewest in Oakland history as the 1980 club had just four.
- First batters faced are 8-for-49 (.163) with four walks and two doubles...
  rank fourth in the majors in opponents slugging percentage against first
  batters (.204), fifth in OPS (.426), sixth in on-base percentage (.222) and
  ninth in batting average.

- Has not allowed a run in seven appearances (6.2 ip) and opponents are 2-for-21 (.095)...however, has issued four walks (.240 on-base percentage).
- Now has a 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...his career high is 14.2 innings from May 11 to June 18, 2016.
- Left-handed hitters are 0-for-8 and opponents are 0-for-11 with runners on base
- Did not allow a run in three appearances against the Angels earlier this year (2.2 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 4 so)...has not allowed a run in 11 of his last 12 appearances against the Angels dating back to April 11, 2018 (10.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 bb, 14 so, 0.84 ERA) and has stranded all six of his inherited runners...now has a 2.57 ERA (6 er in 21.0 ip) in 25 career appearances against Los Angeles.

- Had the A's second walk-off grand slam of the season last
- Tuesday night against Texas, the ninth in Oakland history...it was his second career walk-off home run (May 8, 2019 vs. Cincinnati) and his third career grand slam (had two in 2016 with St. Louis).
- Had two hits in the fifth inning a week ago today at Seattle to become the first Athletic with two hits in an inning since Matt Chapman on Sept. 21, 2019 against Texas.

- Is 5-for-15 (.333) over his last three games after going 3-for-27 (.111) over his previous six contests.
- Made his 149th consecutive start batting leadoff yesterday, which breaks Rickey Henderson's Oakland record for consecutive games batting first in the order (148, May 12, 1981-June 22, 1982)...the only longer streaks in Athletics history are by Topsy Hartsel (177 from May 17, 1906-June 20, 1907 and 156 from April 23, 1902-May 11, 1903).
- Has a consecutive games played streak of 259 dating back to June 28, 2018 (all starts)...has played all but 37 innings at short over that span... his consecutive games started streak is second longest in Oakland history (347, Alfredo Griffin, April 9, 1985-April 30, 1987) while the consecutive games played streak is fourth best to Griffin's 347.
- is 2-for-17 (.118) against left-handed pitching, 13-for-54 (.241) against right-handers.
- Leads the majors in at bats (71) and is tied for eighth in strikeouts (22).
- Went 4-for-16 (.250) with a walk against the Angels earlier this year and has now reached base safely in 23 consecutive games against the Angels dating back to March 28, 2019...that is the longest by an Athletic against the Angels since Mark McGwire had a 29-game streak from May 8, 1993-May 28, 1997...is hitting (.333 (31-for-93) with nine walks and a hit by pitch over that span (.398 on-base percentage)...has 17 career home runs against Los Angeles, which are his most against any team.
- Hit his first home run of the season Saturday against Houston, a lead-off shot in the bottom of the first...it was his seventh career lead-off home run, which is fourth most in Oakland history (Henderson 43, Crisp 15, Campaneris 10)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletic (since 1901) to leadoff a game with a home run after ending the previous game with a walk-off RBI...the last Major Leaguer to do it was Charlie Blackmon last year on April 19-20 against Philadelphia.
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the bottom of the 13th inning Friday night for his second career walk-off RBI (March 29, 2018 vs. LAA, single).
