OAKLAND ATHLETICS (12-5) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (6-11)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's had their Major League best nine-game winning streak snapped last night to fall to 12-5 (.706)...that is still the second best record in the majors to the Cubs (10-3, .769)...it is tied for the third best record in Oakland history after 17 games...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the eighth consecutive day and are 4½ games ahead of second place Houston...that is one short of the season high of five on Aug. 9...have not had more than a five game lead in the West since June 29, 2014 when they led by 5½ games...have held at least a share of first place for 16 of 18 days this year (eight days in first, eight days tied for first, one day tied for second and one day in third)...spent a total of 21 days in first from 2015-19...swept a pair of three-game series from Texas and Houston on the last homestand...the sweeps were the A's first two sweeps of the season.

NINE-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: The A's had their nine-game winning streak snapped last night...it was the longest in the majors this year and tied for ninth longest in Oakland history...it matched the second longest winning streak by an A's team over the last 14 years (11, May 16-27, 2019)...outscored the opposition 47-19 during the streak...the pitching staff had a 1.88 ERA and .183 opponents batting average...struck out 86 in 86.0 innings and walked just 21...the bullpen allowed just four runs (three earned) in 33.0 innings (0.81 ERA)...batted .229 with 44 walks and 10 hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage)...homered in each of the nine games (16 total)...committed just two errors.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff had season highs in runs (10), hits (14) and home runs (4) last night and matched their season high in walks (6, July 24 vs. Angels)...have allowed two runs or fewer in seven of the last 10 games and have a 2.68 ERA (28 er in 94.0 ip) over that span...have a 3.10 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the majors behind Cleveland (2.04) and the Dodgers (2.50)...have the fourth lowest opponents OPS (.629), slugging percentage (.345) and on-base percentage (.283)...have surrendered just 13 home runs, which is tied with the Rockies for second fewest to the Cardinals (5 in 5 games)...rank fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.64) and tied for second in fewest hit batters (2).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last nine games and are 5-0 with a 3.10 ERA (17 er in 49.1 ip) over that span...have a 3.80 ERA (36 er in 85.1 ip) for the season, which is fifth lowest among teams in the West (AL and NL) but 10th lowest in the majors...rank fifth in the majors in innings pitched (85.1) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs allowed (8).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .217, which is sixth lowest in the majors...however, are tied for the Major League lead in walks (76), rank second in hit by pitches (15) and sixth in on-base percentage (.326)...have homered in each of the last 10 games (18 home runs total) after homering just five times over the first seven contests...are tied for seventh in the majors in home runs (23)...have been successful in 9-of-11 (81.8%) stolen base attempts...are tied for fifth in the majors in steals and rank seventh in stolen base percentage...are hitting .247 (66-for-267) with 50 runs scored and 16 home runs over the last eight games after batting .188 with 30 runs and seven home runs over the first nine contests...are 8-for-21 (.381) with two home runs and 23 RBI with the bases loaded...lead the majors in RBI with the bases loaded and are tied for the lead in hits and home runs.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a season-high seven-game errorless streak after making six errors over their first 10 contests...have a .991 fielding percentage, which is fifth best in the majors...have turned just nine double plays, which is tied for fifth fewest...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for third most in the majors (Red Sox and Pirates, 5).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on their second road trip of the season tonight, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-1), San Francisco (three games) and Arizona (two games)...went 3-1 on their first road trip to Seattle and are 3-2 (.600) on the road...this trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 18 of 23 games on the road...played 12 of their first 16 games at home where they are 9-3...went 6-0 on the last homestand against Texas (3-0) and Houston (3-0) for their first undefeated homestand of six or more games since July 3-8, 2014 when they went 4-0 against Toronto and 2-0 against San Francisco...have a six-game home winning streak, which

matches their longest home winning streak over the last two years (July 4-17, 2019 and Aug. 1-17, 2019).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost their first one-run decision of the season last night and are now 3-1 in one-run games...are tied for sixth in the majors in one-run wins...are 7-2 in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 3-0 in extra inning games...no other team has more than one extra inning win and only Houston has more extra inning games (4)...have scored seven runs in extra innings, which is the most in the majors...played 13 innings last Friday night against Houston, which matches the longest game by innings in the majors this year (Dodgers defeated the Astros 4-2 on July 29)...are 4-1 in games decided in the last at bat and the four wins are tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the majors...lead the majors with three walk-off wins, two of which are grand slams.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 7-5 when they start a right-hander...the wins against left-handed starters are tied with the Rockies for the most in the majors...have a run differential of +22, which is tied for fourth best in the majors...are 12-2 when homering, 0-3 when going homerless...are one of five teams that has not won a game when going homerless (Pirates, Cardinals, Phillies, Yankees)...the opponent has scored first in 11 of the A's 17 games, but the A's are 7-4 in those games...are 9-2 in this stretch from July 31 to Aug. 30 when they are scheduled to play 30 games in 31 days...are scheduled to play 60 games this season, which are the fewest in Athletics history...the previous low was 109 in the strike-shortened 1981 season.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have two players on the injured list (Puk, Weems) and have used the IL three times this year...used in 17 times last year, which tied Houston for second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (13)...began the season with one player on the injured list (Puk), which marked the first time Oakland had fewer than two players on the IL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for this road trip to Seattle features right-handed pitchers Paul Blackburn and James Kaprielian, catcher Jonah Heim, infielder Sheldon Neuse and outfielder Seth Brown...Heim was on the taxi squad for the first trip and Kaprielian was on the active roster Aug. 4 and 5...all five players are on the A's 40-man roster.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 3-2...lost the first game in Anaheim last night after winning three of four in Oakland to start the season...following this three-game series, meet the Angels one more time in a three-game series in Oakland from Aug. 21-23...have won 10 of the last 13 games and 23 of the last 35...won the season series last year 13-6 for the their first season series win since 2013...the 13 wins tied the A's second most against the Angels (14-6 in 2001, 13-5 in 1968)...went 7-3 in Oakland and are 6-3 in Anaheim...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 453-384 against the Angels...that includes 238-181 in Oakland and 215-203 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 502-461 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is the first player in Athletics history with at least two home runs, a triple and six RBI in a game...the last Major Leaguer to do it was Mookie Betts on Sept. 12, 2017 against the A's (...**Liam Hendriks** is tied for the Major League lead in saves (5))...has a streak of 27 consecutive games with a strikeout, which ties his own Athletics record for consecutive games with a strikeout by a reliever (June 8-Aug. 14, 2019)...**Yusmeiro Petit** is tied for the Major League lead in games pitched (10) and leads the majors with 164 games pitched over the last three seasons...**Burch Smith** not allowed a run in his first five appearances (10.1 ip) and opponents are 4-for-35 (.114) with a walk...his innings pitched are fourth most in the majors among relievers and are second most among all pitchers that have not allowed a run (DeSclafani, CIN 11.0)...**Joakim Soria** has struck out at least two batters in each of his last five appearances, which matches the longest such streak of his career...is tied for fifth among ML relievers in strikeouts (13).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1920** the A's score 10 times in the seventh inning to defeat Detroit 13-4...In **1978** Rick Langford tosses a three-hit shutout in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota in a 2-0 A's victory...in **2003** Tim Hudson tosses a complete game two-hit shutout and needs just 93 pitches to defeat Boston, 4-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (1-0, 5.63 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...is 1-0 over his first three starts but the A's won in both of his no decisions...Oakland is now 33-12 (.733) when he starts in his career...is in his 10th season in the majors and is with his fourth team...has pitched for Milwaukee (2011-15), Houston (2015-17), Detroit (2018) and Oakland (2018-present)...is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2013, 15-17, 19-20).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .182 (6-for-33) average against left-handed hitters compared to .387 (12-for-31) against right-handers...has a .154 (4-for-26) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .368 (14-for-38) with all three of his home runs after that.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Los Angeles (AL) July 26 in Oakland...did not walk or strikeout a batter in 4.0 innings...it was his first career start with no walks and no strikeouts...the A's scored five times in the first and he allowed a three-run home run to Trout in the third inning...was relieved by Petit with runners on first and third and no outs in the fifth and Petit allowed one of those runners to score.

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 10-inning win at Seattle on Aug. 1...allowed a two-run single to Seager in the third inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...the A's tied the game with two runs in the seventh and he was relieved by Diekmann to start the bottom of the seventh.

LAST START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 6-4 victory over Texas last Thursday in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on a hit and walk over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead entering the fifth...allowed a RBI single to Tejeda in the fifth, a solo home run to Frazier in the sixth and a two-run home run to Tejeda in the seventh...was relieved by McFarland with no outs in the seventh and the A's leading 5-4.

FIERS vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 6-4 with a 5.18 ERA (83.1 ip, 89 h, 49 r, 48 er, 22 bb, 59 so, 16 hr) in 15 career appearances, 14 starts...is 3-3 with a 7.97 ERA (31 er in 35.0 ip) in seven games in Angel Stadium and 3-1 with a 3.19 ERA (17 er in 48.0 ip) in seven starts in his home ballparks...including 1-0 with a 4.80 ERA (8 er in 15.0 ip) in three starts in the Coliseum...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-4 A's win in Oakland on July 26 (see first start above)...went 3-0 with a 3.04 ERA (23.2 ip, 21 h, 8 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 15 so, 3 hr) in four starts last year.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-3 with a 5.51 ERA in five starts during the spring...however, held the opposition to a .210 batting average...the five starts tied for the most in the majors...his 16.1 innings pitched led the Cactus League and ranked fifth in the majors...is now 7-11 with a 5.96 ERA (77 er in 116.1 ip) in 43 games, including 31 starts, in his career during the spring.

2019 RECAP: Was 15-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 33 starts in his first full season with the A's...ranked third in the American League in winning percentage (.789), sixth in opponents batting average (.243), tied for eighth in wins and 10th in OPS (.712) and on-base percentage (.304)...also tied for third in wild pitches (13) and tied for fifth in games started...had career highs in wins, games (33), games started, innings pitched (184.2) and winning percentage...led the A's in wins, starts, innings pitched, runs (82), walks (53) and home runs (30)...is the first A's pitcher to win 15 games since Scott Kazmir had 15 in 2014 and the first to make 33 starts since Sonny Gray had 33 in 2014...his innings pitched were the most by an A's pitcher over the last three years...his .789 winning percentage was fourth best in Oakland history among pitchers with 15 or more decisions...his 30 home runs tied for 10th most in a season in Oakland history...struck out 126 batters, an average of 6.14 per nine innings...that was the third-lowest mark in the AL...had the fifth-lowest strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.38)...the A's were 22-11 (.667) in his starting assignments in 2019 and are 33-12 (.733) in his career...left with the lead in eight of his no decisions in 2019 only to have the bullpen blow the save...has left with the lead in 12 of his 45 career starts with the A's only to have the bullpen blow the save.

BEGINNING, MIDDLE AND END: Went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA, .297 opponents batting average and .854 OPS over his first eight starts last year, 10-0 with a 2.12 ERA, .199 opponents average and .572 OPS over his next 17 starts from May 7-Aug. 9 and 3-1 with a 6.27 ERA, .304 opponents average and .940 OPS over his final eight starts.

2019 HOME AND AWAY: Was 9-2 with a 2.90 ERA and .641 OPS in 17 starts at home compared to 6-2 with a 5.14 ERA and .796 OPS in 16 starts on the road...had the fifth-lowest home ERA in the AL and the fourth-highest road ERA...tied for fourth in the AL in home wins and ranked eighth in OPS...one of his home losses was in Tokyo and he is now 13-1 with a 2.95 (47 er in 143.1) ERA in 24 starts in the Coliseum since he was acquired from Detroit on Aug. 6, 2018...is 8-0 with a 2.87 ERA (30 er in 94.0 ip) over his last 15 home starts and has not lost at home since April 20, 2019 vs. Toronto...is 14-3 with a 3.28 ERA (63 er in 172.2 ip) and .226 (142-for-628) opponents batting average in 30 career games, including 29 starts, in the Coliseum.

2019 NIGHT AND DAY: Was 11-2 with a 3.66 ERA and .683 OPS in 24 starts at night, 4-2 with a 4.60 ERA and .800 OPS in nine starts during the day...tied for fifth in the AL in night wins and ranked seventh in ERA and OPS...is now 16-3 with a 3.60 ERA (77 er in 192.2 ip) in 35 career appearances at night with the A's.

2019 DAYS REST: Compiled an 11-1 record and a 3.21 ERA in 17 starts on five days rest and is now 14-1 with a 3.12 ERA (48 er in 138.1 ip) in 23 starts on five days rest in his A's career...went 2-1 with a 4.59 ERA in 10 starts on four days rest and 2-2 with a 5.10 ERA in six starts on six days rest or more.

2019 MONTH BY MONTH: Was 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA in five starts in April, 1-1 with a 7.84 ERA in five starts in September and 12-1 with a 2.59 ERA in 21 starts in May, June, July and August...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in his career in April, 8-14 with a 5.67 ERA in September and 56-35 with a 3.44 ERA (306 er in 801.0) in between.

2019 OPPONENTS BATTING: His .243 opponents batting average broke down to .239 (83-for-348) against righthanded hitters compared to .248 (83-for-335) against left-handers...yielded a .264 average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .185 with RISP and two outs...now has a .191 (76-for-397) career opponents average with RISP and two outs...allowed a .216 opponents average with two outs.

2019 DIVISIONAL PLAY: Was 5-2 with a 5.63 ERA in 17 starts against AL West competition compared to 10-2 with a 2.38 ERA in 16 starts against all other teams...is now 15-15 with a 5.54 ERA (188 er in 305.1 ip) in 58 career appearances against the AL West, 55-44 with a 3.46 ERA (305 er in 793.1 ip) in 150 games against all other opponents.

WITH THE A'S: Was acquired by Oakland on Aug. 6, 2018 and is 21-6 with a 3.97 ERA (112 er in 253.2 ip) in 46 games, including 45 starts, with the A's...the wins are tied for fifth most in the American League over that span.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (1-0, 1.08 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...has allowed one run or fewer in each of his first three starts...is the first A's pitcher to begin the season in the starting rotation and allow one run or fewer in each of his first three starts since Gio Gonzalez in 2011 (April 3-14)...has a career-high four game winning streak dating back to Aug. 11, 2019...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's win in 13 innings over Houston last Friday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 2-2 with a 5.33 ERA (25.1 ip, 31 h, 19 r, 15 er, 6 bb, 27 so, 3 hr) in seven career appearances, including five starts, against Los Angeles...including a no decision in one start this year, a 3-0 A's win in Oakland on July 27 (4.0 ip, 5 h, 1 bb, 5 so)...saw the most extensive action of his five-year career last year, going 10-5 with a 3.81 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 28 games, including 25 starts.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

7-1, 2.26 ERA (18 er in 71.2 ip)
Saves/Opportunities: 8-for-10 (80.0%)

- The A's bullpen yielded six earned runs last night after allowing just one earned run in the previous five games (20.0 ip, 0.45 ERA) and three in the previous 10 (37.0 ip, 0.73 ERA)...has a 2.26 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League.
- Ranks third in the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.259), fourth in OPS (.567) and slugging percentage (.308), and eighth in batting average (.205).
- Leads the majors with eight saves...had the blown save in the opener and converted all eight save opportunities prior to last night.
- Has issued just five walks in the last eight games (30.1 ip) and is fourth in the majors in fewest walks per nine innings (2.51).
- Is third in the Majors with seven wins (Braves/Rays, 8)...despite the reduced schedule, the seven wins will not be the fewest in Oakland history as the 1980 club had just four.

- Is 5-for-19 (.263) over his last four games after going 3-for-27 (.111) over his previous six contests.
- Made his 149th consecutive start (now 150) batting leadoff Sunday, which breaks Rickey Henderson's Oakland record for consecutive games batting first in the order (148, May 12, 1981-June 22, 1982)...the only longer streaks in Athletics history are by Topsy Hartsel (177 from May 17, 1906-June 20, 1907 and 156 from April 23, 1902-May 11, 1903).
- Has a consecutive games played streak of 260 dating back to June 28, 2018 (all starts)...has played all but 37 innings at short over that span...his consecutive games started streak is second longest in Oakland history (347, Alfredo Griffin, April 9, 1985-April 30, 1987) while the consecutive games played streak is fourth best to Griffin's 347.
- Is 2-for-17 (.118) against left-handed pitching, 13-for-58 (.224) against right-handers.
- Leads the majors in at bats (75) and is tied for 10th in strikeouts (22).
- Has now reached base safely in 24 consecutive games against the Angels dating back to March 28, 2019...that is the longest by an Athletic against the Angels since Mark McGwire had a 29-game streak from May 8, 1993-May 28, 1997...is hitting (.320, 31-for-97) with 10 walks and a hit by pitch over that span (.389 on-base percentage)...has 17 career home runs against Los Angeles, which are his most against any team.
